Jammu, Nov 28: Asking poets to use their pens as weapons against separatists and the elements trying to radicalize youth, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Friday highlighted the crucial role of poets, writers and artists in shaping a peaceful, progressive, and culturally enriched Jammu & Kashmir.

Addressing a kavi sammelan here, LG Sinha, according to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said, "A huge responsibility lies on intellectuals to contribute towards building J&K and Viksit

"Poets and writers must strengthen the unity, counter secessionist attempts to divide and radicalise youth in



Kashmir valley," he added. The LG said the past five to six years have been decisive for Jammu and Kashmir's

transformation. "We have tried our best to give a peaceful atmosphere to the youth," he said. "But some people are still attempting to radicalize them and disrupt peace. Our security forces are doing their job, but society—especially

poets-must not remain silent." He urged poets to use their pens as a powerful tool against anti-peace elements and separatist ideologies. "You have to play a vital role in building a Jammu & Kashmir where our youth can fulfil their dreams. Kavita (poetry) is a reflection of society," he said.

Calling poetry "more valuable than diamonds," LG Sinha said that the verses flowing from a poet's pen carry the strength to influence minds and shape society.

"Despite the challeng-es poets face in sustaining themselves a poet plays an important role in building the nation," the Lieutenant Governor added.

'New India' responds decisively to terror threats: PM Modi

Says country, world witnessed govt's resolve through 'Op Sindoor'

New Delhi, Nov 28: Asserting that the "New India" responds decisively to terror threats, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday reiterated that the nation would neither bow before anyone, nor will it leave any stone unturned to safeguard its citizens.

Referring to April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that left 26 people dead, PM Modi, according to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said, "The country and the entire world witnessed the government's resolve through Operation Sindoor, the military response involving precision strikes on terror launchpads in Pakistan.'

He highlighted that earlier, governments remained passive in the face of such attacks, whereas today, India acts firmly to protect its citizens. "This is a new India that neither bows before anyone nor wavers from its duty to safeguard its people," PM Modi said.



The Prime Minister added that India understands both how to establish peace and how to protect it.

PM Modi also urged citizens to follow nine resolutions inspired by dharmic principles including conserving water, planting trees, uplifting the poor, promoting Swadeshi, advancing natural farming, embracing healthy lifestyles, practicing yoga, preserving manuscripts, and visiting at least 25 heritage sites.

Kashmir records coldest Nov night in 17 years

Temps plunge across Valley Sajid Raina

Srinagar, Nov 28: Kashmir woke up to an intensified cold wave on Friday as several stations recorded their lowest November temperatures in nearly two decades, with Srinagar, Qazigund and Kupwara all touching historic lows for the second con-

secutive day. According to figures compiled by Kashmir Weather and accessed by the news agency— Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Srinagar recorded a minimum temperature of minus 4.5°C, the lowest for November since 2007, when minus 4.8°C was logged on November 28.

November minimum for the

city stands at minus 7.8°C, recorded on November 29, 1934. Qazigund, known as the

Gateway of Kashmir, also posted its lowest November temperature since 2007, settling at minus 4.4°C.

It had last recorded minus 5.5°C on November 28, 2007, while its record low remains minus 8.2°C, noted on November 24, 1962

In north Kashmir, Kupwara dropped to minus 4.8°C, marking the lowest November minimum since November 29, 2007, when minus 5.5°C was reported, still standing as the district's all-time record.

The cold wave extended across the Valley with sub-zero temperatures at almost all stations. Pampore touched minus 6.0°C, while Anantnag and Pulwama both recorded minus 6.2°C Shopian | More on P6

Srinagar, Nov 28: The Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education (JKBOSE) Friday proposed to introduce dual-level mathematics examination for Class-10 wherein students will have the option to choose between 'Basic or Standard' levels.

The official according to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said that the proposal is aimed to reduce the stress among those students who do not wish to continue mathematics at senior secondary level.

"The idea behind introducing the two levels or two Question

papers of varied difficulty is that the students who do not study Mathematics after Class 10th need not to be tested for the standard skills," the official said.

In the meantime, Director Academics of JKBOSE in a notification seeking public opinion has said that as per the Guidelines of National Education Policy 2020, JKBOSE intends to implement a mechanism for offering two level Mathematics 'Basic and Standard' for class 10th.

Selective demolitions conspiracy against elected govt: CM Omar 'Bulldozers used without our consultation or approval'

Srinagar, Nov 28: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Friday alleged that officers appointed by Raj Bhavan were carrying out selective demolition drives without consulting the elected government, in an attempt to defame it.

Speaking to the media, as per news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the CM claimed that officers were using bulldozers without the knowledge or approval of the elected government."Officials appointed by Raj Bhavan are using bulldozers at their own discretion, without the permission of the elected government and without the consent of the concerned minister. It clearly



means that a massive conspiracy has been hatched to malign and humiliate the elected government," he said.

He added that the elected government should have the

Common cold, upper respiratory infections surge as cold wave grips Kashmir

Doctors call for timely vaccination, preventive care to reduce winter illnesses

Srinagar, Nov 28: With temperatures dipping steadily across Kashmir, doctors are reporting a rise in cases of common cold and upper respiratory tract infections (URTIs).

Health experts warn that the trend is likely to intensify in the coming weeks, especially among vulnerable groups, unless timely precautions are taken.

Dr Abdul Hameed Dar, a chest specialist posted in south Kashmir, told the news



agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that the cold season creates ideal conditions for various respiratory viruses—such as

rhinoviruses, influenza viruses, and certain coronaviruses—to spread more easily.

'Cold and dry air allows these viruses to survive longer in the environment. This makes infections more frequent and more difficult to control," he said.

According to him, young children, the elderly, and individuals with chronic illnesses like asthma, diabetes, or COPD are at the highest risk of complications once infected. The doctor emphasised the importance of influenza vaccination, especially for high-risk groups.

"Flu vaccines significantly reduce the severity of illness and prevent complications. Pneumococcal vaccines are also advised for people prone to bacterial infections that follow viral episodes," he added. Dr Mumtaz Mir, another

doctor, explained that winterrelated behavioural changes also play a major role in the seasonal spike.

Chief Secy, NITI Aayog hold high-level talks on J&K's drug abuse response

JAMMU, NOVEMBER 28: In a significant step towards countering the growing menace of drug addiction in Jammu and Kashmir, Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo Friday held a high-level consultation with Member NITI Aayog, Dr V.K. Paul, seeking expert guidance to evolve a comprehensive, effective and sustainable strategy to combat substance abuse across the UT.

The consultation session, as per an official statement, brought together leading national-level experts from AIIMS New Delhi and PGIMER Chandigarh, besides senior officers and health administrators

The meeting was steered by the Secretary, Health & Medical Education (H&ME), and attended by the Managing Director, National Health Mission; Director SKIMS; Principals of Government Medical Colleges; and Heads of Departments of Psychiatry from GMC Srinagar and GMC Jammu.

While addressing the gathering, the Chief Secretary outlined the gravity and dimensions of the drug abuse problem in the UT,



highlighting ongoing initiatives, institutional mechanisms and coordinated efforts being undertaken by various agencies.

He elaborated on the multi-pronged strategy adopted by the administration, which rests on five key pillars of strict enforcement, Information, Education and Communication (IEC) campaigns, counselling, treatment, and rehabilitation aimed at ensuring both immediate intervention and long-term recovery of victims. Emphasizing the need for a community-centric approach, the Chief Secretary sought expert inputs from Dr Paul on strengthening the network of counsellors down to the grassroots level, including educational institutions, Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and local communities.

He further stressed the importance of developing a more robust rehabilitation framework, supported by an effective monitoring mechanism to prevent relapse and enable reintegrated individuals to lead dignified and productive lives in society.

Appreciating the proactive approach of the J&K Administration, Dr V.K. Paul commended its vision of looking beyond mere treatment and focusing on holistic rehabilitation and community mobilization. He noted that the proposed model, with strong emphasis on counselling and rehabilitation, brings greater vigour and sustainability to the overall strategy, making it innovative and comprehensive.

Dr Paul also shared insights from the Himachal Pradesh model of substance abuse management, wherein a structured treatment network supported by national experts has yielded positive results. He suggested studying this model in detail and adapting its framework, with necessary modifications, to suit the specific needs and socio-cultural context of Jammu and Kashmir.

Assuring full support from NITI Aayog, Dr Paul stated that a dedicated team of experts would assist the UT Administration in preparing a comprehensive action plan. He identified the core focus areas of the proposed action-oriented strategy as IEC activities, enhanced patient services, structured treatment protocols and systematic rehabilitation of recovered individuals.

The experts from AIIMS and PGIMER also shared valuable insights on clinical treatment protocols, counselling methodologies and best practices in managing substance use disorders.

State Taxes Dept holds GST analytics, fraud-detection workshop

JAMMU, NOVEMBER 28: State Taxes Department (STD) Friday conducted a day-long capacity-building workshop on newly developed GST Analytics and Fraud Detection Portal, a state-of-the-art technology platform shaped in collaboration with Bhaskaracharya National Institute for Space Applications and Geo-informatics (BISAG-N).

The workshop was chaired by Commissioner, STD P.K. Bhat. Additional Enforcement), Jammu, Namrita Dogra; Additional Commissioner, (Administration and Enforcement) Kashmir, Parveez Ahmad Raina; State Tax Officers (STOs) from both divisions and other officers of the department were present, either in person or through video conferencing.

In his inaugural address, the Commissioner, as per an official statement, emphasised the pivotal role of technology-driven analytics in transforming tax administration, detecting fraud proactively, and augmenting revenue collection in a transparent

and efficient manner. He urged all officers to make optimal use of the portal and treat it as an indispensable tool in their day-to-day enforcement and assessment functions.

The Commissioner directed all Divisional and Circle-level officers to use the portal regularly to familiarize themselves with its functionalities and derive maximum benefit for enforcement and compliance management.

During the workshop, a detailed technical overview and live demonstration of the portal was presented by Additional Commissioner (Administration and Enforcement), Jammu, Namrita Dogra. She highlighted advanced features of the portal, including real-time data analytics, risk profiling of taxpayers, automated fraud alerts, geospatial mapping of business activities, mismatch detection, and predictive modelling for potential revenue leakage.

She added that the portal, powered by cutting-edge data science and machine learning algorithms, enables officers to identify suspicious patterns, track input tax credit chains,

NC CWC reaffirms to restore statehood, special status

Srinagar, Nov 28: National Conference's top decision-making body, the Central Working Committee, Friday reaffirmed its commitment to the restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's special status and statehood. The top body, which held a two-day session since yesterday here, also condemned Delhi blast that left 15 people dead and many others injured.

It also called for accountability in the Nowgam blast in which at least 9 people were killed and several others were injured after a stockpile of explosives went off accidentally.

Speaking with reporters at the end of two-day session today, NC spokesman and MLA Zadibal Tanvir Sadiq said the Working Committee unanimously reaffirmed its commitment to the restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's special status and statehood.

"The committee reiterated that this issue remains central to the aspirations of the people and must be addressed without delay. The party will continue its principled fight for its full resolution," he said.

He said the Working Committee urged the Government to



immediately restore full statehood to Jammu and Kashmir as promised on the floor of the Parliament, repeatedly reaffirmed in the public domain, and noted by Constitution Bench of

the Supreme Court. He said the top body also expressed deep concern over the recent terror attack in Delhi and extended heartfelt condolences to the families of those who lost their lives. The Working Committee passed several resolutions, calling

for immediate statehood restoration. condemning Delhi blast, and seeking protection of Kashmiri outside Jammu and Kashmir.

"In a civilised society, such acts of violence has no place and such heinous acts must be dealt with firmly," reads third resolution of the party. The Party's fourth resolution expressed concern over the Nowgam blast and conveyed its condolences to the affected families.

"The committee stated that the

incident must be investigated at the highest level and responsibility fixed for any deviation from standard procedures," it states.

The fifth resolution expressed serious concern over the reports of harassment faced by students, traders, and residents of Jammu and Kashmir in different parts of the

"It strongly condemned the selective targeting in the aftermath of recent events. The Committee emphasised that the people of Jammu and Kashmir cannot be stereotyped and called upon the state governments to ensure the safety, dignity and protection of the lives and property of Kashmiris and other residents of Jammu and Kashmir living or working across India. Not every Kashmiri is a terrorist or a supporter of terror," the resolution states. In its sixth resolution, the NC reiterated the party's commitment to fulfilling all promises made in its manifesto.

In the last resolution, the party unanimously reaffirmed its full support to the government led by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and urged it to continue fulfilling the aspirations of the people and upholding their dignity—(KNO)

'Winter pruning fires choke Kashmir'

Srinagar, Nov 28: As winter sets in Kashmir, mounds of pruned branches and leaves are set ablaze in orchards to prepare charcoal for the harsh winter ahead. However, behind the glow of these fires lies an increasingly visible crisis: dense, lingering smoke that seeps into homes and lungs, turning the season into a nightmare for those with fragile respiratory health.

Across towns and villages, heavy grey smoke hangs in the air, forming a blanket that irritates eyes, stings throats, and for many, shuts down their ability

What was once a necessity for warmth has now become a major contributor to winter pollution, drawing growing concern from medical experts and residents alike.

The fruit-growing belts of Kashmir are particularly affected, where the widespread burning of orchard waste marks the beginning of respiratory distress for hundreds of patients.

"I feel like my chest is tightening every time the smoke enters my home," Mohammad Akbar Ganaie, a COPD patient from Shopian said. "For the last few weeks, things have become unbearable. I may have to shift to Jammu until the air becomes breathable again."

Ganaie's struggle mirrors the experience of countless others across the Valley who spend the winter months battling breathlessness, persistent cough, and a constant fear of hospitalisation.

Health professionals say the combination of cold weather and seasonal biomass burning pushes many chronic respiratory patients into emergency

Dr Ghulam Hassan Khan, a specialist in chest diseases, said COPD cases in Jammu and Kashmir have been rising sharply.

"During winter, a major share of emergency admissions includes COPD and asthma patients," he said.

He further said that smoking remains the number one cause. Quitting smoking is the most effective preventive measure,

The doctor, however, pointed out a worrying trend-people who have never smoked are also developing the

"Poor air quality is becoming a major factor. From biomass fuels and charcoal for kangris to industrial emissions and household pollutants, pollution levels in Kashmir have reached concerning levels. On some days, our air quality has ranked worse than several major metropolitan

cities," he added. According to doctors, once COPD sets in, it cannot be cured—only managed. "Lifestyle changes like avoiding pollutants, keeping warm, maintaining hydration, exercising regularly, and staying away from allergens can slow the disease's progression," Dr Khan

He interacted with field officers, traffic personnel, and local commuters to assess real-time issues affecting smooth vehicular movement "Several bottlenecks were identified, including improper lane discipline, roadside parking, and heavy traffic pressure at the bridge approach. Taking immediate cognizance, the DIG Traffic issued on-spot directions to streamline traffic flow," reads the statement.

He empathised upon deployment of additional traffic personnel especially during peak hours, removal of unauthorized parking and roadside obstructions near the bridge and strict enforcement of lane discipline for all types of vehicles.

■Hindu neighbour gifts land to Muslim Jammu journalist after bulldozer action

Jammu, Nov 28: In a rare and heart-warming gesture, a Hindu neighbour of journalist Arfaz Ahmad Daing- whose house was bulldozed by Jammu Development Authority on Wednesday - has gifted 5 Marla (approximately 1,400 Sq ft) land to him.

Kuldeep Raj Sharma, moved by the viral images of Arfaz's elderly parents pleading with authorities and his young children watching helpless, took an extraordinary step that has touched thousands across Jammu and Kashmir "I saw my brother's family on the road. I couldn't sleep that night," Sharma told reporters with

moist eyes. "Today, I have transferred 5 Marlas of my land to Arfaz's name through proper registered documents. They demolished his home on 3 Marla land, I gifted him 5 Marla land. If they demolish this one to, I will give him 10 Marla land. Even if I have to beg, I will rebuild his home. He is my brother, not a stranger," he said.

In an emotional moment, Sharma declared: "Our communal harmony will never break. Jammu has always



standing proudly beside her father, said, "I am extreme-ly proud of my father. This is the real Jammu – where humanity comes before everything. I appeal to every citizen of J&K to stand with families losing their homes in such drives.

KCCI files objections before JERC

■ Opposes proposed 20% ToD surcharge

Srinagar, Nov 28: The Kashmir Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCCI) has formally submitted its objections before the Joint **Electricity Regulatory Commission** (JERC) in response to petition filed by Kashmir Power Development Corporation Limited KPDCL) seeking approval for the Proposal to impose a 20 percent Time of Day (ToD) surcharge during peak hours

KCCI in a statement said that the submission of written objections and feedback follows the open JSERC hearing on 20th November, 2025 in which Secretary General KCCI Faiz Bakshi had vehemently opposed the

20 percent surcharge In its submission, the chamber has expressed deep concern over KPDCL's proposal to impose a 20 percent Time of Day (ToD) surcharge during peak hours, describing it as an indirect tariff hike that would disproportionately burden

domestic, commercial, and indus-

KCCI has said, "Although KPDCL claims to have proposed no tariff increase, the imposition of a steep surcharge during the busiest consumption hours effectively translates into a significant financial escalation for consumers already struggling under economic pressures."

The chamber in the response had argued that the proposal is premature and technically infeasible, given that nearly half of Kashmir's consumers are still not equipped with smart meters capable of recording time-based consumption.

"Without universal smart metering, there is no scientific or equitable mechanism to differentiate between peak and off-peak usage. Introducing such a surcharge, the Chamber noted, would lead to widespread billing inaccuracies, consumer disputes, and discriminatory treatment between metered and non-metered households," it reads.

It also highlighted that KPDCL's proposal lacks fairness, as it seeks to penalize consumers during peak hours without offering any corresponding rebate for off-peak usage, an essential feature of ToD tariff systems followed across the country. "A one-sided model focused solely on revenue enhancement, KCCI said, undermines the regulatory principles of balance, equity, and consumer protection."

Expressing concern over KPDCL performance, KCCI noted that the utility continues to report extremely high Aggregate Technical & Commercial losses of around 47 percent, far above the national average.

"The Chamber stressed that honest, bill-paying consumers cannot be made to bear the financial burden of infrastructure leakages, and administrative inefficiencies. It reminded the Commission that established regulatory frameworks prohibit passing the cost of a utility's shortcomings onto consumers," reads the

The chamber in a response filed before JERC said, "KCCI underscored the poor quality and reliability of power supply in the Valley. Citing data from the Central Electricity Authority (CEA), the Chamber pointed out that Kashmir's interruption indices are among the worst in Îndia, with prolonged and frequent outages severely affecting households, businesses, industries, healthcare facilities, and the education sector."

"A utility struggling to ensure basic reliability, the Chamber submitted, cannot justify charging consumers a premium for peak-hour consumption," it reads.

The statement further said that "Additionally, the Chamber called attention to the stagnation in local power generation capacity, noting that no new power projects have been commissioned since 2015. This shortfall forces the UT to depend heavily on costly power purchases, a consequence of planning gaps that,

the Chamber insisted, should not be compensated through consumer surcharges.'

"KCCI also reminded the Commission of the provisions of the Electricity (Rights of Consumers) Rules, 2020, which mandate automatic compensation for outages and service deficiencies—rules that remain unimplemented. Instead of safeguarding consumer rights, the Chamber said, the present proposal seeks to increase costs without ensuring reliable service," reads the

The Chamber urged the Commission to ensure strict implementation

of consumer compensation rules. KCCI said that it reaffirms its commitment to protecting the rights and interests of the business community and the people of Kashmir, and expressed hope that the Hon'ble Commission would consider its submissions in the interest of justice, equity, and public welfare—(KNO)

Vital bridge declared unsafe in Budgam

Budgam, Nov 28: Authorities on Friday ordered closure of Chadoora bridge in central Kashmir's Budgam district for traffic movement after experts declared it unsafe due to damage by recent floods.

From Growth Engine To Global Edge: Supercharging India's Logistics

A New Chapter in India's Logistics Story

India's logistics is entering a new phase and converting itself into a faster, smarter, and globally competitive sector. From integrated digital platforms that streamline freight movement to modern infrastructure connecting every part of the country, a next-generation logistics ecosystem is steadily taking shape. Backed by targeted policy reforms, institutional realignment, and technology-driven solutions, the government is transforming logistics into a key driver of India's economic growth and global trade positioning.

A wave of structural changes is reshaping how logistics is planned, executed, and scaled across the country. Platforms like ULIP (Unified Logistics Interface Platform) are integrating data across departments, while LDB (Logistics Data Bank) 2.0 enables real-time visibility of millions of containers. Every HSN (Harmonized System of Nomenclature) code is mapped to its line ministry, improving accountability and policy design. Logistics plans at the city and state levels under the SMILE (Strengthening Multimodal and Integrated Logistics Ecosystem) programme are being aligned with national priorities. Inland waterways transported a record 145.84 million tonnes of cargo last year, while rail congestion is being addressed through dedicated freight corridors. In industrial zones, plug-and-play parks under NICDC (National Industrial Corridor Development Corporation) offer ready infrastructure for investors. On the ground, reforms such as GST and the e-Way Bill have removed long-standing frictions in interstate transport. These interventions are driving a clear objective: reducing logistics costs, improving efficiency, and strengthening India's position in global supply chains.

Multimodal Logistics along the Gangetic Plain

India is transforming its logistics network along the Gangetic Plain through an integrated multimodal approach that combines road, rail, and inland waterways, making transport faster, cheaper, and greener. The Eastern Dedicated Freight Corridor (EDFC), a high-speed rail freight line, has reduced wagon turnaround times from 15–16 days to 2–3 days and cut transit times from over 60 hours to around 35-38 hours. Freight operations are now managed via a central contro Prayagraj, easing congestion on existing rail networks. The revival of the Ganga Waterway, linked to the EDFC at Varanasi, allows manufacturers to move cargo efficiently to eastern ports like Haldia. Rapid development of warehousing and logistics facilities near the corridor has boosted employment, improved inventory management, and enabled timely production and export. These projects involve significant investments from the World Bank, including \$1.96 billion for the Eastern Dedicated Freight Corridor and Rail Logistics initiatives and \$375 million for the Ganga Waterway development. Together, these efforts are creating an efficient, integrated logistics system that reduces costs, lowers carbon emissions, and strengthens India's connectivity to domestic and international markets.

Why Logistics Matter More Than Ever

India's path to economic growth increasingly relies on efficient logistics, which are key to enhancing competitiveness and global connectivity.

The National Logistics Policy and PM GatiShakti have injected new momentum into this transformation, laying the foundation for a more integrated and data-driven logistics ecosystem. But strategy needs precision, and that starts with knowing the true cost of logistics.

Until recently, India's logistics costs were often overestimated. Commonly cited figures of 13 to 14 percent of GDP were based on partial or external data. This led to confusion in policymaking and misperceptions globally.

That has now changed.

A new, first-of-its-kind study titled Assessment of Logistics Cost in India by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), in collaboration with National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER), provides a scientifically grounded estimate. Using a hybrid methodology that combines primary data from over 3,500 industry stakeholders with secondary data from the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MOSPI), Reserve Bank of India (RBI), and Goods and Services Tax Network (GSTN), the report places India's logistics cost at 7.97 percent of GDP and 9.09 percent of non-services output for 2023 to 2024. In absolute terms, the total cost is estimated at 24.01

This is more than just a headline number. The report offers a detailed breakdown by cost components, firm size, and product type. It highlights a critical insight: smaller firms face significantly higher logistics costs, which affect their ability to scale and compete. The study also introduces benchmark freight costs per tonne-kilometre across various transport modes and

planning and pricing.

Multimodal transport is emerging as a key lever for efficiency. For example, the report shows that for journeys of around 600 kilometres, improving the first and last 50 kilometres can significantly lower the total logistics cost. This underscores the importance of last-mile

infrastructure and multimodal logistics integration. All findings are available through a new interactive dashboard designed to support real-time analysis and informed decision-making. With this data-backed clarity, both the government and industry can make smarter investments, design sharper policies, and upgrade infrastructure faster. This brings India closer to its goal of becoming a global logistics hub.

In short, logistics is no longer a black box. With accurate cost estimates, actionable insights, and targeted interventions, India is transforming its supply chains from a hidden burden into a source of strength.

2025: Supercharging India's Supply Chains

Several initiatives launched in 2025 showcase the government's push to refresh logistics across measurement, local planning, infrastructure, and data integration. These new-generation logistics programs were unveiled to break bottlenecks, accelerate movement, and supercharge supply chains.

1. PM GatiShakti: Driving Integrated Planning

During the commemoration of four years of the PM GatiShakti National Master Plan, the transformative impact of this path-breaking initiative was highlighted, and several key initiatives were unveiled. Key launches included:

PM GatiShakti District Master Plans in all 112 Aspirational Districts to guide social and economic infrastructure projects.

PM GatiShakti – Offshore, consolidating geospatial

LEAPS 2025 is a DPIIT initiative to benchmark logistics performance and promote innovation and sustainability in the sector.

2. SMILE: City-Level Logistics Planning

The Strengthening Multimodal and Integrated Logistics Ecosystem (SMILE) program, developed by DPIIT in collaboration with the Asian Development Bank, focuses on streamlining logistics at both state

and city levels. As part of this initiative, plans have been launched across eight pilot cities in eight states, each selected to demonstrate how local logistics systems can align effectively with national priorities.

SMILE operates on two synchronized fronts: State Level: It connects growth hubs to trunk routes,

economic corridors, and logistics gateways.

City level: It aligns urban freight with city mobility frameworks, master plans, and land use policies. This two-tiered approach makes logistics not an afterthought,

but a built-in layer of economic and spatial planning.
Each of the eight pilot cities under SMILE will be building integrated logistics plans that span both urban and peri-urban zones. These plans map and optimize freight-intensive activity such as local retailers, e-commerce delivery routes, warehousing clusters, truck terminals, and last-mile corridors. The aim is to combine data-driven decisions with clear urban policies and institutional coordination. The plans focus on noise reduction, city decongestion, low- and zero-emission

The outcome is a national model where central, state, and city agencies, along with private players and start-ups, act in coordination. This supports sustainable urban freight, faster and more affordable movement of goods, cleaner and less congested cities, and millions of new jobs across the logistics value chain.

3. LEADS 2025: Scoring States on Logistics

The Logistics Ease Across Different States (LEADS) 2025 initiative sets a new benchmark for measuring the logistics performance of States and Union Territories. Evolving into a more comprehensive framework, LEADS now incorporates both perception-based inputs and objective data, with the latter making up 32.5% of the framework and expected to increase further. The assessment covers regulatory and institutional support, logistics enablers, infrastructure, services, the operating environment, and sustainability.

The initiative also monitors five to seven key transport corridors, capturing real-time data on journey times, average truck speeds, and waiting periods. API-enabled tools allow for section-wise monitoring of road speeds, enabling the identification of delay points and performance gaps. By offering detailed insights and tracking the improvement trajectory of logistics systems, LEADS serves as a key mechanism to enhance logistics efficiency and supply chain robustness across States and Union Territories, supporting India's progress toward its long-term development goals.

4. LDB 2.0: Visibility that Moves Markets

The upgraded Logistics Data Bank 2.0 now syncs with Unified Logistics Interface Platform (ULIP) APIs, offering exporters and MSMEs real-time visibility across road, rail, sea, and even high seas. A live container heatmap highlights where containers are delayed, enabling swift corrective action before minor issues escalate. Now users will be able to track shipments using container number, vehicle number, and railway FNR (Freight Name Record) numbers.

What once required days of coordination and guess-work now appears instantly on a single platform.

Each park is assessed and categorized as a Leader, Challenger, or Aspirer, based on factors such as infrastructure quality, logistics connectivity, digital readiness, sustainability features, and tenant satisfaction. This clear and consistent grading gives investors reliable information to guide decisions, while motivating States and Union Territories to upgrade their facilities and attract more investments.

Under NICDC, 20 plug-and-play industrial parks are in development. 4 are completed, the other 4 are under construction, and several are on the drawing board. These ready-to-use parks reduce entry barriers for industries and send a strong signal to global and domestic investors that India is serious about ease of doing business and industrial growth. With IPRS 3.0, India is not just building more parks. It is building better ones: more competitive, more inclusive, and more geared towards the goals of national development.

6. Guidebook on HSN Codes: Clarity that Counts

A comprehensive guidebook has mapped 12,167 HSN codes across 31 ministries. Mapping each HSN code with the respective line ministry will help the industry understand processes related to their sectors. For businesses, it simplifies coordination. For policymakers, it sharpens accountability, and for trade negotiators, it strengthens India's hand on the global stage.

Conclusion

Logistics has long operated behind the scenes and is gradually receiving more attention. The past decades have laid the tracks and built the systems, with the current developments propelling these efforts to roar: faster, greener, and fully connected.

If Make in India builds the factories, logistics builds the highways, waterways, and data flows that carry their output to the world. He observed that despite the availability of free meals, uniforms, textbooks and other facilities in government institutions, enrollment particularly at the primary level remains relatively low. He directed the department to undertake a detailed assessment to identify gaps and devise a targeted strategy to enhance educational quality and strengthen parental confidence in government schools.

Emphasising the role of technology in transforming education, the Chief Secretary called for making existing technological interventions more focused, inclusive and student-centric. He stressed the need for enriching the Vidya Samiksha Kendra (VSK) platform with diverse and comprehensive learning

materials and increasing the number of high-quality learning videos for students across all classes to ensure ease of access and effective learning.

Encouraging innovative funding approaches, the Chief Secretary urged the department to explore Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funding opportunities from major Central PSUs and local businesses to support educational interventions. He assured his full support in facilitating such collaborations.

He instructed the department to ensure that all students receive their prescribed textbooks in a timely manner and called for the formulation of a robust mechanism to curb the illegal charging of admission fees by private schools. He directed for the adoption of an effective enforcement strategy to address this issue across J&K.

India re-elected to IMO Council for 2026-27 with highest vote tally

New Delhi, Nov 28: India has been re-elected to the Council of the International Maritime Organization (IMO), London, in Category B, comprising 10 countries with the most significant interest in international seaborne trade, an official statement said on Friday.

The statement further said that India secured the highest number of votes in this category, receiving 154 out of 169 valid votes cast during the election.

The Council elections were held during the 34th session of the IMO Assembly in London on Friday by secret ballot.



The term of Council will be for the 2026-27 biennium.

"India secured the large-scale support of the international community at the International Maritime Organisation for India to continue to serve the global maritime domain," the statement said.

IMO Council is a body composed of three categories, with 40 elected members out of 176 IMO member countries. The Council performs functions between

CJI Surya Kant lauds his predecessors, says benchmark set by their vision, leadership

New Delhi, Nov 28: Chief Justice Surya Kant on Friday lauded the contributions of the past Chief Justices of India and said, going forward, their vision and leadership would set the benchmark for him.

Speaking at a function organised by the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) to felicitate him, CJI Kant called for cooperation from bar bodies and lawyers, and said their issues, pending for years, will be resolved amicably.

On November 24, Justice Kant, coming from a middle-class family in Haryana's Hisar district, took oath as the 53rd Chief Justice of India and will remain in the post for nearly 15 months.

He will demit office on February 9, 2027, on attaining the age of 65 years.

Kant disclosed that he had meetings with SCBA president Vikas Singh and Supreme Court Advocate On Record Association (SCORA) chief Vipin Nair on streamlining the mentioning and case listing process.

From December 1, a new system will be in place for listing of fresh cases before different benches, he said.

"I can foresee that there might be certain difficulties at the initial level. Whenever you introduce a new thing, certain issues do arise, but with your cooperation, support, timely advice, and your ideas and suggestions, which I always look forward to, we will be able to resolve those issues," Kant said.

With the office of the CJI, he said, he will have the responsibility of the "entire judiciary in the country", but the pending

demands of the bar bodies like space crunch, listing of cases, and other urgent issues will "definitely be resolved".

"So, I'm thankful to all the CJIs in the past, who, with their best of abilities, their commitment to the cause, experience, ability, their jurisprudential principles — judicial and administrative — did a commendable job and whatever leadership they have provided in the past... that will be the benchmark for me to

move ahead," the CJI said.

He said an introspection would be done about the previous CJIs' steps, to see how much of the journey was left to achieve their vision.

their vision.

"With your help, you being on both sides, we will achieve that journey," the CJI told the lawyers amid loud applause.

Kant, who was present here, along with all the apex court judges, said, "In this entire endeavour, I must very candidly acknowledge the contribution of my sister and brother judges. For

each and every reform and positive action we plan to take, they are far ahead of me. Their vision, commitment, and support are going to be my real wealth, which I intend to invest in the system and in the institution," he said.

Kant further said he discussed with the SCBA and SCAORA chiefs the streamlining of the cause list.

"Not only the listing of the matters in terms of the days, (but) that unpredictability, that element of uncertainty... How can it be effectively addressed so that your valuable time is not wasted, and we can utilise it for some constructive purposes,' he said. He further recalled his relationship with the bar bodies, while serving as a judge in the Punjab and Haryana High Court and said, "So, we will have certain challenges in the district courts, high courts, or before the Supreme Court. It is our duty that we find some viable solutions with collaborative efforts, and we will effectively address those issues to take the Indian judiciary to the highest position it always deserves.'

The CJI said it is not a case where one Chief Justice of India will come and "do some miracle or wield a magical wand to resolve the issues".

"This institution has grown, and it has gained its strength from different leaders over time, who have really done invaluable service to the system," he said.

"I assure you that I am not going to disappoint the bench, bar, litigants for whom, actually, we are in existence. The system will definitely work; it will come out with a glorified future," he promised.

development, the LG said, "For Viksit Bharat, science and sahitya (literature) are important. Science, sahitya and kavita together make the nation stronger."

Highlighting India's enduring civilizational heritage, LG Sinha noted that while many tried to plunder India's wealth historically, "they could not loot our culture." He said Bharat has always maintained a balance between scientific progress and literary excellence.

Reiterating his call, the LG appealed to the artistic community to stand firm against forces that threaten peace and harmony, and to contribute actively to nurturing a vibrant, confident and progressive Jammu & Kashmir.

"The students shall have an option to choose any one level. The difficulty level of the Mathematics-Standard exam shall be the same as the existing exam and the Mathematics-Basic Question paper will be easier in comparison," it reads.

It also said that the standard level will be meant for students, who wish to opt for Mathematics at Senior Secondary Level and the Basic Level would be for students not keen to pursue Mathematics at Higher Secondary level.

"The syllabus, classroom teaching and internal assessment methods for both the levels will remain the same to allow students to study a range of topics and then decide upon the level for which they wish to appear during the board examination," it reads.

JKBOSE notification further said that the students, who opt for Mathematics-standard and fail in the exam will be allowed to appear in the Bi-Annual Exam for Mathematics-Basic or Mathematics Standard.

"In case a student opts for Mathematics-Basic and passes in the exam but changes their mind later and wishes to pursue Mathematics at Higher Level, they will be allowed to appear for Mathematics-Standard Compartment Exam," it reads.

JKBOSE said that in order to generate informed opinion regarding the implementation of the scheme, all stakeholders including civil society, academicians, parents, scholars, students are requested to send their views within ten days from the issue of this notification.

Common cold, upper

surge as viruses remain stable and infectious for longer durations in cold conditions. "Winter air dries the nasal passages, weakening the mucus barrier that protects against infection," he said. "People spend more time indoors with limited ventilation, increasing the chances of transmission. Devices like kangris create enclosed warm spaces that favour viral spread."

The reduced sunlight leads to Vitamin D deficiency, while cold stress lowers immune response and the use of wood, coal and traditional bukharis releases smoke and irritants that damage the respiratory tract, the doctor added.

Dr Mumtaz said allergens like dust, smoke and soot become more common in winter homes, aggravating pre-existing respiratory issues and

making people more susceptible to infections.

Health experts have advised the public to follow a combination of lifestyle measures, hygiene practices, and medical precautions to control the surge. These measures include influenza vaccine for high-risk groups: elderly, children, pregnant women, and patients with chronic diseases, pneumococcal vaccine for those

vulnerable to secondary bacterial infections, exposure to sunlight whenever possible to boost Vitamin D levels, and a balanced diet rich in seasonal vegetables, fruits, nuts, and warm fluids.

The doctors advised adequate sleep and hydration, improving indoor air quality, ensuring proper ventilation in homes, even during cold weather, avoiding excessive use of smoke-producing heaters; using chimneys and exhausts where possible, keeping indoor spaces clean and dust-free, frequent handwashing with soap and water, avoiding touching the face, especially eyes, nose, and mouth, use masks in crowded indoor places.

They called for seeking timely treatment at the onset of symptoms to prevent complications, avoiding self-medication, especially with antibiotics, keeping children and the elderly warm and away from smoke-filled rooms and monitoring chronic disease patients closely during the winter months.

Doctors reiterated that winter infections, though common, can be controlled significantly through awareness and preventive health practices.

Precautions taken today can prevent severe illness tomorrow. The community must stay alert and adopt a proactive approach throughout the winter season, they said. (KNO)

Forces conduct

Eyewitnesses and officials present during the exercise said that the surprise checks form a crucial part of preventive policing and are es-

sential to maintain law and order in crowded and commercially active zones.

The officials also advised hotel and business owners to maintain proper guest registers, verify identity documents and immediately alert police about any suspicious activity or unfamiliar presence. "Public cooperation always remains a

key to ensure a safe environment for all," he said.

Meanwhile, the searches that lasted several hours concluded peacefully without any untoward incident. Security officials maintained that such coordinated drives will continue periodically as part of a city-wide security review plan designed to strengthen vigilance during the winter season and festive period. India records six-quarter high GDP growth of 8.2 pc in Q2

New Delhi, Nov 28: The Indian economy grew by a higher-than-expected 8.2 per cent -- a six-quarter high -- as increased factory production in anticipation of a consumption boost from the GST rate cut helped offset deceleration in farm output.

Thinner

The growth in the second quarter, which compared to 7.8 per cent in the preceding three months and 5.6 per cent in the year-ago period, was also aided by a good showing by the services sector, which clocked double-digit growth.

The previous high at 8.4 per cent was posted in the fourth quarter (January-March) of fiscal 2023-24.

The expansion helped India retain its position as the world's fastest-growing major economy. During the July-September quarter, the Chinese economy grew

by 4.8 per cent.
As per data released by the National Statistics Office (NSO), the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in the first half of 2025-26 worked out to be at 8 per cent, up from 6.1 per cent in the year-ago

With an 8 per cent growth rate in the first half, India may exceed the annual growth target of 6.3-6.8 per cent for FY26 as projected in the Economic Survey in January this year.

During the quarter, the manufacturing sector recorded a robust growth of 9.1 per cent compared to 2.2 per cent in the year-

Following the GST rate cut announcement by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his Independence Day address, factories stepped up their output to meet the festival season demand. The GST rate cut came into effect on September 22.

The performance of the services sector, including banking and real estate, also witnessed an impressive growth of 10.2 per cent from 7.2 per cent in the same



period a year ago.

However, the agriculture sector growth decelerated to 3.5 per cent from 4.1 per cent in the year-ago period.

Commenting on the growth numbers, Icra Chief Economist Aditi Nayar said India's GDP growth significantly surpassed expectations, printing at a six-quarter high of 8.2 per cent in Q2 FY2026, and displaying an acceleration over the 7.8 per cent growth seen in Q1 FY2026, in contrast to the widespread market expectation of some moderation.

While the government's final consumption expenditure expectedly contracted, led by weak revenue spending, the growth in gross capital formation moderated between these quarters, she said, adding that discrepancies played an important role in bumping up the GDP growth in Q2 FY2026 compared to the preceding quarter.

"An adverse base, the potential negative impact of US tariffs and limited headroom for capital spending by the Government of India (vis-a-vis the Budget Estimates) may dampen the pace of growth from the robust 8 per cent seen in H1 FY2026. Nevertheless, the FY2026 real GDP expansion now appears set to materially exceed 7 per cent," she noted. With the Q2 FY2026 GDP growth exceeding 8 per cent, she said, the probability of a rate cut in the December 2025 MPC review has certainly eased, notwithstanding the series-low CPI inflation print for October 2025.

Earlier in October, the Reserve Bank of India had upped the GDP forecast to 6.8 per cent from the earlier projection of 6.5 per cent for the current financial year.

The statement further said the Real Private Final Consumption Expenditure (PFCE) has reported a 7.9 per cent growth rate during Q2 of FY2025-26 against the 6.4 per cent growth rate in the corresponding period of the previous financial

As regards the first half of the current fiscal, the real GDP or GDP at Constant Prices is estimated at Rs 96.52 lakh crore against Rs 89.35 lakh crore in H1 of 2024-25, registering a growth rate of 8 per cent.

Nominal GDP or GDP at Current Prices in H1 of 2025-26 is estimated at Rs 171.30 lakh crore compared to Rs 157.48 lakh crore in H1 of 2024-25, showing a growth rate of 8.8 per cent, the statement said.

Gross Fixed Capital Formation (GFCF) has recorded a 7.3 per cent growth rate at Constant Prices against the growth rate of 6.7 per cent in Q2 of FY25.

The discrepancies (differences in values calculated using different methods of GDP estimation) jumped to Rs 1.62 lakh crore during the second quarter of this

India's Q2 FY 2025–26 GDP growth came in stronger than expected at 8.2 per cent year-on-year, Rumki Majumdar, Economist, Deloitte India, said.

"With festive season spending and the momentum from GST 2.0 likely to support activity in Q3, we anticipate a significant upward revision to full-year growth estimates," she said.

India's GDP deflator has fallen to its lowest level since 2019, pulling down nominal GDP growth, she said, adding that this poses challenges for key ratios tied to nominal GDP, such as fiscal deficit, debt, and current account.

She expressed apprehension that it will be harder for the government to meet its fiscal deficit targets, which are measured as a percentage of GDP.

Nitish disburses Rs 1,000 cr among 10 lakh women beneficiaries of entrepreneurship scheme

Patna, Nov 28: Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Friday disbursed Rs 1,000 crore among 10 lakh beneficiaries of the Mukhyamantri la Rojgar Yojana, which is aimed at promoting entrepreneurship among the state's women.

Kumar, who was recently voted back to power for a record fifth consecutive term, gave away Rs 10,000 to each beneficiary, through the DBT system, from his official residence, in the presence of cabinet colleagues and top officials.

Speaking to reporters

after the function, Rural Development Minister Shravan Kumar said, "A total of 1.56 crore women have received the money so far." "The beneficiaries are being encouraged to use the sum for self-employment. Those who do so demonstrably will in due course get further assistance of Rs 2 lakh each," he added.

Notably, the scheme was launched in September, about a month before assembly polls were announced, at a function which was attended, in the virtual mode, by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Money was disbursed among beneficiaries in batches and the process continued after the elections were announced, evoking allegations from the opposition that votes were being "purchased".

The scheme is said to have paid rich electoral dividends as women turned up to vote in unprecedented numbers and the ruling NDA retained power with a brute majority.



Study details independent role of Alzheimer's gene in causing delirium



New Delhi, Nov 28: Risk of delirium, a state of confusion commonly experienced by hospitalised patients, has been independently, directly linked to a gene wellknown to contribute towards Alzheimer's disease, according to an analysis of more than a million people from across the UK, Finland and the US.

Gene "APOE" is known to make a protein that helps carry cholesterol and other fats in the blood. Having the gene variant "APOE e4" is said to increase one's risk of developing the ageing-related Alzheimer's disease, in which thought processes and decision-making are steadily impacted over time.

However, the gene has a distinct, direct role to play in causing delirium, and one's risk of experiencing delirium cannot be solely explained by the gene's link to Alzheimer's disease, researchers from the University of Edinburgh said. Findings published in the journal Nature Ageing show that the effects of the APOE gene on risk of delirium held despite adjusting for dementia, thereby providing strong evidence that the gene contributes to the risk in people without dementia.

The overlap between genetic risks of delirium and Alzheimer's disease may help explain why

delirium so often precedes or accelerates cognitive decline, the researchers said.

"The study provides the strongest evidence to date that delirium has a genetic component. Our next step is to understand how DNA modifications and changes in gene expression in brain cells can lead to delirium," said co-author of the study, Vasilis Raptis from the University of Edinburgh.

The researchers "conducted a genetic meta-analysis on delirium using multi-ancestry data from the UK Biobank, FinnGen, All of Us Research Program and Michigan Genomics Initiative cohorts, yielding the Apolipoprotein E (APOE) gene as a strong delirium risk factor independently of dementia." Blood samples from 32,000 individuals in the UK Biobank who developed delirium, collected up to 16 years before a diagnosis, were also analysed.

They identified proteins that can help predict delirium risk years before developing symptoms, which included markers of

brain injury and inflammation. "The findings shed new light on the biological foundations of delirium, suggesting that brain vulnerability, systemic and nerv-ous system inflammation may all play important roles," co-author Albert Tenesa, professor of quantitative genetics at the University of Edinburgh, said.

Death toll from floods, landslides rises to 56 in Sri Lanka

Colombo, Nov 28: The death toll due to floods and landslides has risen to 56 and 21 remain missing in Sri Lanka as it announced a public holiday on Friday other than for those involved in essential services.

At least 46 deaths have been recorded within the past 72 hours as adverse weather conditions continue to affect the island, the Disaster Management Centre (DMC) said.

In view of the emergency situation, the Government declared Friday as a public holiday other than for those involved in essential services.

Disaster management officials said that 43,991 people from 12,313 families have been affected by the extreme weather conditions

Meanwhile, cyclonic storm Ditwah is located near Sri Lanka's eastern district of Trincomalee, the meteorology department announced on Friday morning. Ditwah was centred about 50 km south of Trincomalee and was seen



to be moving north and northwestwards.

Heavy showers, thunderstorms and strong winds will continue island-wide, with very heavy rainfall above 200 mm expected in several provinces, and up to 150 mm in areas, including Trincomalee in the east, Badulla in central Galle and Matara in the southern province, the weather bureau said.

Winds of 60-70 kmph, gusting up to 80-90 kmph, are likely across much of the country.

SriLankan Airlines said several inbound planes had been diverted to Kochi and Trivandrum in India and the Mattala airport in the southern province.

The Government is considering making an international appeal for help at a meeting to be convened by Prime Minister Harini Amarasuriya later in the day, sources said.

The railway department said all services have been suspended until further notice from 6 am today.

In the central province town of Gampola, the railway station was completely submerged with several carriages trapped underwater, officials said.

The risk of floods has increased further due to the opening of spill gates at all of the reservoirs through-

China's top diplomat to visit Russia for security talks



Beijing, Nov 28: China's top diplomat Wang Yi will visit Russia next week to attend security talks, Beijing's foreign ministry announced Friday, as the United States renews its push to end the war in Ukraine. Wang will travel to Russia for a routine China-Russia strategic security consultation from Monday to Tuesday, Beijing's foreign ministry spokeswoman Mao Ning told reporters at a regular briefing. Wang, who was invited by Russian security chief Sergei Shoigu, will "thoroughly exchange views on international and regional issues of mutual concern, and ... strengthen communication and coordination on key issues involving the strategic security interests of both countries," Mao said.

Washington stunned Kyiv and Europe last week with a surprise plan to end the nearly four-year war in Ukraine.

Russian President Vladimir Putin said Thursday that he would end his Ukraine offensive if Kyiv withdrew from territory claimed by Moscow – otherwise his army would take it by force. The Russian army has been slowly but steadily grinding through eastern Ukraine in costly battles against outnumbered and outgunned Ukrainian forces. China is not a party to the conflict, but Kyiv has long complained that Beijing has supplied items to Moscow that can be used in its war against Ukraine, and continues to purchase Russian energy. Beijing strongly denies that it supplies Russia with material for use in its military campaign in Ukraine and has sought to portray itself as an impartial broker ready to help resolve the conflict.

Anti-corruption units raid home, offices of Zelensky's chief of staff



Kyiv, Nov 28: corruption units have raided the home and office of Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky's chief of staff, Andrii Yermak, in an unwelcome distraction for Kyiv officials as they battle to defeat Russia's invasion and persuade US officials to accommodate their demands in peace proposals. Two national agencies fighting entrenched corruption in Ukraine said they searched Yermak's office. Yermak, a powerful figure in Ukraine and a key participant in talks with the United States, confirmed they also searched his apartment.

"The investigators are facing no obstacles," Yermak wrote on the messaging app Telegram. He added that he was cooperating fully with them and his lawyers were present. The National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine and

the Specialized Anti-Corruption Prosecutor's Office are Ukrainian anti-corruption watchdogs. They are behind a major investigation into a \$100 million energy sector corruption scandal involving top Ukrainian officials.

The scandal has heaped more problems on Zelensky as he seeks continued support from Western countries for Ukraine's war effort and tries to ensure continued foreign

Human washing machine goes on sale in Japan

Tokyo, Nov 28: After wowing World Expo visitors, a human washing machine is now on sale in Japan, a company spokeswoman said Friday.

Users lie down in the pod, close the lid and get cleaned like clothes in a washing machine — but without the spin — while music plays.

A prototype of the device, called the human washer of the future, attracted long queues at the sixmonth Expo that wrapped up in Osaka in October after welcoming over 27 million people.

Made by Japanese firm Science, the device is an update of a product displayed the last time Osaka host-

"Our (company) president was inspired by that as a 10-year-old boy at the time," Science spokeswoman Sachiko Maekura told AFP.



The machine "not only washes your body but also your soul," she added, while also monitoring users'

heartbeats and other vital signs. After a US resort compan contacted Science to see if the prototype would be commercialized, the firm decided to produce it for real. A hotel in Osaka bought the first machine and is preparing to offer the service to hotel guests, the spokeswoman said.

Other customers include Yamida Denki, a maior consumer electronics retail chain in Japan, which hopes the machine will draw people to visit its outlets,

Sunil Kumar took 2/11 from 3.3 overs, while veteran India seamer Bhuvneshwar Kumar returned 1/14 from two overs.


