# From Art 370 to Op Sindoor, Modi govt broke all walls of terrorism: Amit Shah

HM says forces ensure terrorists don't find safe havens anywhere within or outside India

Srinagar, Oct 14: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said that from the abrogation of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir to Operation Sindoor, the Narendra Modiled Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government broke all walls of terrorism.

Speaking at the 41st Raising Day of the National Security Guard (NSG) at its headquarters in Manesar, Shah, as per the news agency - Kashmir News Observer (KNO), said the government's approach follows a "zero tolerance" policy toward terrorism.

He mentioned amendments to the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), new definitions of terrorism in criminal laws, and bans on organisations such as the Popular Front of India (PFI) as part of this

Shah said that Operation Sindoor successfully destroyed



Pakistani terror bases, training camps, and launch sites. He added that in Operation Mahadev, Indian security forces conducted targeted operations to neutralise those responsible for the Pahalgam attack, boosting public confidence in the armed forces.

The Home Minister said that under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the government maintains a zero-tolerance approach toward terrorism. "The campaign against terror has been broad and coordinated, from the abrogation of Article 370 to surgical strikes, airstrikes, and Operation Sindoor, aiming at dismantling the core of terrorist networks," he said.

"No matter where terrorists try to hide, they cannot find safe havens. Our forces are prepared to take action anywhere to respond to acts of terror," he added. Shah said that since 2019, the

# **India's response to** Pahalgam massacre was precise: Lt Gen Ghai

'IAF hit 11 Pakistani air bases'

New Delhi, Oct 14: Director General Military Operations (DGMO) and Army's Deputy Chief Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai on Tuesday said that India's military response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack was measured, meticulously planned and carried out with precision.

Speaking at a function here, Lt Gen Ghai, according to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) described the Pahalgam attack in which 26 tourists were shot dead by terrorists — as a "sponsored" cross-Line of Control (LoC) strike in which terrorists singled out victims on the basis of community. "They asked for the community that they came from and shot them in cold blood in front of their families and

loved ones," he said. "There were immediate claimers; this was 'glory'. However, when the Kashmir Resistance Front initially claimed the attack, they



realised that matters had possibly gone beyond their control, and they immediately withdrew," Lt Gen Ghai added, underscoring that while a response was inevitable, the armed forces intentionally took time to plan and prioritise targets.

# **Coalition cracks** widen in J&K

**Congress submits** 'scathing' report to high command against NC

AICC leadership to decide on RS voting, by-elections

Srinagar, Oct 14: The tension between ruling alliance partners in Jammu & Kashmir has escalated, with the J&K unit of the Congress on Tuesday submitting a 'scathing' report to the party high command against its ally, the National Conference (NC), over "reneging" on its "commitment" to offer the party a "safe seat" in the Rajya Sabha elections, "violating" the principles of coalition dharma, and "sidelining" its MLAs in the decision-making process.

Sources told news agency -Kashmir News Observer (KNO), that the detailed report is based on the views and opinions of party leaders over "betrayal" by NC with the Congress leadership in the Rajya Sabha polls and a "violation" of coalition ethics by the National Conference

"The high command has been informed that the party leadership in Jammu and Kashmir is anguished over the backtracking of commitment by the National Conference leadership with senior leader Sonia Gandhi over Rajya Sabha polls," they said, adding that the high command has also been told there is mounting pressure on the PCC leadership to pull -out from the government.

The report also contains details how the National Conference has turned a "deaf ear" to the party's suggestion of forming a coordination committee for the smooth functioning of the coalition.

It also accuses National Conference of sidelining Congress MLAs in decision-making process and governance.

Sources disclosed that Congress unit of J&K has also given its feedback to the party high command about voting in Rajya Sabha polls as well as the party's strategy in bye-elections.

"The high command will take a final call on the party's strategy for the Rajya Sabha polls as well as the by-elections for Budgam and Nagrota seats," | More on P6

Srinagar, Oct 14: Two infiltrators were killed after security forces foiled an infiltration attempt along the Line of Control in Machil sector of north Kashmir's Kupwara district, officials said on Tuesday.

Officials told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that based on specific intelligence input, a joint operation by the Army and Jammu and Kashmir Police was launched in Machil sector on October 13.

Alert troops noticed suspicious movement near the LoC and challenged the infiltrators, who opened indiscriminate fire. In the ensuing gunfight, two terrorists were neutralized.

A large quantity of weapons and other war-like stores were recovered from the encounter site, officials added. (KNO)

Srinagar, Oct 14: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Tuesday said that the agriculture sector in Jammu and Kashmir holds immense potential and requires focused attention towards value addition to unlock full gamut of business opportunities across Jammu and Kashmir.

The Chief Minister made these remarks while addressing the National Executive Committee Meeting of the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce



Srinagar.

The meeting was attended by FICCI President Harsh Vardhan Agarwal, Senior Vice President Anant Goenka, Director General FICCI Jyoti Vij, Past President Dr. Jyotsna Suri, Chairman FICCI J&K Council Mushtaq A. Burza, and members of the National Executive Council.

Highlighting the immense potential of the agriculture sector, the Chief Minister said that most of the produce from Jammu and Kashmir leaves the region in its raw form, with very little processing or value addition being done locally.

"This opens significant opportunities for industrial growth, both on Jammu side and

Kashmir's side," he stated. Citing the dairy sector as an example, CM Abdullah said that only about 4–5 percent of the J&K's dairy production is processed within Jammu & Kashmir, while the rest goes unprocessed into the market. He urged industry leaders to explore these areas for investment and growth. Referring to the broader eco-

nomic scenario, Omar said that the J&K has faced challenges due to recent natural calamities and the downturn in tourism following the Pahalgam incident, but the administration remains optimistic about revival across sectors. # **Need for time-bound execution of USOF programme: CS**

Reviews progress on mobile, internet connectivity in shadow areas

SRINAGAR, OCTOBER 14: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo Tuesday emphasized the need for coordinated and timebound execution of the Union Government's Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF) programme aimed at expanding mobile network and 4G connectivity in shadow areas of the Union Territory.

He made these remarks while chairing a high-level meeting convened to review the status of mobile tower installation and network coverage across the uncovered areas of J&K.

The meeting was attended by Additional Chief Secretary, Public Works (R&B); Commissioner Secretary, Forests; Secretary, Information Technology; Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir; Secretary, Rural Development



Department; Chief General Manager, BSNL; and other senior officers.

During the review, the Chief Secretary directed both Divisional Commissioners to take weekly appraisals of the progress made on each identified site. He asked them to closely monitor the pace of tower construction, electricity provisioning, and

land-related issues, ensuring that every

tower is made functional at the earliest. He also reviewed the status of NoCs from the Forest Department for tower erection and laying of electricity networks and directed for early resolution of such matters through inter-depart-

mental coordination. The Chief Secretary instructed the IT

Department to act as the nodal agency for the programme, ensuring effective coordination among all stakeholder departments and timely removal of operational bottlenecks. Reviewing the extension of 4G network coverage under Bharat Net and Amended Bharat Net Programmes, the Chief Secretary observed that enhanced digital connectivity in these network shadow areas will significantly strengthen grassroots-level empowerment, governance delivery, and access to public services.

He urged BSNL, the implementing agency, to expedite tower installations and ensure early commissioning. The company was advised to flag any implementation hurdles with the IT Department for prompt redressal.

The Chief Secretary was informed that out of a total 847 identified sites, BSNL has applied for electric connections at 744 sites, of which 505 sites have been energized. Additionally, 466 towers have been put on air, 98 more have been erected, and 95 others are ready for commissioning. Seven sites are off-grid and 19 are currently under execution.

BSNL representatives apprised the Chief Secretary that land issues persist at around 30 locations, for which he directed the concerned Deputy Commissioners to resolve matters at the earliest to avoid project delays.

The Chief Secretary also reviewed the implementation of the 'Call Before U Dig' (CBuD) initiative, highlighting its importance in preventing avoidable damage to road infrastructure. He directed the PWD to enforce mandatory use of the app before any road excavation, maintain strict vigilance, and initiate legal action against violators.

It was informed that the portal currently has 40 registered agencies and 403 asset owners, with 176 unauthorized excavation instances recorded in the past.

The meeting was also apprised that 5G infrastructure mapping is underway, with around 1,58,126 assets including electric poles, traffic lights, bus terminals, and government buildings already mapped by H&UDD so far.

Regarding the Amended Bharat Net project, it was informed that 4,299 Gram Panchayats are targeted for coverage across the UT, providing high-speed internet connectivity to government institutions and the public.

Implemented by the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), the project has a three-year timeline, with 10% Gram Panchayats to be commissioned by December 2025 and 30% by June 2026.

# Apple demand prices hike by 30%

Srinagar, Oct 14: After facing over a month of sluggish demand and falling prices, apple growers in Kashmir are finally witnessing some relief as rates have started to climb.

According to traders and farmers, the demand for Kashmiri apples has improved over the past week, pushing prices up by nearly 30 per cent.

Bashir Ahmad Basheer, president of the Kashmir Valley Fruit Growers Cum Dealers Union, said the turnaround has brought a glimmer of hope to the community after weeks of distress.

"The rates have started going up as demand has increased in various mar-kets outside Kashmir. We expect prices to improve further in the coming days, which could help growers recover at least part of the losses they suffered earlier," he said.

Basheer added that the government's "indifference" towards the crisis faced by orchardists has deepened their financial woes.

"A majority of the growers have already suffered heavy losses this season due to low demand, poor rates, highway closure, freight rise and other issues. Unfortunately, the government has so far failed to provide any compensation or relief," he said.

Local farmers echoed similar concerns, expressing cautious optimism about the current rise in rates but

warning that recovery may still take time.

Abdul Rashid, an apple grower from Shopian, said that the last month was "one of the worst" in recent years.

"We were forced to sell apples at throwaway prices. The rates were so low that they didn't even cover transport and packaging costs. Now, with the demand improving, we are hopeful the next few weeks will be better." he said.

Another grower, Mohammad Yousuf from Sopore, said many farmers had to delay sales in the hope of better prices. "Those who stored their apples are now in a better position as the market has started responding. If the demand continues to rise, it could bring some relief to us," he said.

Traders in the other fruit mandis also confirmed an uptick in market activity. They said demand from many Indian states has improved slightly due to festive season needs, leading to higher prices for A- and B-grade apples.

Experts believe the next few weeks will be crucial for the fruit market, as consistent demand could stabilise rates and help offset the losses growers incurred earlier in the season.

Meanwhile, farmers have reiterated their appeal to the government for compensation and support, saying the horticulture sector—one of the backbones of Kashmir's economy-needs urgent attention to prevent long-

## Dy CM calls for Indo-Pak dialogue

Baramulla, Oct 14: Deputy Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, Surinder Kumar Choudhary on Tuesday called for dialogue between India and Pakistan, saying engagement and talks are better alternatives to conflict.

"If India's team can play with Pakistan's team, and if Afghanistan's Minister can come here and hold talks, then what is the harm in talking to Pakistan? That's why I don't think that today is the era of war," Choudhary, told reporters in Baramulla.

Reacting to statements by the Western Army Commander on possible Pakistani aggression along the LoC, he said, "Those who comment on conflicts from afar should visit the border to witness the reality. What the general says is not new. This has been a common situation for us".

Choudhary said that J&K has faced repeated conflicts since 1947 and has undergone significant changes, including its transition from a state to a Union Territory. "So, there is nothing new for J&K. The people of J&K are brave and patriotic. They have always kept the flag high and stood behind our troops whenever there was a war," he said, adding that war is not the solution

to any problem. He warned that modern warfare is destructive for both countries and especially for civilians. "This war is not like the wars of the past. This is a war of technology. In



today's world, attacks can be launched from Pakistan and reach anywhere, while our forces can respond from Delhi or other locations to any corner of Pakistan. The poor people, who have nothing to do with these conflicts and do not even understand the full meaning of war, are the ones who suffer the most," he said.

### CM deny ticket to Congress at behest of BJP: Sajad Lone

Srinagar, Oct 14: Peoples Conference (PC) Chairman Sajad Gani Lone on Tuesday announced that he will not vote for National Conference (NC) candidates in the upcoming Rajya Sabha elections. Lone accused the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir of aligning with the BJP and betraying Congress.

Lone said he recently saw a video clip in which the Chief Minister suggested that anyone not supporting the NC in the Rajya Sabha polls is effectively siding with the BJP. He criticized this stance, arguing that such rhetoric paints even Congress and others as BJP supporters, which he called "astonishing."

Recalling past political events, Lone accused the NC, particularly Omar Abdullah, of misleading the people of Jammu and Kashmir in the 2024 elections. "We lost the elections, and our expectations were shattered. How many times must we be blamed for the same thing?" he said, questioning the NC's repeated



Lone challenged the Chief Minister to prove that the denial of a Rajya Sabha seat to Congress was not done on BJP's instructions. He claimed that the CM had traveled to Delhi under controversial circumstances in the past, notably before the abrogation of Article 370, and accused the NC of backstabbing Congress.

Highlighting Congress's consistent opposition to BJP, Lone said, "There is only one party that is truly anti-BJP and that is Congress. The NC has collaborated with BJP before, but Congress has never done so." He added that on the issue of restoring statehood to Jammu and Kashmir. only Congress could play a pivotal

role since BJP was unwilling. Lone also criticized Omar

Abdullah for damaging his party's credibility by allegedly burning bridges with Congress after receiving their support in the 2024 elections. "You must now prove you're not with BJP," Lone argued, adding that the recent actions of the NC only benefit the BIP.

Addressing his own position, Lone said he would never vote for the National Conference, either ideologically or practically. He also pointed out the hardships faced by ordinary Kashmiris under the current administration, citing the example of a worker whose ailing mother was denied a transfer.

Lone questioned the Chief Minister's leadership and motives, referencing Omar Abdullah's interactions with BJP leaders, time spent with BJP officials, and a history of aligning with them on key decisions. He challenged the NC to clarify its position and asked, "What could be better news for BJP than you denying Congress the seat?"—(KNO)

# Paintball fever grips valley

Srinagar, Oct 14: Wearing a safety vest and uniform while splattering colours across a mock battlezone, paintball is fast winning hearts in Kashmir.

Once known mainly for cricket and football, the valley is now witnessing a fresh wave of recreational excitement as paintball – the global combat sport born in the U.S. makes its entry in Srinagar's Rajbagh.

It all began with young entrepreneur Tajamul, who transformed the top floor of a building in Rajbagh into Kashmir's first and only indoor paintball arena. The game offers a taste of action long missing from the region's leisure scene

"I wanted to bring something new to Kashmir, something that takes people away from their



and lets them enjoy in a safe, exciting way," Tajamul said while holding paintballs in his hand and briefing players about the game.

He said paintball is not just about shooting colours but about teamwork, bonding, and unforgettable moments. "Players gear up in two teams, helmets and protective safety vests before charging into friendly battles that

It is worth mentioning that the sport, which originated in the 1980s in the United States, has become a global craze with arenas in cities like Delhi, Bengaluru and Mumbai. For Kashmir, where recreational infrastructure has long remained limited, the entry of paintball marks a refreshing shift. About the introduction of

this sport, Tajamul said he has been trying to bring this game to the valley since 2017. "We introduced paintball in Kashmir in 2017, and now, after so many years, we have started the arena in Rajbagh," he said.

"Families, kids, students, married couples and even office-goers are showing up to try their hand at the game, which has quickly turned into a popular activity," he added, noting that many say it is not just about fun but also about building fitness, bonding with your family, and staying active.

Tajamul further said the venture was not easy. "Bringing the gear, setting up a safe arena and convincing people that it's an all-season adventure - all of that took time. But once people tried it, they loved it," he said with a

## A Wake-Up Call For Digital Vigilance In Kashmir

The massive crackdown on the Robust Secure Network (RSN) platform in Ganderbal, with 4,500 accounts under investigation, exposes a disturbing trend of financial exploitation targeting vulnerable communities. This elaborate scheme, promising unrealistic returns through digital platforms, has ensnared thousands, particularly the youth, in a web of deception that now threatens both their financial security and legal standing. The modus operandi

reveals calculated manipulation: young individuals are being recruited to mislead elders into "investing" in non-existent insurance policies, while others are lured by promises of quick wealth. Such schemes prey on economic anxiety and digital illiteracy, exploiting trust within communities. The consequences extend beyond financial loss, as authorities rightly warn; such situations often culminate in personal tragedies, including suicides, when the house

of cards eventually collapses. This case underscores several urgent concerns. First, the a need for enhanced financial literacy, particularly regarding digital investments. Second, the responsibility of families is to monitor the financial activities of younger members who might be either victims or perpetrators in such schemes. Third, the importance of verifying the legitimacy of any investment platform before committing funds. While the enforcement actions

by the Crime Branch and ED are commendable, prevention must be our primary strategy. Educational institutions, religious centres, and community organisations should collaborate with financial institutions to conduct awareness campaigns about identifying and avoiding fraudulent schemes. The administration's warning about potential PSA invocation indicates the seriousness with which they view this threat to public order and financial security.

However, lasting solutions lie in empowerment through education rather than solely through enforcement. With digital platforms becoming increasingly embedded in our daily lives, this case serves as a crucial reminder: if an investment opportunity appears too good to be true, it almost certainly is. Our collective vigilance, coupled with institutional accountability, can build stronger defences against those who would exploit hope for personal gain.

# Building Inclusive Workplaces: Empowering Women For A Viksit Bharat

#### Nari Shakti at the Heart of Viksit Bharat

Imagine a nation where every woman, from rural artisan to urban innovator, steps into the workforce not as a participant, but as a powerhouse driving economic transformation. This is the promise of Viksit Bharat, that envisions a developed India by 2047, centring women's economic inclusion and empowering them through education, skills, safety, and entrepreneurship to unleash Nari Shakti for national growth.

One of the key pillars of achieving Viksit Bharat is ensuring at least 70 percent workforce participation by women, making them equal stakeholders in India's growth story.

### Advancing Women's Workforce Participation

India has witnessed a remarkable increase in the female workforce participation rate. Women employment rate nearly doubled between 2017-18 to 2023-24. Data from The Ministry of Labour and Employment states that female Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) increased from 23.3% in 2017-18 to 41.7% in 2023-24.

Worker Population Ratio (WPR) for women aged 15 years and above rose from 22% in 2017-18 to 40.3% in 2023-24, LFPR increased from 23.3% to 41.7%.

More recently, Female WPR rose to 32.0% in August 2025 from 31.6% in July 2025 and 30.2% in June 2025 and Female LFPR increased to 33.7% in August 2025 from 33.3% in July 2025 and 32.0% in June 2025.

Besides, latest EPFO payroll data highlights a growing trend of formal employment among women. During 2024–25, 26.9 lakh net female subscribers were added to EPFO. In July 2025, ~2.80 lakh new female subscribers joined and the net female payroll addition stood at ~4.42 lakh, asserting today's more inclusive and diverse workforce.

#### India's Rise in Women's Workforce Participation Across BRICS

Over the past decade, India has recorded the most significant rise in women's labour force participation among the BRICS nations, according to World Bank Data. Between 2015 and 2024, India's female labour force participation rate has surged, with a growth of over 23%. In contrast, Brazil, China, and Russia experienced either stagnation or slight declines, while South Africa posted only modest gains.

This upward trajectory reflects India's rapid transformation in women's economic inclusion, driven by targeted policy initiatives that expand access to skills, credit, and formal employment.

The country's decade-long momentum positions it as a model of inclusive growth within BRICS, demonstrating that sustained policy focus can transform women's economic empowerment into a national growth driver.

### Legal Framework for Women's Workplace Empowerment

Labour laws in India cover a wide range of provisions aimed at regulating employment and ensuring the protection and welfare of women workers. A summary of the key legal safeguards and entitlements for women employees is provided below:

#### Maternity Benefit Act, 1961 (Amended 2017)

The Maternity Benefit Act, 1961, which provides maternity benefits to women employees, was amended in 2017 that extends maternity leave from 12 to 26 weeks. In addition to granting maternity leave, the Act mandates that employers with 50 or more employees must establish and maintain a crèche within the workplace. This crèche is intended to cater to the needs of children, ensuring a convenient way for



working mothers to leave their children in a safe space during working hours. Now the act also includes provisions for surrogate mothers, aiming to support and promote women's participation in the workforce.

According to the BRICS Women's Development Report 2025, India stands out for its generous paid maternity leave provisions, offering 182 days—the second longest in the group, behind only Iran's 270 days. This exceeds durations in other BRICS nations, such as Brazil, South Africa, and Ethiopia (120 days each), Egypt and Indonesia (90 days each), and the UAE (60 days). The report emphasises India's position as a leader in fostering family-friendly workplaces to enhance women's retention and participation.

### Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, 2013

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013, plays a pivotal role in fostering a safe and secure working environment by actively preventing and addressing instances of sexual harassment in the workplace, indirectly enhancing women's participation in the workforce.

One of its key provisions is the mandatory creation of Internal Complaints Committees (ICCs) within organisations, which are responsible for addressing complaints related to sexual harassment and ensuring a fair and confidential redressal process.

The ICC comprises both internal and external members, including a presiding officer, representatives from among employees, and a member from a non- governmental organization or association committed to women's rights. The Act outlines the procedures and timeframes for the resolution of complaints, promoting a workplace culture that prioritises the dignity and well-being of women employees.

The POSH act also requires district administrations to constitute a Local Complaints Committee (LCC) in each district to focus on cases where the complaints are lodged against the employer themselves or in organisations with less than 10 employees where an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is not constituted.

#### **Equal Remuneration Act, 1976**

This Act, is a significant legislation designed to eliminate gender-based wage discrimination and emphasises the principle of equal pay for equal work, ensuring women receive the same remuneration for

identical or similar work. The Act promotes fairness, non-discrimination, and equal opportunities for both male and female workers, fostering a more equitable work environment.

According to the BRICS Women's Development Report 2025, India ranks 120th globally in gender pay equity (2024 data), closely mirroring peers like Brazil (118th), Iran (114th), and South Africa (113th), while trailing behind China (14th) and UAE (10th). Note that the higher the ranking, the better the situation of equal pay for men and women. This positioning underscores India's progress in bridging pay gap.

#### Code on Social Security, 2020

This Code, strengthens protections for women by extending maternity, health, and social security benefits to all categories of workers, including those in the unorganised and platform sectors.

The Code also emphasises inclusivity across all sectors of employment under the Employees' State Insurance Scheme, notably extending its benefits to plantation workers. This provision is particularly beneficial for women engaged in tea and coffee plantations, providing them with essential support and ensuring their well-being.

#### The Occupational Safety, Health, and Working Conditions Code, 2020

This Code incorporates specific provisions to address the occupational safety, health, and welfare of workers including women. It emphasises a secure and healthy working environment, with attention to women's unique health needs and mandates free annual health checkups for all workers. This Code allows women to work night shifts with their consent, provided employers ensure their safety. It also requires employers to offer transportation for women working at night, reinforcing protection for female employees across work settings.

The law also mandates that employers ensure adequate safety measures for women in hazardous occupations and provide crèche facilities for children under the age of six in establishments with over fifty workers, as prescribed by the Government.

#### Workplace Inclusivity in Government Sector

The Government has undertaken various women-centric initiatives to promote inclusivity in the workplace, workplace

wellness and holistic wellbeing of female employees in Government service. These, measures, among other things include:

### Empowering Women through Skills and Employment

A range of employment and skill development initiatives have been launched by the Government across Ministries to enhance women's participation in the workforce, equipping them with market-relevant skills, entrepreneurial opportunities, and pathways to economic independence.

Empowering women through skills and employment initiatives has been a key focus of the government, with various schemes launched across different ministries to enhance women's participation in the workforce. These initiatives aim to equip women with market-relevant skills, promote entrepreneurial opportunities, and pave pathways toward economic independence.

One such scheme is the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), managed by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE). This program enables youth to undertake industry-relevant skill training, with approximately 45% of the candidates being women, thus fostering greater female participation in skill-based employment.

The Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY), overseen by the Ministry of Finance, focuses on funding micro-enterprises and small businesses that are often led by women. Notably, over 68% of the account holders under this scheme are women, contributing significantly to the growth of women-led enterprises across India.

Similarly, the Stand-Up India scheme aims to empower SC, ST, and women entrepreneurs, with over 2.01 lakh womenowned accounts as of March 2025. This initiative helps facilitate financial inclusion and entrepreneurial development among marginalized women.

The Start Up India program, managed by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, supports innovation and startup growth nationwide. It has successfully fostered over 75,000 women-led startups, encouraging female entrepreneurs to contribute to the country's economic dynamism.

In the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) fields, the WISE-KIRAN initiative by the Department of Science and Technology focuses on increasing women's participation at various career stages, promoting gender diversity in these critical sectors.

Finally, the NAVYA program—collaboratively managed by the Ministry of Women and Child Development and the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship—targets girls aged 16 to 18. It provides training in emerging sectors such as digital marketing and cybersecurity, along with modules on hygiene, conflict management, communication skills, workplace safety, and financial literacy, thereby supporting holistic development and employment readiness for young women.

#### **Enabling Ecosystems for Working**

#### SHe-Box (MWCD)

The Ministry of Women and Child Development launched the SHe-Box portal, an online system designed to help in better implementation of various provisions of 'The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013' (SH Act). This Act mandates the appropriate Government to monitor its implementation and maintain data on the number of cases filed and disposed of.

The SHe-Box portal provides a publicly available centralised repository of information related to Internal Committees (ICs) and Local Committees (LCs) constituted at various workplaces, whether in government or private sector, and also an end-to-end integrated complaint monitoring

system. It provides for designating a nodal officer for every workplace who is required to ensure updating of data/ information on a regular basis for real time monitoring of complaints.

#### Mission Shakti

The Ministry of Women and Child Development implemented 'Mission Shakti' on April 01, 2024 which aims at strengthening interventions for women safety, security and empowerment. The objective of this Mission is to provide to all women and girls including differentlyabled, socially and economically marginalised and vulnerable groups, who are in need of care and protection, with short term and long-term services and information for their holistic development and empowerment.

The Mission Shakti has two verticals 'Sambal' and 'Samarthya'.

#### Sambal (Safety & Security)

One Stop Centres (OSC): Provide integrated support to women facing violence through medical aid, legal assistance, psychological counselling, and shelter services under one roof.

Women Helpline (181-WHL): A 24/7 tollfree service connecting women to emergency response systems (police, fire, ambulance) and One Stop Centres.

Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP): Aims to ensure survival, protection, education and empowerment of the girl child.

Nari Adalat: Offers a community-level grievance redressal platform at Gram Panchayat level to address issues such as harassment, denial of rights, and petty disputes.

### Samarthya (Empowerment & Rehabilitation)

Shakti Sadan: An Integrated Relief and Rehabilitation Home for women in distressful situations including trafficked women.

Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY): Provides financial compensation for loss of wages due to pregnancy and childbirth, now extended to the second child if it is a girl, promoting gender equity. Sakhi Niwas: Ensures safe, affordable

accommodation and day-care facilities for working and aspiring women.

Palna: Expands access to quality crèche

facilities through Anganwadi centres, offering childcare for children under six in a safe, nurturing environment. SANKALP: Hub for Empowerment of

SANKALP: Hub for Empowerment of Women (HEW): Bridges information gaps about government schemes, assists women in availing benefits, and acts as a project monitoring unit for Mission Shakti initiatives.

#### Conclusion

Over the last decade, India is witnessing an unprecedented transformation in women's workforce participation. With landmark reforms, expanding skill development, enhanced maternity and childcare benefits, and initiatives like Mission Shakti, the Government has created a strong foundation for inclusive and supportive workplaces.

The steady rise in women joining the labour force, the surge in women-led enterprises, and the mainstreaming of gender-sensitive policies signal a new era where Nari Shakti is powering the nation's growth. From village entrepreneurs to corporate leaders, women are increasingly shaping India's economic and social landscape.

He directed officers from the Drug Control department to ensure sealing of medical establishments that fail to comply with installation of CBS and CCTV systems, and called for stringent action against drug peddlers. The DC directed CMO for establishing a facility for drugs testing at the District Hospital. He also directed BDOs and Social Welfare department to enhance awareness under Nasha Mukt Abhiyan to sensitize the public about the ill effects of drug abuse.

# CS terms PMGS to serve as a holistic planning tool

SRINAGAR, OCTOBER 14: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo Tuesday chaired a meeting of Administrative Secretaries to review the progress made on the PM Gati Shakti (PMGS) portal, with a special focus on uploading of thematic data layers to strengthen evidencebased planning across Jammu and Kashmir.

During the meeting, the Chief Secretary emphasized the need for comprehensive and coordinated data integration on the portal. He directed all concerned departments to upload data layers pertaining to Mission YUVA and the Holistic Agriculture Development Programme (HADP) besides incorporating the digitized land bank created by the Forest Department, to enable inclusive and informed decision-making.

Underscoring the importance of leveraging the Gati Shakti platform for social sector interventions, Dulloo stressed on the mandatory inclusion of datasets related to education infrastructure, health indicators, employment statistics, drug hotspots, and disaster-prone areas. He said that consolidating such multi-sectoral information on a single digital platform would facilitate focused interventions and better resource planning.



The Chief Secretary also took stock of the Action Taken Report on his previous directions regarding the portal and reviewed progress made in transitioning from point data to polygon data for mapping departmental assets. He called upon departments such as Industries, Tourism, Power Development, Health, and Jal Shakti to expedite the transition and provide clear timelines for completion of the data uploads.

Highlighting the value of data-driven governance, Dulloo directed that relevant datasets be shared with research institutions to encourage analytical inputs and innovative solutions for improving developmental outcomes.

During meeting, Commissioner Secretary, Industries & Commerce, Vikramjit Singh gave a detailed presentation on the current status of the portal. He informed that all 28 mandatory data layers have been successfully uploaded by J&K, in addition to 608 supplementary

lavers, with the onboarding of 40 departments and conduct of over 100 major and 120 minor training sessions to build departmental capacity.

Providing further sights, Director, Industries & Commerce, Jammu, Arun Manhas, highlighted several new features and initiatives incorporated into the portal to enhance its utility. These include the Unified Geospatial Interface PMGS offshore integration, Management Knowledge System for sharing best practices, Decentralized Data Sharing Module, formulation of District Master Plans in Aspirational Districts, and the rollout of the LEAPS 2025 framework for effective monitoring and implementation.

The Chief Secretary appreciated the efforts made so far and urged all departments to ensure real-time data updation and cross-sectoral linkages to make the PM Gati Shakti portal a comprehensive planning and monitoring tool for accelerated development across J&K.

# Govt panel recommends measures to achieve 100 GW nuclear capacity target

New Delhi, Oct 14: From legislative amendments to increasing uranium production in India, a government committee has made several recommendations to overcome the challenges facing the 100 GW nuclear capacity target by 2047.

These measures will not

only attract private investment in nuclear space but also help with faster clearances required to set up such projects.

In February, Ministry of Power had constituted a committee to prepare a 'Road Map for Achieving the goal of 100 GW of Nuclear Capacity by 2047'.

The committee has held several rounds of discussions on all aspects of the journey towards 100 GW by 2047 and identified several challenges facing the target and recommended measures needed to mitigate the same. The present nuclear installed capacity in the country is 8.88 GW.

The committee estimates that the incremental investment required to achieve 100 GW capacity based on anticipated capacity mix will be Rs 19 lakh crore.

Amendments to Atomic Energy Act, 1962 and Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act, 2010 (CLNDA) would be essential to bring much needed private capital and to ease risk perception of sup-

pliers and potential investors.

The Atomic Energy Act, 1962 currently does not allow participation of private sector or even state governments in the nuclear projects. This, perhaps was considered necessary due to the need for stringent safety, security and safeguards in atomic power generation.

Further, suppliers and potential operators are apprehensive about some of the provision of the Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act. 2010.

has taken several steps to enhance national security. These include amendments to the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and the National Investigation Agency Act, along with actions under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act by the Enforcement Directorate to stop funding of terror groups, he said.

"For the first time, terrorism has been clearly defined under criminal law, addressing previous gaps. So far, more than 57 individuals and several organisations have been declared unlawful," Shah said.

The HM said the NSG's new hub is being established in Ayodhya, joining five existing hubs in Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, and Jammu to respond to terror threats quickly. The commandos will operate around the clock, with special groups ready to respond to any sudden terror attacks, he added.

These actions, Shah said, have made India's security forces capable of dismantling terror networks inside and outside the country. "We have ensured that terrorists do not find safe havens anywhere, whether inside India or abroad," he said.

On the NSG's role, the Home Minister said the force has been operating for over four decades and remains critical in the fight against terrorism and organised crime.

"The government will continue to strength-

"The government will continue to strengthen security measures and maintain readiness to respond to any threats, ensuring the safety of the nation's citizens," he said. (KNO)

targets that we scrutinised," he said, noting a concurrent "harmonised and proactive information warfare campaign."

Describing the military escalation in early May, Lt Gen Ghai said drone activity intensified even after two DGMOs had addressed the situation, prompting the Indian Air Force to act. In precision strikes on the nights of May 9 and 10, he said, Indian forces struck 11 Pakistani air bases — damaging eight bases, three hangars and four radars — and destroyed several

Pakistani air assets on the ground.

He also claimed the destruction of one C-130 class aircraft, one AEW (airborne early warning) platform, and "four to five fighter jets," with some assets also destroyed in the air.

"We now know that the world's longest ever ground-to-air kill was at 300 kilometres plus and five high-tech fighters," Lt Gen Ghai said, adding that the "impunity" with which the attacks were conducted by the perpetrators was a key factor prompting a strong response.

All figures and operational details were attributed by Lt Gen Ghai to India's operational account of the events. The DGMO emphasised that the deliberate timing and multi-service coordination of the response reflected the armed forces' flexibility and intent to deliver a carefully calibrated, effective retaliation.

The Army Deputy Chief while referring to the turmoil that prevailed in J&K for three decades, as per KNO, said, "Over 1,00,000 people, including around 60,000 minority families, had

to leave Jammu and Kashmir since 1990 due to threats and violence."

He said, "More than 15,000 civilians and 3,000 security personnel lost their lives in the region over the years." (KNO)

#### 'Op Sindoor 2.0'

Kashmir (PoK). The skirmishes that followed continued for 4-days until Pakistan Director General of Military Operations (DGMO) reached out to his counterpart in India and requested for a ceasefire.

In a strongly worded message, Lt Gen Katiyar said, "If Pakistan repeats what it did, then what we do next will be more than the last time. Operation Sindoor 2.0 has to be more powerful."

Lt Gen Katiyar said Pakistan follows a policy of causing harm through multiple smaller actions rather than open conflict. "It does not have the capacity to fight a war with us. It does not want to fight a war. Its actions are part of the policy of 'bleed India through a thousand cuts'," he said.

Asked if similar attacks like the one in Pahalgam could happen again, he said, "Until there is a change in Pakistan's thinking, it will continue with these actions."

Earlier during his address at an ex-servicemen rally held to mark 60 years since the 1965 India-Pakistan War ceasefire, Lt Gen Katiyar, as per KNO, said that public support played a key role during Operation Sindoor. "We acted after our people were killed. The response was carried out with the support of the administration, ex-servicemen, and local people."

He said the army remains prepared to act again if needed. "Pakistan will try again. It has always tried to repeat Pahalgam-type attacks. The army is ready to respond. The action this

time will be more than last time."
Referring to the 1965 war, Lt Gen Katiyar said that Pakistan had miscalculated the situation in Jammu and Kashmir. "They sent around 10,000 Razakars trained by their army. But they failed to understand the people here. The public supported the army. We were able to drive them back."

He said that the same level of support will be required if another response becomes necessary.

Lieutenant General Manoj Katiyar hailed Operation Sindoor, saying the Indian Army gave a befitting reply to Pakistan after the Pahalgam terror attack. "Terrorists killed our innocent people. Our befitting reply to Pakistan taught them a lesson."

He assured the public of the Indian Army's readiness to thwart future attacks by the neighbouring country. (KNO)

On the upcoming elections, Abdullah said the party would campaign on its record and future plans. "We will tell people about the work done in the past year and what we intend to achieve in the next four years. We hope the people of Budgam and Nagrota will place their trust in the National Conference once again," he added.

The CM also praised the district administration for the effective use of CAPEX and centrally sponsored schemes and urged them to complete ongoing projects in October, November and December to prevent any lapse of funds before March 31.

On regional developments, Omar said, "What happens in Pakistan and Afghanistan will not affect Jammu and Kashmir directly." He, however, emphasised the importance of peace across the subcontinent. "If our neighbours are fine and relations are stable, we will also be fine," he said. (KNO)

#### Tourism revival hasn't

Kashmir News Observer (KNO), said that there is a clear slowdown in our economy post the middle of April this year and that will have a bearing on the government's ability to be able to spend as the year goes to a close.

He said that the manufacturing, tourism, handicrafts, handlooms, and unfortunately because of the recent heavy rains and floods both in Jammu and in Kashmir, agriculture and horticulture have also not remained unscathed.

"Our own internal assessment is that coupled with the recent changes in the GST rates, which will obviously impact our GST earnings, we will have a hold on our GST earnings alone for anything in the range of 900 to 1000 crores this year. And for a state that anyway has a deficit financial position, 1000 crores is a lot of money to lose in terms of earnings in one year. But that said, this is not a situation of doom and gloom. It's not a story of pessimism. It's a story of hope. It's a story of optimism. It's a story of not looking backwards but looking forwards," he said

The Chief Minister said that he along with his colleagues and friends in the tourism industry is working hard to put things back on track.

"It hasn't been easy. It hasn't been a journey without challenges. We had hoped that the revival would be a little quicker than it has turned out to be. The fact is that while summer was an entirely lost season, in fact even autumn hasn't been as promising as we had hoped. We had hoped to see a reasonably strong tourism growth, particularly from the east of India, centred around the Punjab holidays," he said.

He also said that his year has been difficult - first, because of the Pahalgam terror attack and then the India-Pakistan conflict. "Then, in July, August, and September, there were heavy losses due to rain and flash floods. The result is that the condition in Jammu and Kashmir is very bad. For tourism promotion, one of our teams in Singapore. Southeast Asia is very big market for tourism, and we are trying to capitalise on that. We are also promoting tourism in Mumbai, Delhi, Bengaluru, Kolkata, Ahmedabad." he said.

Ahmedabad," he said.

"We draw a lot of our tourism from West Bengal and large groups from there, which unfortunately this year we didn't see in the numbers that we had hoped to. Now our next hope is for a decent winter season. We hear that this winter will be more extreme than past winters and that we can hope for more snow than perhaps in previous ones. If that's the case, then hopefully we will rebuild our tourism on the snow in Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

While speaking to media persons on the sidelines of the FICCI National Executive Committee meeting in Srinagar, the Chief Minister said that he has no knowledge about senior party leader and MP Aga Ruhullah Mehdi's decision to stay away from the National Conference's campaign for bypolls in Budgam.

Asked about Ruhullah's recent remark that he would not participate in the party's campaign for bypoll in Budgam, CM Omar said that he didn't know anything about him. (KNO)

# WHO issues global alert on substandard Indian cough syrups after child deaths

New Delhi, Oct 14: The World Health Organisation (WHO) has issued an alert against three "substandard" oral cough syrups identified in India -- Coldrif, Respifresh TR and ReLife -- and urged national regulatory authorities worldwide to immedi-

ately notify it if these are detected in

their country. It has also advised healthcare professionals to report the detection of these substandard products and any incident of adverse effects, or lack of expected effects to their national regulatory authorities or National Pharmacovigilance Centre.

The alert comes after at least 22 children, mostly under the age of five, have died due to suspected kidney failure after being administered Coldrif in Madhya Pradesh. Besides, at least three children have allegedly died in Rajasthan after consuming cough syrup in different districts of the state.

The WHO has further called for increased surveillance and diligence within the supply chains of countries



and regions likely to be affected by these substandard products.

"Increased surveillance of the informal/unregulated market is also advised," the alert issued on Monday said. The affected products are oral liquid medicines containing active ingredients commonly used to relieve symptoms of common cold, flu, or cough According to the

alert, the Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO) of India reported to WHO the presence of Diethylene Glycol (DEG) in at least three oral liquid medicines in October 8. This followed information identified by WHO on September 30 of localised clusters of acute illness and child fatalities in India

The CDSCO informed WHO that

the contaminated products were reportedly consumed by the affected children and confirmed that relevant state authorities have ordered an immediate halt to production at implicated manufacturing sites and have suspended product authorisations. In addition, a recall of the contaminated products has been initiated by relevant state authorities.

The contaminated oral liquid medicines have been identified to be specific batches of Coldrif, Respifresh TR and ReLife, manufactured by Sresan Pharmaceutical, Rednex Pharmaceuticals, and Shape Pharma, the alert said.

The alert stated the CDSCO has informed WHO that none of the contaminated medicines have been exported from India and there is currently no evidence of illegal export.

"Nevertheless, WHO encourages National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs) to consider targeted market surveillance, with particular attention to informal and unregulated supply chains where products may circulate undetected. NRAs are also advised to carefully evaluate risks

associated with any oral liquid medicines originating from the same manufacturing sites- particularly those produced since December 2024," the alert stated.

The products identified in this alert are considered substandard as they fail to meet their quality standards and their specifications. These contaminated products pose significant risks to patients and can cause severe and potentially life-threatening illness, the global health agency said. Diethylene glycol is toxic to humans when consumed and can prove fatal.The contaminated oral liquid medicines referenced in this alert are unsafe and their use, especially in children, may result in serious injury or death. Toxic effects can include abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhoea, inability to pass urine, headache, altered mental state and acute kidney injury which may lead to death. To protect patients, it is essential to detect and remove these contaminated products from circulation, the alert said.

"Healthcare professionals

should report the detection of these substandard products and any incident of adverse effects, or lack of expected effects to their National Regulatory Authorities or National Pharmacovigilance Centre. The WHO advises increased surveillance and diligence within the supply chains of countries and regions likely to be affected by these substandard products. Increased surveillance of the informal/unregulated market is also

National regulatory authorities and law enforcement authorities are advised to immediately notify the WHO if these products are detected in their country," the

"If you are in possession of any of these products, WHO recommends that you do not use them. If you, or someone you know, has, or may have, used these products, or suffered an adverse event or unexpected side-effect after use, seek immediate medical advice from a health-care professional or contact a poisons control centre.," it added.

# **BJP** releases list of 71 candidates for Bihar polls

New Delhi, Oct 14: The BJP on Tuesday released its first list of 71 candidates for the Bihar Assembly elections, fielding Deputy Chief Ministers Samrat Choudhary and Vijay Kumar Sinha from Tarapur and Lakhisarai seats, respectively, and six state ministers.

The list also includes nine women candidates, including sitting Minister

Renu Devi, who will seek re-election from the Bettiah Assembly constituency. Shreyasi Singh, a sitting MLA and Arjuna awardee, will contest from the Jamui seat, seeking another term.

Sitting ministers Mangal Pandey will contest from Siwan, Nitin Nabin from Bankipur, Nitish Mishra from Jhanjharpur, Krishna Kumar Mantoo from Amnour and Prem Kumar from Gaya Town.

### Why no CCTV cameras in interrogation room of police stations: SC asks Rajasthan govt



New Delhi, Oct 14: The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked the Rajasthan government why no CCTV cameras are installed in the interrogation room of police stations. A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta observed that interrogation room of a police station is the "main place" where CCTV cameras have to be there.

"As per your affidavit, there is no camera in the interrogation room which is the main place where cameras have to be there,' the bench said. The top court said installing CCTV cameras would entail cost but "it is a question of human rights".

It also asked the state how it proposes to have an oversight mechanism.

The bench was hearing a suo motu matter concerning lack of functional CCTVs in police stations.

On September 4, the apex court had taken suo motu cognisance of a media report which stated that 11 lives were lost in police custody in Rajasthan in the first eight months of 2025, of which seven incidents occurred in the Udaipur division.

The apex court had in 2018 ordered installation of CCTV cameras in police stations to check human rights abuses. During the hearing on Tuesday, the bench observed why cannot an agency be involved in the oversight process.

"The feed has to go to some centralised place or agency where there is an oversight," the bench said.

It also heard the submissions of senior advocate Siddhartha Dave, who was appointed as an amicus curiae to assist the court in a separate matter in which the top court had passed an order in December 2020.

# Google to invest \$15 bn in AI hub in Andhra; to partner Adani for India's largest data centre

New Delhi, Oct 14: Google will invest USD 15 billion over the next five years in setting up an AI hub in India, which will include the country's largest data centre in partnership with Adani Group.

The AI hub at Visakhapatnam in Andhra Pradesh will be Google's largest outside the US and will include 1-gigawatt data centre campus, new large-scale energy sources, and an expanded fiber-optic network, the tech super giant said.

"It's the largest AI hub that we are going to be investing in anywhere in the world outside of the US," Google Cloud CEO Thomas Kurian said at an event here to sign

The announcement was made during Bharat AI Shakti, a Google-hosted event in New Delhi which served as a precursor to the upcoming India-AI Impact Summit 2026. The event saw attendance of Electronics and IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, and Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, among others.

"Great to speak with India PM @narendramodi @ OfficialINDIAai to share our plans for the first-ever Google AI hub in Visakhapatnam, a landmark development.

'This hub combines gigawatt-scale compute capacity, a new international subsea gateway, and largescale energy infrastructure. Through it we will bring our industry-leading technology



to enterprises and users in India, accelerating AI innovation and driving growth across the country," Google CEO Sundar Pichai said in a

Separately, Adani Enterprises, the flagship firm of billionaire Gautam Adani's conglomerate said its joint venture company Adani-ConneX, and Google will develop India's largest AI data centre campus and new green energy infrastructure in Visakhapatnam.

Google's AI hub in Visakhapatnam is a multi-faceted investment of approximately USD 15 billion over five years (2026-2030), comprising gigawatt-scale data centre operations, supported by a robust subsea cable network and clean energy, to drive the most demanding AI workloads in India.

"It will be brought to life in close collaboration with ecosystem partners including AdaniConneX and Airtel," the company said in a statement.

It however did not indicate the investment in the data centre.

vestment in new transmission lines, clean energy generation and innovative energy storage systems in Andhra Pradesh, the firm said. "The Adani Group is proud to partner with Google on this historic project that will define the future of India's digital landscape," said Gautam Adani, Chairman of Adani Group. "This is more than just an investment in infrastructure. It is an investment in the soul of a rising nation.'

To unlock India's massive potential in the AI age, "we are investing in the Google AI hub, which will provide the critical foundation to drive growth and enable businesses, researchers, and creators to build and scale with AI," Kurian said.

An analysis commissioned by Google suggests that the AI hub is expected to generate at least USD 15 billion over five years (2026-2030) in American gross domestic product (GDP) because of new economic activity from increased cloud and AI adoption, as well as the American talent and resources involved in developing and operating the AI hub. Speaking at the event, Sitharaman said under the Modi regime, several policy enablers have been part of the governance since 2014.

Appreciating Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Naidu, Sitharaman said he in his earlier stints has shown what he can do to scale up digital infrastructure.



# **COVID-19** may alter offspring's brain dev, cause anxious behaviour, study in mice finds

New Delhi, Oct 14: Changes in sperm caused by COV-ID-19 in a mouse could affect the offspring's brain development and cause anxious behaviours, a study has found, suggesting that the viral disease may have long-lasting effects on future generations, even as the results would need to be verified in humans, researchers said.

The team from Australia's Florey Institute of Neuroscience and Mental Health found that an offspring mouse conceived after a father has been infected with the SARS-CoV-2 virus and developed COVID-19 symptoms have higher levels



of anxiety-like behaviours. 'We let male mice recover

from SARS-CoV-2 infection for a few weeks before they mated with healthy females. We found that the resulting offspring showed more anxious behaviours compared to offspring from uninfected fathers," Elizabeth Kleeman, research officer and first author of the study

published in the journal Nature Communications,

All offsprings from COV-ID-19-affected fathers were seen to display increased anxiety-like behaviours.

"Using an established mouse-adapted SARS-CoV-2 preclinical model, we infected adult male mice with the virus, or performed a mock

control infection, and bred them with naive female mice four weeks later, when males were no longer infectious. Here we show that offspring of infected sires display increased anxiety-like behaviours,' the authors wrote. Lead researcher Anthony Hannan said it is known that male mice exposed to adverse environmental and lifestyle factors, such as consuming a poor diet before mating, can change brain development and behaviour in offsprings.

"This is because the father's experiences can alter the information carried in sperm, including specific RNA molecules, which transmit instructions for offspring development," Hannan said.

Analysis of RNA gene material from infected fathers' sperm showed altered molecules, including those involved in regulating genes known to be important for brain development. Female offspring mice also had significant changes in how specific genes in

the brain's hippocampus region -- important for regulating emotional responses such as anxiety and stress -behaved, the study found. "These kinds of changes in the hippocampus, as well as other brain regions, may contribute to the increased anxiety we observed in

offspring, via epigenet-

ic inheritance and altered

brain development," co-sen-

ior author Carolina Gubert

Epigenetics refers to the process by which a gene interacts with the environment to produce an

observable behaviour. Hannan said the study is the first of its kind, and added that if the results are verified in humans, millions of children and families worldwide could be impact-

ed. "with major implications for public health".

While more research is needed, particularly in the sperm and offspring of humans infected with the SARS-CoV-2 virus, these findings suggest that the COVID-19 pandemic could have long-lasting effects on future generations," the lead researcher said.

"We've had very good indications already," UNDP's Jaco Cilliers told reporters at a press conference in Geneva, without giving details. He estimated that the two-year Israel-Hamas war had generated at least 55 million tonnes of rubble

## **ODI World Cup is still 2.5 years** away, need to stay in present: Gambhir on Rohit, Kohli future

New Delhi, Oct 14: Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma are keen on playing the 2027 ODI World Cup but India head coach Gautam Gambhir was non-committal over the star duo's future on Tuesday, saying the ODI World Cup is still more than two years away and "it is important to stay in the present"

With Shubman Gill's appointment as the ODI skipper, the national selectors have already hit the transition button in ODI cricket and there is a lot of doubt over the future of the ageing stalwarts who will be 39 (Kohli) and 40 (Rohit) respectively in 2027.

"The 50-over World Cup is still two and a half years away. It is very important to stay in the present. Obviously they are quality players. They are coming back. Their experience is going to be valuable in Australia.

"Hopefully those two guys can have a successful tour, and more importantly, as a team we can have a successful series," Gambhir said when asked about the future of the two former skippers.

It is believed that a lot will depend on how the duo plays in the nine ODIs in the next couple of months (3 vs Australia, 3 vs SA and 3 vs

In the past one year, the Indian team has undergone transition across all formats under Gambhir's coaching. When asked what are the

player in the national team, Gambhir presented his checklist. "First and foremost, you

when he wants to blood a

look at talent. Then you look at the work ethic. You look at the characters in that dressing room, especially in red-ball cricket.

You look at what they bring on the table, apart from the amount of runs and wickets they do, I think how hungry they are. And if you've got all those attributes, you will definitely have a successful Test career."

With so much of competition for slots, Gambhir feels that international cricket is an "insecure environment". "For me, giving them

a longer run is very, very important because as we all know that international cricket is a very insecure environment because only 15 players can go on to represent the country and there are so many people waiting

for their opportunity.
"So make sure first you pick the right characters and then if you see that, attributes he is looking for try and give them a longer run so that they themselves should be content and happy that they've got a longer run rather than just chopping and changing as well."
Personally, Gambhir has

an aversion towards the word "dropping" and he feels emotional when a worthy player misses out on a national team berth.

"Sometimes it's difficult as a head coach and a team management where you will have to sometimes leave out players. I don't like using this word, dropping players because you don't drop players, you only select players.

When a player is left out, the least a coach can do is be empathetic and not ruthless.'

For Gambhir, the Test squad that went to England was superb in terms of its work ethic and ticked all the right boxes.

"So for me, I think that is something which is exceptionally important and these guys have done their bit, especially on the England tour, the kind of work ethic they had shown. For me, that was a huge tick."

New Delhi, Oct 14: Shubman Gill has "already passed his toughest test as captain in England" and no one has done any favours by appointing him captain across two formats, head coach Gautam Gambhir couldn't stop waxing eloquent about the young skipper.

# **Zelensky to visit Washington** seeking long-range weapons

Kyiv, Oct 14: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said he will travel to the United States this week for talks on the potential US provision of long-range weapons, a day after US President Donald Trump warned Russia he may send Kyiv long-range Tomahawk missiles.

A meeting between Zelensky and Trump could take place as early as Friday, the Ukrainian president said, adding that he also would meet with defense and energy companies and members of Congress.

"The main topics will be air defense and our long-range capabilities, to maintain pressure on Russia," Zelensky said.

He spoke at a meeting with EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs Kaja Kallas. He said he also would seek fur-ther US assistance to protect Ukraine's electricity and gas networks, which have faced relentless Russian bombardment. The US visit follows what Zelensky described as a "very productive" phone call with Trump on Sunday. Trump later warned Russia that he may send Ukraine long-range Tomahawk missiles if Moscow doesn't settle its war there soon. The missiles would allow Ukraine to strike deeper into Russian territory.

Moscow has expressed "extreme concern" over the




Tomahawk cruise missiles to Ukraine. Russian President Vladimir Putin himself has previously suggested that the US supplying long-range missiles to Ukraine would seriously damage relations between Moscow and Washington.

Zelensky will join a Ukrainian delegation already in the US for preliminary talks, led by Prime Minister Yulia Svyrydenko. Russia has stepped up attacks in recent weeks targeting electricity and gas infrastructure ahead of winter, in an effort to cripple Ukraine's power grid ahead of freezing temperatures to erode public morale. Ukraine's State Emergency Service said the worst attacks early Monday using

around the Black Sea port of Odesa and in the northern Chernihiv region, where one person was killed.

Kallas, the EU's top diplomat, pledged continued pressure on Moscow. She also expressed confidence that objections led by Hungary to a new Russia sanctions package would be overcome, even if the process drags on past a meeting of EU leaders next week. "On funding, the needs are enormous. We must help Ukraine defend itself so we don't later spend even more repairing destroyed infrastructure," Kallas said. "We are 27 member states, and 27 democracies, so debates take time ... I'm positive that, as before, we'll achieve a decision."
