Valley's fruit industry suffered Rs 2,000 cr losses due to August disaster: KVFG

Urges govt to announce compensation, revive support schemes

Srinagar, Nov 19: In the wake of the devastating natural disaster that struck Jammu and Kashmir in August 2025, the valley's fruit industry, one of the region's major economic lifelines, has reported massive losses estimated at nearly Rs 2,000 crore, the growers said on Wednesday.

At an emergency meeting convened by the Kashmir Valley Fruit Growers-Cum-Dealers Union (KVFG) at Fruit Mandi, Apple Town, Sopore, the representatives from all major fruit growers' associations across the valley expressed grave concern over the crisis and urged the government to immediately announce a comprehensive relief package.

The meeting, as per the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), was chaired by KVFG Chairman Bashir Ahmad Basheer, who said the valley's apple economy had been crippled after an unprecedented deluge in August, followed by the closure of the Srinagar-Jammu National Highway for more than 20 days.

Basheer said the disaster hit at the peak of the apple harvesting season, turning the situation catastrophic for growers, traders, and buyers. Thousands of trucks carrying fresh apples | More on P6

India among 7 countries expected to add over 500 million city residents between 2025 and 2050: UN

United Nations, Nov 19: United Nations, India, along with six other countries, "will shape the future growth of the city population" of the world as they are expected to add more than 500 million city residents between

2025 and 2050, the UN said. The 'World Urbanisation Prospects 2025: Summary of Results', released by the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA), said that the world is becoming increasingly urban, with cities now home to 45 per cent of the global population of 8.2

billion. The report said that the growth of the world's city population between now and

2050 will be concentrated in seven countries: India, Nigeria, Pakistan, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Egypt, Bangladesh and Ethiopia.

These seven countries, which host nearly one third (30 per cent) of the global population in 2025, "will shape the future growth of the city population" and are projected to contribute over half of the global growth of city dwellers by 2050.

Taken together, these seven countries are expected to add more than 500 million city residents between 2025 and 2050, accounting for over half of the projected 986 million increase in the global number of city dwellers over that period.

"The success or failure of urbanisation in these key countries

will shape global development outcomes. Their ability to manage city growth sustainably will have profound implications not only for their populations but also for global progress toward the Sustainable Development Goals and climate objectives," the report said.

The report said that the two most populous countries, India and China, will also have the largest populations residing in towns between now and 2050. As of 2025, the proportion of people living in towns has reached 44 per cent in India and 40 per cent in China. Together, India and China account for more than 1.2 billion town population, representing over 40 per cent of the population living in towns globally.

1975 and 2000 and in subsequent years, largely due to declining fertility rates and slower overall population growth.

The report said that the number of megacities quadrupled from eight in 1975 to 33 in 2025, with 19 in Asia. Projections indicate that there will be 37 megacities globally by 2050, as the populations of Addis Ababa (Ethiopia), Dar es Salaam (United Republic of Tanzania), Hajipur (India) and Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia) grow to over 10 million.

Highly placed Congress sources revealed that the re-entry of Jugal Kishore Sharma, Abdul Majid Wani, G M Saroori, Taj Mohiuddin and others was earlier "blocked due to alleged sabotage by a few senior leaders within the J&K unit" just before the

2024 Assembly elections. Speaking on the occasion, JKPCC Chief Tariq Hameed Karra welcomed the leaders and said their return would further consolidate the Congress as the principal opposition force

in Jammu and Kashmir.

AICC in-charge Dr Sayeed Naseer Hussain termed the development a "big morale booster" and asserted that more leaders disillusioned with the DPAP and other regional outfits are in touch with the Congress. The string of high-profile returns comes at a time when Ghu-lam Nabi Azad's DPAP has been facing internal dissent and poor electoral performance, having failed to open its account in the 2024

Assembly polls. Meanwhile, senior DPAP

leader, Salman Nizami called the leaders who rejoined Congress today as "deadwood," noting that some had left the party, contested independently & are still using Azad's name, but they had lost by large margins.

He added that former chief minister Ghulam Nabi Azad had told these leaders to go anywhere, as he did not want the burden of such leaders again.

Nizami said Congress, weakened in many states including J&K, cannot expect revival by relying on these deadwood leaders.

He also noted that Congress lacks a strong face in J&K, with even their alliance partner NC not taking them seriously. "Since Azad's departure, Congress has lost 8 assembly elections and 1 Lok Sabha election. Nizami praised Azad as a national leader with significant contributions, emphasising that the people of J&K did not fully understand his vision, a mistake they now regret.'

He added that Azad will visit J&K soon, after which future strategy will be decided—(KNO)

Kashmir fully prepared for harsh winter: Garg

Srinagar, Nov 19: As the valley braces for sub-zero temperatures, Divisional Commissioner (Div Com) Kashmir, Anshul Garg, on Wednesday said that Kashmir is "fully prepared for the coming winter," with essential services, supplies and emergency systems firmly in place, even as the region celebrates its centuries-old heritage under the spirit of unity and cultural pride.

Speaking to media persons during the inauguration of World Heritage Week 2025 in Srinagar, Garg said the administration has ensured seamless coordination across departments to guarantee uninterrupted services through the season.

"Our people are seasoned in facing winter, but the administration has also ensured every mechanism, from snow clearance to power restoration, is active and ready," the Div Com Anshul Garg said.

He said that in far-flung and border districts such as Kupwara and Bandipora, the administration has set up 872 ration dumping sites, each stocked with four months of essential supplies. "Special arrangements have also been made to ensure smooth LPG availability and to maintain road connectivity during snowfall," he added.

The Div Com said the winter stocking process has been completed in advance across all remote regions, while emergency response teams, snow-clearance machinery and power restoration units stand fully mobilised.

"The Srinagar Integrated



Command and Control Centre, along with district control rooms, is functional 24×7 to monitor conditions and coordinate quick response," he said.

According to him, the people of Kashmir have naturally adapted to the winter challenges over generations. Their resilience is remarkable and the administration is complementing that spirit with proactive planning and preparedness," he said. District administrations,

he said, are continuously reviewing local needs to ensure smooth supply chains and uninterrupted services. "Any weather-related disruption will be dealt with swiftly, and all departments have been placed on high alert throughout the season," he said. "World Heritage Week is celebrated every year, and the Department of Culture has taken a wonderful initiative. Many students from schools and colleges are participating, and several priceless treasures have been displayed. I encourage everyone to visit from November 19 to 25," Garg said. He said such events create a bridge between generations, allowing youth to connect with their identity. "Kashmir has preserved unique civilizational treasures for centuries, whether through Shaivism, Sufism, Buddhism or other influences. Our arts, crafts and music have earned global recognition, and our archaeological sites continue to attract visitors from across the world," he said.

Highlighting the link between heritage and governance, the Div Com said the administration has intensified efforts over the past four years to revive archaeological sites, restore monuments and document rare manuscripts.

"The Department of Culture is running a major campaign for the revival of heritage sites. Many projects are underway to bring our cultural wealth closer to people and ensure public participation," he said.

The Divisional Commissioner added that the World Heritage Week is not only a celebration but also "a reflection to reconnect with our roots and recognise the work being done to safeguard them".

"Understanding where we come from helps shape how we build the future," he said, underscoring that cultural awareness and civic preparedness are integral to Kashmir's resilience—(KNO)

Know your risk, prevent diabetes: endocrinologist

Srinagar, Nov 19: As diabetes continues to rise at an alarming pace across the globe, a leading endocrinologist has stressed the urgent need for people to understand their individual risk factors and adopt lifestyle changes to prevent the disease.

Dr Shariq Masoodi said that awareness, early detection and disciplined living remain the strongest tools against the diabetes epidemic.

He said diabetes is no longer a disease limited to the elderly, and younger populations in both urban and rural areas are now increasingly vulnerable. "People first need to understand their risk factors to stay away from diabetes. If someone in your family is diabetic, if you are obese or have other lifestyle-related issues, your chances of developing diabetes are significantly higher," he explained.

According to Dr Masoodi, nearly 90 per cent of all diabetes cases worldwide are Type II, and a majority of these cases are being reported from underdeveloped or developing countries. "Rapid



urbanisation and drastic lifestyle changes are major contributors. People are not exercising the way they used to, physical activity has reduced sharply, and our diets have become calorie-dense," he said.

The endocrinologist said the prevalence of diabetes in Kashmir stands at around 10 per cent, while Jammu has nearly 20 per cent, making it the region with a comparatively higher burden of the disease. These rising numbers demand a stronger preventive approach at the community level, he said, adding that around 40-50 per cent of patients are unaware that they are diabetic because of no symptoms and regular screen-

ing is a must. Recommending dietary discipline, Dr Masoodi said maintaining a balanced diet is crucial risk," he added—(KNO)

for prevention and management. "We need to limit carbohydrates and proteins in our meals and ensure our food intake is balanced

throughout the day," he said. He advised that breakfast should account for 40 per cent of daily food intake, followed by 30 per cent each for lunch and dinner.

He pointed out a widespread habit in Kashmir that worsens health outcomes. "People here often take heavy, unlimited dinners and go to sleep almost immediately. This is harmful and creates multiple health issues. There should be at least a three-hour gap between dinner and sleeping, and dinner should ideally be taken early," he stressed.

Around 50 per cent of the plates we eat should be fruit and vegetables, he advised.

Underscoring the immense role of physical activity, Prof Masoodi said that daily exercise is essential for keeping diabetes and many other lifestyle diseases at bay. "Lifestyle and diet play a major role in prevention. Regular walking, simple physical activities and healthier food habits can drastically reduce disease

Fire damages DFO Tangmarg office record

Tangmarg, Nov 19: A Divisional Forest Office in Tangmarg was gutted in a massive blaze on Wednesday.

Officials said, the fire started in the morning and engulfed the building within minutes. Fire and Emergency Services reached the spot but failed to douse the flames in time. The building was damaged and most sections were reduced to ashes. they said. Meanwhile, Police have launched a preliminary inquiry while no injuries were reported during the incident.

DFO Tangmarg, Feroz said the structure was old and made of wood, which helped the fire spread fast. He said most official records were destroyed.

The official added that the department informed Fire and Emergency Services on time, but the delay in response remains unexplained—(KNO)

Winter break until 8th grade from December: Minister Itoo

Srinagar, Nov 19: Minister Sakina Itoo Wednesday said that the winter break for students up to the middle classes is likely to begin from the first week of December amid cold temperatures.

Speaking to reporters, the minister said that the parents repeatedly requested for the announcement of the schedule for winter break. "The winter season becomes difficult for younger children."

Itoo further said that, "We have already conducted a meeting regarding the winter break and we have tentatively decided that for lower classes from Class 1 up to middle grade, will probably observe the vacation from the first

week of December."

About the textbook issue, the minister said, "We have already streamlined the matter to a large extent."

"Directions have been issued to ensure there is no shortage of books or uniforms," she said. Minister Itoo also said

that strict instructions have been passed to the JKBOSE Secretary, Chairman, Education Secretary, and other concerned officials to act tough against the private schools who violate the government norms.

"Wherever we will receive a complaint against any private school regarding the books or fees, we will definitely take strict action against them," she said. Pertinently, KNO in

previous week had reported that the School Education Department has tentatively decided to announce the winter vacations in a phased manner from the first week of December for the winter zone of Kashmir division. The news agency had

reported that Education Minister Sakina Itoo in a recent review meeting informed the officials of the department that the government will likely announce winter vacation for primary level classes from the first week of December.

The official sources further informed that in case of other classes upto 12th standard, the vacations are likely from the second week of December—(KNO)

Delhi terror blast....

Victim's body arrives home to grief

Ganderbal, Nov 19: Grief spread across the mountainous terrain of Babanagri Wangat in Kangan, approximately 56 Kilometers from Srinagar, on Wednesday as the villagers gathered to mourn the 30-yearold labourer, Bilal Ahmad Sango, who was among thirteen people killed in the recent terror blast near Delhi's Red Fort. Bilal's body, wrapped in a white

shroud, arrived from Delhi to the village, nestled among pine-covered slopes and rugged hills.

Hundreds of residents assembled, their faces etched with sorrow, trying to come to terms with the sudden loss of a man remembered for his humility and tireless dedication to his family.

Meanwhile, hundreds attended his funeral in his native village, with family and relatives wailing and mourning the unexpected loss.

"Bilal left home in 2005 to earn for his family. After returning in 2016, he went back to Delhi to continue supporting his loved ones. His whole life was spent trying to fulfil his family's dreams," said Atta Mohd, a neighbour.

Ghulam Ali recalled his last conversation with Bilal over the phone. "Just last month, he said he would return in January. "None of us imagined he would come back like this. The home feels emptier without him," he said.

Villagers remembered Bilal as someone who quietly carried the dreams of his family on his shoulders while always offering help to anyone in need. "He was like a mountain stream, giving life and support wherever he flowed," said another resident.

MLA Kangan Mian Mehar Ali visited the family and offered condolences, assuring them that the government would provide compensation and support. He noted that the Chief Minister had clarified that Kashmiris should not be treated as sus-

pects in such incidents.
"Bilal had spent his life chasing dreams far from home, and his return, in a coffin, left a trail of grief, memories, and the silent hope that his family would be cared for as he had cared for them," he said-(KNO)

Powering Creative Technology: India's Leap Into The Future Of Media And Entertainment

India's Creative Economy at an Inflection Point

India's Media and Entertainment sector has emerged as one of the country's fastest-growing industries, powered by digital innovation, youth-driven demand, and a surge in creative entrepreneurship. Recognised by the government as a high-potential segment within the services economy, the sector is projected to grow at a compound annual rate of about 7 percent, reaching approximately

3,067 billion by 2027. The national outlook envisions this ecosystem scaling up to USD 100 billion by 2030, signalling a decisive shift from a content-consuming nation to a global creator and exporter of intellectual property. The strategic vision for the sector rests on

three core pillars:
 Current initiatives aim to strengthen domestic capability in animation, visual effects, gaming, and extended reality through investments in training, digital infrastructure, and innovation-driven institutions. At the same time, inclusive participation across regional and linguistic boundaries remains a key policy priority, ensuring that creative opportunities extend beyond metropolitan clusters and into emerging cultural economies.

Media Economically, the Entertainment sector contributes significantly to value addition and job creation, with its gross value-added share steadily increasing over the last decade. India offers a 40 to 60 percent cost advantage in animation and VFX services, supported by a large skilled workforce. This comparative edge has attracted a steady inflow of international projects and positioned India as a preferred destination for global post-production work. The sector's growing global resonance is equally visible in digital media, where nearly 25 percent of total viewership for Indian OTT content originates from overseas audiences. This reflects not only the commercial appeal of India's creative output but also its expanding role in cultural diplomacy, as Indian stories continue to build emotional and cultural connections

The AVGC-XR Revolution

This creative resurgence finds its most dynamic expression in the AVGC-XR sector, where technology, storytelling, and innovation converge to define the next chapter of India's media and entertainment growth. It is here that India's creative ambition meets its digital capability marking a shift from producing content for audiences to shaping experiences for the world.

Genesis and Institutional Framework

India's creative economy has entered a transformative phase with the formal recognition of the Animation, Visual Effects, Gaming, Comics and Extended Reality (AVGC-XR) sector as a key driver of growth. The policy journey gained momentum in 2022 with the constitution of the AVGC Promotion Task Force, established to formulate a comprehensive national strategy for nurturing India's AVGC-XR ecosystem as a global hub for creative technology and digital content production. The Task Force recommended the establishment of a National AVGC-XR Mission with a "Create in India" focus to position the country as a global hub for digital content creation and creativity. The AVGC Promotion Task Force's report projected the creation of around 20 lakh direct and indirect jobs in the coming ten years, while estimating that the sector could contribute to India's GDP through production, exports, and allied

IICT – From Vision to Action

May 2025: Indian Institute of Creative Technologies (IICT) was formalised as a Section 8 company to advance India's AVGC-XR ecosystem through education, research, and innovation, transforming policy intent into institutional action.

May 2025: IICT onboarded Google, YouTube, Meta, Adobe, Microsoft, NVIDIA, Wacom, and JioStar as industry partners to co-develop curricula, offer internships and scholarships, and support creative-tech

startups through incubation and mentoring. July 15, 2025: Admissions opened for the first academic session featuring specialised courses across Gaming, Post-Production, Animation, Comics, and XR, designed in consultation with industry experts. The institute has also signed an MoU with the University of York (United Kingdom) to facilitate faculty exchange, collaborative research, and globally benchmarked curriculum development.

July 18, 2025: The first IICT campus was inaugurated at the NFDC Complex, Mumbai, with an initial budget of 400 crore and a goal of training around 300 students in the inaugural batch alongside professional upskilling modules.

August 30, 2025: The WaveX Media-Tech Startup Incubator was launched to nurture creative entrepreneurship. The first cohort included 15 startups, receiving mentorship, infrastructure, and access to global partners.

October 7, 2025: IICT signed an MoU with FICCI and Netflix to co-create curricula, conduct masterclasses, and provide scholarships under the Netflix Fund for Creative Equity, integrating global content expertise into India's creative-education ecosystem.

One of the most significant milestones in India's AVGC-XR journey has been the creation of a dedicated institutional framework to nurture talent and innovation. The National Center of Excellence (NCoE) for AVGC-XR, approved by the Government in 2024, was envisioned as the country's apex body for training, research, and industry collaboration in animation, visual effects, gaming, and immersive media.

In 2024, the Indian Institute of Creative Technologies (IICT) was unveiled in Mumbai, Maharashtra, as the National Centre of Excellence for AVGC-XR. Set up as a Section 8 company—a not-for-profit entity that reinvests its resources into institutional growth—the institute brings together academia, industry, and government on one platform. By developing modern curricula, fostering joint research, and promoting global industry linkages, IICT is shaping a new generation of creators and innovators, positioning India at the forefront of the global creative economy.

Policy Momentum

Complementing national initiatives, several states are advancing the AVGC-XR vision through targeted policies and institutional frameworks. Karnataka has been one of the firsts to implement a dedicated AVGC-XR Policy 2024–2029, focusing on skilling, incubation, and global market competitiveness. Maharashtra, too, has taken significant steps with the approval of its AVGC-XR Policy 2025 in September this year, backed by a financial plan of 3,268 crore and a long-term roadmap extending to 2050. The policy seeks to attract investments, create employment opportunities, and strengthen state-level production infrastructure through dedicated clusters and training initiatives.

Policy Reforms and Infrastructure

From updated cinema laws and digitalgovernance frameworks to the development of integrated production facilities, the following initiatives collectively demonstrate India's commitment to building a globally competitive and future-ready media and entertainment industry:

Cinematograph (Amendment) Act, 2023

The Cinematograph (Amendment) Act, 2023, represents a landmark reform in India's film legislation. The amendment strengthens the regulatory and enforcement framework of the Cinematograph Act, 1952, introducing for the first time stringent anti-piracy provisions to curb unauthorised recording and distribution of films. Sections 6AA and 6AB make digital piracy a punishable offence, with imprisonment of up to three years and fines that may extend to 5 per cent of a film's audited gross production cost. The newly introduced Section 7(1B) (ii) authorises the Government to direct online intermediaries to remove or restrict access to pirated film content hosted on their platforms, ensuring

timely action against digital infringement.

The Act also modernises certification by introducing age-based, streamlining recertification for television and OTT release, and enabling permanent certification validity for films. Together, these provisions align creative freedom with audience protection and content integrity. As one of the key policy milestones under the government's broader media-reform agenda, the amendment underscores India's commitment to a transparent, secure, and innovation-friendly cinematic ecosystem.

National Broadcasting Policy

The National Broadcasting Policy is being developed to create a modern, inclusive, and growth-oriented framework for India's broadcasting ecosystem. It will focus on promoting content diversity, fair competition, and investment in digital infrastructure, while ensuring ethical standards, intellectual property protection, and audience trust. The policy also aims to strengthen India's global footprint in media and entertainment by fostering innovation, supporting local content creation, and integrating traditional broadcasting with emerging digital platforms to build a future-ready communication environment.

India Cine Hub

India Cine Hub (ICH), developed under the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting and managed by the National Film Development Corporation (NFDC), serves as the Government's single-window platform for film facilitation across India. It streamlines processes, promotes transparency, and enhances India's appeal as a global filming destination.

By integrating permissions, incentives, and production resources, India Cine Hub has become the digital backbone of India's film facilitation ecosystem, reinforcing the country's position as a premier global filmmaking hub.

WAVES: India's Global Platform for Creative Collaboration

The World Audio Visual and Entertainment Summit (WAVES) is India's first integrated platform to showcase and strengthen the country's creative economy on a global scale. The platform serves as a convergence point for policymakers, industry leaders, creators, and investors across the film, television, OTT,

animation, VFX, gaming, and XR sectors.

The inaugural edition, held from 1st - 4th May 2025 at the Jio World Convention Centre in Mumbai and inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister, brought together participants from across the world and global majors in content, technology, and investment. The four-day summit combined ministerial roundtables, market screenings, investor forums, masterclasses, and B2B networking, setting the stage for India's leadership in the global media landscape.

Key highlights included the adoption of the WAVES Declaration on Global Media Cooperation, a 1,328 crore business pipeline generated through the WAVES Bazaar, and a 50 crore investment pool unveiled at WaveX for media-tech start-ups. Anchored in the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047, WAVES underscores India's growing role as a hub for creative technologies, digital storytelling, and international co-production partnerships.

Achievements and Impact

India's technological evolution in this sector reflects a decade-long progression from experimentation to excellence. The use of motion capture and CGI in films such as Ra.One (2011), Baahubali: The Beginning (2015), and Brahmastra (2022) etc. demonstrated early domestic capability in highend production. Since then, Indian studios have advanced rapidly, adopting real-time rendering, volumetric capture, and virtualproduction pipelines to produce immersive storytelling experiences. This growing technical maturity has strengthened India's competitiveness in global post-production and VFX markets, with an increasing number of international studios outsourcing advanced creative work to Indian facilities.

The AVGC-XR ecosystem has also witnessed remarkable progress in professional training and creative capacity building.

Skilling and Workforce Development

Through initiatives led by the Media and Entertainment Skills Council (MESC), professionals are being trained in specialised disciplines such as animation, VFX, gaming, and post-production. Industry-academia collaborations have led to the development of competency standards and modular courses that reflect international benchmarks.

Ecosystem Growth and Global Visibility

RRR: Featured over 2,800 VFX shots. All animal scenes were synchronised using radio-controlled cars, programmed to operate at specific speeds, reflecting the high sophistication of India's VFX workflow

Thor: The Dark World: The VFX work was partially executed by a Mumbai-based studio, illustrating India's expanding participation in international productions

Game of Thrones: The iconic dragons (Khaleesi's dragons) were animated in India, highlighting India's growing technical credibility in high-end animation and creature design

Avatar: Over 200 VFX shots for Avatar were completed by an Indian company, reflecting India's collaboration on top-tier global productions

India's growing mastery in visual effects and animation has positioned it among the world's most sought-after creative destinations. The country's studios are now integral to large-scale domestic and international productions, contributing to some of the most visually complex projects in global entertainment. This evolution reflects the sector's shift from service-based outsourcing to high-value creative collaboration, where Indian talent drives innovation, precision, and storytelling at par with global standards.

Innovation and Enterprise

India's gaming industry, driven by titles such as BGMI (Battlegrounds Mobile India) and FAU-G (Fearless and United Guards), represent the emerging home-grown gaming ecosystem and local IP creation

The Indian comics industry continues to thrive with iconic characters like Suppandi, Chacha Chaudhary, Tenali Raman, and Shikkari Shambhu, several of which are being adapted into animated series and films, signalling the convergence between traditional storytelling and new media platforms.

The rise of start-ups in gaming, XR, and immersive storytelling marks a major shift toward indigenous innovation. Indian studios are now developing mobile and console games rooted in local narratives, mythology, and heritage—reflecting a move from service-driven work to original content creation. Indie developers have introduced culturally resonant titles such as Raji: An Ancient Epic and Indus Battle Royale, which have earned global attention for their design and storytelling depth. These ventures also attract increasing investor interest, signalling growing confidence in India's creative-tech potential and its readiness for the metaverse economy.

Mission Director JJM reviews working of DPUs

JAMMU, NOVEMBER Mission Director Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) J&K, Khurshid Ahmad Shah Wednesday convened a virtual meeting to review the working of District Project Management Units (DPMUs) across the UT.

The meeting was attended by Technical Advisor Kashmir and Jammu along with Technical Officers and I/C DPMUs.

The review focused on strengthening implementation mechanisms, monitoring progress of key JJM deliverables and streamlining coordina-tion between district and the Directorate for timely execution of water supply schemes.

All districts were directed to ensure immediate uploading of updated Minutes of District Water & Sanitation Mission (DWSM) meetings on the designated portal. Timely documentation was emphasized as essential for compliance and



transparency.
A detailed review of the onboarding process of the IJM 2.0 Dashboard was undertaken. District teams presented the current status of data migration, reporting formats and real-time entries. The Mission Director stressed that complete on boarding will significantly enhance monitoring accuracy and accountability.

Districts shared updates regarding geo-tagging of functional and under-construction

assets. The Mission Director instructed all DPMUs to complete pending geo-tagging activities at the earliest to support field verification and improve asset traceability.

Amendment-related procedures were discussed and DPMUs were advised to strictly adhere to guidelines while seeking modifications in project components. Uniform compliance across districts was underscored as a priority.

The status of Information,

Education & Communication (IEC) initiatives was reviewed. Districts were encouraged to intensify awareness campaigns on water quality, safe drinking practices, community participation and Operations and Maintenance (O&M) responsibilities under JJM.

Strengthening coordination with Deputy Commissioners (Chairman District Water & Sanitation Mission) was emphasized, especially for resolving administrative issues, accelerating tendering and execution process, and ensuring inter-departmental support at the district level.

All DPMUs were directed to adhere to timelines, strengthen monitoring mechanisms and maintain close coordination with the Mission Directorate to ensure quality execution on the ground

The review meeting concluded with the Mission Director reiterating the Government's commitment to ensure universal, safe and sustainable drinking water supply to all rural households of Jammu & Kashmir in alignment with the objectives of the Jal Jeevan

DC Budgam reviews progress under Social Security Schemes

Budgam, November 19: A review meeting on the implementation of major Social Security Schemes was Wednesday held under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner Budgam, Dr. Bilal Mohi-Ud-Din Bhat, at the DC Office Complex.

The meeting was attended by the CPO, LDM Budgam, DSWO, ALC Budgam, representatives from ICDS, and branch managers from public and private sector banks operating in the district.
During the meeting, a de-

tailed assessment of PMJJBY, PMSBY and Atal Pension Yojana (APY) was presented as per the progress report updated till 15 November 2025. Under PMJJBY, 5,749 applications were sourced, out of which 4,427 eligible beneficiaries were enrolled, with the district's cumulative enrollment reaching 29,221. Under PMSBY, 36,440 applications were received and 27,863 enrolments were completed, taking the total district enrolment under the scheme to 91,121. For APY, 511 applications were sourced and 372 persons were enrolled, with overall district enrolment reaching 6,129.

It was noted in the meeting that a total of 42,700

applications had been received under the three schemes during the period, of which 32,662 were successfully enrolled, while 9,727 applications had

Directions were issued that awareness activities be intensified across all blocks, with village-level enrolment camps being organised in coordination with BDOs, Anganwadi Workers, CSCs and Self-Help Groups.

He also stressed that doorto-door mobilisation strengthened in unbanked and under-banked areas to ensure better coverage.

Further, the DC directed that scheme-wise progress be monitored on a weekly basis through the LDM office and that coordinated action be ensured through better convergence among Social Welfare, Labour, ICDS, RDD and all banks. It was reiterated that achieving saturation of these schemes must be treated as a priority governance deliverable in the district.

The DC called for renewed efforts so that no eligible beneficiary in Budgam is left outside the financial safety net, and full saturation under all social security schemes is ensured.

Nitish Kumar to take oath as Bihar CM for record 10th time today

PM Modi, HM Shah to attend

Patna, Nov 19: JD(U) supremo Nitish Kumar is set to be swornin as Bihar chief minister for a record 10th time on Thursday, days after the NDA secured a landslide victory in the assembly elections.

Preparations for the swearing-in ceremony at Patna's historic Gandhi Maidan are in the final stages, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, and several top NDA leaders expected to attend.

Apart from the main stage, several pandals have also been erected to accommodate VIPs.

Elaborate security arrangements have been put in place, and over three lakh people are anticipated at the event, a senior BJP leader said.

Kumar submitted his resignation as the outgoing CM to Governor Arif Mohammad Khan on Wednesday.

He was accompanied by Union minister Chirag Paswan, RLM chief Upendra Kushwaha and Uttar Pradesh Deputy CM Keshav Prasad Maurya.

State BJP chief Dilip Jaiswal told reporters that the governor accepted his resignation and asked him to continue as caretaker CM till a new government was formed.

Kumar was elected leader of the NDA legislature party following meetings of newly elected MLAs, where senior leader Samrat Choudhary was chosen as the BJP legislature party leader and Vijay Kumar Sinha as the deputy leader.

Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya, who was appointed as the central observer for the election of the legislature party leader in Bihar by the BJP, was present at



the meeting.

Besides, Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal and former Union Minister Sadhvi Niranjan Jyoti, who were made co-observers for the election process of the legislature party leader, were also present.

Meanwhile, lobbying among NDA allies to finalise cabinet berths continued throughout

The new Bihar Cabinet is expected to include 16 ministers from the BJP and 14 from JD(U), including the party chief.

Sources said consensus has been reached among NDA partners to appoint BJP's Prem Kumar as the Assembly Speaker. The Deputy Speaker's post is likely to go to JD(U).

Sources said the new Cabinet will have five to six new faces from the main constituents of

the NDA – the BJP and the JD(U).

Umesh Singh Kushwaha,
JD(U) state chief who won from Mahnar assembly seat, is likely to be inducted in the new

Cabinet. While JD(U) is likely set to retain its current ministers, BJP may bring in a few new faces.

led by Union Minister Chirag Paswan, HAM-S led by Jitan Ram Manjhi, and RLM led by Upendra Kushwaha – will also

get representation.

"The LIP (RV) is likely to get three berths in the new state cabinet while the HAM-S and RLM one berth each. A maximum of 16 ministers from the BJP and 14 ministers, along with CM Nitish Kumar from JD(U), will take oath on November 20", sources said.

JD(U) leaders likely to be

part of the new Cabinet include Bijendra Prasad Yadav, Vijay Kumar Choudhary, Shrowan Kumar, Sunil Kumar, Lesi Singh, Sheila Mandal, Madan Sahni, Ratnesh Sada, Mohammad Zama Khan, Jayant Raj, Umesh Singh Kushwaha, and Ashok Chowdhary.

Other probable inductees from JD(U) are Rahul Kumar Singh, Sudhanshu Shekhar, Kaladhar Prasad Mandal, and Panna Lal Singh Patel, sources

BJP sources said most ministers from the outgoing Cabinet will be retained, with the party considering three new faces.

Those likely to continue

include Samrat Choudhary, Prem Kumar, Mangal Pandey, Vijay Kumar Sinha, Nitish Mishra, Renu Devi, Jibesh Kumar, Neeraj Kumar Singh, Janak Ram, Hari Sahni, Kedar Prasad Gupta, Surendra Mehta, Santosh Kumar Singh, Sunil Kumar, and Motil Lal Prasad.

Potential new faces from BJP include former IPS officer Anand Mishra (elected from Buxar), Rana Randhir, Gayatri Devi, and Vijay Kumar Khemka, sources said. "We are aiming for greater

representation in the new cabinet," a JD(U) leader said.

In the outgoing government, the BJP had 15 ministers, JD(U) 12 including CM Nitish Kumar, Hindustani Awam Morcha (Secular) had one, and one minister who was an Independent

"Given that our MLA count has risen sharply since 2020, when we had fewer than 50, we expect more berths this time, a JD(U) leader said.

The NDA stormed back to power in Bihar, winning 202 seats in the 243-member assembly, with BJP bagging 89, JD(U) 85, LJP(RV) 19, HAM 5 and RLM 4.

Meanwhile, Jan Suraaj founder Prashant Kishor described his decision not to contest the Bihar polls as a "mistake," noting that his party secured less than 4 per cent of votes. He affirmed his commitment to future electoral efforts in the state.

In an interview with NDTV India, Kishor said, "My decision not to contest polls can be considered a mistake. We have to do a lot to achieve a satisfactory result. I had never expected that our party would get less than 4 per cent votes in the assembly

The former poll strategist also asserted that his effort would continue to win future elections. "I will not back down without winning Bihar. I don't know how much time it will take," he said during the interview.

Dharmkund cloudburst

Timely relief, compensation provided to victim families: **Ramban Admin**

Refutes 'incomplete, onesided' news on cloudburst tragedy **KT News Desk**

Ramban, Nov 19: District Administration Ramban has strongly refuted a news item published in a local daily on November 14 regarding Dharmkund Cloudburst, terming it an incomplete and one-sided narrative, lacking proper ground truthing and factual verification.

While refuting the news item, the administration said that in the news item, several critical facts have been overlooked, leading to a misleading portrayal of the situation.

"Contrary to the claims made in the news, all families affected by the cloudburst and flashfloods on April 20, 2025 in Dharmkund, Tehsil Ramban, have been provided due relief and compensation strictly as per

SDRF norms," the administration said. "Immediately after the incident, the District Administration Ramban extended comprehensive support, temporary shelter, food, water, medical care, and other essential logistics".

The administration said it undertook timely damassessments, processed cases under SDRF guidelines, and released compensation accordingly. Every affected household received the assistance mandated under SDRF provisions

The district administration said that constructive feedback is always welcomed, however, reports published without verification can create unnecessary panic and undermine the hard work of officials who responded promptly and diligently during the disaster.

The administration reiterated that relief as per SDRF norms has been provided to the cloudburst affected families.

Presidential reference

SC judgement on question over fixing timeline for guvs' nod to clear bills today

New Delhi, Nov 19: The Supreme Court is slated to pronounce on Thursday its verdict on the presidential reference, which asked if a constitutional court can impose timelines for governors and the president to give assent to bills passed by state legislatures.

A constitution bench of Chief Justice B R Gavai and justices Surya Kant, Vikram Nath, P S Narasimha and A S Chandurkar, which heard the arguments for 10 days, had reserved the verdict on September 11.

In May, President Droupadi Murmu exercised powers under Article 143(1) of the Constitution to know from the top court whether timelines could be imposed by judicial orders for exercise of discretion by the President while dealing with the bills passed by state assemblies.

The president's decision had come after the April 8 verdict of the apex court, on powers of the governor in dealing with bills passed by the Tamil Nadu government. In a five-page reference, Murmu posed 14 questions to the Supreme Court and sought to know its opinion on powers of governor and the president under Articles 200 and 201 in dealing with bills passed by the state legislature.

Some cities' populations shrank even as their country's population grew. Conversely, some cities' populations grew despite shrinking national populations.

Despite the global shift towards city life, towns remain (in 2025) the most common settlement type in 71 countries. Countries in all regions and at diverse levels of economic development are found within this group, including Germany, India, Uganda and the United States of America.

Together, India and China host more than 1.2 billion town dwellers, representing over 40 per cent of the global population of towns. The towns of sub-Saharan Africa and of Central and Southern Asia are expected to continue to experience robust population growth between 2025 and 2050.

From 2000 to 2025, the global population living in cities increased by 1.25 billion, but over half of this growth came from only a few countries. India, China, Nigeria, Pakistan and the United States of America have collectively contributed over 500 million people to the global city population.

Additionally, five other countries Indonesia, Egypt, Bangladesh, the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Brazil - added another 187 million city dwellers. In contrast, several countries in Eastern Europe, including Ukraine, Romania, Poland, the Republic of Moldova and Hungary, along with Japan in Eastern Asia, experienced a significant decline in their city populations.

"In the world's two most populous countries, India and China, towns currently accommodate nearly one seventh of the global population, a proportion expected to persist at least through the mid-century," it said.

SC strikes down key provisions of Tribunals Reforms Act

> Says Parliament can't override verdicts

New Delhi, Nov 19: The Supreme Court on Wednesday struck down several provisions of the 2021 Tribunals Reforms law related to the appointment, tenure, and service conditions of members of various tribunals, saying they had been re-enacted by the Centre with minor tweaks.

A bench of Chief Justice B R Gavai and Justice K Vinod Chandran said the impugned provisions violated the principles of separation of powers and judicial independence, and they should not have been brought back.

The bench said that dealing with the backlog of cases was not the sole responsibility of the judiciary, and the onus must be shared by the other arms of the government.

The bench held that Parliament had sought to "legislatively override" binding judicial precedents by re-enacting clauses

The court restored the earlier judicial directions on tenure, making it clear that members of the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal (ITAT) and the Customs, Excise and Service Tax Appellate Tribunal (CESTAT) shall continue to be in service until the age of 62, while their chairpersons or presidents shall remain in office until the age of 65. The details of the judg-

ment are awaited. On November 11, the top court reserved its verdict on a batch of petitions challenging the constitutional validity of the Tribunals Reforms (Rationalisation and Conditions of Service) Act, 2021. The law abolished several appellate bodies, such as the Film Certification Appellate Tribunal, and amended provisions governing appointments, age criteria, and tenure across the tribunal framework.

Al Falah chairman had reasons to flee, ₹415 cr tainted funds identified: ED

New Delhi, Nov 19: Chairman of the Al Falah group Jawad Ahmed Siddiqui had "incentives" to flee India as his close family members are settled in Gulf countries and he is in receipt of at least Rs 415 crore tainted funds generated "dishonesty" from students of educational institutions run by his Trust, the ED informed a

Siddiqui was taken into custo-dy by the federal probe agency on Tuesday night after it conducted daylong searches against the Al Falah University group of Faridabad. The University is central to the investigation into the November 10 Red Fort area blast which killed 15 and injured several others.

He was produced at the residence of Additional Sessions Judge Sheetal Chaudhary Pradhan (Saket court) where the agency sought his 14-day remand for custodial interrogation. The court sent him to 13-day ED custody till December 1.

The agency informed the court that the university and its controlling trust, under the direction of Siddiqui generated proceeds of crime of Rs 415.10 crore by dishonestly inducing students and parents to part with money on the basis of false accreditation and recognition claims.

It further claimed that Siddiqui's arrests was necessary as there was an apprehension of his absconding and of non-cooperation.

"Accused has significant financial resources and influence and has a history of serious economic offences. His close family members are also settled in Gulf countries and he has incentives to flee India.

"Given the gravity of the present allegations (with proceeds of crime



quantified in hundreds of crores) and the potential consequences under PMLA, there is a reasonable apprehension that if not arrested he may abscond or remain unavailable for effective interrogation, relocate assets and himself beyond the jurisdiction, and continue to delay or obstruct the investigation," the ED told the court.

It said Siddiqui was the founder and managing trustee who was "controlling the mind" of Al Falah charitable trust and exercises de facto influence over Al Falah University and its institutions.

It alleged Siddiqui's custodial interrogation was necessary to unearth and quantify the full extent of the "proceeds of crime", including those not yet visible in the disclosed income tax return (ITR) figures and to enable the timely attachment and confiscation under the PMLA.

The ED also claimed that Siddiqui has "command" over the staff that handles admission registers, fee ledgers, accounts and IT systems of the University and other institutions under the Trust and he could "destroy or alter records". The entire Al Falah educational ecosystem is controlled by him (Siddiqui) and only a portion of the proceeds of crime worth Rs 415.10 crore has been identified so far..., the ED informed the court seeking his

The agency said the entire Al Falah group has seen a "meteoric rise" since the 1990s, metamorphosing into a large educational body.

Siddiqui's lawyer told court that his client has been falsely implicated in the present matter.

The court gave Siddiqui's 13 days remand to ED saying his arrest was as per the PMLA provisions and considering the "gravity" of the offence and that the investigation was at a nascent stage.

The ED has taken cognisance of two Delhi Police FIRs to register its case under the anti-money laundering law against the Al Falah group.

The Indian Army has successfully registered the design of the New Coat Combat (Digital Print) with the Controller General of Kolkata, under Design Application No. 449667-001, dated 27 February 2025 and published in the Official Journal of the Patent

Office on 07 October 2025. With this registration, the exclusive Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) for both the design and camouflage pattern rest solely with the Indian Army. The registration establishes the Army's sole ownership and legal protection against unauthorised manufacturing, reproduction, or commercial use by any non-authorised entity. Any infringement of these rights will attract legal consequences, including injunctions and claims for damages, as per the provisions of the Designs Act, 2000 and Designs Rules, 2001

tisgarh, Goa, Gujarat, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Puducherry, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, and Lakshadweep. Among these, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Kerala,

and West Bengal will go to the polls in 2026. In Assam, where elections are also due in 2026, the EC announced a 'special revision' of electoral rolls

per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). Silver prices also bounced back, surging Rs 4,000 to Rs 1,60,000 per kilogram (inclusive of all taxes), snapping a three-day losing run in the

local bullion market. "Gold advanced on Wednesday, supported by renewed safe-haven demand, while persistent signs of weakness in the US labour market kept expectations for a potential rate cut alive," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst -- Commodities at HDFC Securities, said. On the global front, spot gold extended its gains for the second straight session rising USD 46.32, or 1.14 per cent, to USD 4,114.01 per ounce. "Spot gold is trading above

USD 4,084 level as investors await Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) minutes of October meeting to be released tonight," Praveen Singh, Head of Commodities, Mirae Asset ShareKhan, said.

Kaynat Chainwala, AVP & Analyst Commodities Research, Kotak Securities, noted that gold recovered from a one-week low on Tuesday to settle above USD 4,065 per ounce, supported by softer US employment data and caution ahead of several delayed macro releases.

Dhaka, Nov 19: This sentencing to of Bangladesh's former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on charges of crimes against humanity is seen by her opponents as a chance to move forward for a nation traumatized by the scale of the violent uprising that drove her from power into exile.

Hasina has been in India since Aug. 5 last year, when her 15-year rule ended during the violence that left hundreds of people dead and thousands injured. She has rejected Monday's verdict, calling it "biased and politically motivated." Challenges are enormous for Bangladesh's interim government led by Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Muhammad Yunus, under pressure to hold a credible election in February after decades of rule by either Hasina or her longtime rival.

Here's what to know. A tense election ahead

Bangladesh's new leaders are determined to move the South Asian nation back to democracy through the upcoming election, one they have made sure won't include Hasina and her Awami League party. But emotions remain high.

"The interim government has fully suppressed the Awami League ... So the level of polarization is at a fever pitch," said



analyst Michael Kugelman, a senior fellow with the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada.

The biggest concern is violence involving the election, he said. "Awami League spoil-

ers may try to disrupt the election with unrest. And with Bangladesh's police force dealing with serious morale issues, there would be concerns about the state's capacity to manage the violence," Kugelman said. Police in Bangladesh were on the frontlines of the deadly crackdown in 2024 and some in their ranks were killed after protesters attacked police stations. Hasina's son has warned that the party could try to block the election if the ban on its political activities is not lifted and that only an inclusive election could

stabilize the country. A 'long game' for Hasina to eventually get back to politics. Mustafa said the trial was "seriously flawed" and that a death sentence was unjust for a case held in absentia. Despite that, he said it would be a challenge to get her supporters and others out into the streets to protest anytime soon.

Mustafa said that without party reforms and new leadership under the guidance of Hasina, it would be difficult for the Awami League to make a comeback.

Human rights groups and the UN's High Commissioner for Human Rights have expressed mixed reactions to the verdict and trial process.

Human Rights Watch and Amnesty International raised questions of fairness in the trial process, while the UN rights body said the verdict was "an important moment" for victims of last year's crackdown that killed hundreds, although it remains opposed to the

death penalty in all cases. Given that, the Yunusled administration will need to convince the international community about the credibility of the trial process.

For Kugelman, Yunus' first priority — and his biggest challenge — is ensuring a safe and peaceful environment for the

stakes polls: It's the first election in nearly 20 years in Bangladesh in which there are strong expectations that the vote will be free and fair. The January 2024 election, which swept Hasina to power for a fourth consecutive term, was boycotted by opposition parties and marked by violent protests and international scrutiny.

Mustafa said Yunus has already failed his legacy as a Nobel Peace Price laureate by presiding over many violations, including blatant mob justice, custodial deaths, blanket arrests and jailing of people, some without any specific and credible charges, especially among Hasina supporters. But he thinks the international community will continue to support the interim leader.

"The challenge before him between now and February is to ensure that things run smoothly and the elections do happen in February in a peaceful and credible manner," Mustafa said. He said that, given the electoral ban of the Awami League, Yunus should ensure the election is not rigged by the Bangladesh Nationalist Party, headed by former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia, or the country's largest Islamist

Afghanistan needs \$129 million for quake recovery, UN says, as donor support falls

Karachi, Nov 19: A UN-led assessment says Afghanistan requires \$128.8 million to restore housing, schools and key services in its quake-hit eastern provinces, warning that reconstruction faces "significant shortfalls" as donor support for the country falls

sharply.
The Joint Rapid Recovery Needs Assessment (JRRNA), conducted with the World Bank, EU and ADB, outlines a three-year plan to rebuild homes, health facilities, water systems and farmland in the eastern provinces of Kunar, Nangarhar and Laghman.

It comes as aid to Afghanistan shrinks, with the UN estimating a \$3.2 billion need this year and a similar requirement in 2026, less than half of which has been funded.

"The earthquakes-hit communities are already strained by drought, mass returns and a sharp economic contraction," **UN Resident Representative** Stephen Rodriguez told Reuters. There is very limited capacity left to cope with another shock.'

Spokespeople for the Taliban administration and the government's disaster management authority did not respond to requests for comment.

The JRRNA says the quakes caused \$86.6 million in damage across 10 districts, affecting 56,000 families, with more than 6,200 homes collapsed, 2,000 severely damaged, and 22



health facilities and 80 schools hit. The full recovery bill is higher at \$128.8 million.

Housing is the biggest challenge, costing \$54.9 million to rebuild thousands of homes. Education needs \$14.9 million, with more funding needed for water, irrigation, farmland and rural roads.

UN agencies have provided emergency tents and cash to thousands of families, with nearly 10,000 households needing urgent shelter support and 7,700 people still displaced.

Rodriguez said the assistance eased immediate pressures but was "nowhere near enough" to move families out of survival mode without longer-term investment.

TIGHTENING AID ENVIRONMENT

Rodriguez said a major donor cut \$80-90 million this year, forcing more than 400 health centers to close in the first half of 2025, adding that basic services had already been scaled back as needs rise. He did not identify the donor. The UN Development Programme plans to seek \$150 million for infrastructure, jobs and private-sector support next year, including \$43 million for re-integration of refugees who have returned, but Rodriguez said it was unclear how much donors would provide.

Afghanistan has also absorbed one of the world's largest forced return of refugees. Rodriguez said 4.3 million to 4.5 million Afghans have returned since 2021, with UN refugee agency data showing up to 2.5 million more in Iran and 1.7 million in Pakistan could return if current policies continue.

'The absorptive capacity is already exceeded," he said, noting that 88 percent of returnees are in debt and only 4 percent have salaried jobs. With 400,000 young Afghans entering the labor market each year, Rodriguez warned that delays in reconstruction risk fueling social tensions and outward migration.

Indonesia raises alert level as volcano near **Bali erupts**

Surabaya (Indonesia), Nov 19: A volcano on Indonesia's main island of Java erupted on Wednesday, throwing ash and gas kilometers into the sky and forcing officials to raise the alert status to its highest level. Mount Semeru in eastern Java, about 310 kilometers west of the tourist hotspot of Bali, erupted at 2:13 p.m. local time (0713 GMT), spewing what are known as pyroclastic flows, Indonesian geological agency head Muhammad Wafid said.

"The public is advised not to engage in activities within an 8 kilometer (5 mile) radius of the crater or peak of Mount Semeru due to the risk of being struck by ejected rocks," he said in a statement.

The national disaster agency said the plume of ash had risen as far as 13 kilometers (eight miles) into the air. Its spokesman Abdul Muhari said at least 300 villagers living near the volcano have been evacuated to two temporary shelters. There were no immediate reports of casualties.

2nd ODI: Ravindra, Conway pave way as NZ clinches series against WI

Bengaluru, Nov 19: Devon Conway and Rachin Ravindra's early attack helped New Zealand beat West Indies by five wickets with three balls to spare in a rain-curtailed second one-day international in Napier to seal the three-game series 2-0 on

Wednesday.
Chasing 248 for victory in a 34-overs-a-side contest, Conway and Ravindra powered the Black Caps with attacking half-centuries, putting on a 106-run opening stand that

dismantled the Caribbean bowling attack early on.

After being put into bat, West Indies' top order faltered, losing half its batters for only 86 in 15.3 overs, as Kyle Jamieson (3-44) dismissed John Campbell and Keacy Car-

ty early on. Wicketkeeper-batter Shai Hope anchored the innings with a counterattacking century - his 19th in ODIs - featuring 13 fours and four sixes.

Late contributions from Justin Greaves and Romario Shepherd, alongside Hope, helped the visitor reach 247-9.

New Zealand started well, but after Ravindra (56) fell in the 17th over, the host lost Will Young and Mark Chapman in quick succession. Conway (90) also departed in the 26th over, leaving it on shaky ground at 166-4.

But unbeaten innings by Tom Latham (39 off 29) and captain Mitchell Santner (34 off 15) kept the pressure off New Zealand even as the required run rate went above 10 at times.
