Panchayat, ULB polls nowhere in sight

- Govt awaiting commission recommendations decision
- Delay hampers grassroots dev funding
- Appointment of SEC pending

Srinagar, Sept 13: The National Conference (NC)-led government is unlikely to conduct local body elections in the near future, as it has yet to take a call on the recommendations of a commission appointed by the LG-led administration regarding reservation for Other Backward Classes and the appointment of the State Election Commissioner.

Based on current indications, the government appears averse to conducting Panchayat and Urban Local Bodies elections in the remaining months of 2025. "There are no chances of holding Panchayat and Urban Local Bodies polls this year. As of



now, we have not received any such indication from the government," a legislator from the ruling National Conference told news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

Holding of Panchayat and Urban Local Bodies (ULB) polls falls under the domain of the elected government.

The last local body elections were held during Governor's rule in 2018, and the term of those bodies has since expired.

The first indication that the government has no plan to hold local body elections comes from its 'inaction' over the recommendations submitted by a three-member panel headed by former High Court Judge Justice Janak Raj Kotwal.

"The cabinet is yet to take a call on the report. It has to decide whether to adopt or reject it," sources within the government disclosed.

Secondly, the government has not taken any visible steps toward appointing the State Election Commissioner, the authority responsible for conducting the polls, after former IAS officer B.R. Sharma completed his term.

CM Omar to Centre: Empower J&K's elected govt, honour statehood promise Says Congress part of UT Govt; seeks release of MLA Doda

Srinagar, Sept 13: Asserting that the elected government in Jammu and Kashmir should be empowered in accordance with the aspirations of the people, Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Saturday said that the dispensation led by him has not compromised on any issue. He urged the Centre to honour the promise of restoring J&K's statehood made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah in the Parliament.

Addressing a news conference in Chennai, Omar, as per the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said, his regime has not compromised on anything. "Since the day my government has been elected, we have stood steadfast in our belief that statehood must be restored. We were the ones who passed a resolution in the assembly asking for the special status of Jammu and Kashmir to be restored. We are the last people



who will compromise on a mandate that has been given to us by the people," he said.

He further stated that "the law & order and policing, these are not part of the elected government's responsibilities and I think it is unfortunate. Jammu and Kashmir has been promised full statehood by the Prime Minister, by the Home Minister, by representatives of the Government of India when this matter was argued before the Supreme Court. So there is no reason why this promise shouldn't be kept. Again, this is

something that should have already happened. I fail to understand why it hasn't been done, but we continue to push and believe that this promise must be kept and the elected government must be empowered the way the people want it to be."

POST OPERATION SINDOOR, ALL NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS BEING TAKEN

He said that all the necessary precautions are being taken post 'Operation Sindoor.' Replying to a query on measures taken post Operation Sindoor for the safety of people, Chief Minister Omar said, "We did a comprehensive security audit of all our tourist destinations. Some of them are even at this moment not open for tourism activity but most of the places have reopened and we are taking all the precautions that are necessary."

SEEKS RELEASE OF MEHRAJ MALIK

About the detention of a legislator from Doda, Mehraj Malik under Public Safety Act (PSA), the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, said, "Whatever the complaints might have been there about the conduct of the MLA, the law that has used to detain him is excessive use of force against an elected representative".

Addressing a gathering at Imphal, the Prime Minister, according to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) paid rich tributes to martyr Deepak Chingkham and other personnel from the Manipur who participated in the operation.

The Prime Minister inaugurated multiple development projects worth over Rs 1,200 crore in Manipur. These included the Civil Secretariat at Mantripukhri, the IT Special Economic Zone building, the new Manipur Police Headquarters, Manipur Bhawans in Delhi and Kolkata, and four

Ima Markets in different districts.

Poonch landslides, Ramban cloudburst displace families

700 evacuated, 95 houses develop cracks; rescue teams assess risks, damage

Poonch, Sept 13: Continuous rainfall has triggered landslides, land subsidence, and flash floods, forcing hundreds of families from their homes and leaving several areas in Poonch and Ramban districts

of the Jammu division on edge.
As per the news agency—
Kashmir News Observer (KNO),
the Kalaban village of Poonch
district's Mendhar sector has
been declared unsafe after the
soil beneath residential areas began shifting earlier this
week

Officials said that around 95 houses have developed cracks and nearly 700 residents have been evacuated to temporary

shelters.

"Portions of the ground sank overnight, and the walls of our homes started splitting apart," said Mohammad Yousuf, a farmer in Kalaban who was shifted with his family to a government school. "We left everything behind, not knowing if we could ever return."

District officials said relocation was carried out as a precautionary measure, with relief supplies and medical teams deployed to the shelters. "Our priority is safety. We are providing food, bedding, and essential support to all affected families," an officer from the Mendhar administration said.

Bemina Bypass road chokes traffic, 4-lanning plan 'still in limbo'

Despite flyover, key Sgr link to NH-44 remains clogged

Srinagar, Sept 13: The Bemina-Bypass road, one of Srinagar's most vital traffic links connecting the Children's Hospital, SKIMS Bemina and several government offices to the NH-44 corridor—continues to remain clogged with traffic throughout the day, causing daily chaos

for commuters and patients.

Locals from the area said the stretch from Bemina Crossing (Tattoo Ground) to Bemina

Bypass, where it merges with NH-44, carries a major share of traffic towards north and south Kashmir but is too narrow to handle the growing volume of vehicles.

"Traffic snarls have become routine here. Ambulances get stuck for long and very few men from the traffic department manage the mess," said Irfan Ahmad, a daily commuter, speaking with the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

Other commuters pointed out that the road surface is smooth but its narrow width leads to frequent congestion and long traffic iams

and long traffic jams.

They said authorities had commissioned the Bemina Bypass Flyover in June 2024 to ease congestion at the junction. However, the flyover has done little to decongest the ground-level road, which continues to see bottlenecks during peak hours.

Residing in Surhotti, Ari, Bukhari has dedicated herself to a noble mission preserving local culture, preventing rural migration and creating sustainable livelihood opportunities through her pioneering Cocoon Art and Craft Initiative.

Justice Kumar inaugurates 3rd National Lok Adalat

SRINAGAR, SEPTEMBER 13: Continuing its endeavour to fulfil the constitutional commitment of providing swift, cost-effective, and efficient dispute resolution to the masses in general and the litigant public in particular, the J&K Legal Services Authority—under the patronage of Justice Arun Palli, Chief Justice, High Court of J&K and Ladakh (Patron-in-Chief, J&K Legal Services Authority), the dynamic leadership of Justice Sanjeev Kumar, Executive Chairman, J&K Legal Services Authority, organized the 3rd National Lok Adalat of the year 2025 across the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir, to promote amicable settlements in a wide range of cases, including MACT claims, matrimonial disputes, cheque bounce cases under the Negotiable Instruments Act, money recovery, commercial disputes, and compoundable criminal offences.

Justice Sanjeev Kumar, Executive Chairman, J&K Legal Services Authority inaugurated the 3rd National Lok Adalat at District Court Complex Kupwara. Upon his arrival, the Executive Chairman was received by Shazia Tabasum, Member Secretary, J&K Legal Services Authority, Additional District & Sessions Judge NIA Court Kupwara, Iqbal Ahmad Masoodi alongwith the other Judicial Officers of the District Judiciary and other



civil administration. To mark the occasion, a ceremonial guard of honour was accorded to Justice Sanjeev Kumar.

During his visit, Justice Sanjeev Kumar inspected different benches and interacted with the Presiding officers, members of the benches, Advocates and litigants and appreciated the arrangements made for the smooth conduct of the Lok Adalat. Several cases were resolved on the spot. As a gesture of timely justice delivery, several MACT compensation cheques were also distributed among eligible claimants on the occasion, providing immediate relief to the beneficiaries.

At the ADR Centre of the Court Complex, Justice Sanjeev Kumar convened an interaction with LADCs and Penal Lawyers. He sought feedback regarding the progress of cases handled by them and urged them to work with greater dedication and enthusiasm to

ensure timely hearings and speedy settlement of cases, thereby minimizing pendency.

Later in the day, Justice Sanjeev Kumar visited District Jail Kupwara, where he inspected all barracks and interacted with inmates to assess the status of their cases. He also reviewed the facilities being provided in the jail, including food and healthcare arrangements, and obtained feedback directly from the inmates.

As per the information received from various Legal Services Institutions working in different districts across the UT of J&K, out of total3,06, 851cases taken up by 167 Benches in the day long National Lok Adalat, 2,39,533 cases were amicably settled and disposed off involving an amount of Rs.50,50,78,932/as compensation/settlement amount in cases like Motor Accident Claims, civil, criminal, labour disputes, Electricity and Water Bills, Land Acquisition, Family matters, cheque dishonor and Bank Recovery etc.

Shazia Tabasum, Member Secretary, J&K Legal Services Authority informed that the 4th National Lok Adalat of the current calendar year shall be held on December 13, 2025 and those litigants who could not get their cases either listed in today's Lok Adalat or could not settle the same for any reason can avail the opportunity in the next Lok Adalat.

Adopt scientific methods for collection, disposal of waste: Div Com

Stresses on collaborative efforts for Aerospace Safety

SRINAGAR, SEPTEMBER 13: Divisional Commissioner (Div Com) Kashmir, Anshul Garg, who is also the chairman of the Airfield Environment Management Committee, emphasized the need for collaborative efforts among stakeholders to ensure aerospace safety around the airfield.

Div Com made these remarks while chairing a high-level committee meeting today, here.

The meeting was attended by Deputy Commissioners of Budgam, Anantnag, and Pulwama, along with the Commissioner of Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC), Air Officer Commanding of Air Force Station Srinagar, Director Urban Local Bodies, ADC Srinagar, and officials from the Airport Authority, Pollution Control Board, Irrigation & Flood Control Department, and Rural Development Department.

During the meeting, Div Com issued a slew of directions aimed at enhancing airfield safety, particularly with regard to visibility, bird hazards, dog menace, and the regulation of carcass disposal in the proximity of the airport.

To improve air quality and visibility for aircraft, he directed the immediate closure of unlicensed brick kilns within an 8-kilometer radius of the airfield. Also, he called for the



implementation of the zigzag technique in the operational brick kilns to minimize emission of pollutants.

Addressing the issue of bird hazards, especially the presence of Black Kites attracted by open waste dumps, Div Com instructed Deputy Commissioners, SMC Commissioner, and the Director of Urban Local Bodies to adopt scientific methods for the collection and disposal of solid waste, with special attention to villages identified by airfield authorities. He also emphasized the need for proper disposal of waste from slaughterhouses and butcher shops.To mitigate the dog men ace in and around the airfield,

he directed the SMC to give priority to dog sterilization drives in the area. Besides, he stressed the importance of public sensitization campaigns to ensure proper disposal of dead animal carcasses by local residents.

Garg urged officials to utilize resources under centrally sponsored schemes through coordinated efforts across departments to effectively address the identified challenges.

Earlier in the meeting, the Committee Secretary presented a detailed PowerPoint presentation outlining key safety concerns affecting the airfield environment.



Negative power variation in J&K, Ladakh: NRPC

Srinagar, Sep 13: Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh has witnessed a negative variation of 19 percent in power availability and 7.5 percent in power requirement in the previous month during peak hours.

According to the official documents showing the anticipated power supply position v/s actual power supply position (Provisional) of Northern Region during the month of August-2025 states that in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh it has anticipated power availability of 2050 MU's and requirement of 1740 MU's respectively.



The official figures further reveals that the actual power availability was 1490 MU's whereas the requirement was 1493 MU's. It also states that there was a variation of minus 27.3 percent in power availability and minus 14.2 percent in requirement respectively. It also states that during the peak, NRPC has anticipated that there will be a peak power availability of 3370 Megawatts (MW's) and power requirement of 3007 MWs. The documents said that there was a

peak variation of minus 19 percent in power availability and minus 7.5 percent in power requirement in the previous month.

NRPC said that there was a negative,

significant variation (≥5%) in Actual Power Supply Position(Provisional) vis-à-vis Anticipated figures is observed for the month of August-2025 in terms of Energy Requirement for Chandigarh, Delhi, Haryana, HP, UTs of J&K and Ladakh, Punjab, Rajasthan, UP, and Uttarakhand and in terms of Peak Demand similar variation is noted for Chandigarh, Delhi, Harvana, UTs of J&K and Ladakh, Punjab, Rajasthan, and Uttarakhand.

NH restrictions threaten livelihood of growers

Srinagar, Sep 13: Kashmir's fruit growers, already battling falling apple prices and crop damage have been now facing the challenge of transportation of their produce. With the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway witnessing repeated closures and the Mughal Road allowing only sixtyre vehicles on alternate days, the orchardists are struggling to move their harvest to markets across India.

To keep their apples from perishing, growers are resorting to a patchwork system of transportation. They load their produce onto nearly small vehicles in south Kashmir, ferry it across the Mughal Road to Rajouri and then reload it onto a single truck bound for Delhi, Mumbai or other mandis.

"This is proving to be a night-mare for us," said Abdul Rashid, an orchardist from Shopian. "Hiring small load carriers, then shifting the same fruit into a truck, means double expenditure and double handling. Not only does it raise costs, but the fruit also loses freshness by the time it reaches outside markets. Buyers immediately cut down the rate.'

The financial strain is palpable. Mushtaq Ahmad, a grower from Pulwama, explained, "Apple prices are already low this season due to massive fruit fall. Whatever little margin we had is now wiped out by transport hurdles. We are paying more for logistics than what we are getting in

return from mandis.' Many farmers fear that if such

challenges persist, Kashmir's horticulture - the backbone of its rural economy - will see a decline in future investment. "We depend on this crop for our survival," said Ghulam Nabi from Kulgam. "But every year it's the same story — weather, pests, or road closures. If the situation doesn't improve, people will abandon orcharding.

The horticulture sector in Kashmir contributes thousands of crores to the economy and sustains lakhs of families. Yet, transport has remained its most fragile link. With the current restrictions, traders warn of cascading losses.

"If alternate routes are not made viable, the entire chain will collapse," said a fruit trader in Sopore. "We urge the administration to either permit bigger trucks on the Mughal Road every day or ensure smooth traffic on the Jammu highway. Without that, this season will be disastrous for us."

As the harvest season peaks, the silence from officials has only deepened growers' anxiety. For the orchardists, the fear is not just about this year's sales, but about the future of a livelihood that has sustained generations.

Though the government has been making efforts by making train arrangements for the produce besides that vehicles have been allowed on national highway as well in past few days but it isn't normal as of now and growers have been demanding better arrangements from the government—(KNO)

Today, the region stands not just transformed but empowered, with better connectivity, stronger economies, and a renewed sense of purpose. The story of the Northeast is now one of peace, progress, and prosperity, a true reflection of a Viksit Bharat in the making.

Empowering the Northeast: A Vision to Empower, Act, Strengthen, and Transform

To accelerate inclusive growth in the North Eastern Region the Central Government has implemented a series of transformative initiatives under its Act East vision. This strategic framework positions the Northeast as a vital gateway to India's engagement with Southeast Asia while also ensuring balanced development within. As articulated in the Prime Minister's words "For us EAST means Empower, Act, Strengthen and Transform" a guiding philosophy that underpins every policy initiative in the region. From infrastructure and digital connectivity to education, healthcare and livelihoods these efforts are focused on creating opportunities improving access and enhancing the quality of life across the eight states.

North East on Track: Railways and Development

The Ministry of Railways is spearheading a massive transformation in the North Eastern Region, with record investments aimed at bridging infrastructure gaps and boosting connectivity. Since 2014, the railway budget allocation for the region has increased fivefold reaching a cumulative 62 477 crore 10,440 crore for the current fiscal year. Railway projects worth 77,000 crore are currently underway, marking the highest level of investment the region has ever seen. A significant highlight of this progress will be the inauguration of the Bairabi-Sairang railway linein Mizoram by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Built at a cost of over 8,000 crore, this 51-kilometre linewillconnect Aizawl to the national railway network for the first time since independence. With 143 bridges and 45 tunnels constructed across challenging terrain, the construction is an engineering marvel with one of the bridges taller than Outub Minar. Beyond passenger convenience, the line will also improve freight movement, open new markets for local produce like bamboo and horticulture, and provide a strong boost to tourism and employment. Prime Minister will also flag off three new train services from Sairang to Delhi (Rajdhani Express), Kolkata (Mizoram express) and Guwahati (Aizwal Intercity). This firmly places Mizoram on the map of India's development story. The Prime Minister will lay the foundation stone for multiple road projects, including the Aizawl Bypass, Thenzawl-Sialsuk, and Khankawn-Rongura roads. The 45 km Aizawl Bypass, costing over 500 crore under the PM-DevINE scheme, will ease city traffic and improve connectivity. The Prime Minister will also lay the foundation stone for the Chhimtuipui River Bridge on the Lawngtlai-Siaha Road, which will ensure all-weather connectivity, reduce travel time and facilitate cross-border trade under the Kaladan Multimodal Transit framework.

In Manipur, the Prime Minister will lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects worth over Rs 7,300 crore at Churachandpur. The projects include 5 National Highways, Manipur Urban Roads, and drainage and asset management improvement project. Along with this, Prime Minister will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of major infrastructure and industrial development projects worth over Rs 18,530 crore in Assam. Beyond individual projects, the Northeast has witnessed a systematic infrastructure expansion through



multiple sanctioned initiatives. Since FY 2022–23, 17 new railway surveys covering 1,790 kmhave been approved under the PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan to identify future expansion corridors. Key ongoing projects include the Jiribam–Imphal and Dimapur–Kohima lines, which aim to strengthen strategic and inter-state connectivity. Additionally, several gauge conversion and doubling works are progressing, addressing both passenger and freight needs. These efforts reflect the Centre's long-term vision to fully integrate the region into the national railway grid.

National Highways Development

The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRT&H), responsible for the development and maintenance of National Highways, has constructed 16,207 km of National Highways in the Northeast Region (NER). The government's continued investments in roads, railways, and rural transport projects are reshaping the region, enhancing mobility, and opening up new opportunities for local communities. A notable example of this commitment is the approval of a 15 km road construction project between Mangaldoi and Mazikuchi in Assam, costing 45.31 crore. Approved in August 2025, the project will be implemented under the North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS) – Roads.

Roadworks and Bridges under PMGSY

Under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY), 17,637 road works covering 89,436 km and 2,398 bridges have been sanctioned in the North Eastern Region. Of these, 16,469 road works spanning 80,933 km and 2,108 bridges have been completed, significantly improving last-mile connectivity in remote and rural areas.

Digital Connectivity and Mobile Services

Multiple government-funded projects, including BharatNet and others supported by Digital Bharat Nidhi, have enhanced digital connectivity in the Northeast by making Gram Panchayats service-ready and commissioning mobile towers across the region.

Regional Air Connectivity (UDAN) Scheme

The Ministry of Civil Aviation has introduced the Regional Connectivity Scheme – UDAN to improve air travel access from airports that were previously unserved or underserved. This initiative has helped establish numerous routes, linking various airports and heliports across the North Eastern Region.

Financial Assistance for Development

The Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) is providing financial assistance to the eight Northeast states to support developmental projects linked to infrastructure, connectivity, and communication. This is being done through five Central Sector Schemes: NESIDS (Roads), NESIDS (OTRI), PM-DevINE, Schemes of North Eastern Council (NEC), and Special Development Packages (SDPs).

1. PM-DevINE Scheme

The Prime Minister's Development Initiative for North East Region (PM-DevINE) is a 100% centrally funded Central Sector Scheme announced in the Union Budget 2022–23. The scheme has a total outlay of 6,600 crore for the four-year period from 2022–23 to 2025–26. Its objectives are to fund infrastructure projects in a convergent manner in line with the PM GatiShakti framework, support social development initiatives based on the region's specific needs, enable livelihood opportunities for youth and women, and address development gaps across various sectors in the North Eastern

NESIDS – Roads

The North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS) – Roads is a Central Sector Scheme launched in 2017–18 and extended until 31st March 2026. It provides targeted gap funding for the construction of roads and associated infrastructure that are not covered by other central ministries or agencies. The scheme focuses on projects that enhance access to remote areas, improve market connectivity, and serve strategic or security purposes. Only those proposals that result in the creation of physical assets such as roads, bridges, and auxiliary infrastructure are eligible for funding.

NESIDS – Other Than Roads Infrastructure (OTRI)

The NESIDS – Other Than Roads Infrastructure (OTRI) is a component of the NESIDS Central Sector Scheme. It includes unfinished projects from earlier schemes like the Non-Lapsable Central Pool of Resources (NLCPR) and the Hill Area Development Programme (HADP). NESIDS-OTRI provides financial assistance to the eight North Eastern States for infrastructure development in areas such as primary and secondary healthcare education power water supply, solid and liquid waste management, industrial development, civil aviation, sports, telecommunications, and conservation of iconic water bodies. As of July 2025, 29 projects under NESIDS-OTRI have been sanctioned and are at various stages of implementation, with an expenditure of 462.21 crore incurred so far.

Schemes of the North Eastern Council (NEC)

The schemes implemented under the North Eastern Council (NEC) were extended from 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2026. These schemes aim to promote the holistic development of all eight North Eastern states by supporting projects in priority sectors identified by the states. The selection, sanctioning, and monitoring of projects are managed by the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) and NEC in coordination with the respective State Governments. Implementation is carried out by the designated state or central agencies. Key focus areas under NEC schemes include bamboo development, piggery, regional tourism, higher education, tertiary healthcare, and livelihood generation.

Special Development Packages (SDPs) for Assam and Tripura

The Special Development Packages (SDPs) for Assam and Tripura are part of an ongoing Central Sector Scheme aimed at promoting inclusive development and peace in the North Eastern Region. In August 2025, the Union Cabinet approved four new components under the scheme with a total outlay of 4,250 crore. Of this, 4,000 crore is allocated for Assam over five years (2025–26 to 2029–30), and 250 crore for Tripura over four years (2025-26 to 2028-29). The packages aim to improve socio-economic conditions, generate employment through infrastructure and livelihood projects, and benefit youth and women through skill development and entrepreneurship. They are expected to bring long-term stability, mainstream marginalized communities, and

boost tourism and local economies in the region.

GST not applicable on post-sale discounts given by manufacturers to dealers: CBIC

New Delhi, Sept 13: Post-sale discounts given by manufacturers to dealers intended solely for competitive pricing and promoting sales will not be subject to GST, the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) said.

However, GST would be payable on such discounts if the manufacturer and the dealer have entered into an agreement under which the latter conducts promotional activities like co-branding, advertising campaigns or sale drives on behalf of the manufacturer.

Issuing a circular regarding treatment of secondary or post-sale discounts under Goods and Services Tax (GST), the CBIC said it has received representations seeking clarifications on the issue.

When dealers receive such post-sale discounts, they may engage in promotional activities to boost sales. However, these activities ultimately enhance the sale of goods that the dealers themselves own, thereby increasing their own revenue. In this context, the discount merely reduces the sale price of the goods and is not linked to any independent service rendered to the manufacturer.

"Therefore, it is clarified that

post-sale discounts offered by manufacturers to dealers in such cases shall not be treated as consideration for a separate transaction of supply of services," the CBIC said.

However, GST would be leviable in cases where a dealer undertakes specific sales promotional activities, such as advertising campaigns, co-branding, customisation services, special sales drives, exhibition arrangements, or customer support services, etc., only when such services are explicitly stated in the agreement with a clearly defined consideration payable for such a supply.

AMRG & Associates Senior Partner Rajat Mohan said dealers often receive discounts from manufacturers and may, in the process, carry out activities like small marketing drives or efforts to sell faster. However, such actions are undertaken primarily to increase the dealer's own sales and profits.

"The government has rightly clarified that these routine trade discounts cannot be treated as payment for any service provided by the dealer to the manufacturer, and therefore no additional GST liability arises in such cases," Mohan added.

EY Tax Partner Saurabh Agarwal said the circular correctly distinguishes between a genuine trade discount and a separate service. It affirms that where manufacturers and dealers operate on a principalto-principal basis, discounts provided by the manufacturer to the dealer, intended solely for competitive pricing and sales promotion, are not a consideration for any independent service.

This crucial distinction resolves a key pain point and brings the tax treatment in line with commercial practice.

"In light of these clarifications, businesses must revisit their contractual arrangements and tax positions. The government's clear demarcation between trade discounts and promotional services will significantly reduce interpretational disputes and provide greater certainty in compliance for the industry, paving the way for a more streamlined GST regime," Agarwal said.

Grant Thornton Bharat Partner Manoj Mishra said the CBIC's latest circular on post-sale discounts provides long-awaited clarity on an area that has consistently triggered disputes. input tax credit will remain unaffected when financial or commercial credit notes are issued, it removes a major compliance uncertainty for dealers.

J&K dental surgeons protest after 17 years of job freeze

Urge govt to advertise long-pending posts

Srinagar, Sept 13: Scores of unemployed dental surgeons from Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday staged a protest at Government Dental College and Hospital Srinagar, decrying the non-advertisement of dental surgeon posts for the last 17 years.

The protesting dental surgeons, carrying placards, raised slogans and demanded immediate intervention from the government to address their long-pending issue.

"We have worked hard for years to earn these degrees, but the government has failed to advertise even a single post for more than a decade," said one of the protesting dental surgeons while speaking to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

Another protester said the government must recognise their plight. "Hundreds of qualified dental surgeons are sitting idle despite the shortage of dental healthcare services in many areas," he said.

He added the government

should either create new posts or advertise the existing vacant ones.

Meanwhile, the protesters appealed to the Lieutenant Governorled administration to take immediate steps to resolve the issue and save the future of dental professionals in the Union Territory. "We have come here with hard work and the government must address the issue without further delay," they added. (KNO)

Thirdly, the process of revising electoral rolls could not be undertaken due to the absence of a State Election Commissioner, who holds the authority to order such revisions.

According to a former Block Development Council chairman, the delay in holding Panchayat elections is causing financial losses, as some components of funding by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj are contingent upon the existence of Panchayati Raj Institutions. "The government should hold elections so that we don't lose crores of rupees annually. The implementation of plans at Panchayat level have also been affected to some extent due to non-existence of PRIs," he said.

A report tabled in Parliament recently revealed that the Union Ministry of Panchayati Raj had issued an advisory to Jammu & Kashmir in December 2024, urging steps to hold Panchayat elections.

In its report tabled in both Houses of Parliament on July 28, 2025, the department-related Standing Committee on Rural Development and Panchayati Raj stated that the ministry had advised various states, including J&K and Ladakh, to initiate the process for conducting Panchayat elections. (KNO)

his conduct, take it up with the Speaker of the Assembly. There are other ways to do it. But detaining him under Public Safety Act, where he is not eligible for bail for at least six months is definitely an excessive use of force," he said.

CONGRESS PART OF ALLIANCE IN J&K

The Chief Minister rejected the claims of parting ways with the INDI Alliance, saying that there is no gap between the National Conference and the India bloc. "We continue to remain a part of the India bloc. The Congress Party is part of the alliance in Jammu and Kashmir government. Though for their own reasons they are not participating in the government at the moment and have said that they will join the government once statehood is restored to Jammu and Kashmir. But, otherwise we are very much a part of the India bloc."

PM MANIPUR VISIT A GOOD THING

About PM Modi's visit to Manipur, he said it is a good thing. "There has been a lot of commentary about the fact that Prime Minister Modi has avoided travelling to that part of the country and particularly after the violence that broke out in 2023. So, as we say, better late than never. We hope that peace and calm is restored and the differences between the two tribal communities are reduced to the point where people are able to live lives normally," he said.

CRICKET HAS BECOME VICTIM OF POLITICS

Reacting to a query on the India-Pakistan Cricket match tomorrow, Omar said, "I think our problem has always been with bilateral cricket. I don't think we have ever had a problem with multilateral parts of large tournaments. If I understand correctly, this game is part of a tournament. It's not part of a bilateral series between the two countries. If this is a start and things can move in a positive trajectory from there, nothing like it. Very often, sport becomes a victim to politics and nowhere is this more true than with cricket and the subcontinent. But you can't wish away what happens."

"J&K has been the direct victim of this. More than 30-35 years of trouble and this year we all saw what happened in Pahalgam. These are real concerns that we have and you can't wish them away," he said.

J&K TRYING TO IMPROVE CONNECTIONS WITH SOUTH INDIA

He said that his government has been trying to improve the connections between the South Indian states and Jammu & Kashmir. "We don't get enough visitors from Chennai and from the rest of Tamil Nadu to Jammu and Kashmir. In fact, one of the challenges that my government has taken upon itself is to try and improve the links and the connections between the South Indian states and Jammu & Kashmir. We hope that in the months and years ahead, we will see more film shootings from this part of the country and more people coming to Jammu and Kashmir for their holidays," he added.

Omar further stated that his relation with the Chief Minister MK Stalin is very good. "We have always been very grateful to the DMK for the support that they have extended to Jammu and Kashmir for the issues that matter to us. Poonch landslides,

has engulfed Gadhgaram village in Rajgarh Tehsil, where a cloudburst earlier this week claimed five lives.

New Delhi, Sept 13: Asserting that manuscripts are "not merely relics of the past, but a guiding light for the future", a global conference on Saturday adopted the New Delhi Declaration to bolster efforts to preserve, digitise and disseminate knowledge embedded in them. The Declaration was adopted on the closing day of the three-day 'Gyan Bharatam' conference on India's manuscript heritage, hosted at the Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi.

The New Delhi Declaration resolved that manuscripts are "living memory of a nation, and foundation of its civilisational

India has one of the richest collections of ancient manuscripts in the world, with nearly 10 million texts that hold the country's traditional knowledge and cultural heritage.

The declaration adopted at

the conference also resolved to "acquire and repatriate original manuscripts or secure their digital copies".

"We resolve to preserve, digitise and disseminate this vast treasure. We firmly believe manuscripts are not merely relics of the past, but a guiding light for the future," it said.

The government has launched the Gyan Bharatam Mission as a major initiative under the Ministry of Culture. It aims to survey, document, conserve, digitise and make accessible more than one crore manuscripts located at academic institutions, museums, libraries and private collections across India.

The declaration also resolved to "awaken people and make the Gyan Bharatam mission a 'jan aandolan'."

Diplomacy essential between judiciary & executive: Calcutta **HC Chief Justice**



Kolkata, Sept 13: Maintaining that diplomacy is essential between the judiciary High Court Chief Justice TS Sivagnanam on Saturday said he maintained a delicate balance between the two sides during his tenure.

Justice Sivagnanam, who is due to retire on September 15. said Kolkata had treated him dearly during his time here, first as a judge of the high court from October 2021 and later as Chief Justice from May 2023.

"Being the head of the judiciary, in the sense of being a chief justice of our high court, is a delicate balance between judiciary and state," he said while addressing a farewell programme organised by the West Bengal government at the Town Hall

Stating that "diplomacy is important on either side," he stressed that there should not be a feeling that the judiciary is subordinate or subservient to the executive.

Lauding West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, Judicial Secretary Siddhartha Kanjilal and Law Minister Moloy Chatak he said because of their unflinching support, much development work could be taken up for the betterment of the state judiciary.

"In close to three years, both during my tenure as acting Chief Justice and Chief Justice, the CM has never returned me with an empty hand," Justice Sivagnanam said. A farewell by the state government for a Chief Justice of Calcutta High Court was previously given to Chief Justice Jai Narayan Patel in 2012.

Born on September 16, 1963, Sivagnanam enrolled in the Bar Council of Tamil Nadu in 1986.

He was appointed as an additional judge at Madras High Court in March 2009, and as a permanent judge in March 2011, according to information on the Calcutta High Court website.

Mann slams speculations on social media about his removal as Punjab CM

Chandigarh, Sept 13: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Saturday slammed speculations on social media about his removal from the top post and asserted that he will remain at the helm.

Addressing the media here, Mann said that some "experts" have changed the chief minister four times when he was in the hospital, while referring to some claims on social media. The CM was discharged from

hospital in Mohali on Thurday, where he was admitted due to exhaustion and low heart rate. Mann said when Kejriwal came to the Golden Temple in Amritsar, he had said Mann would remain the CM.

"Who are these? Former journalists, a former smuggler, a



former gangster, a former drug addict. They are acting (in social media space) as experts. They can say anything for views. But they do not speak against the BJP as they are scared of the Enforcement Directorate," Mann said, asking people to avoid these

"Facebook experts". He also asserted that there was no factionalism in the party.

Replying to a question on central ministers visiting flood-hit areas, he alleged that they were coming for a "photo-op" only.

Maneka Gandhi backs 'kabutarkhanas', says pigeons harmless, firecrackers cause pollution

New Delhi, Sept 13: Former Union minister and BJP leader Maneka Gandhi on Saturday expressed confidence that kabutarkhanas (pigeon feeding spots) in the city will be reopened, saying that pigeons have not caused any harm, while firecrackers have contributed more to pollution.

Speaking to reporters here after attending an event, Gandhi said Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis has constituted a committee to take a decision regarding kabutarkhanas and the report will be favourable.

The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation had banned feeding pigeons and closed some old kabutarkhanas in the city last month, considering them to be a public health hazard.

"India's foundation is about compassion; it is about living and letting others live. There is no example of anyone ever dying because of pigeons. Pigeons have caused no harm to anyone." Gandhi said.

She noted that there are 57

kabutarkhanas in Mumbai, some of which have been closed.

The chief minister has formed a committee to make a decision over it. It will take one month. Once the report is out, the kabutarkhanas will be reopened. I am confident of it," she said. "If pigeons are killed for spreading disease, firecrackers cause multifold pollution. Firecrackers did not exist during the time of Lord Ram and Sita. People would light diyas and share food. The time for firecrackers is now over. People can no longer breathe," the BJP leader said.

Gandhi criticised India's approach towards tourism, saying unchecked deforestation and neglect of natural assets had diminished its appeal.

"India's tourism appetite is less than that of many small countries The more trees you cut and the more local culture you make disappear, the fewer people will come. If we respect our jungles and animals, within five years, we can do miracles," she said, pointing out that trees on nearly 21 lakh hectares of land had been cut down in the past decade.

Adani Power to invest \$3 bn to set up 2400 MW power project in Bihar

Mumbai, Sept 13: Adani Power on Saturday said it will set up a 2,400 MW ultra super-critical power plant in Bihar at an investment of USD 3 billion (around Rs 26,482 crore).

The Adani group company, in a statement, said that it has signed a 25-year Power Supply Agreement (PSA) with Bihar State Power Generation Company Ltd. (BSPGCL) to supply power from the project that will come up at Pirpainti in Bhagalpur district of the state.

The PPA is further to the Letter of Award issued by BSPGCL to Adani Power, on behalf of North Bihar Power Distribution Company Ltd (NBPDCL) and South Bihar Power Distribution Company Ltd (SBPDCL) in August.

Adani Power won the project by offering the lowest supply rate at Rs 6.075 per KWh. The company said it plans to invest approximately USD 3 billion to build the new plant (800 MW X 3) and its supporting infrastructure under the Design, Build, Finance, Own, and Operate (DBFOO) model. The company aims to commission the plant in 60 months.

The coal linkage for the power plant has been allocated under the SHAKTI Policy of Government of India. The project will generate direct and indirect employment for 10,000-12,000 people during the construction phase and 3,000 once in operation.

A part of the billionaire Gautam Adaniled group, Adani Power is the largest private thermal power producer in India. It has an installed thermal power capacity of 18,110 MW.

Whether it's calcium oxalate, uric acid, or another type, small tweaks in daily meals can make a big difference. So, you don't have to hop back on that flaming roller-coaster – you just have to mind what you're putting in your plate.

What's more? You don't need to wave goodbye to all your favorite foods. Instead, it's about knowing which ones to limit or swap, especially if you've had calcium-oxalate or uric acid stones.

In this guide, we'll tell you some of the most common foods that you should be avoiding in order to protect yourself from kidney stones. Additionally, we'll figure out smart, tasty, and healthy alternatives that help protect your kidneys instead of attacking them.



High-oxalate foods (spinach, beets, nuts, chocolate)


Why avoid: These contain oxalates, which can combine with calcium in your kidneys and form hard, painful stones, especially calcium oxalate stones, the most common type.

Swap with: Opt for low-oxalate fruits and veggies like watermelon, cucumber, bananas, cauliflower, grapes, or cauliflower and pair occasional oxalate foods with a calcium-rich food (like cheese) to reduce absorption.

High-sodium (salty) foods (processed, canned, fast food)

Why avoid: Too much salt is never good for your kidneys, whether you've had stones or not. Too much salt boosts calcium excretion into urine, a key trigger for calcium stone formation.

Swap with: Pick up fresh, home-cooked meals seasoned with herbs, lemon juice, or mild spices. Choose low or no-sodium labeled items, and check for sneaky sodium in sauces like



soy sauce or teriyaki. Animal protein (red meat, organ meat, shellfish)

Why avoid: Tasty? Yes! But these are also high in purines (leading to uric acid stones), and animal protein also acidifies urine, raising stone risk.

Swap with: Plant-based proteins like lentils, beans, chickpeas, or moderate portions of poultry or fish, and plenty of vegetables and fruits. Sugary and sweetened bever-

ages (sodas, sweet juices) Why avoid: Just the way too much salt is bad for the kidneys, too much sugar can harm them, too. High fructose and sugar boost risk, as processed sugar raises calcium excretion, while sweet sodas' phosphoric acids promote stones.

Swap with: Might sound bollocks, but drink water - plain water. You can have sparkling water, if that's unsweetened, or water flavored with fresh lemon or lime juice. Natural juices are

OK in moderation. Colas and caffeinated drinks

Why avoid: Colas have phosphoric acid linked to stones; caffeine may dehydrate, concentrating minerals in urine.

Swap with: Water is the best – hands down. Unsweetened herbal teas or coffee in moderation help, but steer clear of colas and energy drinks.

High-purine foods (sardines, anchovies, organ meats, beer) Why avoid: These foods raise uric acid levels, causing uric acid stones.

Swap With: Plant-based proteins and moderate animal proteins, plus good hydration and citrus, like lemon (increase citrate), can help inhibit stone formation.

Excessive vitamin C supplements

Why avoid: High doses of vitamin C can convert into oxalate in your body, fueling stone

Swap with: Instead of opting for supplements, have vitamin C from whole foods, like oranges, strawberries, and bell peppers. Consuming these foods in regular amounts is safer and highly beneficial.

Kathmandu, Sept 13: Nepal's capital on Saturday took a step back toward normality after deadly anti-corruption protests, as daily life returned with a curfew eased and an interim prime minister sworn into office.

Soldiers scaled back their presence on the streets, where they had been deployed in large numbers since Wednesday after violent demonstrations toppled the government and left parliament in flames.

At least 51 people were killed in the worst unrest since the end of a decade-long civil war and the abolition of the monarchy in 2008.

On Friday evening, 73-year-old former chief justice Sushila Karki was sworn in as interim leader, tasked with restoring order and addressing protesters' demands for a corruption-free future.

Parliament was later dissolved, elections set for March 5, 2026, and work to restore the government began. By Saturday morning, the mood on the streets was calmer, with markets opening, traffic returning and families visiting temples.

'Satisfied today' For many Nepalis, Karki's appointment carried both symbolic weight and the promise of change.

Magar added. 'Musical chairs' Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday offered his "best wishes" to Karki, adding that New Delhi was "firmly committed to the peace, progress and prosperity of the people of Nepal.'

Huge challenges remain.

The protesters' hope of rooting out endemic corruption is no easy task, while in terms of security, more than 12,500 prisoners who escaped from jails during the chaos are on the run.

But for many, Karki's swearing-in marks a break from the revolving door of aging prime ministers who fueled public anger with endless polit-

ical horse-trading. KP Sharma Oli, the 73-year-old leader of the Communist Party, quit as prime minister on Tuesday, ending his fourth term in the post. His whereabouts are not known.

Turkiye orders detention of Istanbul district mayor, others

Istanbul, Sept 13: A Turkish prosecutor ordered the detention of 48 suspects, including the mayor of Istanbul's opposition-run Bayrampasa district, as part of a corruption investigation, state broadcaster TRT Haber said on Saturday.

The police carried out early morning raids at 72 locations to seize documents and detain suspects on charges including embezzlement, bribery, and tender rigging, according to TRT Haber.

In a post on X, Bayrampasa Mayor Hasan

Mutlu, from the main opposition Republican People's Party (CHP), said he had nothing to hide and called the investigation "a political operation based on unfounded slander." The detentions come amidst a nearly yearlong crackdown on the CHP and CHP-run municipalities, in which hundreds of party members have been arrested and jailed. A court ruling due on Monday could remove the leader of the CHP in a case widely seen as a test of the country's fragile balance between democratic institutions and centralized power, increasing the legal pressure on the party.

BCCI to finalise Team India's new jersey sponsor within three weeks

New Delhi, Sept 13: BCCI vice president Rajiv Shukla on . Saturday said the new jersey sponsor of the Indian cricket team will be finalised in the next two to three weeks, with bids scheduled to close on September 16.

Team India is without a shirt sponsor in the ongoing Asia Cup after the BCCI's deal with online gaming company Dream11, worth Rs 358 crore per year, was cut short following the enactment of the Promotion and Regulation of Online Gaming Bill, which banned real-money gaming applications.

The BCCI has since floated a new tender that bars companies involved in real-money gaming, betting, cryptocurrency, or alcoholic products from bidding.

"The tender process has been released and there are a lot of bidders. We will tell you after it's finalised. I think it will be finalised in 15-20 days," said Shukla at an event organised by realtors' apex body CREDAI here.

Asked if any name had emerged as a frontrunner, Shukla added: "No, there is no name yet. There are a lot of bidders. We will tell you after it's finalised." Shukla also spoke about the recent GST hike on IPL tickets, which now places them in the 40 per cent slab, alongside casinos

and race clubs. As a result, a Rs 500 ticket



will now cost Rs 700 and a Rs 2,000 ticket will go up to Rs 2,800. Regular international and domestic matches will continue to attract 18 per cent GST.

"I am seeing that a lot of common people come to watch IPL. It will definitely have an impact. But I am hopeful that a lot of people will come to watch IPL," he

On criticism that the BCCI enjoys tax exemptions, Shukla responded: "BCCI pays income tax like a corporate company. It also pays GST. We don't have any exemptions." "We pay thousands of crores of taxes. State associations also pay taxes. And we never take a single rupee grant from the government.

On the growth of women's cricket, Shukla said: "A lot of efforts are being made... The only challenge is that the stadium should be full." "Women should also come to watch the game. From our side we are doing everything. The salary is also at par.

"We are promoting women, organising tournaments, all facilities are being provided. The only thing is that people should come and watch women's games.'
