Kishtwar, Nov 03: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Monday assured the people of Chishoti village in Kishtwar district that the hamlet will be rebuilt in a short span of time.

LG Sinha, according to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) visited the cloudburst hit village today and laid the foundation stone for construction of new houses for the victims, who lost shelters



on August 14 this year after a cloudburst triggered massive landslides in the area. More than 60 people died in the calamity hit remote village.

It may be recalled that on the ill-fated day large groups of pilgrims were gathered at Chisoti village- a key stop on the pilgrimage to the Machail Mata Mandir — and were collecting food from a langar when flash floods washed them away. Search and rescue operations continued for many days to

trace the missing persons. LG Sinha during his visit to the village announced that 19 houses that were completely damaged during the disaster will be rebuilt free of cost with support of High-range Rural

Development Society (HRDS India), a Kerala based Civil

Society Organisation.
The Lieutenant Governor paid homage to the citizens and security personnel who lost their lives due to the tragic

Cong's mistakes cost Kashmir its peace; PM Modi hit terrorism with full force: HM Shah

Says cross-border strikes proof of Modi Govt's firm anti-terror policy

Srinagar, Nov 03: Holding the Congress rule responsible for decades of violence in Jammu and Kashmir, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday said the Narendra Modi-led government follows a policy of zero tolerance against terrorism.

Addressing election rallies in Sheohar and Sitamarhi areas of Bihar, Shah said that during Congress governments, Pakistani terrorists used to infiltrate into India frequently, but no strong action was taken. "It was the Congress government who is responsible for the decades of terrorism and violence in Kashmir, while the PM Modi government hit back at the ter-

rorism with full force," he said. Shah added, "Earlier, Pakistani terrorists used to sneak into India every day. Did Congress and Lalu ever respond to them? They would feed them biryani instead," he said, as per the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

The Home Minister said that the present government has changed this approach. "When

Over 94,000 students appear in 10th class exams

BOSE issues revised date sheet amid J&K by-elections

Srinagar, Nov 03: Over 94,000 students appeared in the annual regular exams of 10th standard that commenced on Monday in Kashmir division.

According to the news agency–Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education (BOSE) had set-up 994 examination centres across the Kashmir region.

BOSE has said that 68,804 students enrolled for the annual regular exams of 10th are from ten districts of Kashmir division and 25,224 students are from eight districts of winter zone areas of Jammu division.

Besides, the board had also informed that at least 660 from Kargil and 95 from Leh district were also enrolled for the examinations.

Earlier, BOSE Secretary had said that nearly 95,000 students are enrolled to appear for 10th class exams and the board has made 994 exam centres for them, 760 centres for 82,000 students of 11th standard and 682 centres for 70,000 students of 12th class respectively.

In the meantime, BOSE Monday issued a revised date sheet for annual regular exams of 10th standard in view of Assembly by-elections.

Srinagar, Nov 03: Nearly seven months after the Pahalgam terror attack on April 22, which led to widespread cancellations of film shoots across Kashmir, the valley has once again welcomed a film crew, this time from the South Indian film industry, marking a noteworthy revival for cinematic tourism in the

The movie, whose title has been kept under wraps for now, is being filmed at various beautiful locations in Srinagar and South Kashmir. The project signals a renewed confidence among filmmakers who had earlier pulled back their schedules following the attack that shook the local film and

Srinagar, Nov 03: The government has initiated a verification drive to regulate media operations in the valley, making it mandatory for all journalists to register and validate their credentials with the District Information Offices.

The directive, as per the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), issued by the District Information Officers (DIOs) of Baramulla and Kupwara, follows instructions from the loint Director Information Kashmir.

It aims to curb the misuse of media identity and ensure that only genuine journalists are allowed to operate in the field.

move comes amid growing concerns over the presence of unverified individuals posing as journalists. Media persons have been asked to submit their documents and credentials within

Crackdown on illegal mining: 506 cases lodged, 17,806 vehicles penalised in 3 yrs IMSS tracks illegal extraction in real time; 22 check posts set up to curb unauthorised mining

Srinagar, Nov 03: The Jammu and Kashmir government in its intensified crackdown on illegal mining, penalizing 17,806 vehicles and machinery in the past three years and recovered fines worth Rs 46.68 crore besides, 506 FIRs were registered against violators for illegal extraction and transportation of minerals across the region.

Official data, accessed by the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) reveals, in 2023-24, authorities penalized 7,018 vehicles, lodged 133 FIRs and realized Rs 19.19 crore in fines.

In 2024-25, 6,219 vehicles In an ongoing year,



were penalized, 212 FIRs filed and Rs 16.79 crore collected. During the current fiscal year 2025–26, up to September, 4,569 vehicles have been penalized, 161 FIRs lodged besides Rs 10.70 crore recovered.

Kupwara in Kashmir, topped the list with 516 vehicles penalized, 43 FIRs registered and Rs 0.78 crore recovered, marking the highest enforcement count so far this fiscal. Baramulla followed with 393 vehicles penalized and fines worth Rs 0.75 crore, while Budgam recorded 360 vehicles penalized with Rs 0.60 crore realized.

Similarly, Anantnag reported 334 vehicles seized, recovering Rs 0.57 crore and Kulgam led in total fines with Rs 1.25 crore collected from 270 vehicles.

In the Jammu division, Samba emerged as the topperforming district with 470 vehicles penalized and Rs 0.67 crore recovered. Kathua followed with 445 vehicles penalized and Rs 2.16 crore collected, while Jammu district reported 317 vehicles penalized with Rs

IHPL cricket cons

Srinagar, Nov 03: What began as a glittering sporting spectacle in Kashmir featuring global cricket stars has ended in chaos, unpaid bills and a police investigation.

Tashmir

The privately-organised, high-profile Indian Heaven Premier League (IHPL) T20 in Srinagar has collapsed amid allegations of fraud, unpaid dues and the sudden disappearance of its organisers.

Police have registered a case and initiated a probe after multiple players, service providers and hotel managements accused the organisers of cheating and breach of trust.

The global names associated with the league included Chris Gayle (West Indies), Martin Guptill (New Zealand) and Jesse Ryder (New Zealand), among other famous names of local and national cricket, announced as part of the line-up and a first for Kashmir cricket. Notably, the Jammu and Kashmir Sports Council (JKSC) clarified that it had no role beyond ground allotment, stating the event was entirely private. A timeline of major incidents that have unfolded over the past weeks is as follows:

October 2025: A Dream Launch The IHPL was launched in October as Kashmir's own high-profile T20 league, prom-

ising to blend international glamour with local talent. Backed by a Mohali-based group, Yuva Society, the tournament featured eight teams named after regions such as Pul-

wama Titans, Gulmarg Royals

and Kishtwar Giants and more. The organisers claimed sponsorship tie-ups and promised significant prize money. Matches were scheduled at Srinagar's Bakshi Stadium from October 25 to November 8, among which the



first few matches were held too. Late October: Early Cracks

In the initial matches, players and support staff began complaining of payment delays and a lack of basic facilities. Reports suggest players were promised payments of up to Rs 3 lakh per match, but those payments allegedly never arrived.

Team managers began receiving "technical explanations" for non-payments, even as organisers continued posting promotional videos online showing celebrity arrivals and matches at Bakshi Stadium.

A player, as earlier reported by KNO, said, "They promised match fees, accommodation and travel support. But after two games, everything stopped, no payments, no clarity and no one picking up calls.'

November 1–2: Matches Cancelled, Confusion Peaks

The situation deteriorated over the weekend. Matches scheduled for November 1 and 2 were abruptly cancelled, and players were reportedly told not to come to the ground due to "technical issues"

Hotel staff and transport contractors also began complaining about unpaid bills.

A local cricketer told KNO their manager said not to report to the stadium, citing "technical issues". "No one knew what was



going on," he said. Several international and outstation players left Srinagar, while others were stranded at the Radisson Collection Hotel, unsure whether to leave or stay. Some were even asked to vacate their rooms.

November 2: Organisers Vanish Overnight

On the morning of November 2, it emerged that the organisers had fled Srinagar overnight, leaving behind unpaid dues esti-mated between Rs 80-90 lakh. Reports said hotel managements were owed large sums for room bookings, catering and logistics. Bus drivers and event workers also claimed they had not been paid.

Staff at one Srinagar hotel told media outlets that "calls to the organisers went unanswered and the remaining event managers quietly disappeared".

One player also told KNO that catering vendors and transporters contacted them directly seeking clarity. "They thought we were part of the organising team. Everyone was in panic; no one from management was around," he said.

November 3: FIR Registered, Probe Launched

On November 3, the Jammu & Kashmir Police confirmed to KNO that a case has been registered under relevant sections of law at Rajbagh Police Station. Staff shortage hits GMC Baramulla

Srinagar, Nov 03: Government Medical College (GMC) Baramulla's associated hospital - the largest tertiary care facility in north Kashmir — continues to operate without two critical diagnostic and emergency care services: an MRI unit and a cardiac catheterisation laboratory (Cath Lab). Alongside this, nearly 200 key posts remain vacant, severely affecting day-to-day functioning, sources said.

Officials said that the absence of these services not only delays treatment but forces hundreds of patients daily to travel to Srinagar, losing crucial time during emergencies.

'Due to the staff shortage, the institution is struggling to manage routine functioning. Departments are overstretched and patients are bearing the brunt," they said. Doctors said that although a cardiology unit is functional at GMC Baramulla, patients experiencing chest pain or heart attacks have to be shifted to Srinagar — to SMHS or SKIMS — for angiography and angioplasty.

"The first hour after a heart attack is known as the golden hour. A delay of even 30–40 minutes can decide life or death," said a doctor. According to CDC data, nearly 47% of deaths due to sudden cardiac arrest occur before a patient even reaches a hospital.

Doctors added that a fully functional cath lab at Baramulla could save dozens of lives every year.

said the absence of an MRI facility at the government hospital has pushed patients to private diagnostic centres, where rates are unaffordable for many. Zameer Ahmad, a patient

recently had to spend nearly Rs 6,000. "Doctors advised an MRI. But since GMC doesn't have one, I had no choice. Not everyone can afford private

from Baramulla, said he

diagnostic centres," he said. Residents said there are around 700 health facilities in three districts of north Kashmir — but not a single government hospital has an MRI facility. "We are left with no option but to travel to Srinagar or go to private labs. This is unjust," they said. Senior health officials said that the government has already taken up the matter of filling

vacant posts. They also confirmed that MRI procurement and Cath Lab installation have been included in this year's budgeted works.

"Provision for an MRI machine at GMC Baramulla has been taken up during the current financial year. JKMSCL has been authorised to procure it. Installation will begin once the rate contract is finalised and funds are released," an official told KNO.

He added: "In the first phase, four new GMCs are being covered; the remaining three will be taken up next financial year."

Regarding the Cath Lab, the official said that the Cath Lab project at GMC Baramulla has been sanctioned at Rs 12.50 crore this year. Funds worth Rs 9.37 crore have Locals from Baramul-la and Kupwara districts

n November 3, the world observes the International Day for Biosphere Reserves, celebrating regions where nature and communities coexist in harmony. These reserves serve as living laboratories that demonstrate practical models of sustainable development, environmental conservation, and community wellbeing. Designated by UNESCO, the day underscores the importance of biosphere reserves as vital platforms for advancing scientific research, preserving ecological and cultural diversity, and fostering a balanced relationship between people and the

India celebrates this day alongside the world, highlighting its strong network of biosphere reserves that stretch across diverse terrains: mountains, forests, coasts, and islands. These areas demonstrate India's commitment to conserving biodiversity and fostering harmonious living between people and nature through both national initiatives and international frameworks like the UNESCO Man and Biosphere (MAB) Programme.

The Government of India's ongoing efforts reinforce the potential of biosphere reserves to protect ecological riches and promote the well-being of present and future generations. These reserves continue to prove that sustainable living and conservation can go hand in hand.

What are Biosphere Reserves?

Biosphere reserves are areas identified by national governments for conserving biodiversity and promoting sustainable development. They have been described as 'learning places for sustainable development'. They are sites for testing interdisciplinary approaches to understanding and managing changes and interactions between social and ecological systems, including conflict prevention and management of biodiversity. Biosphere reserves include terrestrial, marine and coastal ecosystems. Each site promotes solutions reconciling the conservation of biodiversity with its sustainable use.

Biosphere reserves are nominated by national governments and remain under the sovereign jurisdiction of the states where they are located.

BRs are thus special environments for both people and the nature and are living examples of how human beings and nature can co-exist while respecting each other's

Did you know?

More than 260 million (26 Crore) people live in biosphere reserves across the world. Altogether, these sites protect more than 7 million km2, an expanse roughly equal to the size of Australia.

UNESCO Man and Biosphere Programme

Biosphere Reserves are areas of terrestrial, coastal or ecosystems internationally recognized under UNESCO's Man and Biosphere (MAB) Programme. These reserves must meet specific criteria and conditions before being included in the World Network of Biosphere Reserves (WNBR) designated by UNESCO. The network represents the world's major ecosystem types and landscapes, dedicated to conserving biodiversity, promoting research and monitoring, and providing models of sustainable

It combines the natural and social sciences with a view to improving human livelihoods and safeguarding natural and managed ecosystems, thus promoting innovative approaches to economic development that are socially and culturally appropriate and environmentally sustainable.

By focusing on sites internationally recognized within the World Network of Biosphere Reserves, the MAB Programme strives to



Identify and assess the changes in the biosphere resulting from human and natural activities and the effects of these changes on humans and the environment, in particular in the context of climate change.

Study the interrelationships between ecosystems and socio-economic processes amid loss of biological & cultural diversity that hinders ecosystems provision of services for human wellbeing

Ensure basic human welfare and a liveble environment in the context of rapid urbanization and energy consumption as drivers of environmental change.

Promote the exchange and transfer of knowledge on environmental problems and solutions, and to foster environmental education for sustainable development.

The WNBR forms a dynamic network of sites of excellence that encourages collaboration across regions and fosters international cooperation through exchange of experiences, capacity-building, and promotion of best practices among Biosphere Reserves.

The MAB Programme operates under the guidance of UNESCO Member States.

Its main governing body is the International Coordinating Council (MAB-ICC), also known as MAB Council, which is composed of 34 Member States

Biosphere Reserves in India

India has 18 notified Biosphere Reserves covering approximately 91,425 sq. km, of which 13 are recognized by UNESCO's World Network of Biosphere Reserves (WNBR). These reserves span diverse landscapes, from mountains and forests to coasts and islands, showcasing India's ecological richness and commitment to conserving biodiversity while supporting local communities.

The Biosphere Reserve Division of the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change (MoEFCC) administers a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for Biodiversity Conservation, which operates as a sub-scheme under the broader Conservation of Natural Resources and Ecosystems (CNRE) programme.

The scheme provides financial assistance to states for targeted conservation and development activities, with implementation primarily handled by State Forest

The scheme follows a cost-sharing model: 60:40 (Central: State) and 90:10 for the North Eastern and Himalayan states.

The budget allocation for biodiversity conservation under CNRE has doubled from

5 crore in 2024-25 to 10 crore in 2025-26, highlighting the government's increasing commitment to sustainable ecosystem

What sets this scheme apart is its focus on local communities, particularly those living in and around Biosphere Reserves. By promoting alternative livelihoods, eco-development activities, and sustainable resource management, the scheme helps reduce biotic pressure on core biodiversity zones.

Special emphasis is placed on buffe transition zones, providing supplementary support to minimize dependence on critical ecosystems and ensure long-term sustainability.

India's Biosphere Reserves not only conserve biodiversity but also serve as living laboratories for sustainable development. integrating ecological protection with community welfare. They complement other national initiatives, such as Project Tiger, Project Elephant, Green India Mission, and the National Biodiversity Action Plan, creating a holistic framework for conservation and sustainable livelihoods.

In essence, India's Biosphere Reserve programme exemplifies the balance between nature and human development, demonstrating how environmental stewardship, scientific research, and socio-economic support can coexist to secure ecological and community well-being.

In September 2025, India's Cold Desert Biosphere Reserve in Himachal Pradesh was included in UNESCO's World Network of Biosphere Reserves.

Impact of Conservation Efforts

The establishment of Biosphere Reserves in India reflects a long-term national vision for conservation and sustainable development aligned with global environmental goals under UNESCO's Man and the Biosphere (MAB) Programme. India is at the forefront of promoting and managing Biosphere Reserves, showcasing its dedication to conserving biodiversity, empowering local communities, and advancing sustainable ecosystem practices.

Biosphere Reserves have significantly contributed to maintaining ecosystem balance, enabling conservation of biodiversity, and strengthening climate resilience in fragile habitats. They serve as demonstration sites for sustainable practices and provide economic and livelihood security to forest-dependent populations through alternate livelihood measures.

Organization's Global Forest Resources

Assessment (GFRA) 2025. Continuous monitoring, enhanced community participation, and expansion of the

Biosphere Reserve network have collectively strengthened India's position among global leaders in forest and biodiversity

conservation.

Biosphere Reserves complement India's broader conservation framework by linking habitat protection with sustainable community development. These reserves act as living laboratories where integrated approaches from converge to strengthen ecosystem resilience and conserve species across diverse landscapes.

Several national schemes operate in alignment with the objectives of Biosphere Reserves, contributing collectively to habitat conservation, sustainable resource use, and community development. Some of these are as follows:

Project Tiger- Initiated in 1973, has been India's flagship conservation initiative, successfully completing 50 years in 2023. Focused on tiger conservation through dedicated reserves and strict protection measures, it has played a crucial role in reviving tiger populations.

Project Elephant – India, home to over 60% of the global Asian elephant population, has undertaken significant measures to protect and conserve these majestic animals. Project Elephant is a flagship initiative aimed at ensuring the long-term survival of elephants in their natural habitats. This program focuses on habitat preservation, human-elephant conflict mitigation, and the welfare of captive elephants, reflecting India's deep-rooted cultural and ecological commitment to elephant conservation.

Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats (IDWH) Scheme -This centrally sponsored scheme provides financial and technical assistance to state and union territory governments for wildlife conservation activities.

National Biodiversity Action Plan (NBAP) The NBA, established under the Biological Diversity Act, 2002, is entrusted with the crucial responsibility of regulating access to India's vast biological resources and associated traditional knowledge.

Eco-Sensitive Zones (ESZs) and Wildlife Corridors - Eco-sensitive Zones around Protected Areas i.e. National Parks and

DC Bandipora approves 82 Mission YUVA cases



Fugitive Mehul Choksi challenges extradition order in Belgium Supreme Court

New Delhi, Nov 03: Fugitive diamantaire Mehul Choksi has challenged before the Supreme Court of Belgium the October 17 order of the Antwerp Court of Appeals, which had termed India's request seeking his extradition "enforceable", officials said

In response to queries sent by the PTI, the public prosecutor at the Court of Appeal in Antwerp said Choksi filed an appeal in the Court of Cassation on October 30.

"This appeal is strictly limited to legal merits and will be judged by the Court of Cassation. During this procedure, the execution of the extradition is suspended," Ken Witpas said.

The Court of Cassation is the

Supreme Court of Belgium. On October 17, a fourmember indictment chamber at the Court of Appeals in Antwerp found no infirmity in the orders issued by the pre-

trial chamber of the district court on November 29, 2024, terming the arrest warrants issued by a Mumbai special court in May 2018 and June 2021 as "enforceable", allowing Choksi's extradition.

The Court of Appeals ruled that fugitive Choksi, the main accused in a Rs-13,000 crore PNB scam, faces "no risk" of being denied a fair trial or subjected to ill-treatment if he is extradited to India.

Of the Rs 13,000-crore scam, Choksi alone has siphoned off Rs 6,400 crore, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has alleged in its chargesheet.

13 dead as dumper truck ploughs into multiple vehicles in Rajasthan

Jaipur/New Delhi, Nov 03: A rashly driven dumper truck ploughed into at least 17 vehicles, leaving 13 people dead and 10 injured in Harmada area in Jaipur in Rajasthan on Monday afternoon.

Bodies were strewn across the road; mangled cars lined the highway; and several motorbikes were crushed under the dumper's wheels following the horrific chain collision that occurred near Loha Mandi when the truck, whose driver was allegedly under the influence of alcohol, ploughed into these vehicles on a 300-metre stretch before crashing into a trailer.

Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma, his deputies Diya Kumari and Premchand Bairwa and former Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot expressed grief over the loss of

"The road accident that occurred in the Lohamandi area of Harmada in Jaipur, resulting in loss of life, is extremely tragic and heart-wrenching. Officials concerned have been directed to ensure proper treatment for the injured," Mr. Sharma posted on X.

Eyewitnesses described the scene as nothing short of a

'We saw people pulling out one body after another from the wrecked cars. Some were trapped inside, others were lying on the road. It was chaos, screams and blood everywhere," said Mahesh Sharma, a local shopkeeper.

Speeding dumper According to Jaipur District

Collector Jitendra Soni, the dumper came from Road No. 14 towards the Loha Mandi petrol pump at high speed, hitting vehicles in its path.

"Thirteen people died and 10 are injured. The injured are being treated at SMS Hospital's

trauma centre, and several are in critical condition," Mr. Soni told PTI.

Additional Commissioner Rajiv Pachar, who was present at the scene, said that the dumper was being

driven recklessly.

The driver hit a car, prompting locals to chase him. He accelerated further, hitting pedestrians and bikers along the road. He then stopped after colliding with a trailer truck and a car on the Delhi-Ajmer Highway.

Locals managed to nab the driver and handed him over to the police.

On whether the driver was intoxicated, Mr. Pachar said, "Since the accused driver is injured, the situation will become clear only after a medical examination. However, the nature of the accident indicates it could certainly be due to intoxication or medical factors." CCTV footage showed the dumper truck speeding at over 100 kmph, ramming into vehicles and crushing motorcyclists.

Diwali visit turns tragic Among the victims were members of a family from Agra Nanji Bhai, his brother, two women and a child — who were returning from Khatushyamji

after offering prayers. "Our car was parked on the roadside when the dumper hit it from behind. The dumper hit our car. Five people of the family have sustained injuries," Mr.

Nanji Bhai said. Rakesh, a relative of deceased Mahendra (38), a weaver, said, 'They live on Bainad Road in Jaipur. Mahendra's elder brother has two daughters, Varsha (19) and Bhanu (5), who had come to Jaipur to celebrate Diwali with their uncle.

"After the holidays, Mahendra had come to the bus stand with his two nieces to take them back to Sikar. This is when the accident occurred. Varsha is in the trauma centre, while Mahendra and Bhanu have died." The accident triggered protests in the area, with residents demanding stricter enforcement of road

This is the second major road accident in Rajasthan in the past week. At least 15 people, including 10 women and four children, died and two others were injured when a tempo traveller rammed into a stationary trailer truck in Phalodi area on Sunday evening.

PM, President express grief Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday expressed grief over the deaths in the road accident in Jaipur and announced an ex gratia of 2 lakh to the next of kin of each deceased.

"Pained by the loss of lives due to a mishap in Jaipur, Rajasthan. My thoughts are with those who have lost their near and dear ones. I pray that the injured recover soon," the PMO said in a message on X.

ED attaches assets worth over Rs 3,000 cr in money laundering case against Anil Ambani

Mumbai, Nov 03: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached assets worth more than Rs 3,000 crore linked to Reliance Group Chairman Anil Ambani as part of a money laundering investigation against his group companies, official sources said on Monday.

The federal probe agency has issued four provisional orders under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) for attaching the properties, including the 66-year-old Ambani's house in Pali Hill, Mumbai, apart from other residential and commercial properties of his group companies,

A plot of land belong-Maharaja Ranjit Singh Marg in Delhi and multiple other assets in the national capital, Noida, Ghaziabad, Mumbai, Pune, Thane, Hyderabad, Chennai and East Godavari have also been attached.

According to the sources, the total value of the attached assets is Rs 3,084 crore. The case pertains

to alleged diversion and laundering of public funds raised by Reliance Home Finance Ltd. (RHFL) and Reliance Commercial Finance Ltd. (RCFL).

During 2017-2019, Yes Bank invested Rs 2,965 crore in RHFL instruments and Rs 2,045 crore in RCFL instruments.

These turned into 'non-performing" investments by December 2019, with Rs 1,353.50 crore then outstanding for RHFL and Rs 1,984 crore for RCFL, according to the ED.

The action against Ambani pertains to alleged financial irregularities and collective loan "diversion" pegged at more than Rs 17,000 crore by multiple group companies, including Reliance Infrastructure.

This came after the agency searched 35 premises of 50 companies and 25 people, including executives of his business group, in Mumbai on July 24.

The ED's money laundering case stems from a Central Bureau of Investigation FIR.

SC to issue directions on Nov 7 with respect to feeding of stray dogs in institutions

New Delhi, Nov 03: SC to issue directions on Nov 7 with respect to feeding of stray dogs in institutionsThe Supreme Court on Monday said it will issue directions on November 7 with respect to the stray dogs menace being faced in institutions, including government and public sector ones, where employees are supporting, feeding and encouraging the canines.

A three-judge special bench comprising Justices Vikram Nath, Sandeep Mehta and N V Anjaria was hearing the matter. "Apart from recording the appearance and affidavits and everything, we will also be issuing some directions with respect to institutional menace which is being faced in government institutions, public sector institutions and other institutions where the employees are supporting feeding and encouraging dogs in that area. For that, we will definitely be issuing some directions," Justice Nath said.

One of the advocates appearing in the matter urged the bench that they be heard prior to passing of directions on the issue.

"For institutional matters, we are not going to hear any arguments at all. Sorry," Justice Mehta said. The bench



noted that chief secretaries of most of the states and Union Territories were present

It allowed the exemption application filed by the chief secretary of Kerala and noted that a principal secretary of the state was present in the

The bench said the Animal Welfare Board of India be made a party in the matter.

At the outset, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta informed the bench that most of the states and UTs have filed their compliance affidavit in the matter.

"List for orders on November 7," the bench said.

It said personal presence of the chief secretaries of states and UTs would no longer be required. However, the bench said their presence would again become necessary in case there was any default in compliance of the orders passed by the court.

While hearing the matter on October 27, the top court had directed the chief secretaries of states and UTs, except West Bengal and Telangana, to remain present before it on November 3 to explain why compliance affidavits were not filed despite the court's August 22 order.

The apex court on August 22 asked the states and UTs about the steps being taken Birth Control (ABC) Rules.

The bench had expressed displeasure over the non-compliance of its order and observed that by October 27, compliance affidavits were not filed by the states and UTs, except West Bengal, Telangana and the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD).

It had made clear that the chief secretaries would have to appear in the court and explain as to why no compliance affidavits were filed by

On October 27, the top court had slammed the states and UTs, which had not filed their compliance affidavits in the matter, and said continuous incidents were happening and the country was being "shown as down" in foreign nations.

The apex court had earlier expanded the scope of the stray dogs case beyond the confines of Delhi-National Capital Region, and directed that all states and UTs be made parties in the matter.

It had directed the municipal authorities to file an affidavit of compliance with complete statistics of resources like dog pounds, veterinarians, dog-catching personnel, and specially-modified vehicles and cages available as on date for the purpose of compliance of the

The bench had also impleaded the states and UTs in the matter while observing that application of ABC Rules was uniform all over India.

The apex court is hearing a suo motu case which was initiated on July 28 over a media report on stray dog bites leading to rabies, particularly among children, in the national capital.

SC junks Jamiat's plea to pay compensation to victims of mob lynching



New Delhi, Nov 03: The Supreme Court on Monday dismissed a plea by Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind seeking direction to the Uttar Pradesh government to pay compensation to the victims of mob lynching.

A bench of Justices J.K. Maheshwari and ay Bishnoi refused to interfere with the Alla-habad High Court order which asked the petitioner to approach the state government.

The plea filed by Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind and others had sought extensive directions concerning the implementation of the apex court's guidelines in

the Tehseen Poonawalla case.

The plea highlighted the alleged failure of the State government in implementing the preventive, remedial, and punitive measures prescribed by the apex court in this judgment.

While disposing of a PIL filed by Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind compliance with apex court's guidelines for checking incidents of mob lynching, the high court on July 15 had observed that every incident of mob lynching/mob violence is a separate incident and it cannot be monitored in a public interest litigation.

Side effects of high blood pressure: How it affects your heart, brain, kidneys

New Delhi, Nov 03: High blood pressure, or hypertension, is often known as the "silent killer" because it usually shows no clear symptoms until it causes serious internal damage. When blood pressure remains high for an extended period, it exerts a continuous force on the artery walls, causing the heart and other vital organs to work harder than normal. This strain gradually weakens blood vessels, leading to severe health complications such as heart disease, kidney damage, vision loss, and brain disorders. Since hypertension often develops unnoticed, many people remain unaware until a major problem arises. Regular blood pressure monitoring and early lifestyle changes are crucial in preventing the long-term, life-threatening effects of high blood pressure.

Know how hypertension impacts your body

1. Heart damage and cardiovascular complications

The heart is one of the first organs affected by high blood pressure. The constant force of blood against arterial walls makes the heart work harder, leading to thickened muscles and reduced efficiency over time. This condition, known as left ventricular hypertrophy, increases the risk of heart failure and coronary artery disease.



High blood pressure can also cause irregular heart rhythms (arrhythmias) and raise the likelihood of heart attacks.

2. Stroke and brain-related disorders Hypertension is one of the leading causes of stroke, which occurs when a blood vessel in the brain becomes blocked or bursts. Continuous high pressure weakens brain arteries, making them more susceptible to rupture or clot formation. It can also reduce oxygen flow to brain tissues, increasing the risk of vascular dementia and cognitive decline. A study published in the Hypertension Journal found that even moderate elevations in blood pressure significantly raise the risk of small-vessel disease and memory impairment later in life. Maintaining optimal blood pressure levels can therefore help preserve brain function and reduce the risk 3. Kidney damage and renal disease

The kidneys play a key role in filtering waste and balancing fluids, but hypertension can damage the small blood vessels within them. This leads to reduced kidney function, chronic kidney disease (CKD), or even kidney failure in severe cases. Early warning signs may include protein in the urine or swelling in the feet and ankles. Over time, the combination of high blood pressure and impaired kidney function

can form a dangerous cycle, as each con-

dition worsens the other.

4. Vision problems and eye damage High blood pressure can harm the

delicate blood vessels in the eyes, leading to hypertensive retinopathy. This condition can cause blurred vision, eye strain, or in extreme cases, permanent vision loss. Hypertension also raises the risk of glaucoma and optic nerve damage, both of which can severely affect sight.

5. Artery damage and atherosclerosis Persistent high blood pressure damages the inner lining of arteries, causing them to harden and narrow. This process, known as atherosclerosis, reduces blood flow and oxygen supply to vital organs. Over time, it may result in aneurysms, dangerous bulges in artery walls that can rupture. According to a study in the European Heart Journal, people with untreated hypertension are nearly twice as likely to develop major arterial complications compared to those with controlled blood pressure. Adopting a balanced diet rich in fibre, avoiding smoking, and maintaining a healthy reight are key preventive measures.

6. Sexual dysfunction

Hypertension can interfere with normal blood flow to reproductive organs, leading to sexual health issues. In men, this often manifests as erectile dysfunction, while in women, it can cause reduced libido or difficulty achieving arousal. Since sexual function relies heavily on vascular health,

controlling blood pressure through lifestyle adjustments and medical care can significantly improve sexual well-being and overall confidence.

7. Weakened bones and metabolic issues Emerging research suggests a connection between high blood pressure and increased calcium loss through urine, which may weaken bones over time. This can contribute to osteoporosis, particularly in older adults. Hypertension is also linked to metabolic syndrome, a combination of obesity, high cholesterol, and insulin resistance, all of which heighten cardiovascular risks.

8. Complications during pregnancy

High blood pressure during pregnancy can lead to preeclampsia, a dangerous condition involving high blood pressure and organ dysfunction, especially in the liver and kidneys. This can result in premature birth, low birth weight, or other serious complications for both mother and baby. Expectant mothers with hypertension require close monitoring, a nutritious diet, and medical supervision to ensure a safe preg-

Three Bangladeshis convicted for illegal stay in country

Thane, Nov 03: A Thane court convicted three Bangladeshi nationals for illegal stay in India and sentenced them to the period of stay in jail after being caught in Janu-

In his order of October 30, the details of which were made available on Monday, Additional Sessions Judge AS Bhagwat held Mohamad Babul Shamshuddin Mulla (43), Mohamad Tuhin Mohamad Mijanul Mulla (24) and Rana Abdul Malik Shaikh (24) guilty under Passport (Entry into India) Rules and Foreigners Order.

The three, hailing from Nodain district of Bangladesh, were held by Shil Daighar police from Uttarshiv Naka in Padale area of Thane on January 26.

On October 30, the charges were framed, following which the three pleaded guilty and sought a lenient

Considering the fact that the accused are in jail from more than nine months, leniency in sentencing is required to be done, the court

said in its order. While the offences they have been charged with carry a maximum punishment of five years, the court sentenced them to the time they had already spent in jail, which was nine months and four days.

"Rahega sab se upar, hamara Tiranga! ham hai Team India, ham hai Team India!" (Our tri-colour would fly high) echoed deep into the triumphant night as the squad sung their

They were in sync for the six hours spent on 22 yards, and no one cared if they were in tune or not.

Head coach and domestic stalwart Amol Muzumdar's voice was among the prominent ones singing the song that was heard from



"Saath mein chalenge, saath mein uthenge. ham hai Team India, saath me jeetenge," (We will walk together, we will rise together, we will win together, we are Team India) they sang boisterously after winning the first global trophy.

Long after their passionate fans, who revelled in celebrations on every occasion the Indian team did well, had left, the winning side emerged to sing the team song, which was perhaps never heard before.

Vice-captain Smriti Mandhana, who set the record for most runs for any Indian in a World Cup (434), held the trophy in both her hands as she walked out to the middle with her teammates and every single member of the coaching staff.

Diminutive Jemimah Rodrigues, whose incredible 127 not out against Australia here in the semifinal added another seminal moment in women's cricket history, was a

The crowd had kept breaking into chants of Jemi Jemi! to keep on cheering for India's pocket dynamite from Bandra, who has made DY Patil Stadium her bonafide

home ground in recent years with the ven-

ue hosting plenty of India's fixtures. With families and friends around, there was hardly a moment to sit back and reflect on their achievements but Indian players did not miss out in mingling with their South African counterparts till they were at the

venue, hugging and consoling them.

The venerable Marizanne Kapp's eyes were obviously moist but Jemimah and Radha Yadav embraced her in bear hugs, while the tournament's two best batters - Mandhana and South Africa captain Laura Wolvaardt (a record 571 runs) - kept chatting for a long duration before they received their respec-

Skipper Harmanpreet Kaur, whose legacy will be defined by being the first woman ever in more than half a century to lead India to a World Cup win, said she was "numb" before offering the members of the media the chance to hold that elusive trophy which hardly anyone did out of respect.

For sometime, the waiting media had more fan boys and fan girls the moment Harmanpreet asked for their phones to take selfies. There was a mini-stampede like situation.

While several players had their families

with her partner Palash Muchal and some time later, the two emerged from the team's dressing room with the latter holding the Indian superstar's helmet.

As players began retreating to their hotel adjacent to the stadium, a cheerful Harmanpreet, finally free from her customary duties and routines including the mandatory media interaction, emerged in a totally different

A hoodie dangling from her head, the Indian skipper walked out from the dressing room to the beats of dhol in the team hotel surrounded by security personnel but also the indomitable young volunteers at DY Patil, mostly students, who carry heavy workloads of studying and managing events here which also help them gain experience.

As the players passed by, India's most visible fan of digital era, the tri-coloured Sudhir Kumar Chaudhary, kept blowing the conk and waving the national flag.

The players are believed to have had some celebratory moments inside the confines of their team hotel, before retiring for whatever was left of the night, for a well-deserved rest.

Afghanistan earthquake kills at least 20, injures over 300

Kabul, Nov 03: A strong earthquake killed at least 20 people in northern Afghanistan, authorities said Monday, just months after another deadly tremor that left the country reeling.

The 6.3-magnitude quake struck overnight at a depth of 28 kilometers (17 miles) with the epicentre near the city of Mazar-i-Sharif, according to the U.S. Geological Survey.

More than 20 people were killed and around 320 were injured in the provinces of Balkh and Samangan, health ministry spokesman Sharafat Zaman told journalists on Monday morning, stressing that this was a preliminary toll. He did not provide a province-wide breakdown of the

Residents of Mazar-i-Sharif, one of Afghanistan's largest northern cities, scrambled into the streets due to fears their homes would collapse, an AFP correspondent observed.

The city's famed Blue Mosque, a 15th-century landmark known



for its vibrant tiles, was also damaged, an AFP journalist witnessed. Pieces of the structure, particularly from one of its minarets, broke off and lay scattered ing tourist spots.

Correspondents in the capital Kabul, around 420 kilometres to the south, also said they felt shaking.

Poor communication networks and infrastructure in mountainous Afghanistan have hampered disaster responses in the past, preventing authorities for hours or even days from reaching far-flung villages to assess the extent of the damage.

It is the latest natural disaster for the Taliban government, across the mosque's grounds, which has faced three major deadly earthquakes since taking over Afghanistan in 2021, even as the foreign aid that formed the backbone of the country's economy has dramatically dropped.

In August, a shallow 6.0-mag-nitude quake in the country's east wiped out mountainside villages and killed more than 2,200 people. Large tremors in western Herat, near the Iranian border, in 2023, and in eastern Nangarhar province in 2022 killed hundreds and destroyed thousands

The United Nations and aid agencies have warned hunger is rising among the Afghan population.

The isolated country is suffering from a humanitarian crisis compounded by drought, economic restrictions on the banking sector, and the pushback of millions of Afghan citizens from neighbouring Iran and Pakistan.

Earthquakes are common in Afghanistan, particularly along the Hindu Kush mountain range, near where the Eurasian and

Many homes in the predominantly rural country - devastated by decades of war are shoddily built.

It often takes hours or days to travel by steep roads and paths to remote villages, which are often cut off from help during disasters or poor

Mamdani leads dramatic NY mayoral race going into voting day

New York, Nov 03: New Yorkers will pick a new mayor on Tuesday after an unpredictable race that has drawn attention from far beyond the largest city in the United States, with President Donald Trump branding frontrunner Zohran Mamdani "a communist."

Breakout Democratic Party candidate Mamdani, a naturalized Muslim American who represents Queens in the state legislature, leads former governor and sex assault-accused Andrew Cuomo, running as an independent after losing his party's primary contest to

The Republican party candidate polling in third place a colorful past as founder of the Guardian Angels vigilante group, a prolific broadcaster and cat lover. The latest Quinnipiac University poll conducted October 23 to 27 gives Mamdani 43 percent of the vote, followed by Cuomo on 33 percent and Sliwa on 14 percent.

The race has centered on cost



of living, crime and how each candidate would handle Trump, who has threatened to withhold federal funds from the city.

"Mamdani is an unusual political figure and really captures the spirit of the moment. This is a moment where a loud anti-Trump voice in America's biggest city is going to get news," Lincoln Mitchell, a politics professor at Columbia University, told AFP.

"Frankly, a Muslim candidate for mayor of New York is an enormous story."

Mamdani, 34, has attacked his opponents for Islamophobic

ing out both Republicans and Democrats for "anti-Muslim sentiment that has grown so endemic in our city.'

NYC Board of Elections data showed 275,006 registered Democrats had cast ballots, as had 46,115 Republicans, along with 42,383 voters unaffiliated with any party in the first five days of early voting, which ends November 2.

Mamdani's ascent has high-lighted the gulf between the left and center-right of the Demo-

Trump says no **Tomahawks for** Ukraine, for now

Washington, Nov 03: US President Donald Trump said on Sunday that, for now, he is not considering a deal that would allow Ukraine to obtain long-range Tomahawk missiles for use

Trump has been cool to a plan for the United States to sell Tomahawks to NATO nations that would transfer them to Ukraine, saying he does not want to escalate the war.

His latest comments to reporters aboard Air Force One indicate that he remains reluctant.

"No, not really," Trump told reporters as he flew to Washington from Palm Beach, Florida, when asked whether he was considering a deal to sell the missiles. He added, however, that he could change his

Trump and NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte discussed the Tomahawk idea when they met at the White House on October 22. Rutte said on Friday that the issue was under review and that it was up to the United States to decide.

Tomahawk missiles have a range of 2,500 km (1,550 miles), long enough to strike deep inside Russia, including Moscow.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has requested the missiles, but the Kremlin has warned against any provision of Tomahawks to Ukraine.
