Budgam's high-stakes electoral battle heads for a photo finish

Cult loyalties, traditional vote bank, floating voters and rising discontent signal a nail-biting contest; MP Ruhullah's silence echoes loudly

Soibugh (Budgam), Oct 08: It is 3:00 PM on Friday, and a group of youngsters begin chanting slogans from the top of a vehicle in the main square of Soibugh village in support of independent candidate Sameer Ahmad. "Why should we vote for outsiders? Why not for our local candidate?" shouts a youngster sitting besides the candidate, who hails from Soibugh

As Sameer and his supporters head to another village for canvassing, BJP supporters take over the venue and begin shouting slogans mocking the National Conference (NC)-led government over its



"unfulfilled" election promises-ranging from employment and electricity to Chief Minister Omar Abdullah's remarks on the installation of smart meters. "Naukri, Naukri-Ek Lakh Naukri! Unit, Unit -200 Soo Unit! Cylinder, Cylinder -12 Cylinder, Meter, Meter- Smart Meter!" the BJP workers chanted repeatedly.

While BJP workers were deriding NC for 2024 promises, Awami Ittehad Party leaders were waiting for their turn to hold a similar event at the same venue. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah had already addressed the public at the same venue in the morning.

The main contest in this segment, which goes to polls on November 11, is between the National Conference and the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP)-both of which have fielded candidates from the Shia community. In this segment, with a total electorate of over 1.25 lakh voters, the Shia community accounts for 35000 to 40000 votes.



In Cong rule, terrorists freely entered, left Kashmir after carrying out attacks: Amit Shah

'India's military ops against cross-border terrorism under PM Modi shattered terrorists, sponsors'

Srinagar, Nov 08: Asserting that Kashmir continues to remain peaceful under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday said that during Congress rule, terrorists used to "freely enter and leave" the Valley after carrying out attacks.

Addressing a public rally in Katihar, Bihar, Shah, according to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said, "During the governments of Sonia Gandhi, Manmohan Singh, and Lalu Prasad Yadav, terrorists used to freely enter and leave Kashmir after carrying out attacks."

"The government led by PM Modi responded differently and India's military operations against cross-border terrorism bear testimony to it. Military operations against cross border terrorism shattered terrorists and their sponsors," he added.

"When they attacked Uri,



we carried out a surgical strike. When they attacked Pulwama, we responded with an air strike. And when they killed our people in Pahalgam, we conducted Operation Sindoor and eliminated terrorists by entering Pakistan," Shah said, adding that under the government led by PM Modi, Kashmir has

remained peaceful, unlike during previous governments when terrorist attacks went unanswered.

The Home Minister said that Prime Minister Modi had approved the establishment of a defence corridor in Bihar, which would strengthen India's defence manufacturing sector and create local

employment. "Modi ji has ensured that a defence corridor will be established in Bihar. If terrorists dare to act in the future, their bullets will be answered with shells, and those shells will be manufactured on our land and fired on Pakistan," he said.

Shah said the government's approach towards national security is based on deterrence and direct action against cross-border terrorism. He linked this to the country's increasing defence capability and localised arms production.

He also accused opposition leaders of supporting infiltrators for political gains. "Lalu and Rahul see infiltrators as their vote bank and are afraid of them," Shah said, adding that opposition parties were running campaigns such as "ghuspaithiya bachao yatra" to protect infiltrators.

"We are not afraid of their vote bank. The BJP will identify every infiltrator and drive them out of India," he said.

POWER PERILS

J&K's hydel power generation dips by nearly 70%

Kashmir records 1742 MWs power load



Srinagar, Nov 08: In Jammu and Kashmir, hydel power generation has reduced by nearly 70 percent from the local generation plants.

An official informed the news agency–Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that the power generation from all the power plants owned by Jammu and Kashmir has decreased by nearly 800-900 Megawatts (MWs).

The official also said, "The power generation from across local power plants is currently ranging from 330 MWs to 400 MWs." It also said, "From one of the

plants from Baglihar, the power generation is ranging from 250-380 MWs and in case of another power plant of Baglihar, Kishenpur and New Wanpoh, we are generating a maximum of one MW."

The official further informed that the department is able to generate only 71 MWs from Kashmir based power plants.

About the power load and forced curtailment, the official said that there was a forecast of 1750 MWs load and forced curtailment of 40 MWs in Kashmir on Monday.

PDP's alliance with BJP in 2014 marked beginning of I&K's 'downfall': CM Omar

Budgam, Nov 08: Minister Omar Abdullah on Saturday accused the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) of betraying the people by joining hands with the BJP after seeking votes to keep them at bay, stating that the partv's alliance in 2014 marked the beginning of Jammu and Kashmir's "downfall".

Addressing a public rally at Mirgund, Budgam, CM Omar, per news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said that no one has caused as much damage to Jammu and Kashmir as the BJP. "We are the unfortunate people who were turned from a state into a Union Territory. The PDP went door to door in 2014 asking for votes to keep the BJP away, but after winning, they joined hands with them."

He said that the NC, unlike others, remained true to its word. "We are punished because we didn't join the BJP. We refused to compromise and we are the only party ready to fight them," he



added.

Omar accused the PDP-led government of introducing GST and said the destruction of Jammu and Kashmir began in 2014, not in 2019. "Did the PDP ever apologise for its alliance with the BJP?" he asked, adding that parties like PDP, BJP, Apni Party, and others were unfairly targeting the National Conference.

He questioned why the PDP and other parties didn't field candidates in the Nagrota by-election if they were truly against the BJP. "We even offered the seat to Congress, but they took four days and declined at the last moment, so we fielded our own candidate," he said.

Promising major development

projects for Budgam, Omar announced plans to establish a university and a new BCCI cricket academy and stadium in Kashmir. "Budgam is best suited for this — with the rail, airport and bypass nearby," he said.

He added that despite vacating the Budgam seat earlier, he never abandoned the constituency. "I worked for a year for Budgam's development, spending over Rs 110 crore on projects, including macadamisation, sports, and other infrastructure. Wherever Aga Mahmood points, work will happen — a new era of development will begin," he said.

Army foils infiltration bid. 2 terrorists killed

Srinagar, Nov 08: Army on Saturday foiled an infiltration bid by killing two terrorists along the Line of Control (LoC) in North Kashmir's Keran sector in Kupwara district, officials told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

They said on the basis of specific information about the infiltration attempt from the other side, the Army launched a counter-infiltration 'Operation Pimple'. "Alert troops detected suspicious movement in the area and challenged the infiltrators, who opened fire. Soldiers retaliated, leading to an exchange of fire in which



two terrorists were killed," the officials added.

Meanwhile, Army's Srinagar based Chinar Corps in a statement said that two terrorists were neutralised by the security forces in the ongoing operation,

CBK files charge sheet in fraudulent appointment, salary drawal case

Srinagar, Nov 08: The Economic Offences Wing of the Crime Branch Kashmir has produced a charge sheet in a case pertaining to the fraudulent appointment, salary drawal.

As per a statement issued to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the spokesman said that the Economic Offences Wing of the Crime Branch Kashmir has produced a charge sheet in a case under FIR number 95/2022, under Sections 419, 420, 409, 468, 471 read with 120-B of the Ranbir Penal Code (RPC), before the Court of Sub Judge, Chadoora, against the accused persons namely Gh. Mohi-ud-Din Gazi (Retired Headmaster), S/o Ghulam Mohammad Gazi, R/o Zaindar Mohalla, Habba Kadal, Srinagar; Mubeena

Kawsar; and Ifra Nissar.

"The case originated from communication received from the Directorate of School Education, Kashmir, highlighting irregularities in appointments and manipulation of service records under SRO-43. Consequently, a formal case was registered at Police Station Economic Offences Wing (Crime Branch Kashmir)," the

spokesman added. Investigation that the original appointee, Miss Ifra Nissar, had resigned from government service. However, the then Drawing and Disbursing Officer (DDO) deliberately concealed her resignation and fraudulently substituted another individual in her place, continuing to draw salary against the said post, the statement reads.

Police launch valley-wide operation on cross-border terror networks OGWs, relatives of JKNOP, networks suspected of terror funding targeted: Officials

Srinagar, Nov 08: Police on Saturday launched coordinated operations across Kashmir targeting networks linked to individuals operating from Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK).

A top official told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), that the drive is aimed at dismantling local support structures, tracing financial and communication linkages, and seizing materials used to aid cross-border activities.



He said the campaign seeks to disrupt coordination between

handlers across the border and their contacts in the valley.

In Bandipora, police launched a crackdown on J&K Nationals Operating from (JKNOP) and PoK.

Acting on specific intelligence inputs, multiple Cordon and Search Operations (CASOs) were carried out across the district, targeting individuals involved in facilitating, funding, and promoting terrorism on behalf of relatives based across the border, the official said.

He said several associates and relatives of JKNOP members were booked under relevant laws for alleged involvement in providing logistical support and aiding recruitment. "Digital devices and other materials were seized during the raids," he added.

Police said operations to dismantle such networks would continue and urged residents to report suspicious activity, as-

AIP accuses NC-BJP collusion for Nagrota seat

Srinagar, Nov 08: Awami Ittehad Party (AIP) on Saturday criticised the National Conference (NC), Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), saying the ongoing political developments in Nagrota reflect a "friendly contest" between NC and BJP.

Addressing a press conference at the party head-quarters in Srinagar, AIP State Secretary Sheikh Ashiq said it has now become absolutely clear that what is happening in Nagrota is "a friendly match between NC and BJP."

"Omar Abdullah's token visit to Nagrota, where he barely spoke for a few moments, carried a tone that reflected softness toward the BJP rather than opposition," Ashiq said, adding that NC's entire focus remains on Budgam, not Nagrota, not development, not people's issues and only Budgam.

He also said the NC has again betrayed Budgam by sidelining the constituency and staging a managed show in Nagrota.

Ashiq also criticised NC and PDP for staying silent on the Public Safety Act (PSA). He said NC introduced the law in Jammu and Kashmir and even after the abrogation of Article 370, when most laws changed, the PSA remained. "Why are NC and PDP silent when Kashmiris are still being booked under PSA?" he asked. He said only AIP took the protest to Jantar Mantar

demanding scrapping of PSA and release of prisoners including jailed MP Engineer Rashid. Ashiq also welcomed Aga Ruhullah's decision not

to campaign for NC and urged Aga Ruhullah Mehdi, Molvi Imran Raza Ansari and Hakeem Mohammad Yaseen to support AIP candidate Nazir Ahmad Khan 'for dignity and justice in Budgam.'

Responding to media queries, AIP Chief Spokesperson, Inam un Nabi, said Engineer Rashid was shifted from Jail No. 3 to Jail No. 1 after he complained against some jail officials accused of taking bribes from Kashmiri prisoners. "After the complaint, the harassment began, attacks, injuries and pressure to withdraw it. He never gave in," Inam said, reiterating the demand for a judicial inquiry.

Inam also said voters in Budgam must see through the pattern of dynastic politics. "If you vote for NC. PDP or BJP, it is the same. All three candidates belong to the same family. This dynasty has controlled Budgam for 70 years," he said.

He also said, "People trusted him, but he left Budgam and went back to Ganderbal. This is the history of betraval."

The AIP leaders also urged the people of Budgam to "end decades of exploitation" and unite behind Nazir Ahmad Khan, calling it "the only path toward justice, political integrity and restoration of people's rights."-(KNO)

FAIMA writes to union ministry

New Delhi, Nov 08 The Federation of All India Medical Association (FAIMA) has expressed grave concern over the hardships faced by students of Government Medical College (GMC) Handwara, Jammu & Kashmir, due to the continued absence of hostel facilities and other

essential amenities. In a formal appeal addressed to Union Health Minister Dr. J.P. Nadda, FAIMA National Executive J&K, Dr. Mohammad Momin Khan, highlighted that students are being forced to reside in unsafe and expensive private accommodations amid the freezing winter conditions of

The lack of proper hostel facilities has left students struggling with rent, transportation, safety and instability, turning their academic journey into one of daily survival rather than focused learning, reads the formal appeal.

"The absence of a hostel has

made life extremely difficult for these students. It is disheartening to see future doctors, who should be dedicating themselves to study and patient care, battling issues of accommodation and security," said Dr. Mohammad Momin Khan.

The situation is particularly alarming for female students, who face increased safety risks in unmonitored and insecure private lodgings. Despite government directives issued in March 2025 and the formation of a committee in May 2025, no tangible progress has been made to date.

FAIMA has urged the Union Health Ministry to take immediate action to ensure safe and affordable hostel accommodation and to expedite the construction of permanent infrastructure at GMC Handwara.

"A hostel is not a luxury — it is a necessity," Dr. Khan emphasized. "We urge the Hon'ble Health Minister to intervene urgently so that these students can live and learn with dignity and safety."—(KNO)

FDA issues fresh guidelines for hotels, restaurants operations, ensure periodic water

Srinagar, Nov 08: The Jammu and Kashmir Food and Drugs Administration (FDA) has issued detailed guidelines for hotels, restaurants, dhabas and other food establishments across the Union Territory under the provisions of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006.

According to the public notice issued by Commissioner FDA J&K, Smita Sethi (JKAS), the move aims to ensure the availability of safe and wholesome food to consumers and mandates strict compliance within one month. The directions include mandatory FSSAI licensing and registration, prominent display of Food Safety Display Boards (FSDBs) and annual medical check-ups of food

Establishments have also been instructed to maintain hygiene ratings, carry out regular pest control

quality testing and strictly adhere to FSSAI's RUCO guidelines for disposal of used cooking oil. As per the notice, every food business must nominate a Food Safety Supervisor (FSS) trained under the FoSTaC programme, maintain records of raw material procurement, pest control operations, water testing reports, UCO disposal records and employee medical certificates and use only food-grade utensils, containers and packaging materials.

The notice also stresses on proper storage and temperature control of perishable food items including chilled, frozen and hot foods and periodic calibration of equipment such as refrigerators, thermometers and ovens. Food establishments have been directed to procure raw materials only from licensed or registered suppliers to ensure traceability.

National Social Assistance Programme: Strengthening India's Social Security Framework Through Inclusive Assistance

The National Social Assistance Programme serves as a key pillar of India s social security system, providing essential support to citizens in need

Introduced on 15 August 1995, the National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP) is a fully funded Centrally Sponsored Scheme that extends financial support to individuals living below poverty line (BPL). Implemented by the Ministry of Rural Development, the programme operates across both rural and urban areas, representing a major step towards fulfilling the Directive Principles of State Policy enshrined in the Constitution. NSAP covers old age pension, widow pension, disability pension, family benefit, and food security through Annapurna for those beneficiaries otherwise eligible under Old

Age Pension Scheme but not receiving its benefits.

NSAP caters to 3.09 crore beneficiaries with a scheme-wise ceiling/ cap for each State/UT on the number of beneficiaries. This includes 221 lakh elderly persons under the Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme (IGNOAPS), 67 lakh beneficiaries under Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme (IGNWPS), more than 8.33 lakh beneficiaries under Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme (IGNDPS), 3.5 lakh under National Family Benefit Scheme (NFBS) and 8.31 lakh beneficiaries under Annapurna Scheme, across the country.

Objectives of NSAP

To provide basic level of social security assistance to most vulnerable category of citizens, such as elderly, widow and divyangajan.

Features of Schemes under NSAP Selection: Gram Panchayats and Municipalities play an active role in identifying eligible beneficiaries under the different NSAP schemes.

Disbursement: Benefits are provided through DBT mode (94%) i.e beneficiary s bank or post office savings accounts, or via postal money orders. Disbursement through Cash at doorstep is also allowed by the scheme guidelines in extreme cases where the beneficiary is unable to go to the bank/post office for receiving the pension.

Monitoring: States and Union Territories have the flexibility to implement the schemes through any State Government department, but each must appoint a Nodal Secretary at the State level to oversee implementation and coordinate with relevant departments. Progress must be reported quarterly in a prescribed format by the 15th day of the month



following each quarter. Non-submission of progress reports is considered a lack of progress and may result in non-release of additional central assistance for the final quarter of the financial year.

Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension

National Family Benefit Scheme (NFBS)
Annapurna Scheme

Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme (IGNOAPS)

The Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme extends financial assistance to elderly citizens aged 60 years and above who belong to families living below the poverty line by the Government of India. Under this scheme, individuals between 60 and 79 years of age receive Rs.200 per month from the Central Government, while those aged 80 years and above are provided Rs.500 per month.

In accordance with the guidelines of the National Social Assistance Programme, States and Union Territories are encouraged to supplement the Central share by contributing an equivalent or higher top-up amount. This additional support helps ensure that the beneficiaries receive a reasonable and dignified level of income. Currently, the top-up provided by States and UTs under the old age pension component ranges from Rs.50 to Rs. 5700 per month, leading to an average pension of

around Rs.1100 in many of the States/UTs. Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme (IGNWPS)

Under this scheme, financial assistance is extended to widows aged between 40 and 79years who belong to families living below the poverty line, as identified by the Government of India. Each eligible beneficiary in this age group receives Rs.300 per month as central assistance. For widows who are 80 years and above, the amount of central assistance is Rs.500 per month, providing essential financial support to help meet their basic needs.

Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme (IGNDPS)

With a total of Rs.243.74 crore released to States and Union Territories under the Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme (IGNDPS) for the year 2024 25, this scheme caters individuals aged between 18 and 79 years who have severe or multiple disabilities and belong to families living below the poverty line. The beneficiaries are eligible for central assistance of Rs.300 per month. Beneficiaries who are 80 years and above receive Rs.500 per month, ensuring continued financial support to help them manage their daily needs with dignity.

National Family Benefit Scheme (NFBS) Under this scheme, a household living below the poverty line becomes eligible for lump sum financial assistance in the unfortunate event of the death of its primary breadwinner, provided the deceased was between 18 and 59 years of age. The Three Technologies Disrupting The Global Order

The great Austrian economist Joseph Schumpeter argued that you could spot a fundamental economic transition by the arrival of new types of goods, new production methods, and new forms of industrial organization. The spread of cheap drones, phones, and solar checks all of these boxes.

lews media tend to focus on the world's major powers, because they command more resources by dint of their relatively larger economies, militaries, and energy endowments. But there are costs to such dominance. For example, a single American Gerald R. Ford-class aircraft carrier costs \$13 billion, while the F-35 fighter jet costs around \$100 million. So, if you can build your military equipment for less than your opponent, you can gain a strategic advantage.

But even those advantages are slipping as key technologies reshuffle military and power asymmetries. Specifically, cheap drones, phones, and solar are disrupting the global order. The most obvious example is in the military domain, where drones are allowing "weaker" countries to inflict significant damage on larger opponents. In June 1, Russia was caught completely off guard by "Operation Spiderweb," when trucks secretly carrying Ukrainian drones unleashed their freight around Russian air bases, ultimately destroying significant numbers of Russian warplanes.

Ukraine has revolutionized drone warfare and is now churning out more than 200,000 first-personview (FPV) drones per month. Producing them does not require a massive military industrial complex or high capital expenditures; anyone can buy commercial versions

of FPVs for under \$300. Moreover, these low costs belie the power of the technology. FPV drones can easily slip through enemy defenses and surveil targets for hours. They can deliver precision strikes or adapt to multiple roles. How many would it take to disable a Ford-class carrier, and at what fraction of the carrier's cost?

Similarly, in finance, the mobile phone is disrupting and – more significantly – extending the reach of information, markets, and products in ways that disintermediate established players. It is also transforming education, employment, and growth throughout the Global South.

In a country like Kenya, communication, information access, and financial services traditionally required significant investment in technological infrastructure and capital goods. But with over 80% of the population adopting the smart-phone, that is quickly changing. Mobile financial transactions are now the norm, with usage reaching 77% and 89.7% in rural and urban areas, respectively. The economic benefits are clear. The Kenyan government estimates that the digital economy will account for nearly 10% of GDP in 2025. And as prices for phones and access continue to fall, established players in media, banking, and other services will find themselves squeezed.

When it comes to energy, the United States is the world's second-biggest producer, and under



President Donald Trump, more of that production is carbon-based. The administration's trade "deals" regularly include riders that attempt to lock allies and trading partners into long-term fossil-fuel use by accepting US exports of oil, liquefied natural gas, and other petroleum derivatives. But solar is disrupting this sector, too. While Europeans and Americans worry about China's dominance in green tech, they are ignoring energy

consumers. As the Chinese solar industry has brought prices down, many developing countries and emerging markets have capitalized on this increasingly affordable source of energy.

For example, in 2025, Algeria's so-

For example, in 2025, Algeria's solar imports from China grew 85-fold from their 2024 level. Pakistan also has taken advantage of cheap panels, generating 20% of its electrical power from solar. Across the Global South, solar offers energy security

and freedom from the current-account crunch that comes with importing energy. Especially in off-grid rural areas, solar means true energy independence, improving quality of life for millions of people.

Here, too, established players with monopoly positions are being disintermediated by cheap technologies. Even in hydrocarbon-exporting countries, the logic of solar is compelling. It protects domestic consumption from geopolitical price

shocks and allows fossil fuels to be used primarily as an export, which is far more profitable.

While these three technologies are notable and interesting on their own, together their adoption suggest that a greater global economic transition may be underway. The Austrian economist Joseph Schumpeter argued that you could spot such a transition by the arrival of new types of goods, new production methods, and new forms of industrial organization. Drones, phones, and solar check these boxes.

We are witnessing not just a technological or organizational transformation within one country, but a geopolitical transformation in which the long-held advantages of the big and powerful are being undermined by cheap, shareable innovations. It remains to be seen whether AI, if it ever pays off, will reverse or reinforce this trend, but our bet is that it will accelerate it.

High turnout '65-volt' shock to Oppn: Modi as he concludes Bihar poll campaign

Sitamarhi/Bettiah, Nov 08: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday claimed that people have given the opposition INDIA bloc a "65-volt jhatka" in the first phase of assembly elections in Bihar, and now they are spending "sleepless nights".

Modi wound up his extensive campaign for assembly polls in Bihar, where he cautioned voters that if the RJD-led opposition came to power, it would order them to hold their "hands up" by placing a "katta" on their head.

The PM seemed confident of an NDA win, claiming that the high turnout in the first phase was in favour of the ruling coalition.

"You have given a 65 volt shock to the opposition which is now having sleepless nights", said Modi, referring to the 65.09 per cent turnout registered across 121 assembly segments where voting was held on November 6.

He urged the electors to "break the record of the first phase on November 11" and ensure that the NDA not just wins "all the seats but established a lead in every booth".

Modi, who addressed a total of 14 rallies across the state, besides a roadshow in Patna, packed in a timespan of less than one month, reflected on his meeting in Bettiah, where he also promised to be back again "for swearing in ceremony of a new NDA government".

"I had started my campaign by visiting the birthplace of Bharat Ratna Karpoori Thakur, and today I am bringing it to a close at the land where Bapu Gandhi transformed into the Mahatma", said Modi, in West Champaran district, recalling his first rally at Samastipur.

"My campaign ends today but canvassing will continue tomorrow. But voters' job begins on the day of polling. I will come again for the swearing in of an NDA government," said the Prime Minister.

Modi, whom Chief Minister Nitish Kumar accompanied only at his inaugural rally in Samastipur, providing some cannon fodder to the opposition, showered encomiums on the JD(U) supremo for having put an end to "jungle raj".

The PM, who has popularised "katta" as a metaphor for the RJD's alleged high-handedness, charged the main opposition party with having pointed a country-made, unlicensed pistol at the head of the Congress when the ally was refusing to back Tejashwi Yadav as the Chief Ministerial candidate.

Asserting that the people of Bihar "do not want a katta



sarkaar", Modi voiced alarm over the RJD's poll campaign, in which children came on stage declaring that they wished to become "rangdaar" (street bullies), armed with unlicensed pistols and double barrel guns (dunaali)".

"People are not voting for jungle raj wallahs because they know if these people come to power they will hold a katta at the head of the public with the order to hold hands up. People of Bihar do not want hands up but start ups, which only the NDA can facilitate," he said.

Although the Prime Minister refrained from mentioning leaders of the RJD and the Congress by names, he made ample references to "royal families" running these, "one most corrupt in the corrupt in Bihar".

Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi was lampooned as a "Congress ke naamdaar" who was "practising drowning", a tongue in cheek reference to Gandhi's jumping into a muddy pond last week to interact with fishermen.

Gandhi's allegation of "vote theft" was dismissed as "net practice for finding excuse, following a defeat in Bihar", while his criticism of Modi's aborted plan to take a dip in Yamuna on Chhath was called an "insult" to the most popular festival of the state.

The PM, whose penultimate rally was at Sitamarhi, the birthplace of goddess Sita, also deftly used the Hindutva card to question the INDIA bloc's pro-deprived caste stance.

He alleged that reluctance of INDIA bloc leaders to visit Ayodhya, which housed not just the Ram temple but also shrines dedicated to Maharshi Valmiki, Mata Shabri and Nishad Raj was on account of their "hatred for Dalits and backwards".

The opposition coalition was also repeatedly charged by the PM with "protecting infiltrators", driving whom out was, according to the government at the Centre, the aim of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls that was completed in the state days before

The opposition has sought to repudiate the charge citing that no infiltrator was detected during the SIR exercise and that "ghuspaithya" was a term used as a dog whistle to target Muslims, who are nearly 17 per cent of Bihar's total population and have a sizeable presence in the Seemanchal region.

Modi's speeches during the assembly polls also had references to the abrogation of Article 370 and Operation Sindoor, and the opposition was charged with "capitulation before religious extremists" for not supporting the government on Triple Talaq and Waqf laws.


He also touched upon the problem of migration, which has been made a major poll issue by Jan Suraaj Party founder Prashant Kishor.

The PM promised that in its next innings in power, the NDA will ensure "sons of Bihar get employed on the home soil and make their motherland proud".

Modi had also been chuffed at the sight of women turning up in large numbers at rallies and at polling booths on the day of voting.

"Our mothers and sisters have been the worst sufferers of jungle raj," Modi said at many of his rallies and remarked that high turn out of "Matri Shakti" meant they had "built a fortress around polling booths, to keep jungle raj at bay".

'Vote chori' allegation baseless, Rahul should approach EC with evidence: Rajnath



Sasaram, Nov 08: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Saturday dismissed Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's allegation of 'vote chori' as "baseless", and said he should approach the Election Commission if he has a complaint with evidence.

Addressing two election rallies in Rohtas district, Singh said Congress was facing a dearth of issues, and that's why Gandhi was levelling such allegations.

"If Rahul Gandhi thinks that votes are being stolen in Bihar, he should file a complaint with the EC. He is not doing that; he is simply levelling baseless allegations against a constitutional body. He is simply lying," he alleged.

Singh alleged Congress creates rift among the people over

caste, creed and religion, as it believes in "divisive politics".

Rahul Gandhi is raising the issue of reservation in the defence forces. Our defence forces are above all these. He should not drag them into politics," he said.

BJP supports reservations. We have given reservations to the poor and other eligible sections of the society," he added.

Hailing the armed forces for their success in Operation Sindoor, Singh said it has been 'halted and not stopped".

"If terrorists attempt to attack India again, we will retaliate strongly. India does not provoke anyone, but if anyone provokes us, we will not spare them," he said.

"India is no longer a weak country. We are now known as a powerful country in the world," he added.

Centre invested Rs 21,000 cr in Northeast's edu sector in 11 years: FM Sitharaman

Gohpur (Assam), Nov 08: Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Saturday claimed that the central government has invested Rs 21,000 crore in the education sector in the Northeast in the last 11 years. Connectivity has also received a boost in the region during the period, with new states put on the railway map and several greenfield airports constructed, she added.

Sitharaman, who was on a two-day visit to Assam since Friday, was speaking after laying the foundation stone for the state's first university focussed on technical and vocational education and training at Bholaguri

in Gohpur in Biswanath district. The 'Swahid Kanaklata Barua State University' will be built at a cost of Rs 415 crore on a total area of 241 acres, with a built-up area of 7 lakh sq ft.

"Since 2014, the Centre has invested Rs 21,000 crore in the education sector in the Northeast. Over 850 new schools have been opened. The first AIIMS in the region has become operational, and over 200 new skill development institutes have been operationalised. The country's first sports university is also coming up in the region," Sitharaman

In Assam alone, 15 new medical colleges have been built, while South Asia's largest cancer care centre is coming up in

the state and the state will also soon have the region's second IIM, she added.

"To boost the education sector, the Centre is working in coordination with the state governments of the region," the Union minister said.

Besides developing roads, bridges and tunnels, the Centre is also working on the aviation and railway sectors in the region, Sitharaman said.cShe said that in the last 11 years, 10 new greenfield airports have been built in the region. Manipur and Meghalaya have been added to the country's railway map for the first time during this period,

Outside the Shia-dominated areas, voters are largely divided among the NC, independent candidates Jibran Dar and Muntazir Mohiuddin, Awami Ittehad Party-backed independent Nazir Ahmad Khan, and PDP's Muntazir Mehdi. Besides them, other key candidates in the fray include Aga Syed Mohsin(BJP), Deeba Khan(Aam Admi Party), Mukthar Dar(Apni

Party) and Sameer Ahmad (independent). An interaction with people by a team of reporters from news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) revealed that the main contest is between the NC and the PDP, though Nazir Khan and Jibran Dar are expected to secure a significant share of votes. "NC has a loyal support base in the segment. Their workers will come out and vote for the party irrespective of who the candidate is. While there are many candidates in the fray, the main contest is between Aga Mehmood and Aga Muntazir," a group of elders listening to Sameer Ahmad's

speech in Soibugh told KNO. The NC's biggest advantage remains its traditional support base in the segment-something other parties lack. However, disillusionment over its alleged failure to deliver on the 2024 electoral manifesto, and the rift with Ruhullah,

could prove to be major setbacks. On the other hand, Peoples Democratic Party, banking on Mustafais, lack an organizational

network in the segment. Other than cult vote, it is mainly eyeing floating vote, which can play a decisive role in outcome of the election. Our interactions indicated that the basic

governance issues resonate more with vot-

ers than broader political narratives. "I have to pay Rs 2100 monthly electricity. Jibran Dar met me and assured help. I will vote for a new face," says 40-year-old Farooq Ahmad Najar of Narkura, who sells masala bread at Naraspora, 41-year-old Abdul Hamid of Wadwan, who

describes himself as a victim of the reservation policy, says the villagers are divided on their voting preferences. "Candidates from the National Conference, Peoples Democratic Party, Nazir Khan, and Jibran Dar will each get their share of votes from our village," he says.

He adds that he is fed up with politics and remains undecided about whether he will vote. "I hold an MPhil and a PhD in Urdu. I had applied for the post of Urdu typist in the Department of Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs, but a candidate from a reserved category was selected. I can no longer apply for government jobs as I have crossed the age threshold," he says.

He supports Ruhullah's decision to stay away from electioneering. "What else should he have done when the government didn't fulfill its

promises? He is right in his decision," he said. The campaigns of major political players has revolved around BJP-links to electoral promises. While the National Conference has tried to target the PDP for its past ties with the BJP-a weapon they tested in every election since the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, the Peoples Democratic Party and other parties have mainly targeted the NC for "failing" to fulfill promises made to the electorate in the 2024 polls.

In this electoral battle, politicians like Imran Reza Ansari of Peoples Conference and Hakim Muhammad Yasin of the Peoples Democratic Front, who command sizeable influence in the constituency, could play a significant role in the outcome of the polls.

The proscribed Jamaat-e-Islami(JeI) also has impressive influence in a few pockets of the segment. The Justice and Development group, comprising former members of Jel, has also kept its cards close to its chest. (KNO)

Sitamarhi (Bihar), Nov 08: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday claimed that people were not voting for the RJD-helmed opposition in Bihar as they fear that if the INDIA bloc was voted to power, the regime would put a 'katta' (country-made firearm) at their heads.

In contrast, the PM told a rally in Sitamarhi district of the poll-bound state that the NDA was facilitating start-up enterprises, in addition to better education and growth in spheres like sports.

Final turnout in first phase of Bihar polls 65.08 pc, highest in state's history: EC



Patna, Nov 08: The final turnout in the first phase of the Bihar assembly polls is 65.08 per cent, the highest in the state's history, the Election Commission said.

A total of 3.75 crore people were eligible to cast their votes at 45,341 polling stations, including 36,733 in rural areas, on November 6 to decide the electoral fate of 1,314 candidates, of whom 1,192 are

men and 122 women. As per the latest update provided by the office of the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), Bihar, the "historic" turnout of 65.08 per cent is 7.79 per cent more than the consolidated polling percentage of the previous assembly polls held in 2020, when 57.29 per cent of the electors had cast their votes. Of the 3.75

crore voters, 1.98 crore are men and 1.76 crore women. Women had come out in large numbers to exercise their franchise in the November 6 polls.

Two districts - Muzaffarpur and Samastipur – recorded over 70 per cent voting. While Muzaffarpur registered 71.81 per cent turnout, it was 71.74 per cent in Samastipur.

Besides, other districts that recorded a high polling percentage were Madhepura (69.59), Saharsa (69.38), Vaishali (68.50) and Khagaria (67.90). Patna district recorded 59.02 per cent voting, while Lakhisarai registered 64.98 per cent, Munger 62.74 and Siwan 60.61.

The remaining 122 seats of the 243-member assembly will vote on November 11, while the counting will take place on November 14.

Govt plans AI-based eKYC, global credential verification in DigiLocker

New Delhi, Nov 08: India signed a deal on Friday to buy 113 engines from General Electric to power an advanced variant of its home-produced Tejas fighter jets, in a sign of warming ties with the U.S. following months of tariff-induced

The Tejas Mk-1A fighters are crucial for India's efforts to shore up its air force's depleting fighter squadrons and replace ageing jets in the face of neighbouring China's growing military strength and support for New Delhi's arch-rival Pakistan.

But the rollout of the fighter has been delayed due to slow deliveries from GE of 99 engines ordered in 2021, of which only four have arrived so far. GE has blamed supply chain issues following COVID-19.

Friday's deal is a follow-on order to power more of the fighters, with the engines expected to be delivered over five years from 2027, Indian state-owned warplane maker Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd said in a statement after the signing. It did not mention the deal

India's relations with the U.S. had soured after President Donald Trump doubled tariffs on Indian

goods to 50% in August as punishment for New Delhi's purchases of Russian oil, which led New Delhi to pause purchases of U.S. defence equipment.

Trump said last month that he planned to reach a trade deal with India, and on Thursday told reporters in Washington that trade talks were going well, and he could visit India next year.

The comment followed a reduction in purchases of Russian oil by



Indian refiners after U.S. sanctions last month on Russia's top two producers.

Trump was due to visit India this year for the summit of leaders of the Quad grouping, which comprises Australia, Japan, India and the United States.

But Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said last month that the summit would likely be held in the first quarter of 2026, and that Trump "has a busy per od" ahead in 2025.

New Delhi, Nov 08: The country's first Vande Bharat train sleeper coach maintenance facility will be ready by mid-2026 at Jodhpur in Rajasthan, according to a senior North Western Railway official.

North Western Railway's Senior Divisional Mechanical Engineer Major Amit Swamy said the state-of-the-art facility at Bhagat Ki Kothi Railway station is being constructed at a cost of Rs 360 crore.

The first phase of the maintenance and workshop depot, which includes a 600-metre track facility to maintain 24 sleeper coaches of Vande Bharat trains, will be ready by June, 2026.

The second phase, with a 178-metre track, including a workshop and simulator facility, will be completed by June, 2027, he told reporters.

The facility will also house a dedicated wheel rack system and a specialised testing laboratory, including latest simulators for training and evaluating high-tech equipment, highlighting Indian Railways' focus on precision, safety and performance, he said.

The first phase will cost Rs 167 crore and the second phase Rs 195 crore, he said. The project is being executed by the North Western



Railway with Railway Vikas Nigam Limited and Kinet Railway Solution, a joint venture between Russia and India, as technology partners.

This facility will maintain only the sleeper coaches of Vande Bharat which are being introduced shortly, Swamy said, adding that the project includes a three-tier inspection facility for Vande Bharat coaches. "The depot will be capable of inspecting and maintaining three trains at the same time. The workshop in the depot will have advanced machinery for lifting entire train rakes, transferring bogies using a drop pit table, and wheel-turning systems that will ensure uninterrupted maintenance of the

Vande Bharat trains," he said. Four more such facilities are being established at Bijwasan railway station (Delhi), Thanisandra railway station (Bengaluru), Anand Vihar (Del-

hi) and Wadi Bandar (Mumbai). Swamy said that the facility in Jodhpur will have the capacity for maintenance of eight to nine trains daily.

Vande Bharat coaches will have to be brought for maintenance at any of these facilities after four days or after travelling 3,500 km, he said.

had second highest chronic kidney disease cases in 2023

New Delhi, Nov 08: India had the second-highest number of people with chronic kidney disease in 2023 at 138 million, following China at 152 million, according to a global study published in The Lancet journal.

The condition was the ninth-leading cause of death and claimed nearly 15 lakh lives globally the same year, researchers led by those at the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME) at the University of Washington and other institutes in the US and UK found.

The highest prevalence was seen in North Africa and the Middle East at 18 per cent each, nearly 16 per cent in South Asia and over 15 per cent in each of Sub-Saharan Africa and Latin America and the Caribbean.

Chronic kidney disease is a major contributor to heart disease and accounted for almost 12 per cent of cardiovascular deaths around the world in 2023. It ranked as the seventh leading cause for heart-related mortality, ahead of diabetes and obesity, the team said.

Fourteen risk factors for chronic kidney disease were detailed in the study, with diabetes, high blood pressure, and obesity driving the highest loss in

healthy living.
"Chronic kidney disease is both a major risk factor for other leading causes of health loss and a significant disease burden in its own right. Yet, it continues to receive far less policy attention than other non-communicable diseases, even as its impact grows fastest in regions already facing the greatest health inequities," senior author Theo Vos, professor emeritus at

The researchers analysed data from



the Global Burden of Disease (GBD) 2023 study, tracking trends in disease, injuries and health risk factors across 204 countries and territories from 1990 through 2023. The IHME coordinates the GBD study.

Dietary factors, such as a low intake of fruits and vegetables and a high consumption of sodium, also made substantial contributions towards one's risk of chronic kidney disease, they said. The authors said that in 2023, most people with chronic kidney disease were in the early stages, highlighting the importance of screening programmes and strategies addressing disease risk.

The measures can help reduce heart-related deaths due to kidney disease and delay one's requirement of replacement therapies, usually seen in advanced stages of the disease, the team said.

Because access to kidney replacement therapies, including dialysis and transplantation, remains limited and uneven worldwide, a greater emphasis is needed on preventing disease progression and ensuring equitable care, hey added.

Improving access to diagnosis and affordable care, tackling key risk factors, and investing in strategies that prevent the disease from advancing will be essential to address the growing burden of chronic kidney disease on patients, families, and health systems worldwide, the researchers said.

Gold records 3rd weekly loss amid fading hopes of **US Fed rate cut**

New Delhi, Nov 08: The price of 24-carat gold (10 grams) dipped by Rs 670 over the week, impacted by a stronger dollar and reduced expectations for another US Federal Re-

serve rate cut. The price of 10 grams of 24-carat gold closed the week at Rs 1,20,100 down from Rs 1,20,770 last week, according to data published by the India Bullion and Jewellers Association (IBJA). International bullion remained around \$4,000 for the week, facing pressure following Fed Chair Jerome Powell's hawkish remarks, even as the US Fed delivered a second 25 bps cut this year.

Market expectations for another cut in December slipped from around 90 per cent to near 60 per cent, pressuring bullion, while the dollar index held close to 100 and USD/INR climbed toward 89. Analysts said that the

longest US government shutdown on record has delayed official data, increasing reliance on private surveys. ISM manufacturing and services PMIs fell below 50, indicating contraction, while private payrolls rose by 42,000, complicating the Federal Reserve's outlook.

Meanwhile, US-China trade tensions eased after US President Donald Trump and Chinese President Xi Jinping agreed to tariff trimming in exchange for Beijing's fentanyl curbs, renewed soybean buying, and continued rare-earth exports, muting safe-haven demand.

Trump calls G20 in South Africa a 'disgrace', says no US official will attend summit

Washington, Nov 08: US President Donald Trump said it is a "total disgrace" that the G20 will be held in South Africa later this month, announcing that no American official will attend the Summit as long as "human rights abuses" against the ethnic minority group of Afrikaners continue in the country.

Earlier this week, Trump had announced that he would not be attending the G20 Summit in South Africa, as he questioned the country's membership in the grouping of major economies.

"It is a total disgrace that the G20 will be held in South Africa. Afrikaners (People who are descended from Dutch settlers, and also French and German immigrants) are being killed and slaughtered, and their land and farms are being illegally confiscated," Trump said in a post on Truth Social on Friday. "No US Government



Official will attend as long as these Human Rights abuses continue. I look forward to hosting the 2026 G20 in Miami, Florida!" he added.

In February this year, just weeks after being sworn in as US President for a second term, Trump issued an order condemning South Africa's "shocking disregard" of its citizens' rights by enacting legislation that enabled the South African government to seize ethnic minority Afrikaners' agricultural property without compensation. In the wake of this, Trump had said that the US shall not provide aid or assistance to South Africa and shall promote the resettlement of Afrikaner refugees escaping government-sponsored race-based discrimination, including racially discriminatory prop-

In his remarks at a business forum in Miami, Florida, on Wednesday, Trump said, "I am not going. We have a G20 meeting in South Africa. South Africa shouldn't even be in the

South Africa assumed the yearlong G20 Presidency on December 1, 2024, and will host the grouping's leaders for a Summit meeting in Johannesburg from November 22 to 23, the first time that the G20 Summit will be held on African soil. The US will take over the Presidency of the G20 from South Africa and head the grouping from December 1, 2025, through November 30, 2026. Trump has previously said that he will host the G20 leaders for the 2026 summit

India was the President of the G20 from December 2022 to November 2023 and hosted the 18th G20 Summit in New Delhi in September 2023. Then-US President Joe Biden had travelled to India to attend the Summit.

It was under India's G20 Presidency that the African Union officially joined the grouping of the world's major economies as a permanent member.

"I mean, if you take a look at what's going on in parts of South Africa, look at South Africa. What's going on. Look at South America. What's going on....Take a look at what's happening in different parts of South America. Take a look at what's happening in different parts of the world."

'Immigrants with underlying health conditions may be denied US visas'

New York, Nov 08: The Trump administration is understood to have directed American consular offices across the world to deem those individuals seeking to enter and live in the US ineligible if they have certain medical conditions, saying these people could end up relying on public benefits. A report by KFF Health News said that foreigners applying for visas to live in the US "might be rejected if they have certain medical conditions".

The report cited a guidance issued in a cable sent by the State Department to embassy and consular officials.

'You must consider an applicant's health...Certain medical conditions - including, but not limited to, cardiovascular diseases, respiratory diseases, cancers, diabetes, metabolic diseases, neurological diseases, and mental health conditions - can require hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of care," according to the cable cited by KFF.

The cable also advises visa officers to consider conditions like obesity in making their decisions, noting that the condition can cause asthma, sleep apnoea and high blood pressure. The officers are advised to take into consideration the medical

conditions to assess whether an immigrant could become a public charge and require expensive, long-term care".

The new guidance directs "visa officers to deem applicants ineligible to enter the US for several new reasons, including age or the likelihood they might rely on public benefits". "The guidance says that such people could become a 'public charge' — a potential drain on US resources — because of their health issues or age," the KFF Health News report said. The cable directs visa officers to also assess if applicants are financially stable to pay for their medical treatment without help from the US government. "Does the applicant have adequate financial resources to cover the costs of such care over his entire expected lifespan without seeking public cash assistance or longterm institutionalisation at government expense?" the cable reads.

The guidance also directs visa officers to consider the health of family members, including children or older parents. "Do any of the dependents have disabilities, chronic medical conditions or other special needs and require care such that the applicant cannot maintain employment?" the cable said, according to the news report.

Chinese firm bags contract to print Nepal's Rs 1,000 bank notes



Kathmandu, Nov 08: A Chinese company has bagged a contract to design and print 430 million pieces of Nepal's ₹1,000 denomination banknotes, officials said on Saturday (November 8, 2025).

Nepal Rastra Bank (NRB) issued a letter of intent to the China Banknote Printing and Minting Corporation on Friday (November 7, 2025) for the design, printing, supply and delivery of the notes, the bank officials said.

The total project cost has been fixed at \$16.985 million, according to the Currency Management Department of the bank. The Chinese company was selected on the basis of the lowest evaluated bid. The firm has previously printed Nepalese banknotes ₹10, ₹100, and ₹500 denominations, the officials said.

Trump admin launches over 100 investigations into H-1B visa prog

Washington, Nov 08: The US Department of Labour (DOL) has launched at least 175 investigations into potential abuses within the H-1B visa programme, as part of a broader effort by the Trump administration to crack down on the foreign worker visa system, Fox News reported on Friday. The initiative, dubbed

"Project Firewall," was launched in September to target companies allegedly exploiting the visa system, which allows US firms to hire foreign workers in speciality occupations such as information technology, engineering, and healthcare. "The Department of Labour is using every resource at our disposal to put a stop to H-1B abuse and protect American jobs," the DOL Secretary Lori Chavez-DeRemer said in a post on X. She added that "Under the leadership of @POTUS, we'll continue job opportunities go to

New Delhi, Nov 08: Indian cricket legend Mahendra Singh Dhoni is set to play in the 2026 edition of the Indian Premier League (IPL) for five-time champions Chennai Super Kings (CSK), said franchise CEO Kasi Viswanathan on Friday. Dhoni, who has been synonymous with CSK since the league's inception in 2008, was back as their captain midway through the 2025 IPL, after newly-appointed captain, opener Ruturaj Gaikwad, was ruled out of the competition due to an

elbow injury. It was a season to forget for CSK as they finished at the bottom of the points table with just four wins from 14 matches. "He is likely to play, that is the (current) status. We have a feeling that he will play in this upcoming IPL," Viswanathan told IANS on Friday. Barring the franchise's suspension for the 2016 and 2017 seasons, Dhoni has been a constant

person in the CSK set-up. A return for IPL 2026 will mark his 17th season with CSK and 19th overall in the competition. So far, Dhoni has played 248 matches for CSK, amassing 4,865 runs and captaining CSK to five IPL titles in 2010, 2011, 2018, 2021, and 2023. Overall, Dhoni has made 5439 runs in 278 matches – with 158 catches and 47 stumpings against his name. Meanwhile, with

November 15 being the IPL retention deadline, the eyes of everyone in the cricketing ecosystem will be on any big name being traded to another franchise. 
