

Srinagar, Oct 11: Asserting that the terror ecosystem has been crushed and now is the time to present the true narrative of Jammu Kashmir, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Saturday called on thinkers and writers to rectify the distorted narratives about Jammu and Kashmir.

Speaking at the inaugural function of Kashmir Literature Festival organised by Srikula Foundation here, LG Sinha, according to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said, "Today the young historians must provide accurate and factually correct accounts challenging lies that were propagated in the region. In the last few years, new writers have tried to do justice to the injustice done to the history of India, which is an excellent initiative. Efforts are also being made to take

which is highly commendable," He said, "For decades, a manipulated narrative was propagated here in Jammu Kashmir. Writers and media figures grudgingly admit that, out of Kashmir, free from all bias and fear of gun, to strengthen the trust and accelerate socio-economic growth,"

"The terror ecosystem has been dismantled and now is the time to present the true narrative of Jammu Kashmir, free from all bias and fear of gun, to strengthen the trust and accelerate socio-economic growth," the Lieutenant Governor said.

"There were people connected with the terror ecosystem and even today, a few still try to control the narrative. The narrative propagated by those sitting across the LoC was deliberately promoted for years," LG Sinha remarked.

He also called for correcting the narrative regarding Jammu Kashmir by identifying the misinformation and countering it with verified facts.

The LG asserted that the administration has acted tough against elements trying to perpetuate this false narrative. However, he acknowledged that a few individuals continue to propagate the ideology of terror outfits and attempt to instigate the public.

"There are some who still have a problem with the progress and peace of Jammu and Kashmir, but the people now fully understand their motives," he said.

Referring to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, LG Sinha praised the overwhelming public condemnation of terrorism across towns and villages. "People across J&K strongly opposed Pakistan-sponsored terrorism. Terrorists and their supporters have no place in our society," he asserted, adding that the administration remains firm in its resolve to root out all remnants of the terror ecosystem.

Sources further told KNO that the Congress may choose not to contest the 'risky' seat if NC remains adamant about its offer, given that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) holds a clear advantage on it.

Many youth misled by promises of policies, returns: SSP Poswal

Ganderbal, Oct 11: In a first criminal case linked to the controversial Robust Secure Network (RSN) platform registered with the Crime Branch, authorities in Ganderbal on Saturday said to have launched a massive crackdown with approximately 4,500 accounts under investigation for suspected financial irregularities. A series of raids were con-

ducted by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) over the past few days, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Ganderbal, Khalil Poswal told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO). Each of these account hold-

ers will receive formal notices at their residences, requiring them to respond to allegations,

Major evacuee land scam uncovered in Sgr

ACB initiates criminal probe

Srinagar, Oct 11: Jammu & Kashmir Anti-Corruption Bureau has initiated a major criminal investigation after uncovering a large-scale scam involving the illegal exchange and manipulation of valuable evacuee land in Srinagar

A spokesman in a statement issued to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), said that the investigation has brought to light serious irregularities and fraudulent acts allegedly committed by officials of the Revenue Department and the Custodian Evacuee Property Department, in active collusion with private individuals, for unlawful enrichment.

"Reliable information was received by the Bureau indicating



that certain officers had facilitated the exchange of prime evacuee property measuring approximately 17 marlas and located on the highly valuable Gupkar Road, Srinagar with land of comparatively lesser worth at another site," the statement reads.

It added that the exchange was executed without obtaining the mandatory No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Defence Estates Office and in blatant violation of the directions of the High Court of Jammu and Kashmir as well

as established government procedures regulating such transactions.

"Enquiry conducted by the ACB revealed that the involved public servants had deliberately ignored legal requirements, manipulated land records, and colluded with private parties to facilitate the unlawful swap. These actions were aimed at extending undue benefits to select beneficiaries while causing wrongful loss to the state exchequer," the statement added.

The probe has revealed that official records were tampered and falsified, particularly revenue extracts and tenancy columns, to conceal the true nature of ownership and tenancy rights. "Certain officials attested and verified false revenue entries and enabled the registration of evacuee property in private names. The value of the exchanged properties was grossly | More on P6

Sorry State of Education

146 schools, 61 teachers in J&K function with zero enrollments

Srinagar, Oct 11: In Jammu and Kashmir, at least 61 teachers in are posted or deployed in those schools having zero enrolments-thus raising a question on managing the human resources and quality of education.

Besides, the official data reveals that Iammu and Kashmir has at least 146 such schools wherein no student is

According to the official figures mentioned in Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE Plus) 2024-25, Jammu and Kashmir as per the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) has 61 teachers in those schools having zero enrol-ments and 146 schools with zero enrolments.

In September, KNO reported that Jammu and Kashmir has



at least 1371 schools wherein single teachers have been posted or deployed.

The figures reveal that there is an enrolment of 32,303 students enrolled in those schools where only single teachers are posted or deployed.

Pertinently, in a previous report, the official figures have revealed that in Iammu and Kashmir more than 31,054 students were enrolled in those schools that

were functioning with a single

In the previous report, there were only 1330 schools that were functioning with only a single teacher. However, the recent report suggests that the numbers have increased by at least 41 schools.

Last year, KNO first broke the news of closure of over 4400 government run schools owing to 'zero or extremely low' enrolment of students.

In July-2024, the news agency reported that there were a total of 23,117 government run schools in Jammu and Kashmir out of which 4394 have been deleted from the UDISE data.

Despite repeated calls, Secretary, School Education Department and Jammu and Kashmir Samagra Shiksha Project Director were not available to comment on the matter.

CS reviews measures to boost handicrafts sector in J&K

Stresses on swift implementation of QR-Code traceability, global branding of crafts

SRINAGAR, OCTOBER 10: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo Saturday chaired a high-level meeting to review the measures being taken by the Industries & Commerce Department for promotion and development of the Handicrafts and Handloom sectors in J&K.

The meeting was attended by Commissioner Secretary, Industries & Commerce; Director, Handicrafts & Handloom, Kashmir/Jammu; Director, Indian Institute of Carpet Technology (IICT); and other senior officers of the department.

At the outset, the Chief Secretary took stock of the initiatives undertaken to support local artisans and weavers, strengthen testing facilities, and

promote genuine hand-made products across the UT.

He underscored the importance of enhancing the testing capacity of existing laboratories and directed for establishment of a robust mechanism for traceability and OR-code based tracking of all Geographical Indication (GI) tagged items. He asked the department to ensure implementation of this digital traceability system by the end of

the year without fail. The Chief Secretary also stressed upon timely grounding of key projects including Ekta Malls in Srinagar and Jammu, besides taking forward other branding and promotion initiatives aimed at giving global recognition to I&K's traditional crafts.

While reviewing the progress on



creation of Wool and Silk Villages, Common Facility Centre for Yarn Dyeing, establishment of the Indian Institute of Textiles at Basohli, Sericulture Park, and Craft-based Resource Centre, the Chief Secretary directed the concerned officers to expedite completion of these projects. He also

advised the department to explore possibilities of NSQF accreditation for its training centres, courses, and trainers to enhance employability and credibility of skilled trainees.

Commissioner Secretary, Industries & Commerce, Vikramjit Singh, presented a detailed overview of the sector, highlighting that J&K presently has 18 registered GI products in the handicrafts segment, while 10 more are in the pipeline. He informed that the capacity of GI product testing has been significantly upgraded from 50 to 100 tests per day and will soon be enhanced to 250 tests daily upon induction of two additional digital microscopes.

Director, Handicrafts & Handloom, Kashmir, Masarat-ul-Islam, in his presentation, informed that the department has substantially enhanced its operational capacity and reduced the GI certification waiting period to just two days, providing major relief to artisans. He further informed that around 6,000 GI users are currently registered across the UT. He revealed that the department is contemplating to make Craft Development Institute (CDI), Srinagar, a 'Pre-Export Testing Facility Centre' to facilitate direct export of certified products. To further augment testing infrastructure, the department is also working on signing an MoU with SKUAST-Kashmir for product testing and bulk production of woollen carpets.

The meeting was apprised that the QR code traceability project, being developed in collaboration with NIELIT, is set to be rolled out soon. Moreover, with the active involvement of NIFT Srinagar, 36 prototype designs in five different crafts have been developed, and nearly 1,000 artists trained under ten design and skill enhancement programmes.

'No funds for PM-ABHIM in J&K for 2025-26'

Srinagar, Oct 11: Despite the significant role played by the Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM) in strengthening healthcare deliv-ery and enabling access to quality medical services for underprivileged sections of society, no central release has been made for the financial year 2025–26, raising serious concerns among health experts and beneficiaries.

This information was disclosed through a Right to Infor-mation (RTI) file obtained by RTI activist MM Shuja.

According to the data, there was Rs 16.11 crore central re-lease for J&K for the year 2021-22 for PM Ayushman Bha-rat Health Infrastructure Mission,

Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana followed by Rs 1 crore in 2022-23, Rs 44.01 crore for 2023-24 and Rs 60.44 crore for 2024-25.

However, as per data, there is zero central release for J&K under this mission for the year 2025-26.

According to officials, thousands of poor and rural pa-tients across Jammu and Kashmir — and the country at large — have received free or subsidised treatment under the mission.

'This scheme has been a lifeline for thousands of poor pa-tients who could not afford specialised treatments. It must continue to get priority at all levels of government so that the momentum in healthcare development is not lost," said a senior health official, wishing not to be named. Dr Shabir Ahmad, a public health expert, said health is not an expenditure but an investment in human capital. Stopping or delaying funds for a scheme like Ayushman Bharat will directly impact the poor, he said.

Officials in the health department expressed hope that the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare would soon ad-dress the funding gap and ensure smooth continuation of the mission in the upcoming quarters—(KNO)

A senior administrative official also confirmed that the stay on the proposed dumping site has been disposed of, and the matter has already been taken up with the Divisional Commissioner's office for final approval. "The process of establishing a permanent waste disposal site for Sopore is underway. Once finalized, it will provide a lasting solution to the town's long-pending sanitation problem," he said.

Locals, meanwhile, welcomed the cleanup effort following media coverage, but urged the authorities to focus on sustainable waste management. "Cleaning after media reports helps temporarily. What Sopore needs is a proper waste site and accountability against those who dump garbage irresponsibly," said a local resident—(KNO)

Rana reviews functioning of Forest departments

Srinagar, Oct 11: Minister for Forest, Ecology and Environment, Javed Ahmed Rana Saturday chaired a review meeting at Civil Secretariat, here to assess the functioning and progress of the Forest department in Anantnag, Kulgam and Pulwama districts.

The meeting focused on evaluating ongoing initiatives of afforestation, eco-tourism development, soil and water conservation, protection of forest assets and role of community engagement in sustainable management of nat-ural resources. The Minister took stock of the achievements made so far and deliberated on key areas requiring further attention and improvement.

In light of the gr mental challenges, especially those posed by climate change, the Minister underscored the urgent need to enhance the green cover in South Kashmir.

He directed the concerned Divisional Forest Officers to accord top priority to plantation drives, formulate detailed and area-specific plantation plans.

Emphasizing that the sustainability and survival of plantations are just as important as plantation itself, he instructed the department to integrate post-plantation care and monitoring mechanisms to ensure long-term impact and



Reaffirming Omar Abdullah-led Government's commitment to forest-based sustainability and improving livelihoods, Rana called for intensified afforestation and rejuvenation efforts across districts.

He emphasized the need for robust Information, Education and Communication (IEC) campaigns to raise environmental awareness, urging the active participation of local communities, educational institutions and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) in such initiatives. The Minister also reviewed the status of pending forest lihoods for forest-dependent

jects and stressed the importance of streamlining the approval process and vigorous follow-up to ensure timely clearances for critical infrastructure projects like water supply, road connectivity and community development. while ensuring that environmental safeguards are not compromised in the process.

Rana placed special emphasis on soil conservation and social forestry activities, noting their crucial role in preventing soil erosion, improving groundwater recharge and generating sustainable live-

He highlighted the importance of integrating these activities into broader climate resilience and rural development frameworks.

The Minister further reviewed the district-wise implementation of the Forest Rights Act (FRA), with particular focus on the recognition and documentation of both individual and community forest rights.

He directed the Forest

department to maintain close coordination with the Revenue and Tribal Affairs Departments to facilitate timely processing of claims, effective grievance redressal and proper documentation of pending cases.

In a bid to boost eco-tourism in South Kashmir, Rana called for the new potential eco-tourism sites.

He underlined the role of local youth in managing and promoting eco-tourism initiatives, stressing that such ventures not only create sustainable employment opportunities but also foster greater awareness and responsibility towards the conservation of forests and natural ecosystems.

The Minister reiterated the government's resolve to strengthen forest governance and conservation efforts across Jammu & Kashmir, ensuring a balanced approach between development needs and environmental sustainability.

Kashmir grapples with one **PET-CT machine**

Srinagar, Oct 11: Amid an alarming rise in cancer cases across Kashmir, the valley continues to rely on just one PET-CT scan machine — located at Sher-e-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences (SKIMS), Soura — for staging, diagnosis, and monitoring of

The absence of this vital diagnostic facility at other major hospitals, including the Government Medical College (GMC) Srinagar, has led to long waiting periods, delayed diagnoses, and increased suffering for patients battling cancer.

According to official data, GMC Srinagar alone has registered around 8,000 new cancer cases since 2017, yet it lacks a PET-CT machine - an essential tool for detecting cancer, evaluating treatment response, and identifying recurrence.

Oncologists told KNO that PET-CT technology has become indispensable in modern oncology but remains severely limited in Kashmir.

"The entire valley depends on a single PET-CT machine at SKIMS, which caters to thousands of patients," said Dr Manzoor, an oncologist. "This leads to long waiting lists, something that cancer patients simply can't afford. We urgently need more such facilities.'

Another oncologist, Dr Aijaz, said PET-CT scans play a major role in the initial diagnosis, treatment planning, prognosis, and follow-up of cancer patients. "It's a breakthrough technology that combines functional and

anatomical imaging. Having more of these machines would significantly improve for patients added. Data from the Union Health Ministry reveals that 51,577 new cancer cases were reported in Jammu & Kashmir between 2019 and 2022. In the same period, 35,623 people lost their lives to the disease.

Since 2013, SKIMS Soura has recorded around 50,000 new cancer cases, while GMC Srinagar has registered around 8,000 since 2017.

Experts attribute the growing cancer burden to multiple factors, including dietary habits, lifestyle changes, genetic predispositions, and delayed diagnoses caused by limited diagnostic infrastructure.

A 2012 SKIMS study identified "dietary practices and high salt consumption" as key contributors to the rising incidence of cancers, especially stomach and oesophagal types, in Kashmir.

The shortage of PET-CT machines has forced many patients to seek diagnostics outside Kashmir, often at

enormous financial and emo-

"I had to wait over a month r my PET scan a said Ghulam Nabi, a cancer patient from Pulwama. "Such delays can be devastating for patients like us. The news about a PET scan being installed at GMC Srinagar brings real hope.'

Officials said the process for installing a PET-CT machine at SMHS Hospital, Srinagar, has been initiated. "We have taken up the installation and expect the facility to be available soon," an official told KNO.

Health Minister Sakeena Itoo recently announced that Rs 124.83 crore has been allocated for major upgrades in J&K's healthcare infrastructure. The plan includes a PET-CT at GMC Srinagar, MRI machines at GMC Baramulla, Kathua, and Rajouri, a Cath Lab at GMC Doda, and enhanced telemedicine facilities across 80 units.

A PET-CT facility has already become functional at GMC Jammu, providing much-needed relief to cancer patients in the region—(KNO)

ACB probes J&K police officer's illegal wealth

Srinagar, Oct 11: Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) Srinagar on Saturday said to have registered a case against Police Officer for amassing disproportionate assets and conducted searches in Budgam.

A spokesman in a statement said that ACB Police Station Srinagar has registered a case under FIR number 20/2025 against a public servant, Peer Zada Mushkoor Ahmad Shah, son of Peer Zada Mohammad Akber Shah, resident of Jawalapora, Budgam, Inspector (M), who was serving as Cashier at District Police Office (DPO). Bandipora, for possession of assets disproportionate to his known sources of income.

The case was registered at Police Station ACB Srinagar following a secret verification into allegations that the said officer had accumulated assets—both movable and immovable far beyond his legitimate income, in his own name as well as in the names of his family members during his service period.

"During the discrete probe, it was found that the accused and his family members possessed several assets that could not be justified by their known sources of income," the statement added.

The details of assets identified so far include:

Land holdings measuring approximately 32 Kanals and 6 Marlas situated in District Budgam, including 17 Kanal and 14 Marlas at Shahpora Wathora, Budgam; A double-storey palatial residential house with an attic, constructed on a plot purchased at Ompora Colony, Budgam; Bank balances amounting to approximately Rs 48,26,036 in various accounts; Multiple vehicles of different types registered in the names of the accused and his family members; Expenditure of around Rs 40 lakh incurred on the education of his children in reputed institutions and substantial expenses on foreign travel and payment of insurance premiums.

'Scrutiny of bank records revealed several suspicious transactions and unexplained cash inflows. It was also observed that the accused and his family were operating multiple bank accounts in different banks through which large sums of money had been routed. Several high-value immovable properties were also found acquired in the names of his wife and children," it reads.

It added that the assessment of income vis-àvis expenditure revealed that the actual income of the accused from known sources during the period 01.01.2012 to 30.06.2025 was grossly

insufficient to justify the assets accumulated and expenditure incurred.

The findings indicate that the accused has illicitly enriched himself by resorting to corrupt and dishonest means, thereby committing offences punishable under the relevant provi-

sions of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988

(as amended in 2018)," it reads. Accordingly, the spokesman said that a case under FIR number 20/2025 under Section 13(1)(b) read with Section 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 (as amended in 2018) has been registered in Police Station ACB Srinagar against the said public servant for criminal misconduct and possession of dis-

proportionate assets. "Îmmediately after registration of the FIR, and in compliance with the Court Order dated 10.10.2025, searches were conducted at two residential houses of the accused in District Budgam," the statement reads.

The accused Public Servant has been taken into Police custody for questioning in in connection with the ongoing investigation of the case, the spokesman said, adding that further investigation is under progress to ascertain the full extent of the illegal wealth accumulated by the accused and his associates—(KNO)

The Department of Biotechnology in partnership with the Wellcome Trust (WT), UK, launched the "Biomedical Research Career Programme" (BRCP) in 2008-2009 through the DBT/Wellcome Trust India Alliance (India Alliance), a dedicated Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV), with the approval of the Cabinet, offering research fellowships, based in India, for biomedical research at the world class standards. Subsequently, Phase II was implemented in 2018/19 with an expanded portfolio, and now Phase III of the programme has been approved by the Cabinet

Importance of the Biomedical Research Career Programme

The biomedical ecosystem spans research, clinical innovation, technology, and public health, delivering benefits including affordable healthcare, better disease preparedness, improved nutrition, and personalized medicine. From Labs to Lives: Key Aims of India's Biomedical Research Programme

BRCP supports world-class biomedical research fellowships in India. It aims to nurture top-tier scientific talent, foster interdisciplinary and translational research, and strengthen research management and systems to reduce regional disparities in scientific capacity. The main objective behind this programme are as follows:

Attract world-class researchers in biomedical and clinical sciences to establish research programmes in Indian institutions and universities, while fostering fulfilling and sustainable research careers.

Fund cutting-edge research of international standards through initiatives that promote independence and career advancement of exceptional early-career researchers in India.

Promote open and ethical research ecosystems by supporting programmes that build awareness and provide training in allied fields such as research management, science administration, and regulatory affairs

Broaden the reach of India Alliance by expanding activities to new regions and under-served research communities across the country.

BCRP Phase II: 700+ Grants and International Recognition


BRCP Phase-II was designed to attract globally competitive researchers in biomedical and clinical sciences to India. The programme had achieved significant success in its first two phases. A total investment of 2,388 crore was made under the scheme, resulting in the award of 721 research grants.

The objective of the mission for the second phase was to "enable biomedical research in India through funding and engagement."

The objectives under Phase II includes: Empowering researchers to achieve international competitiveness and emerge as future leaders in India.

Bridging gaps in research management and fostering stronger connections between science and society.

Promoting excellence in science by ensuring diversity, inclusivity, and transparency.



Scaling India's Biomedical Capacity: BRCP Phase-III Roadmap

The Biomedical Research Career Programme Phase-III marks a major expansion in India's commitment to building biomedical research capacity of global standards. Key features include:

Financial Outlay & Partnership

The Programme will be implemented with a total outlay of 1,500 crore. Of this, the Department of Biotechnology under the Ministry of Science & Technology, will contribute 1,000 crore, while the Wellcome Trust (UK) will contribute 500 crore. This unique model of co-investment reinforces India's commitment to fostering international collaborations in science and technology while ensuring sustained support for domestic research talent.

Timeframe & Structure

2025–26 to 2030–31: Active implementation period during which new research fellowships, collaborative grants, and capacity-building initiatives will be rolled out.2031–32 to 2037–38: Servicing period for continuing support of fellowships and grants already awarded ensuring long-term continuity and completion of projects.

Attract Talent and Career Support

Phase-III of the BRCP aims to further strengthen India's research ecosystem through targeted support across career stages and research domains:

Early Career and Intermediate Research Fellowships: Offered in basic, clinical, and public health research, these fellowships are internationally recognized and designed to nurture scientists at the formative stages of their research careers.

Collaborative Grants Programme: Comprising Career Development Grants and Catalytic Collaborative Grants, this programme supports 2–3 investigator teams, targeting early to mid-senior career researchers with a proven research track record in India.Research Management Programme: Focused on reinforcing core research capacities, this initiative strengthens the infrastructure, administration, and management of scientific

In addition, Phase-III emphasizes mentorship, networking, public engagement, and the establishment of innovative national and international partnerships to enhance the overall impact and sustainability of biomedical research in India.

Expected Outcomes

By training over 2,000 students and post-doctoral fellows, enabling high-impact publications, generating patentable discoveries, and pushing 25–30% of collaborative programmes to Technology Readiness Level (TRL-4) and above, Phase-III is expected to set new benchmarks for biomedical excellence in India. The programme will also provide a 10–15% increase in support to women scientists, encouraging greater inclusivity in India's research ecosystem.

The initiative is directly aligned with the national vision of Viksit Bharat 2047, positioning India as a global hub for biomedical innovation and translational research.

From Innovation to Transformation: Lasting Impacts of the Programme

Over the last two decades, India's biomedical research initiatives have achieved significant milestones:

70+ COVID-19 projects funded

The Biomedical Research Career Programme (BRCP) supports multi-disciplinary research to develop affordable and innovative healthcare solutions in diagnostics, therapeutics, vaccines, and assistive technologies. It provided the strategic framework for India's COVID-19 research response, which included 10 vaccine candidates, 34 diagnostic tools, and 10 therapeutic interventions—aligning the urgent pandemic response with BRCP's long-term goal of strengthening India's biomedical innovation ecosystem.

World's first oral cancer genomic variant

The DBT-National Institute of Biomedical Genomics (NIBMG) has developed dbGEN-VOC, the world's first publicly accessible oral cancer genomic variant database. It hosts over 24 million variants from Indian patients, alongside global data, and includes powerful tools for searching and analysis Undated annually with data from across India and Southeast Asia, dbGEN-VOC supports research into oral cancer pathways-especially important for India, where the disease is the most common cancer among men due to tobacco chewing. By identifying population-specific genetic mutations, dbGENVOC is a vital step toward better prevention, diagnosis, and

National AMR Mission

The Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) mission was launched in collaboration with World Health Organization (WHO) for pathogen surveillance. It adopts a One Health approach to combat antimicrobial resistance by supporting R&D on new antibiotics, alternatives, and diagnostics, establishing a national bio-repository of resistant microbes, creating India's AMR pathogen priority list with WHO, and partnering globally through the AMR R&D Hub to strengthen innovation against drug-resistant infections.

Biorepositories and clinical trial

Biorepositories and clinical trial networks have been established across India to strengthen the ecosystem for translational research. These platforms enable systematic collection, storage, and sharing of high-quality biological samples and data. Together, they accelerate the movement of innovations from laboratory discoveries to clinical applications for patient benefit.

The Department of Biotechnology (DBT) is committed to advancing women's participation in biomedical research. The BioCARe programme offers first independent research grants to women scientists, while the Janaki Ammal Awardhonors excellence in biomedical research by senior and young women researchers. BIRAC's WINER Award and women-focused bioincubators support

women-led biotech startups. DBT also cohosts the Women Leaders in Global Health Conference to promote leadership and collaboration. These efforts drive inclusivity, innovation, and excellence in India's biomedical research ecosystem.

Mapping the Future of Medicine: Focus Fields in Research

India's biomedical research spans multiple critical areas, aiming to deliver affordable, innovative, and inclusive healthcare solutions. Key focus fields include:

Human Genetics & Genomics

Programmes like GenomeIndia and UMMID are mapping India's unique genetic landscape to improve early diagnosis and treatment of inherited diseases. GenomeIndia has sequenced 10,000 genomes, enabled precision medicine and reduced dependence on international databases. UMMID focuses on rare disorders in children and newborns. These initiatives are laying the foundation for predictive, preventive, and personalized healthcare in India.

Infectious Disease Biology (IDB)

The IDB programme targets major diseases like HIV, TB, malaria, hepatitis, and emerging infections like COVID-19 and dengue. It supports large-scale cohort studies, national biobanks, and translational research to develop timely, affordable solutions. Breakthroughs include the Dengue Day 1 test and HIV Tri-Dot+Ag test. These efforts enhance India's preparedness for future epidemics.

Vaccines

The Indo-US Vaccine Action Programme (VAP), established in 1987, supports vaccine development for diseases like TB, dengue, malaria, and COVID-19. Landmark successes include ROTAVAC®, India's first indigenous rotavirus vaccine, and Covaxin, developed with DBT support. The programme also strengthens clinical trial pipelines and international collaborations, advancing India's vaccine self-sufficiency and global leadership.

Diagnostics & Devices

Innovations like CRISPR-based diagnostics, indigenous RT-PCR kits, and affordable medical devices are making health-care more accessible. PM Modi meets Anthropic CEO Dario Amodei



New Delhi, Oct 11: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday met Dario Amodei, the CEO of Anthropic, a company dealing in safe AI systems. The company also plans to open an office in Bengaluru next year.

"We welcome Anthropic's expansion and look forward to working together to harness AI for growth across key sectors." the prime minister said.

Earlier, Amodei said he met Prime Minister Modi to discuss Anthropic's expansion to India, where the use of its product 'Claude Code' has witnessed a five-fold increase since June.

"Today I met with PM @ narendramodi to discuss Anthropic's expansion to India where Claude Code use is up 5x since June. How India deploys AI across critical sectors like education, healthcare, and agriculture for over a billion people will be essential in shaping the future of AI," Amodei said.

Anthropic was set up by former OpenAI executives and focuses on building what it describes as "safe" AI systems and counts Google among its backers.

On October 8, Anthropic announced plans to open its first India office in Bengaluru.

Lawyers, judges must ensure legal system is accessible to every citizen: CJI Gavai

New Delhi, Oct 11: Chief Justice of India B R Gavai on Saturday said lawyers and judges have a responsibility of strengthening the justice system and they must ensure that the legal discourse does not remain confined to metropolises, but is accessible to even those liv-ing in the country's remotest

Speaking at the LAWASIA Conference at Hanoi in Vietnam on the topic of "Role of Lawyers and Courts in Promoting Diversity and Inclusion", the CJI said it is crucial that the principles judges articulate in their judgments are reflected in the administrative policies of the court.

"I can share that when I assumed office as the chief justice of India in May, one of my top priorities was to ensure that affirmative action in the recruitment of administrative positions within the court was implemented not just in letter, but in spirit. I directed that marginalised communities receive their due share in all administrative appointments and that these policies be applied consistently and transparently," Justice Gavai

He said the dream of equality, nurtured by Gautam Buddha, Mahatma Gandhi and B R Ambedkar, was enshrined in the Constitution of India in 1950 and it turned the tide of destiny for millions who were historically marginalised and denied their basic rights.

"For me, born into a lowcaste family, it meant that I was not born untouchable. The Constitution recognised my dignity as equal to that of every other citizen, offering not just protection, but the promise of opportunity, freedom and social recognition," he said.

The CII said lawyers should not be reluctant in hiring women because of assumptions about maternity leave, time constraints or perceived "commitment issues".

"Such biases are unfair and counterproductive. Lawyers have a duty to ensure that the principles they advocate in court and in public life are reflected in their own workplaces and professional conduct he said.

Referring to various Supreme Court verdicts, including the permanent commission judgment, where women officers permanent allowed were commission in defence forces, Justice Gavai said the judiciary has played a crucial role in ensuring that the law protects



than perpetuating historical disadvantages.

"I also believe that lawyers and judges share additional common goals in strengthening the justice system. We must ensure that the legal system and legal discourse do not remain confined to metropolitan cities, but are accessible to every citizen, even those living in the remotest corners of the country.

"Inclusion is achieved only when the common person can understand, relate to and feel connected with the legal processes, the exchanges between a lawyer and a judge, the judgments delivered and the mechanisms of justice itself," he said.

The CJI said in his role as the executive chairperson of the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), which is mandated to ensure that no one is left without legal aid, he made it a priority to direct his team to reach the farthest and most underserved regions of the country.

"The goal was clear -- no individual should be deprived of their legal rights and every person must have access to necessary legal representation, guidance and support," he said at the conference of LAWASIA, which is headed by senior advocate Shyam Divan.

Justice Gavai said lawyers ten have a more direct ac cess to the public than judges, as the latter are expected to maintain a degree of aloofness, and this proximity gives lawyers a unique opportunity and responsibility to engage with the society.

"Their role is not confined to only the courtroom. It extends to the broader community,

ness about rights, legal processes and the principles of justice. By doing so, lawyers serve as vital bridges between the law and the people, ensuring that justice is not only delivered but also understood accessible and meaningful to all members of the society," he

The CJI noted that it is essential to mentor the next generation, particularly professionals from marginalised communities, and said efforts must be made to identify and support talented individuals who, in the future, may lead the profession.

"Mentorship should not be limited to recruitment alone. It must extend to providing guidance, empathy and sustained support. Many of these professionals enter the workplace carrying the weight of historical exclusion and it is our responsibility, as those with experience and privilege, to ensure that they are given the environment, encouragement and patience necessary to thrive," he said.

Underlining that promoting diversity and inclusion is not just about opening doors, the CJI said it is about walk-ing alongside those who enter through those, nurturing their growth and creating a truly equitable professional space where everyone can

"Recruiting a person without offering support, guidance or a nurturing environment undermines the very purpose of inclusion," he said, adding that true inclusion requires active effort, commitment and accountability from everyone who benefits from existing privileges.

US values ties with India, says **Ambassador-designate Sergio** Gor after meeting PM Modi

New Delhi, Oct 11: The US "values" its relationship with India, US Ambassador-designate Sergio Gor said on Saturday after holding talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi that focused on cooperation in areas of defence, trade and critical minerals.

Gor landed in New Delhi this morning on a six-day visit that came amid continuing strains in the bilateral relations over Washington's imposition of 50 per cent tariffs on Indian exports and a host of other measures taken by the Trump administration that hit Indian interests.

The Ambassador-designate held talks with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri before meeting PM Modi. In a post on "X", Modi said he

was "glad" to receive Gor.
"I'm confident that his ten-

ure will further strengthen the India-US Comprehensive Global Strategic Partnership,' the prime minister said.

Gor said his meeting with Modi focused on defence, trade, technology and critical minerals, adding President Donald Trump considers Modi as a great leader and personal friend.

"We had a great series of meetings including with Foreign Secretary Misri, with external affairs minister Jaishankar and National Security Advisor Doval," Got told PTI and two other media outlets.
"We just finished an in-

credible meeting with Prime Minister Modi where we discussed bilateral issues including defence, trade and technology," he said "We also discussed the importance of critical minerals and the importance of that to both our nations," Gor added.

The discussion between the two sides on critical minerals assumes significance as it comes against the backdrop of China putting export restrictions on them.

"The US values its relationship with India and under the strong leadership of President Donald J Trump and Prime Minister Modi, I am optimistic about the days ahead for both of our nations," Gor said.
"President Trump consid-

ers Modi a great and personal friend. In fact, just before I left for New Delhi, they had an incredible phone call. That is something that will continue over the weeks and months ahead," Gor said.

The US ambassador-designate said he was confident that the India-US relationship would continue to grow.

"It's an honour to serve as President Donald Trump's ambassador to India and I look forward to this very important



relationship. And (it will) continue to grow and deepen," he said.

Gor, accompanied by Deputy Secretary for Management and Resources Michael J Rigas, is visiting New Delhi, days after his appointment as the US envoy to India was confirmed by the Senate.

Following his meeting with Gor, Jaishankar said the discussions focused on the India-US relationship and its global significance.

'Pleased to meet Ambassadordesignate Sergio Gor of the US today in New Delhi. Discussed the India-US relationship and its global significance," Jaishankar said on social media.

"Wish him the best for his new responsibility," he said.

On Foreign Secretary Misri's meeting with Gor, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said: "They had a productive exchange on the India-US Comprehensive Global Strategic Partnership and its shared priorities." The relations between New Delhi and Washington have been reeling under severe stress after Trump doubled tariffs on Indian goods to a whopping 50 per cent, including a 25 per cent additional duty for India's purchase of Russian crude oil.

India described the US action as "unfair, unjustified and unreasonable".

India has also been upset over Trump's new policy on H1B visas.

However, the recent phone conversations between Prime Modi and US President Trump have raised hopes for a positive outcome from the ongoing negotiations for the trade deal.

The two countries recently resumed negotiations for the trade deal after a brief hiatus of a few weeks.

Gor, the White House personnel director and a loyal member of President Donald nated as the next American envoy to India in August.

In his reaction, Gor had said he was "beyond grateful" to Trump for showing "incredible trust and confidence" in nominating him to be his next US ambassador to India and the special envoy for South and Central Asian Affairs.

LG Sinha stressed that writers are custodians of ideas - capable of preserving them, shaping the world, and promoting critical thinking.

Despite technological progress, he said, documenting history remains the timeless duty of

Expressing concern over the distortion of India's history, the Lt Governor said efforts will be made to present Jammu and Kashmir's rich literary traditions before the world, describing the region as the "energy center of the nation."

He stressed reviving the spirit of creative thought and called upon Indian writers to present the nation's true history confidently before global audiences.

Highlighting Kashmir's cultural and historical depth, LG Sinha said, "It is essential to weave the region's historic transformations into words and express what we truly feel."

He, however, noted that no modern historian can be compared to Kalhana, the great chronicler of ancient Kashmir.

The Lt Governor said expressions of poets like Habba Khatoon, Nund Rishi and Padma Sachdev emerged from the soil of Kashmir and contributed immensely to India's cultural identity. "India's Sanskrit heritage and Sanatan consciousness are deeply rooted in Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

He also noted that India's history reflects a long-standing spirit of global dialogue. Referring to ancient texts like the 'Nemat Puran', he said they demonstrate India's intellectual engagement with the wider world even in early times.

Urging the youth to draw inspiration from the wisdom of the past, the Lt Governor said learning from ancient dialogues can help the vounger generation move forward with stronger ideas and vision.

PM Modi launches Rs 35,440-crore 2 big agri schemes

Attacks Congress for 'neglecting' farm sector

New Delhi, Oct 11: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday launched two major agricultural schemes with a combined outlay of Rs 35,440 crore, including a mission for self-reliance in pulses, and called upon farmers to increase production to reduce the country's import dependency and meet global demand.

After inaugurating projects related to agriculture and allied sectors, he said farmers have a critical role to play in realising the vision of a developed India (Viksit Bharat) by 2047.

The event at the Pusa campus coincided with the birth anniversary of socialist reformers Jayaprakash Narayan and Nanaji Deshmukh.

During his 30-minute address, the Prime Minister compared his government's record with that of the Congress, saying the Opposition party's neglect had led to a weakening of the farming ecosystem, with different departments functioning "in multiple directions

without coordination". Modi launched the Rs 24,000-crore 'Pradhan Mantri Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana' (PM-DDKY) and the Rs 11,440-crore 'Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses', saying the schemes would "change the fate of millions of farmers".

The two schemes, already approved by the Cabinet, will be implemented from the upcoming rabi (winter) season till 2030-31.

Ban on firecrackers not a new debate, similar proposal was mooted in 1961

New Delhi, Oct 11: The ban on firecrackers in Delhi is not a new issue. As far back in 1961, concerns over pollution caused by crackers prompted a proposal for a ban, though the government of India did not approve it, according to official records preserved by the Delhi Archives Department.

The proposal, dating back to January 1961, originated from the Deputy Ganj Committee -- one of the industrial market associations in Sadar Bazar, Delhi -- which wrote to the chief commissioner of Delhi, complaining about "noise pollution" caused by large-scale use of fireworks during festivals and other celebrations.

The letter was later forwarded from the office of the chief commissioner, who was the executive head of the national capital functioning under the government of India, to the Ministry of Works, Housing and Supply for its consideration, records accessed by PTI showed. More than six decades later, the debate over ban on firecrackers

The Supreme Court on Friday said a

complete ban on bursting of firecrackers in Delhi-NCR is "neither practical nor ideal", as such restrictions are often violated, so a balancing of equities is needed.

The observation, which hinted at relaxation of the ban, was made by a bench comprising Chief Justice B R Gavai and Justice K Vinod Chandran, which reserved its order on a batch of pleas seeking permission to manufacture and sell "green" firecrackers in Delhi-NCR.

In 1961, Delhi's population was just around 26 lakh -- a fraction of the over two crore residents the city has now. Yet, noise pollution caused by firecrackers was a matter of public concern even then.

The Deputy Ganj Committee, in its letter, said the deafening noise from some high-decibel crackers was causing distress to the residents, particularly those with heart ailments.

"During the course of fireworks display, it appears as if a complete warfare is going on outside," the association wrote, adding that the authorities seemed "immune to the situation".

Indian exporters likely to gain from **US-China trade war** escalation: Experts

New Delhi, Oct 11: The escalating trade war between the US and China is expected to benefit Indian exporters in increasing their shipments to the American market, according to experts.

Federation of Indian Export Organisations (PTI) President S C Ralhan said that imposition of higher tariffs by the US on China will shift demand towards India, which exported goods worth USD 86 billion to the US in 2024-25.

"We may gain from this escalation," Ralhan said.

The US has announced an additional 100 per cent tariff on Chinese goods starting November 1, 2025, raising the overall tariff rate on Chinese imports to about 130 per cent.

The move came in response to Beijing's October 9, 2025 decision to impose sweeping new controls on rare earth exports, which are indispensable for US defense, electric vehicles, and clean-energy industries.

At present, US tariffs on Indian goods are 50 per cent, more than that of China's 30 per cent.

White House lays off thousands of US govt workers, blaming shutdown

Washington, Oct 11: President Donald Trump on Friday blamed Democrats for his decision to lay off thousands of workers across the US government as he followed through on his threat to cut the federal workforce during the government shutdown.

Job cuts were under way at the Treasury Department, the US health agency, the Internal Revenue Service and the departments of education, commerce, and Homeland Security's cybersecurity division, spokespeople said, but the total extent of the layoffs was not immediately clear. Roughly 300,000 federal civilian workers had already been set to leave their jobs this year due to a downsizing campaign initiated earlier this year by

"They started this thing," Trump told reporters during an event in the Oval Office, calling the job cuts "Democrat-oriented."

Trump's Republicans hold majorities in both chambers of Congress, but need Democratic votes in the US Senate to pass any measure that would fund the government.

Democrats are holding out for an extension of health-insurance subsidies, arguing health costs will increase dramatically for many of the



24 million Americans who get their coverage through the Affordable Care Act.

Trump has repeatedly threatened to fire federal workers during the shutdown standoff, in its 10th day on Friday, and has suggested his administration will aim primarily at parts of the government championed by Democrats.

Trump has also ordered the freezing of at least \$28 billion in infrastructure funds for New York, California and Illinois — all home to sizable populations of Democratic voters and critics of the

The Justice Department

said in a court filing more than 4,200 federal employ-

ees had gotten layoff notices at seven agencies, including more than 1,400 at the Treasurv Department and at least 1,100 at the Department of Health and Human Services.

Democrats said they will not cave to Trump's pressure

"Until Republicans get serious, they own this — every job lost, every family hurt, every service gutted is because of their decisions," Senate Democratic Leader Chuck Schumer said. Labor unions representing federal workers have sued to stop the layoffs, saying they would be illegal during a shutdown.

The administration said in a Friday court filing that the unions' request should be denied because they lack the legal right to sue over federal personnel decisions.

A federal judge is due to hear the case on October 15.

The government is required by law to give workers 60 days' notice ahead of any layoffs, though that can be shortened to 30 days.

Some Republicans objected to the layoffs, including Senator Susan Collins, the chair of the Senate Appropriations

"Regardless of whether federal employees have been

working without pay or have been furloughed, their work is incredibly important to serving the public," Collins said in a statement.

Earlier in the day, White House budget director Russell Vought wrote on social media that: "The RIFs had begun," referring to so-called reductions in force. A spokesperson for the budget office characterized the cuts as 'substantial," without offering further details.

The announcement came on the same day that many federal workers were due to get reduced paychecks that do not include any pay for the days since the shutdown began. Hundreds of thousands have been ordered not to report to work, while others have been ordered to keep working without pay. The nation's 2 million active-duty troops will miss their October 15 paycheck entirely if the shutdown is not resolved before then.

Employees across multiple divisions of the Department of Health and Human Services have received layoff notices, communications director Andrew Nixon said. The 78,000 workers at the sprawling agency monitor disease outbreaks, fund medical research, and perform a wide range of other health-related duties.

Trump to visit Israel, Egypt as Gaza deal secures hostages, peace efforts



Washington, Oct 11: US President Donald Trump on Friday (local time) outlined his upcoming visits to Israel and Egypt, following the Israeli government's approval of phase one of the Gaza peace plan.

Describing the ceasefire agreement between Israel and Hamas as a "great deal" for the world. Trump said that the deal would secure the release of hostages and the return of approximately 28 bodies.

"It is a great deal for Israel, but it's a great deal for everybody, for Arabs, for Muslims, everybody, for the world. On Monday, the hostages come back. They're in some pretty rough places under Earth. Only a few people know where they are... They're also getting approximately 28 bodies. Some of those bodies are being unearthed right now as we speak. It's a tragedy. I'll be going to Israel. I'll be speaking at the Knesset. Then I'm also going to Egypt. Everybody wants this deal to happen," Trump told reporters at the White House.

Trump added that the agreement represents a broader step towards peace in the Middle East.

"I think Gaza is going to be rebuilt. There are some very wealthy countries there. It would take a small fraction of their wealth to do that. Gaza is very important, but this is beyond Gaza. This is peace in the Middle East. It is a beautiful thing," the US President said while noting that he will address the Knesset during his visit.

Earlier, the Israeli government voted in favour of a ceasefire and hostage release agreement under US President Donald Trump's 20-point Gaza Peace Plan, CNN reported. This came as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu initially convened Israel's security cabinet to discuss the decision, and subsequently, held a meeting with

US targets Iran's energy trade; 8 Indian nationals, several firms sanctioned

Washington, Oct 11: Eight Indian nationals and several India-based firms are among the over 50 entities and persons sanctioned by the US for allegedly facilitating Iranian energy trade, according to an official statement. The State Department

imposed sanctions on approximately 40 entities, individuals and vessels to "deny the Iranian regime funds it uses to conduct its malign activity," the department said in a press release on Thursday.

While the Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) concurrently imposed sanctions on over 50 entities, persons and vessels. involved in exporting Iranian petroleum and liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) to global markets. The lists released by the two



departments included eight Indi-restrictions on entry to the US. an nationals, who were added to Washington's list of "Specially Designated Nationals (SDN) and Blocked Persons". Those on the list are barred from doing business with Americans and face
