Interacting with a delegation of senior officers from the Indian Armed Forces, Civil Services and friendly foreign countries, currently attending the course at the National Defence College here, LG Sinha, according to the Kashmir Thunder said, "Under PM Modi's leadership, Operation Sindoor, marked one of India's boldest military responses in



recent history and the balanced strategic restraint with assertive action has drawn a new red line against terrorism."

He reiterated: "If there is a terrorist attack on India in the

future, it will be seen as an act of war and a fitting reply will be given. India has also made it clear that it will not tolerate any nuclear blackmail and it will strike precisely and decisively

Srinagar, Sept 24: The Election Commission of India (ECI) on Wednesday announced schedule for elections to four Rajya Sabha seats from the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir.

According to a notification issued by the poll -body, a copy of which is in possession of news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the Commission will issue the notification for these seats on October 6.

As per the schedule, the last date for filing nominations is October 13, while scrutiny of nominations will take place on October 14. The last date for withdrawal of candidatures is October 16.

## Kulgam teacher-turned **OGW** arrested for logistic support to terrorists

Kulgam, Sept 24: Security forces on Wednesday arrested a seasonal teacher turned Over-Ground Worker (OGW) in South Kashmir's Kulgam district for his alleged role in providing logistical support to terrorists involved in April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that left 26 persons, mostly tourists dead.

The arrested person has been identified as Mohammad Yousuf Katari, of Manzgam Kulgam, an official told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

He said that Katari was involved in providing logistical to terrorists killed in the Operation Mahadev. dawn strikes, | More on P6

"The accused was arrested after an analysis of weapons seized during July's Operation Mahadev," the official said as per KNO.

"Kataria, a Lashkar-e-Taiba (TRF) operative, was called in for questioning for two days, after which he was formally arrested." he added.

It may be recalled that in one of the most gruesome attacks in Jammu and Kashmir, Pakistani terrorists opened fire on a group of tourists in Pahalgam on April 22, killing at least 26 people.

## People of J&K can't be punished for BJP's defeat: CM Omar on statehood

Srinagar, Sept 24: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Wednesday said the people of Jammu and Kashmir cannot be punished for the defeat of Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in the region.

Speaking with reporters here, CM Omar, per news agency–Kashmir News Observer (KNO), said the people of Jammu and Kashmir were promised a three-way process including delimitation, election and statehood.

He said statehood has not been restored due to the BJP's defeat in the assembly elections last year. "The people of J&K cannot be punished for the BJP's defeat," he added.

The CM said the biggest



challenge at present is that J&K is not a State. "We hoped that statehood would be restored, given the promises made to the people. Even the Supreme Court was told about its restoration after the three-way process," he said.

Omar further said that the

tourist footfall has not increased the way they expected after the recent pilgrimages. "Every sector has been facing losses in the absence of the expected tourist footfall. However, our efforts are still on to attract tourists to Jammu and Kashmir," he added.

Reacting to the controversy over the use of the 'I Love Muhammad' slogan, the Chief Minister said there was nothing wrong with it as the people from other religious communities also display the names of their religious Gurus and Gods.

"There was nothing provocative in this slogan and only the people who lack mindset can oppose it," he said, adding that like other religious communities, Muslims too have every right to express their | More on P6

### Gbl youth's death turns out to be 'pre-planned murder'; police arrest friends

Deceased was strangulated with wire, dumped into canal: SSP Poswal

Kangan, Sept 24: Police on Wednesday confirmed that the death of a youth in Ganderbal's Power Canal, initially believed to be a case of drowning, was a pre-planned murder carried out by his friends.

Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Ganderbal, Khalil Ahmad Poswal, as per the news agency-Kashmir News Observer said the deceased, 22-year-old Ajaz Ahmed Rather, son of Ghulam Muhammad Rather of Sultan Colony, Kangan, was strangulated with a wire before his body was dumped into the canal.

He said a massive rescue operation was launched by Ganderbal Police, SDRF, NDRF, and local volunteers. Teams from Ganderbal and Gund worked nearly 12 hours before retrieving the body. Strangulation marks were found on Ajaz's neck, confirming foul play.

"CCTV footage shows the accused purchasing a wire used in the crime. He was called to the spot on Tuesday evening and strangulated. The wire has been recovered, and both accused are in | More on P6

## Five months after Pahalgam attack, Kashmir's tourism sector remains in deep crisis

#### 'Only 10 pc hotels currently occupied'

Srinagar, Sept 24: Five months after the deadly terror attack in Pahalgam on April 22, Kashmir's tourism sector, a key pillar of its economy, continues to reel from its worst crisis in decades.

The attack that killed 25 tourists and a local resident not only shook the valley's sense of security but also triggered a cascading economic fallout, the effects of which are still being felt across hotels, transport, handicrafts and thousands of

livelihoods tied to the industry. As per the details obtained by the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the time-line from tragedy to struggle is as follows.

#### April 22, 2025 - The attack

A terror strike in the Baisaran meadows of Pahalgam claimed 26 lives, sending shockwaves through Kashmir's tourism industry at the onset of the spring season. Within hours, tourists fled in panic, mass cancellations followed, and businesses faced immediate losses.

Late April – Immediate fallout Security was tightened across



major tourist sites, and 48 of 87 tourist resorts were shut as a precaution. Hotel occupancy nosedived to 5–10%, bookings were wiped out, and thousands of people dependent on tourism - from pony handlers to taxi

May – Desperate push for revival

drivers – were left without work.

government

stakeholders launched campaigns to restore visitor confidence. Security patrols were increased, and political leaders visited key sites. Despite discounts and incentives, footfall remained weak as fears

#### June – Partial reopening

In the month of June, after over three months, authorities reopened 16 of the closed resorts, offering hope to struggling businesses. Occupancy rose slightly but remained far below seasonal norms, forcing hotels and travel operators to offer steep discounts.

#### July - A fragile summer season

The annual Amarnath Yatra was held under heavy security, helping project a semblance of normalcy. Domestic tourists from states like Gujarat and Maharashtra slowly returned, yet foreign arrivals remained negligible, and overall numbers stayed far below 2024 levels.

#### August - Nature's fury adds to the crisis

In mid-August, a cloudburst in Kishtwar's Chositi village triggered flash floods and landslides, causing extensive

damage to infrastructure and affecting local travel. Ongoing landslides and road disruptions across the region hindered tourist movement, prompting cancellations and travel delays.

Tourism stakeholders said the combined impact of the natural disaster and the lingering effects of the Pahalgam attack further strained the sector, deepening the economic crisis.

Adding to the crisis, in August, landslides and rockfalls temporarily closed the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway, disrupting tourist travel and forcing cancellations, further straining the region's struggling tourism sector | More on P6

## HC admits petition challenging PSA detention of MLA Doda

Jammu, Sep 24: After 16 days of his arrest un-der the Public Safety Act (PSA), Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLA from Doda, Mehraj Malik, challenged his detention in the High Court of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh here on Wednesday.

The petition, filed through his counsel Sheikh Shakeel Ahmed, seeks the quashing of Detention Order No. 05 of 2025, dated

September 8, issued by the District Magistrate, Doda, under Section 8 of the J&K PSA, 1978.

Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul admitted the Habeas Corpus petition and issued post-admission notices to the Principal Secretary, Home Department; District Magistrate, Doda; SSP, Doda; and Superintendent, District Jail, Kathua. Notices were also issued to private respondent Deputy Commissioner. S. Harvinder Singh (IAS).

Senior Additional Advocate General Monika Kohli, appearing for the government, was given time to file the response by October 14, 2025, the next hearing date.

During the hearing, Malik's counsel requested the shortest possible time for the respondents to file their reply, citing the urgency as Malik is an elected representative whose duties require his presence.

The petition challenges the detention on several grounds, including alleged personal bias by the District Magistrate. Malik has also claimed compensation of Rs 5 crore for curtailment of his personal liberty.

The High Court is scheduled to consider the matter again on October 14, 2025–(KNO)

## Despite 'shortage', SED sits on promotions

Srinagar Sep 24: The senadministrative-staff crunch in the School Education Department of J&K is yet to ebb as nearly 150 junior assistants despite clearing departmental exams in April this year, await formal orders from the government.

This comes after Minister of Education, Health and Social Welfare, Sakina Itoo confirmed the elevation of 458 teaching and non-teaching staff to the next higher level on August 30. "Orders to follow shortly. Best wishes to all of them," Itoo had posted on X.

But three weeks since then, no formal orders have been issued for their promotion.

The delay is wearing thin on the patience of employees, who into a year-long haul appeared into the promotion-driven Secretariat



**Assistant Training Course** (SATC) examinations in August, 2024 and saw the declaration of results on 25th April, 2025.

Currently, sources say, at least 215 Senior-Assistant posts are lying vacant in the School Education Department among which, 27 posts are occupied by Incharge senior-assistants.

To address the shortage, the Departmental Promotional Committee(DPC) meeting was held on June-14-2025 to finalize the adjustment of 158 qualified candidates against the 188 remaining vacancies. But despite this and later the Minister's tweet, the formal orders for their promotion are nowhere in sight.

"It is important to highlight that the Department is facing an acute shortage of clerical staff which has been repeatedly highlighted and duly acknowledged by the Tribunal in Diary No. 3022/2025. This shortage continues to adversely affect the efficient functioning of the department," SATC This comes after Minister of Education, Health and Social Welfare, Sakina Itoo confirmed the elevation of 458 teaching and non-teaching staff to the next higher level on August 30. "Orders to follow shortly. Best wishes to all of them," Itoo had posted on X.

pass-out Junior Assistants said in an application to the Director School Education, Kashmir on Saturday.

## PDP weakened backbone of JK: Sakina Itoo

"It is ironic that those who weakened the sector now blame others. Mehbooba Mufti is responsible for the economic mess and the pain people face today. Over the past year, our government has been working tirelessly to streamline systems and restart stalled projects," she

## Efforts on to break drug supply chain: **SSP Sopore**

Sopore, Sep 24: Senior Superintendent of Police, Sopore, Iftkhar Talib on Wednesday said the police are making sustained efforts to break the drug supply chain with no loopholes left for traffickers, even as the fight against narcotics remains a pressing challenge despite daily raids and multiple arrests in the region.

Speaking to reporters, SSP Talib said police is working on a dual strategy of enforce-ment and rehabilitation to tackle the crisis. "We are taking action against drug peddling every day. We have registered multiple cases and in recent weeks, seven to eight peddlers have been arrested. Yet, it would not be correct to say that the issue of drugs in Sopore has reduced or improved", he said.

The SSP stated that the narcotics remains the toughest challenge and they are trying to cut the supply chain and control it as soon as possible. "Police is acting on specific intelligence inputs to track down networks involved in drug trafficking. Our focus is on choking the sources and recent arrests are part of that sustained effort", he said.

Acknowledging that enforcement alone cannot address the problem, Talib announced that soon a fully functional drug de-addiction and rehabilitation centre will be established in Bomai area of Sopore—(KNO)

## Unprecedented rush in cold storage units

Srinagar, Sep 24: Amid low demand for Kashmiri apples in outside markets and the recent National Highway crisis that disrupted smooth transportation, the cold storage units across the Valley are witnessing an unprecedented rush this year.

Officials and industry insiders said that nearly 50 per cent of cold storage facilities were filled in just 10 days, a process that usually takes almost a month. The remaining space had already been booked months in advance.

Traditionally, apple growers' start shifting their produce to cold storage units after September 25, but this year, due to declining demand and uncertainty in transportation, half of the storage capacity was already filled before that date. This unusual trend has led to long queues of trucks and load carriers, with some growers waiting for more than 24 hours

to unload their produce. "This year the rush is unimaginable. Normally, it takes weeks before cold stores reach capacity, but this time, within a few days, they are almost full. Vehicles are stranded outside



storage facilities and are being asked to wait for their turn," said Bashir Ahmad, an apple grower from Shopian.

Some growers also complained of being charged higher rates for storing their produce. "We are already facing huge losses due to falling demand and low prices in the outside markets. On top of that, we are being asked to pay extra to get space in cold storage. This is sheer exploitation," alleged Abdul Rashid, a grower from Pulwama.

However, owners of cold

ra Industrial Estate, Pulwama.

storage units dismissed these allegations, maintaining that the booking process had been completed well in advance and that rates were fixed through signed agreements. "How can we change the rates now? Bookings were made months earlier with proper terms and conditions. We have not revised the charges," said Mohammad Yousuf, owner of a cold storage facility in Lassipo-

The owners argued that the issue might be arising from the role of middlemen.

facilities rather than sending their produce directly outside the Valley. "With highway disruptions and low consumption in mandis, growers see cold storage as their only option to prevent immediate losses. This is why the facilities have been overwhelmed in such a short time," explained a senior official in the Horticulture Department.

Kashmir has over 2 million metric tonnes of annual apple production and cold storage has emerged as a vital support system in recent years. Yet, the mismatch between demand and capacity continues to push small growers into distress-(KNO)

## Satellite Internet In India: The Future Of Internet Above Us

India's progress in space is now directly contributing to making the lives of ordinary citizens easier: Prime Minister Narendra Modi

ndia is one of the fastest-growing digital nations in the world, with Linternet connectivity playing a crucial role in its progress. This momentum is reflected in the staggering 1,002.85 million internet subscribers reported during April-June 2025, highlighting the scale and impact of India's digital revolution. However, internet penetration remains limited in certain regions of the country, underscoring the need for satellite internet to complement existing networks.

Satellite internet refers to the internet service provided through satellites placed in Geostationary Orbits (GSO) or Non-Geostationary Orbits

For realising the Digital India vision of a digitally inclusive nation, satellite internet is an emerging technology with the potential to provide connectivity from space to any location. This makes it particularly valuable for remote villages, hilly terrains, border areas, and islands where terrestrial internet services are either difficult to reach or economically unviable.

India's Regulatory Landscape for Satellite Internet

The government has introduced a progressive regulatory framework to govern Satellite Communications (Satcom), aiming to balance innovation with security and spectrum management. Recent policy measures are shaping an environment for private participation, streamlined approvals, and efficient spectrum use, paying the way for large-scale adoption of satellite internet.

In 2020, the Government introduced Space Sector Reforms to open the doors for private sector participation in space activities. Building on this momentum, the Indian Space Policy, 2023 established a level playing field for Non-Government Entities (NGEs) in the space sector by enabling their participation across the entire value chain of space activities in an end-to-end manner.

Department Telecommunications (DoT)


DoT regulates provision of satellite-based communication by granting authorisations under the Unified Licence Regime framework, enabling a range of satellite-based services such as Commercial VSAT CUG services, GMPCS (Global Mobile Personal Communication by Satellite), etc. These services are designed to complement terrestrial networks, extending connectivity to remote and unserved regions across the country. The Telecommunications Act, 2023 empowers the government to assign spectrum, enforce security conditions and, regulate satellite-based services as part of the broader telecom ecosystem.

Telecom Regulatory Authority of

India (TRAI) In May 2025, TRAI released its recommendations on the terms and conditions for the assignment of spectrum for satellite-based commercial communication services. To balance the regulatory framework with flexibility and efficiency in spectrum utilization. One of the key recommendations of TRAI is to assign the satellite spectrum for a period of five years, with the option to extend for up to two additional years based on market conditions.

Indian National Space Promotion & Authorisation Centre (IN-SPACe)

IN-SPACe plays a pivotal role in enabling satellite internet in India. It is responsible for promoting, authorizing and supervising various space activities of the non-governmental



entities (NGEs). This nodal agency acts as an interface between ISRO and NGEs, facilitating the growth of space-based activities including the use of India's satellite resources for broadband connectivity. It also assesses the needs of private players, including educational and research institutions, as well as explores ways to accommodate these requirements in consultation with ISRO.

New Space India Ltd. (NSIL) NSIL is a Central Public Sector Enterprise (CPSE) under Department of Space. It is incorporated as the commercial arm of ISRO. NSIL is currently operating 15 in-orbit communication satellites and providing space-based communication services to various Indian users.

Transitioning India's Landscape

India's satellite communication (Satcom) ecosystem is undergoing a transformative shift. Traditionally dependent on the Geostationary Satellite (GSAT) of Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) and other satellite operators' series, the sector is now witnessing more active private participation and the adoption of next-generation Low Earth Orbit (LEO) and Medium Earth Orbit (MEO) satellite systems. With the rollout of space sector reforms India is set to harness satellite internet as a key driver of Digital India.

of NSIL Satellite Role in Communications

NSIL plays a pivotal role in meeting India's satellite communication requirements through demand-driven missions and operational services. To address the national requirements in Satellite Communications, NSIL undertook two Demand-Driven Satellite

GSAT-N1 [GSAT-24] for Direct-To-Home (DTH) services, which has commenced its operational services.

GSAT-N2 [GSAT-20] for broadband connectivity which is currently undergoing in-orbit testing and commissioning operations.

Demand-Driven Satellite Mission, GSAT-N3 slated for Q1 2026 for the government's S-Band communica-

NSIL has also proposed its 3rd

Satellite Band Services: Satellite

communication services and other space services are managed by NSIL through its ISAT/ GSAT satellites for extending multiple applications in S, C, Extended C, Ka and Ku bands.

Satellite Understanding the Communication Spectrum

In satellite communicati quency bands serve as the essential channels through which voice, data, and broadband signals are transmitted between Earth and space. The popular frequency bands used for providing satellite communication services are:

Shift to LEO/MEO-based Satellite **Internet Services** 

Driven by the need for lower latency, higher bandwidth, and more reliable coverage across remote and unserved regions, India is reimagining its satellite internet landscape from GEO (Geostationary Earth Orbit) satellites to LEO (Low Earth Orbit) and MEO (Medium Earth Orbit) systems. This transition will deliver faster and more reliable internet connectivity nationwide.

LEO satellites orbit close to Earth, typically between 400 to 2,000 km altitude. Their proximity allows for low-latency communication, making them ideal for internet services.

MEO satellites operate at altitudes ranging from 8,000 to 20,000 km. They cover larger regions than LEO satellites and have a slightly higher latency than LEO satellites.

Policy Reforms

With the rollout of space sector reforms, the government now permits up to 100% Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in different segments of the space sector through automatic and government approval routes, thereby liberalising entry norms for private participation, marking the transition of India's satcom landscape.

**Industry Developments** Marking a major step in strengthening the nation's digital connectivity landscape, Starlink Satellite Communications Pvt. Ltd. (SSCPL) in June 2025 received a license to launch satellite internet services in India. Prior to it, Jio Satellite Communication Limited and OneWeb Communications Private Limited have been granted license for providing such services.

As of April 2025, more than 10 satellite operators have shown interest and applied for authorization to provide satellite capacity in India.

The entry of private-sector players in the space sector marks a significant step towards Viksit Bharat 2047, setting the stage for a seamless rollout of high-speed satellite broadband across the nation. The transitioning Satcom landscape underscores the government's focus on fostering innovation and next-generation technologies.

Government Initiatives: Expanding **Inclusive Digital Connectivity** 

The government has launched several initiatives to extend mobile and internet connectivity to the nation's remotest areas, empowering individuals and communities alike. In today's digital era, such connectivity serves as a catalyst for socio-economic development, unlocking access to education, healthcare, and economic opportunities.

Digital Bharat Nidhi (DBN), formery Universal Service Obligation Fund

Under Digital Bharat Nidhi, the government is implementing various schemes for the expansion of broadband facilities through installation of 4G mobile towers in the rural and remote areas of the country under the 4G saturation project. Further, DBN has been instrumental in funding projects that extend mobile and broadband connectivity to underserved areas.

For Island Regions:

The government has implemented Comprehensive Telecom Development Plan (CTDP) for islands to provide connectivity to Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep. Satellite Bandwidth Augmentation executed by BSNL (Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited) increased capacity from 2 Gbps to 4 Gbps in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands and from 318 Mbps to 1.71 Gbps in Lakshadweep. This satellite boost supplements fibre cables to ensure resilient telecom service coverage across the islands.

For North-Eastern Regions: The government has implement-

ed CTDP for providing mobile connectivity to villages and areas along **Key Takeaways**

National Highways with the objective of extending mobile network access to underserved population. As of June 2025, 2,485 mobile towers have been commissioned, providing mobile connectivity to 3,389 locations.

National Broadband Mission 2.0 (NBM 2.0)

NBM 2.0 was launched on January 17, 2025, after the successful completion of NBM 1.0 with the goal of extending broadband services to the remaining 1.7 lakh villages across the country. The NBM 2.0 aims to propel India into a new era of digital transformation and global competitiveness aligning with the vision of Viksit Bharat. Key components under NBM 2.0 are:

BharatNet Project: Funded under DBN, BharatNet is an ambitious project aimed at providing affordable high-speed internet access to every Gram Panchayat in the country, bridging the gap between urban and rural communities. The satellite component of this project is being implemented by BBNL (Bharat Broadband Network Limited) and BSNL under Phase II. So far, over 2.14 lakh Gram Panchayats are connected through the BharatNet project, with BSNL covering 1,408 and BBNL covering 3,753 of them.

Prime Minister Network Interface (PM-WANI):

PM-WANI is designed to create a network of public Wi-Fi hotspots across India. It aims to make affordable and reliable internet access available to citizens, fostering digital participation and economic opportunities. More than 3.73 lakh PM-WANI Wi-Fi hotspots have been installed in the country, as of September 2025.

The Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES) has developed a Geographic Information System (GIS)-based Decision Support System (DSS). It uses internet connectivity to deliver timely and impact-based early warnings for extreme weather events. The system relies on historical data, real-time observations, radar, and satellite imagery. It helps disaster-prone states monitor risks and take measures to protect lives, livelihoods, and infrastructure.

Together, these efforts underscore India's commitment to employing satellite communication to strengthen digital infrastructure and improve public services.

India's Key expanding through high-throughput satellites (HTS) developed by ISRO, which use advanced spot-beam technology to provide faster speeds and higher capacity. India has a fleet of 19 operational communication satellites, among which GSAT-19, GSAT-29, GSAT-11, and GSAT-N2 are specifically geared towards boosting India's broadband services. These satellites are designed to enhance internet connectivity in underserved areas, support in-flight communication, defence networks and disaster management. Together, they form the backbone of satellite-based broadband infrastructure in India, complementing ground-based networks like BharatNet.

Conclusion

In line with the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047, satellite internet is emerging as a key enabler of digital connectivity, extending reliable access to remote and underserved regions, while strengthening critical applications in defence and disaster response. Through the power of space technology, India is reinforcing its strategic autonomy and leadership in space-based communications. ensuring that the benefits of connectivity reach every citizen. From operationalising HTS to enabling private participation in satellite communications, the country is steadily bridging its digital divide.

SRINAGAR, SEPTEMBER 24: With an aim to transfer skill to new generation of craftsmen, Department of Handicrafts and Handloom, Kashmir Wednesday urged interested awardee artisans to set up Karkhanas under the flagship Karkhandar Scheme of the department.

The initiative aims to empower master artisans to lead skill upgradation programmes, revitalizing traditional crafts on the verge of decline and fostering sustainable livelihood in the craft sector.

Giving details, a spokesperson of the department stated the Scheme provides institutional support, advanced training, and financial assistance to facilitate the transfer of traditional knowledge to the next generation, enhancing skills, wages, and market linkages through entrepreneurship. Highlighting the salient

features of the Karkhandar Scheme, the spokesman said special consideration shall be given to those master artisans who have demonstrated excellence in their craft, recognizing their potential to mentor emerging talents and drive revival efforts. "Selected Karkhandars will receive comprehensive support, including a monthly honorarium of 2,000 per trainee (for up to 10 trainees per Karkhana), a lumpsum of 25,000 per batch for logistical

support," he added. He further stated that trainees under the scheme will also benefit from 2,000 monthly stipends, disbursed in instalments upon successful completion of their probationary

Launched in 2021 as a pilot project by the Directorate of

Handicrafts and Handloom, the Karkhandar Scheme focuses on identifying and training artisans in various crafts such as walnut wood carving, silver filigree, carpet weaving, Kani shawl weaving, Khatamband, Papier Mache, Sozni embroidery, as well as languishing crafts like glazed pottery, Numdha felting as well as Gabba and Wagguv making.

The Karkhandar Scheme has already transformed lives by sanctioning 80 units, empowering them to preserve our rich heritage while creating economic opportunities. "Eligible awardee artisans, particularly meritorious ex-trainees from department- are encouraged to apply with online applications which shall include completed form, affidavit, self-attested copies of documents such as Aadhaar, qualification proofs, and prior training certificates, and a passport-size photograph.

It was Informed that during the financial year 2024-25, an allocation of Rs 185.67 Cr was approved, out of which Rs 146.77 Cr were made available. Against this, an expenditure of Rs 122.14 Cr was incurred, thereby achiev-

ing 83.21 percent expenditure. For the current financial year 2025-26, an allocation of Rs 180.50 Cr has been made, with an availability of Rs 90.25 Cr till date. Out of this, an expenditure of Rs 25.06 Cr has already been registered up to August 2025.

On the physical side, the Secretary apprised that 2,716 works were taken up in 2024-25, out of which 1,048 works were completed. Similarly, for 2025-26, around 2,356 works have been taken up, with 1,779 works targeted for completion, out of which 10 works stand completed till August 2025.

The Chief Secretary was further informed about the districtwise abstract of Capex works for 2025-26, under which 1,089 works (540 in Jammu Division and 549 in Kashmir Division) have been approved. The overall allocation for these works stands at Rs 3905.79 lakh, out of which Rs 1261.32 lakh has been released so far. The allocations include Rs 2644.98 lakh for Jammu Division and Rs 1260.81 lakh for Kashmir Division. The Chief Secretary also

The poll body attributed the delay in holding elections to the non-availability of the required electorate at the time the vacancies occurred.

Elected MLAs constitute the electorate for these elections. Nominated MLAs are not eligible to participate in Rajya Sabha polls.

The Commission stated that these seats will be filled through three separate electionsone each for two seats and a combined election for the two seats that became vacant simultaneously.

As per the notification, the tenure of the newly elected members will be subject to the outcome of a pending Supreme Court case-SLP (C) No. 17123/2015 (Election Commission of India vs. Devesh Chandra Thakur & Others).

#### **NC-Cong alliance**

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLA Mehraj Malik, who is currently under detention under the Public Safety Act (PSA).

The combined strength of the NC, Congress, CPI (M), and independent MLAs supporting the alliance stands at 53-down from 54 following Mehraj Malik's withdrawal of support to the Omar Abdullah-led government. The alliance includes 41 MLAs from NC, six from Congress,

five independents, and one from CPI (M). The BJP holds 28 seats. In addition, six MLAs from smaller Kashmir-based parties and independents form a non-BIP opposition bloc in the House. These members maintain a neutral stance, distancing themselves from both the treasury benches and the BJP. This group includes three MLAs from the PDP, one from the PC, and two independents-Shabir Kullay (MLA Shopian) and Sheikh Khursheed (MLA Langate), who is considered independent as his party is not registered with the Election Commission of India. With Mehraj Malik added to this bloc, the total rises to seven.

Based on current numbers, the NC-led alliance is expected to win the first two seats-each to be decided through separate elections-given its 53-member strength compared to BJP's 28. These two seats could go uncontested if the BJP decides not to field candidates.

For the third and fourth seats, which will be decided through a combined election,

voting will take place only if the NC-led alliance chooses to contest the fourth seat.

The NC-led alliance is projected to secure 29 first-preference votes for the third seat, leaving it with 24 second-preference votes for the fourth seat. The BJP, with 28 votes, is favoured to win the fourth seat.

The six MLAs from PDP, PC, and independents are expected to play a minimal role in the elections. They have been vocal critics of both

There are also chances of cross-voting, considering that seven independent MLAs-five from the ruling alliance and two from the opposition-are not required to show their marked ballot papers to any authorized agent.

Mehraj Malik, who is in detention under the Public Safety Act (PSA), is eligible to vote in the Rajya Sabha elections. Section 62(5) of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, does not bar a person from voting if they are under preventive detention. It only prohibits voting by individuals confined in prison or in lawful police custody-whether serving a sentence or otherwise.

He said the Pahalgam attack has cast a shadow over the valley's tourism. "The Chief Minister, Prime Minister and others are pushing hard for revival of tourism, and we hoteliers are also requesting LG Manoj Sinha and the administration to reopen the closed tourist sites and let us show people that normalcy prevails here and that they can come," he said.

Recently, KNO also reported that the famous shikaras of Dal Lake — often referred to as the "floating taxis of Kashmir" now lie idle, their vibrant canopies fading under the sun.

With tourists vanishing after the April 22 Pahalgam attack, the men who rowed them for generations are being pushed to desperate

Wali Mohammad, President of the Shikara Association Kashmir, told KNO that many owners have been forced to abandon the lake.

"Shikaras have been our identity, our lifeline. Today, the same boats float empty. Many owners are now running small shops, pushing carts, or doing gig work because they too have to feed their families," he said. (KNO)

New Delhi, Sept 24: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of a slew of development projects during his visit to Rajasthan's Banswara on Thursday, including the Rs 42,000 crore Mahi-Banswara nuclear plant, officials said.

The projects span across key sectors such as energy, water, infrastructure, health and urban development, they said.

Among the projects to be launched, the proposed 2,800 MW nuclear facility is the most important as it is expected to play a crucial role in the state's journey toward energy self-sufficiency, officials said.

The other projects include a 590 MW renewable energy project in Bikaner to be built at a cost of Rs 8,500 crore, high-capacity power transmission lines with a total capacity of 15.5 gigawatts being laid across Jaisalmer,



Barmer, Sirohi, Nagaur and Bikaner for Rs 13,183 crore.

Fifteen new drinking water supply projects across 11 districts, including Banswara, Udaipur, Dungarpur, Sikar and Ajmer, worth Rs 5,884, construction of two new flyovers, a bridge over the Banas river, 119 roads under the Atal Pragati Path scheme in Bharatpur, and three new grid substations in Bikaner and Jaisalmer, they said.

The prime minister will also inaugurate multiple completed projects, including solar energy plants with a combined capacity the Udaipur-Chandigarh

Apart from these, 15,000 youths will receive appointment letters as part of a government drive to generate jobs across various departments.

"Overall, development projects worth over Rs 1.22 lakh crore will be either inaugurated or have their foundation stones laid in the programme, out of which Rajasthan alone will receive projects worth Rs 1,08,468 crore," the official said.

Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma gave directions to officials to complete all the preparations for the event. He will visit the venue site in Banswara on Wednesday to take stock of the preparations.

Ahead of the event, BJP state president Madan Rathore visited households in Banswara on Tuesday, distributing "yellow rice" as a traditional invitation for the prime minister's programme. Rathore said that

Banswara's nuclear project would become a landmark initiative for Rajasthan.

'This project will not only ensure energy independence for the state but also drive local tourism, employment, and economic growth," he said.

Taking a swipe at the opposition, Rathore accused the previous Congress-led government of misgovernance and failing to address the people's concerns. He also claimed that former chief minister Ashok Gehlot prioritised political drama over pub-

Earlier, Gehlot had asked Modi to speak on the "slow progress" in the investigation of the 2022 Kanhaiya Lal murder case in Udaipur that is being investigated by the NIA.

He also demanded from the prime minister a national monument status for the Mangarh Dham in Banswara during his visit to the tribal dominated district.

## SCBA urges CJI, law min to finalise MoP, calls for transparent system

New Delhi, Sept 24: The Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) has written to Chief Justice of India B R Gavai and Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal seeking finalisation of the memorandum of procedure (MoP) and institution of a "transparent, equitable, and merit-driven" framework for appointment of judges in the top court and high courts.

SCBA president and senior advocate Vikas Singh wrote to the CJI and Meghwal on September 12, flagging structural flaws in the existing collegium system and said the delays in reform were under-mining both judicial integrity and public confidence.

He said while the collegium system was created to safeguard judicial independence, it inadvertently gave rise to serious

Singh said the collegium routinely overlooked qualified lawyers from the Supreme Court bar for elevation to high courts in their respective states, despite their exten-

sive exposure to national jurisprudence.
"The prevailing Collegium mechanism, while designed to preserve judicial independence, has inadvertently created significant challenges. Its structural flaws demand urgent and comprehensive correction.

"First, it arbitrarily ignores the vast talent pool within the Supreme Court Bar for elevation to their respective home state High Courts. These practitioners, whose exposure to national jurisprudence should be viewed as a superior qualification, are being systematically overlooked. This not only wastes valuable judicial talent but also undermines the core principle merit-based selection," he said

He also flagged "troubling" under-rep-resentation of women in judiciary and referred to official data.
"This is not an abstract concern but a

reality borne out by hard data. As of February 2024, women constituted merely 9.5% of the sanctioned strength in High Courts and a stark 2.94% in the Supreme Court. This is a glaring indictment of systemic exclusion, where the tyranny of a presumed meritocracy masks a deeper reliance on informal networks and patron-

On the issue of marginalisation of



briefing lawyers, the SCBA president said the existing process focuses almost exclusively on arguing counsels while ignoring briefing lawyers and juniors, who are often the "unseen architects" of litigation.

"To elevate only the visible face is to perpetuate a flawed understanding of competence," he wrote to the CJI.

The Supreme Court, he said, had already laid down a reform blueprint for revising the MoP.

Singh stressed these directions were not merely aspirational but actionable, and any further delay in implementing them was

Proposing reforms in the MoP, the SCBA said permanent secretariats be set up in every High Court and in the Supreme Court to maintain data on candidates and vacancies, and to ensure institutional memory.

He also batted for transparent application-based process and said, "The current informal system must be replaced with a formal process where applications are invited publicly. This ensures every deserving candidate, including those from the Supreme Court Bar, is considered on demonstrable merit through a structured mechanism.'

The MoP should contain the provision to publish objective criteria, covering minimum age, years of practice, reported judgments, and pro bono work, for evaluating candidates before their elevation to higher judiciary, he added.

### SC bats for dedicated online portal to trace missing children

New Delhi, Sept 24: The Supreme Court on Wednesday asked the Centre to create a dedicated online portal under the aegis of the home ministry to trace missing children and investigate such cases.

A bench of Justices B V Nagarathna and R Mahadevan underlined the lack of coordination among police authorities entrusted with the job of tracing missing children in states and union territories in the country. The court said the portal could have a

dedicated officer from each state who could be in charge of missing complaints besides disseminating information. The top court outlined the need for a "coordinated effort" to trace missing chil-

dren and creation of a dedicated online portal to deal with the issue. The bench consequently asked additional solicitor general Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for the Centre, to seek instructions in the matter. The top court previously directstates and union territories to furnish data

on missing children cases. NGO Guria Swayam Sevi Sansthan had moved the top court and highlighted unresolved cases of kidnapping or missing children besides the actions required to be taken on the basis of information available with the 'Khoya/Paya portal' monitored by the government of India.

The petition illustrated its argument with five cases registered in Uttar Pradesh last year in which minor boys and girls were kidnapped and trafficked through a network of middlemen to states like Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan.

## India, US trade talks on at different levels: Official

New Delhi, Sept 24: India, US talks are happening at different levels covering both trade and non-trade issues, an official said.

Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal is in the US for trade talks. He is accompanied by senior officials of the ministry, including special secretary and India's chief negotiator Rajesh Agrawal.

"Talks are happening at different levels," the official said, adding the minister led team is expected to return from the US later this week.

Goyal has held discussions with his US counterpart.

This visit comes in the backdrop of recently concluded day-long discussions in New on Indian goods entering the earlier in May for the trade Delhi between US Chief Negotiator Brendan Lynch and Agrawal on the proposed bilateral trade agreement.

On September 16, the commerce ministry stated that the day-long discussions with the visiting US team on a bilateral trade deal were positive, and both sides agreed to push for an early and mutually beneficial conclusion of the agreement.

ates: Iran has begun rebuilding missile-production sites targeted by Israel during its 12-day war in June, satellite images analyzed by The Associated Press show, but a key component is likely still missing — the large mixers needed to produce solid fuel for the weapons.

Reconstituting the missile program is crucial for the Islamic Republic, which believes another round of war with Israel may happen. The missiles are one of Iran's few military deterrents after the war decimated its air defense systems — something that Tehran long has insisted will never be included in negotiations with the West

Missile experts told AP that obtaining the mixers is a goal for Tehran, particularly as it prepares for possible United Nations sanctions to be reimposed on the country later this month. The sanctions would penalize any development of the missile program, among other measures. Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian is due to address the United Nations General Assembly on Wednesday.

Known as planetary mixers, the machines feature blades that revolve around a central point, like orbiting planets, and offer better mixing action than other types of equipment. Iran could purchase them from China, where experts and U.S. officials say they've purchased missile fuel ingredients and other components in the past.

"If they're able to reacquire some key things like planetary mixers, then that infrastructure is still there and ready to get rolling again," said Sam Lair, a research associate at the James Martin Center for Nonproliferation

Iran's mission to the United Nations did not respond to questions about the country's efforts to rebuild its missile program.

Solid-fuel missiles can be fired faster than those using liquid fuel, which must be loaded just before launch. That speed can make the difference between launching a missile and having it destroyed in a launcher - something that happened during the war with Israel.

Iran has solid-fuel missile manufacturing bases at Khojir and Parchin, two sites just outside Tehran, as well as at Shahroud, some 350 kilometers (215 miles) northeast of the capital. Even before the most recent war, all of those sites came under Israeli attack in October 2024 during hostilities between the countries.

Attacks during the war in June appeared aimed at destroying buildings that housed the mixers, which are needed to ensure the missile fuel is evenly combined, according to experts. Other sites struck by Israel included manufacturing facilities that likely could be used to make the mixers.

"Israel's targeting indicates that they believed mixing was a bottleneck in Iran's missile production," he said. "If Iran is able to overcome their mixing limitations, they'll have all the casting capacity that they need to start producing at high volumes again."

The Israeli military declined to respond to questions over its strategy. Iran's defense minister, Gen. Aziz Nasirzadeh, recently claimed Tehran now has new missiles with more advanced warheads.

"The 12-day war with Israel has altered some of our priorities," he said on Aug. 22. "We are now focused on producing military equipment with higher precision and greater operational

Îran may choose to rely on China to obtain mixers and the chemicals to make solid fuel.

Such chemicals may have caused a massive explosion in April that killed at least 70 people at a port in Iran. Iran still has not explained the blast, which happened as its diplomats met with Americans in Oman over its nuclear program.

Just days after the explosion, the U.S. State Department sanctioned Chinese firms it said provided the Islamic Republic with "ballistic missile propellant ingredients.'

Meanwhile, Iran's Revolutionary Guard likely supplied a planetary mixer to an underground ballistic missile construction facility in Syria near the town of Masyaf, some 170 kilometers (105 miles) north of the capital, Damascus, near the Lebanese border. Footage released by the Israeli military months after the September

2024 raid on the facility showed the mixer, which bore a resemblance to others sold online by Chinese firms

Iran's president and military officials visited Beijing earlier this month for China's Victory Day parade. Iran's government has provided no detailed readout on what Pezeshkian said to Chinese President Xi Jinping, and China's state-run media offered no indications that Tehran asked for help.

The Chinese Foreign Ministry, asked about possibly supplying Tehran mixers and fuel ingredients, told AP that Beijing is 'willing to continue leveraging its influence to contribute to peace and stability in the Middle East."

"China supports Iran in safeguarding its national sovereignty, security and national dignity," the ministry said. "At the same time, China is deeply concerned about the continued escalation of tensions in the Middle East."

Can Kasapo lu, a senior fellow with the Washington-based Hudson Institute, said Beijing could supply guidance systems and microprocessors as well for Iran's ballistic missiles.

"If Iran uses its relationship with China to bolster its disruptive military capabilities, the 12-day war could be a mere speed bump for the Iranian regime, rather than a decisive defeat," he wrote.

Lair, the analyst, said if Iran restarts its production at prewar levels, the sheer number of missiles produced will make it harder for the Israelis to preemptively destroy them or shoot them down.

"They are clearly very invested in their missile program, and I don't think that they're going to negotiate it away, ever," he said.

## US, EU too trading with Russia: China dismisses Trump's criticism of oil purchases



Chinese and Russian companies' normal exchanges and cooperation are in line with the World Trade Organisation (WTO) rules and market principles, Guo said, adding that Beijing's actions are not targeted against any third party and "should not be interfered with and influenced".

Beijing, Sept 24: Dismissing US President Donald Trump's criticism that India and China are the "primary funders" of the Ukraine war through purchases of Russian oil, Beijing on Wednesday pointed out that America and the European Union are also engaging in trade with Moscow.

Addressing a media briefing here, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Guo Jiakun warned that Beijing will take countermeasures to safeguard its interests if its companies' normal trade with Russia is obstructed, as he rejected Trump's criticism.

"An overwhelming number of countries, including the US and EU, are engaging in trade with Russia," he said, reminding the American leader that Washington too is indulging in trade with Moscow.

Chinese and Russian companies' normal exchanges and cooperation are in line with the World Trade Organisation (WTO) rules and market principles, Guo said, adding that Beijing's actions are not targeted against any third party and "should not be interfered with

He also reiterated that China has always maintained an "objective and just position" on the Ukraine crisis and consistently called for peace talks.

"China will take all necessary measures to safeguard its rights and interests," the spokesperson said. In his address to the UN General

Assembly on Tuesday, Trump accused China and India of being the "primary funders" of the ongoing Ukraine war by continuing to purchase Russian oil.

He also criticised the EU for its continued imports of Russian energy but was conspicuously silent on Washington's own trade with Moscow.

"Inexcusably, even NATO countries have not cut off much Russian energy and Russian energy products... Think of it, they're funding the war against themselves," Trump said, adding that he was not happy about it when he found this out.

The Trump administration has imposed an additional 25 per cent tariff on India as a penalty for its purchases of Russian oil, taking the total levies imposed on the country by the US to 50 per cent, among the highest in the world.

Last month, India also pointed out that both the US and the EU are continuing their trade relations with Russia.

"Unlike our case, such trade is not even a vital national compulsion," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) had said. While the Europe-Russia trade includes energy fertilisers, mining products, chemicals, iron and steel, and machinery and transport equipment, the US continues to import from Russia uranium hexafluoride for its nuclear industry, palladium for its EV industry, fertilisers, as well as chemicals, it said.

### No feeling of disappointment in team due to loss to India in Asia Cup: Pak's Talat



Dubai, Sept 24: Pakistan Talat has rejected suggestions that the team's morale has taken a hit due to the resounding six-wicket loss to India in an Asia Cup Super 4 match, asserting that the players have shut out the criticism to stay composed for the re-

maining games. Batting all-rounder Talat played a pivotal role in helping Pakistan win by five wickets and earn two crucial points on Tuesday against Sri Lanka, rescuing them from a precarious 80/5 in a chase of 133.

His 2/18 and unbeaten 32 helped his side keep alive hopes of an India-Pakistan final after two successive losses in the tournament. Pakistan now have to win against Bangladesh on Thursday to make the final.
"No, there was no

feeling of mayusi (disappointment) coming into the match (against Sri Lanka) but since we had lost (to India in the Super 4s opener), no one was feeling good...(But) We put in our best effort in that match," said Talat in the post-match press

conference on Tuesday. "...but coming into this match there was no pressure. Of course, there was criticism all around but we made a conscious effort to avoid it. Sometimes it's (criticism) not good for the team coming into a crucial match," he added. India and Pakistan have clashed twice in the tournament so far with the former winning on

both occasions. The tensions between the two sides have also gone up after to do the traditional after the game to show solidarity with the victims of the Pahalgam terror attack. The win over Sri Lan-

ka on Tuesday, Talat said, had infused a lot of positivity in the side and if the team could play just two matches with the right intensitv, it could lift the Asia Cup trophy.

We are very confident and the atmosphere in the camp (is good) given that we have been playing nonstop cricket for such a long time and the kind of options we have.

"Ând, the good thing is that the players are being backed (by the management), unlike previous days when they were replaced if they were not performing. Now, only two matches are left. If we play two matches well, the trophy will be ours," he said confidently. Sri Lanka are out of contention following losses to Bangladesh and Pakistan.

Asked if game awareness was lacking among Pakistan cricketers and the batters were finding it difficult to read the spinners in the campaign so far. Talat said it was a case of low confidence among Pakistan batters. "We say if we want a player for No.4 or No. 5, then he should know how to play all three types (forms) of cricket. But the chances of failure increases in that position. Unfortunately, in our country if we lose a game or two or a series or two, then everyone, including the media, spectators... all of them get after you

"And I think, we have to do everything not to withdraw Indians and they will change their attitude to the Russian energy sector," the Ukrainian President said.

He was answering a specific question by a Fox News interviewer: "China, India, they're all contributing here; European nations, the President said, need to get off oil, but need to do it with the US. Do you think that that

is going to happen?" "I'm sure with China, its more difficult because it's not for today. It's not in the interest to not support Russia," Mr. Zelenskyy said. He also said, "I think

Iran will never be on our side, because we'll never be on the side of the United States." Zelenskyy, in his address at the UN ty Council, said: "China is here – a powerful nation on which Russia now depends completely." "If China truly wanted this war to stop, it could compel Moscow to end the invasion. Without China. Putin's Russia is nothing. Yet too often, China stays silent and distant, instead of active for peace," Zelenskyy said.
