Srinagar, Jan 24: Ahead of Republic Day, security has been tightened across Jammu and Kashmir with forces carrying out extensive area domination exercises, and sanitization operations.

A senior security official told the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that the security has been beefed up in all the 20



districts of J&K, particularly in the border areas. "Sensitive areas in Kashmir have seen enhanced security, including road blockades, vehicle checks, security cordons, and search operations," the official added.

He said there is an extensive deployment of police and paramilitary forces along the International Border (IB) and

Line of Control (LoC). "Senior officers have reviewed security arrangements in sensitive border areas to ensure effective coordination between various agencies," the official added.

J&K records severe cold; snowfall, rain expected on Jan 26

- Valley receives significant precipitation over past 24 hrs
- Moderate to heavy rain, snow expected on Jan 26-27

Srinagar, Jan 24: Kashmir recorded a sharp drop in night temperatures on Saturday, with several places reporting sub-zero minimums, even as the Meteorological Department forecast rain and snow across most areas on January 26.

According to data obtained by the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Zethan Rafiabadi recorded the lowest

temperature at minus 10.9 degrees Celsius, followed by Gulmarg at minus 12.0 degrees Celsius and Sonamarg at minus 10.5 degrees Celsius.

Other areas in the Kashmir Valley also reported freezing temperatures, including Beerwah in Budgam at minus 8.2 degrees Celsius, Pahalgam at minus 7.6 degrees Celsius, and Shopian at minus 7.1 degrees Celsius.

Srinagar registered a minimum temperature of minus 1.4 degrees Celsius, while Srinagar Airport recorded minus 3.2 degrees Celsius.

Other areas across the Valley, including Kupwara, Kokernag, Pampore, Awantipora, Anantnag, Baramulla, Pulwama, Kulgam, and Bandipora, experienced temperatures ranging from minus 2.0 to minus 6.2 degrees Celsius.

In the Jammu region, comparatively milder conditions were recorded. | [More on P6](#)

KPDCL restores over 85% electricity across valley

- 'Over 95% 33kV lines, 81% 33kV feeders up'
- Power load back to over 1500 MW from 100 MWs

Srinagar, Jan 23: A day after gusty winds and heavy snowfall in many areas of Kashmir, Power Development Department (PDD) Saturday restored over 85 percent electricity in the affected areas.

According to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), till 8 Pm, KPDCL was

distributing a load of nearly over 1500 Megawatts (MWs) against the usual load of 1850 MWs.

An official said that since Friday morning till 8 Pm of Saturday, KPDCL has restored 81.03 percent of 11kV feeders with eight feeders functioning 100 percent.

The official also said that out of the total 1302 11kV feeders, at least 1055 were running smoothly, 82 were under fault and 165 feeders were off due to the outage in 33kV lines or due to the fault in the respective receiving stations.

In case of 33kV lines, the official said that KPDCL has restored at least 95 percent of lines with | [More on P6](#)

LoP Sharma to lead attacks over 'failed promises'

Srinagar, Jan 24: The upcoming budget session of Jammu & Kashmir is expected to be stormy, with opposition parties, especially the Bharatiya Janata Party, set to challenge the National Conference-led government on a range of issues, from its pre-election commitments regarding



freebies to what they describe as governance failures.

In a clear indication that the BJP will leave no stone unturned in questioning the government's performance over the past 16 months, the party held a training workshop for its legislators on Saturday at winter capital Jammu to prepare them for the upcoming session.

The party's National General Secretary Tarun Chugh, former Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh Jai Ram Thakur and Delhi Assembly Speaker Vijender Gupta were also present in the training session, which was attended by all MLAs and senior leaders of its J&K unit.

Speaking to news agency—Kashmir News Observer

(KNO), senior BJP leader and former minister Pawan Gupta said that they will question the government for its failure to fulfill its election promises.

"The government has completely failed to fulfill its election promises," he said, adding that the party will also raise the issue of flood victims and seek accountability over the package provided by the Government of India for rebuilding infrastructure.

Gupta further said that the party will question the government for weakening the institution of the MLA.

The BJP's attacks on the government in the House will be spearheaded by the Leader of the Opposition Sunil Kumar Sharma, who has been the main target of the NC leadership while countering the saffron party's | [More on P6](#)

Handwara Admin reviews snow clearance, says major roads traffic-worthy

KUPWARA, JANUARY 24: Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) Handwara, Javed Naseem Masoodi, Saturday conducted an extensive inspection of key roads across the Handwara Sub-Division to review ongoing snow clearance operations and ensure smooth movement of traffic amid prevailing winter conditions.

During the inspection, the ADC, as per an official statement, assessed the deployment of men and machinery, interacted with field staff, and issued on-the-spot directions to expedite clearance work on vital routes connecting habitations, hospitals, and other essential service points. Emphasis was laid on maintaining round-the-clock operations to minimize inconvenience to the general public.

The ADC informed that all major roads across the Sub-Division have been cleared and are traffic-worthy, while snow clearance work on interior and link roads is being taken up on priority. He stressed the importance of coordinated efforts among all concerned departments and instructed officers to remain vigilant, particularly in vulnerable areas prone to heavy snowfall and road blockages.

Shopian Admin launches massive snow clearance Restores 70% water supply schemes

SHOPIAN, JANUARY 24: In the aftermath of record heavy snowfall ranging 3 to 5 feet in major parts of Shopian, District Administration Shopian, is on its toes and functioning in emergency mode while launching a massive, district-wide snow clearance and essential services restoration operation since the day one of the impact.

All line departments have been activated on a war footing since the intervening night of 22-23 January, with round-the-clock deployment of men and machinery to clear snow from the national highway, district roads, inner village links, hospital access routes, and other vital corridors.

To ensure fast-track restoration, additional snow clearance machinery has been mobilized from adjoining districts, further strengthening the operational capacity. However, full snow clearance, as per an official statement, may still need more time before the full restoration is achieved despite challenges of momentous snow accumulation across the length and breadth of the district. Almost 80 percent under P1 roads, and more than 50 percent P2 roads cleared till now.

Frontline workers of KPDCL and Jal Shakti are giving their best to restore the services. KPDCL has made significant progress in restoring electricity in major parts of the district. Jal Shakti staff is continuously working to resume the water supplies. Out of 92 Water Supply Schemes, nearly 80% have been affected, mainly because of heavy accumulation of snow at the headworks.

As of now, around 70% of the affected Water Supply Schemes have been restored and normal supply has been resumed in those areas. Restoration of the remaining schemes is taking additional time due to significant challenges, particularly the remotely located and difficult-to-access headworks in snowbound areas. Despite these constraints, every effort is being made to ensure early restoration, and it is expected that by tomorrow evening, almost all remaining schemes will be restored and regular water supply will be fully normalized across the district.

Deputy Commissioner, Shopian, Shishir Gupta is personally supervising and monitoring the situation, conducting regular reviews, and issuing field-level directions to ensure prompt response and effective coordination. He has toured different areas of Shopian and Kellar to monitor the services restoration and snow clearance. All officers and officials have been directed to remain available in the field until full restoration while district officers, Tehsildars, sector officers, engineering and supervising staff have been directed to provide the ground support to ensure the easement of traffic especially catering to ferrying of sick and expecting mothers to healthcare institutions and conduct rescue operations. The healthcare institutions are functioning normally with all aid and care being extended to patients.

TLSC Ganderbal observes National Girl Child Day

GANDERBAL, JANUARY 24: In observance of National Girl Child Day 2026, the Tehsil Legal Services Committee (TLSC), Ganderbal Saturday organised a legal awareness cum sensitisation programme at AWC Busserbugh, Ganderbal.

The programme was conducted with the primary objective of disseminating legal knowledge among the general public, particularly women, with regard to the constitutional rights, statutory safeguards and welfare schemes available for the girl child, and to promote access to justice, equality before law and social inclusion.

The initiative, as per an official statement,



was undertaken in strict conformity with the Calendar of Activities issued by the National Legal Services Authority (NLSA) and the Jammu & Kashmir Legal Services Authority (J&K LSA). The programme was effectively coordinated under the administrative leadership of Shazia Tabasum, Member Secretary, J&K Legal Services Authority, and Abdul Nasir, Chairman, District Legal Services Authority, Ganderbal, with institutional support from Sheikh Babar Hussain, Secretary, DLSA Ganderbal.

During the course of the programme, focused deliberations were held on critical issues affecting the rights and welfare of the girl child, including

the prohibition of child marriage, prevention of gender-based discrimination, eradication of child labour and curbing of child trafficking, all of which constitute

serious violations of fundamental and statutory rights guaranteed under the Constitution of India and allied legislations.

The resource persons

delivered comprehensive lectures on the relevant legal regime governing the protection of Girl child. They elucidated the scope, object and penal consequences under the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, the Child and Adolescent Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986, the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 and the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015, thereby sensitising the participants about the functioning of Legal Services Institutions at district and tehsil levels, including the availability of legal counselling, legal assistance and alternative dispute resolution mechanisms available under law.

They also elaborated the constitutional provisions regarding the welfare of the girl child and their protection.

The resource persons

further elaborated upon the statutory right to free legal aid and legal representation as guaranteed under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, and apprised the participants about the functioning of Legal Services Institutions at district and tehsil levels, including the availability of legal counselling, legal assistance and alternative dispute resolution mechanisms available under law.

Further, the participants were sensitised about various welfare and social security schemes formulated by the Government of India and the Government of Jammu & Kashmir for the benefit of the girl child, including Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, Sukanya Samridhi Yojana, Ladli Beti Scheme, Balika Samridhi Yojana and other education and health-oriented incentive schemes aimed at ensuring financial security, educational advancement and overall socio-economic empowerment of the girl child.

Highway closure spurs train rush

ANANTNAG: As the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway remained closed for the second consecutive day due to slippery conditions, train services witnessed heavy rush with coaches jam-packed. The railways arranged two additional reserved special trains to cater to the surge in passengers.

This reporter visited the highway and the railway station and found tourists stranded on the highway at Qazigund, who later returned to Anantnag railway station and boarded overcrowded trains.

Ishfaq, a tourist from Jaipur said that all roads in the Kashmir Valley were closed, forcing them to travel by train. "We tried to travel by road but were asked to return. Now we are heading by train," he said.

Mohammad Asralan, also from Jaipur, said they have been stuck on the highway for the last two



days and decided to travel by train due to the on-going disruption. "Train is the only option left for us as we were stranded.

All seats are booked and no ticket is available. The train is fully packed," he said, adding that direct train service to Delhi

should be introduced to ease suffering of passengers. Shauita, a passenger from Noida, said they were still unsure

about their travel plan as the station was overcrowded. "There is too much rush inside the train and no place for passengers," she said. Passengers urged that the heavy rush should be restored as soon as possible.

Railways said that two reserved special trains have been planned owing to the closure of the highway and the heavy rush of passengers.

"In view of extremely heavy passenger rush between Katra and Srinagar due to closure of roads and flights owing to inclement weather, it is proposed to run suitable reserved special trains on the route of the non-running Vande Bharat on 27th and 28th January 2026 between Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Katra and Srinagar and vice-versa, with en-route stoppage at Banihal, so that at least two train services remain available on the section," the communication said—(KNO)

Farmers cheered by first snow

Srinagar, Jan 24: The much-awaited season's first significant snowfall has brought relief and renewed optimism among the thousands of farmers, along with fruit growers across Kashmir, ending a months-long dry spell that had sparked fears among the people.

Jammu and Kashmir witnessed widespread snow and rain on Friday, marking the first major precipitation after several months of a dry spell.

The snow has been welcomed as a blessing by all, particularly those associated with the agriculture and horticulture sectors, which form the backbone of the region's rural economy.

Agricultural experts said that prolonged absence of rain and snow, besides leading to the drying up of water sources, severely stresses farmlands and orchards.

They said sustained dryness reduces the soil moisture levels and disrupts the natural growth cycle of crops and can have long-term consequences on both

yield and quality, mainly for the orchards, which are highly sensitive to moisture availability.

"Extended dry spells deprive the soil of essential moisture, which directly affects flowering, along with fruit setting. Such conditions can significantly lower productivity in the upcoming season," Aamir Yousuf Bhat, a well-known fruit trader and horticulture expert, said.

He said that delayed and uneven germination of crops due to moisture deficiency leads to reduced output. However, its impact will be less now as snowfall has eased these concerns to a large extent, he added.

Bhat said the situation had become alarming due to a lack of precipitation, as there was no rain or snow for nearly five months. "Had it not snowed, it would have dealt a severe blow to both agriculture and horticulture," he said.

Most of the orchards in Kashmir are rain-fed and dependent on snowmelt rather than artificial irrigation, and there was no water for irrigation due to a long

dry spell, said Dr Umar Mushtaq, an environmental expert.

"This snowfall will now replenish moisture levels and significantly reduce stress on fruit trees, and adequate moisture also helps curb pest attacks," he said.

Dr Umar Mushtaq said that prolonged dry weather poses serious challenges for orchard sustainability by disrupting natural irrigation systems and reducing water availability. This, he said, impacts both fruit quality and yield, and makes them vulnerable to pests and many other diseases.

He, however, added that this precipitation after a long time will replenish the moisture levels and maintain the water table and help in irrigation facilities in summer.

Farmers who had sown Rabi crops were also particularly anxious due to low moisture, thereby delaying seed germination.

With the arrival of snowfall, there is renewed confidence among farmers and orchardists. They expressed relief by saying that the snowfall had come just in

time, and the seeds will germinate now.

According to farmers, mustard, an important Rabi crop harvested in April, was also under threat because of the lack of rainfall. They said timely snowfall has now revived the expectations of a healthy crop and better yields.

Those associated with agriculture and horticulture described the snowfall as a need of the hour. They expressed optimism that natural moisture will translate into improved crop performance and better economic returns.

Officials from Public Health Engineering (PHE) department said that the prolonged dry spell has pushed many water sources to critical levels, and even some dried up. "This snowfall gives us hope that water sources will gradually recharge, ensuring smoother water supply and hydropower generation," an official said.

They said it may take a few days for springs and streams to fully replenish, but this snowfall has brought much-needed relief after widespread water shortages across the valley—(KNO)

Full dress rehearsals held for R-Day in J&K

Srinagar, Jan 24: Ahead of the 77th Republic Day celebrations, Jammu and Kashmir remained on high alert on Saturday as full dress rehearsals were conducted simultaneously across all districts in the Union Territory amid patriotic fervour.

The rehearsals were held amid high enthusiasm and tricolour spirit, offering a preview of the grand Republic Day celebrations on January 26, featuring impressive parades and cultural performances.

In Kashmir valley, the main venue is at Bakshi Stadium, Srinagar, where today the Divisional Commissioner Kashmir, Anshul Garg unfurled the National Flag and inspected the parade and took the salute.

In Jammu, the full dress rehearsal was held at M.A. Stadium, where Divisional Commissioner Jammu, Ramesh Kumar hoisted the National Flag and inspected the parade, and took the salute.

In both divisions of Jammu and Kashmir, contingents representing Army, BSF, CRPF, SSB, JKAP, IRP, JKAP, UTDRF, NCC, Bharat Scouts & Guides and school students coordinated March Past and shows spirited cultural performances.

In Srinagar City, the Divisional Commissioner first paid floral tributes to martyrs at Balidan Stambh along with senior officers including IGP Kashmir Vijay Kumar Birdi, DIG Central Kashmir and DC Srinagar.

In his address, the Div Com Garg conveyed warm greetings to the people, stating that all arrangements for the Republic Day function at Bakshi Stadium were complete. Snowfall Aftermath

Uncleared roads isolates several valley villages

Srinagar, Jan 24: Several remote areas of the Valley also witnessed similar problems. "Snow clearance is slow, and essential services are badly affected. We urge the administration to act swiftly," said a resident of Dardpora in Bandipora district.

The residents of Ringzabal and Khasahib areas of Budgam district said that snow had remained uncleared in interior roads, leaving an ambulance stranded.

"We called several times, but no help arrived. It was terrifying when a patient needed urgent care," said a resident from Khasahib.

In the Charar-i-Sharief constituency, villagers urged immediate action after snowfall blocked several interior roads. "While the administration has cleared the main road, many interior routes remain cut off due to accumulated snow," said Hakeem Ahmad, a local resident.

Similar complaints came from Ramhall and Rajwar, where locals said the lack of clearance caused severe disruption to daily life.

In Kupwara district, residents in Watayin, Langate, and surrounding villages reported slippery and unsafe conditions on roads that remain uncleared. "Commuting has become dangerous, especially for children and the elderly," said a villager from Langate.

The administration said it was prioritising interior and link roads in Budgam, including Khag, Khasahib, Pakherpora, and Yousmarg, but locals said many areas continue to face hardship. Shopian,

Anantnag, Bandipora's Dardpora area, and higher reaches of the Valley also witnessed similar problems. "Snow clearance is slow, and essential services are badly affected. We urge the administration to act swiftly," said a resident of Dardpora in Bandipora district.

The locals criticised the government for failing to restore essential services, including power and water supply, in Rafiabad, Zainagare and surrounding areas even after nearly 24 hours.

They said main and interior roads connecting the constituency to district and tehsil headquarters remain blocked, disrupting normal life, particularly affecting the movement of patients, elderly residents and emergency services.

Meanwhile, Divisional Commissioner (Div Com) Kashmir, Anshul Garg said snow clearance work is underway across Kashmir, with about 75 per cent of roads cleared following recent heavy snowfall.

Garg said that out of nearly 20,000 kilometres of road length, around 15,000 kilometres have been cleared so far. He added that work on interior and link roads is in progress and is expected to be completed by Saturday evening.

The Div Com said a coordinated plan involving the Mechanical Engineering Department, Roads and Buildings Department, PMGSY and other agencies is being implemented to restore road connectivity across the Valley—(KNO)

EDITORIAL

Time For Systemic Reform To Ensure Safer Roads

The tragic loss of ten soldiers in Doda is a devastating symptom of a far wider crisis. It compels us to confront an unbearable truth: our roads have become killing fields. The concurrent data revealing nearly 3,700 deaths in over 20,000 accidents in Jammu & Kashmir since 2022 is a statistical scream for urgent, systemic intervention. While expressions of grief and condolences from leadership are necessary, they are woefully insufficient. What is required now is

uncompromising action to halt this carnage. The accident in Doda, on a high-altitude, strategically vital road, underscores that this is both a public safety and a national security concern. These roads are lifelines for communities and armed forces alike. Their perilous condition, often lacking basic safeguards like crash barriers, proper grading, and regular maintenance in extreme terrain, is a recipe for repeated tragedy. The government's own data points to clear solutions.

The Chief Secretary's directive for GIS-based, data-driven interventions to identify and rectify 'black spots' is precisely the scientific approach needed. However, identification must lead to immediate, funded rectification by agencies like the BRO, NHAI, and PWD. Engineering flaws which include blind curves, inadequate signage, missing parapets, must be corrected with wartime urgency. Simultaneously, enforcement cannot remain merely a revenue-generating exercise

of issuing challans. The punitive measures discussed, which include cancellation of licenses and vehicle registrations for habitual offenders, must be implemented stringently to create genuine deterrence. Enforcement must be paired with a massive public awareness campaign on responsible driving, targeting the prime accident hours of 3 PM to 9 PM. This is a complex challenge demanding a 'whole-of-government' response, integrating traffic police, transport authorities,

road engineering agencies, and district administrations. The goal must be zero preventable deaths. Every life lost on our roads, be it a soldier serving the nation or a citizen going about their day, is a profound failure of the state's duty to protect. Enough review meetings have been held. We need a declared, time-bound 'Road Safety Mission' with accountability, resources, and the political will to see it through. Our collective conscience and the safety of our people demand nothing less.

CERT-In: India's Frontline Defender Against Cyber Threats

Building a safe, trusted and accountable cyberspace

India's rapid digital transformation has reshaped governance, commerce, and citizen services at an unprecedented scale. From digital payments and e-commerce to online public service delivery, digital technology has become integral to everyday life. As digital adoption accelerates, safeguarding cyberspace has emerged as a national priority.

With rising instances of online fraud, phishing, ransomware attacks, AI-driven scams, and threats to critical digital infrastructure, the need for a coordinated and resilient cybersecurity framework has never been greater. Recognising this challenge, the Government of India has put in place robust policies, institutional mechanisms, and operational capabilities to ensure a safe, trusted, and secure digital environment.

At the centre of India's cybersecurity architecture is the Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-In), operating under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and mandated by the Information Technology Act, 2000. CERT-In provides the institutional depth for national cyber defence by overseeing incident management, enhancing systemic resilience, and promoting secure digital practices across government, industry, and society. Its work underpins the protection of India's rapidly expanding digital ecosystem and supports confidence in digital platforms and services.

In today's interconnected digital landscape, cybersecurity is no longer a purely technical concern but a foundational pillar of national security, economic stability, and public trust. The scale and complexity of digital systems demand continuous vigilance, coordinated action, and strong institutional leadership. By combining policy direction with operational readiness, CERT-In not only responds to emerging cyber threats but also anticipates risks, builds resilience, and ensures that India's digital growth remains secure, inclusive, and sustainable.

India's Expanding Digital Landscape
Over the last decade, India's digital footprint has grown exponentially. It is driven by rising internet penetration, widespread smartphone adoption, and the rapid expansion of digital public services. By 2025, internet connections in India crossed the milestone of 100 crore, reaching 100.29 crore, compared to 25.15 crore in March 2014. Average monthly data consumption per wireless data subscriber increased nearly 399 times, rising from 61.66 MB in 2014 to 24.01 GB in 2025, among the highest globally.

This strong digital foundation has enabled remarkable growth in digital payments. The Unified Payments Interface (UPI) has emerged as the central pillar of India's digital payment ecosystem. In December 2025 alone, UPI processed over 21 billion transactions valued at more than 27 lakh crore. While this digital expansion has significantly enhanced convenience and inclusion, it has also widened the attack surface for cyber threats. To address these risks, the Union Budget 2025-26 allocated 782 crore for cybersecurity, underscoring the government's strong focus on securing India's digital infrastructure.

In this context, CERT-In's role assumes critical importance as the cornerstone of India's cybersecurity framework. CSIRT-Fin i.e. Computer Security Incident Response Team for the Financial Sector functioning under CERT-In, strengthens cybersecurity in the financial sector by enabling coordinated incident response, information sharing, and providing guidance and support for the Banking, Financial Services, and Insurance (BFSI) sector. Similarly CSIRT-Power works as an extended arm of CERT-In for fortifying the cybersecurity posture of the Power Sector by coordinating and analysing cyber incidents, acting on cyber threat intelligence from CERT-In, taking proactive containment measures based on situational awareness details provided by CERT-In, ensuring cybersecurity audits are carried out and mitigating vulnerabilities as reported by CERT-In's Cyber Swachhta Kendra (CSKs).

Core Functions of CERT-In for the National Cybersecurity

CERT-In is the national agency for cyber incident response in India. Its mandate under



section 70B of the Information Technology (IT) Act 2000 includes the prevention of cyber-attacks, real-time monitoring of cyber threats, and swift coordination with stakeholders to mitigate and contain cyber incidents.

Core functions of CERT-In includes:

Promoting cybersecurity awareness among organisations and citizens

Facilitating information sharing through its automated cyber threat exchange platform

Sharing near-real time information on existing and potential cyber threats with organisations covering all sectors

Collaborating with international partners, industry and academia

Conducting regular training programmes, cybersecurity exercises/drills

Operating CSKs for ensuring cyber hygiene & a Command & Control Center for facilitating monitoring of cyber threats and attack campaigns

Coordinating mitigation measures with organisations and stakeholders during significant national and international activities

Institutionalising responsible vulnerability disclosure

Supporting incident investigations & supporting law enforcement agencies through its cyber forensics capabilities

Enabling organisations & providing guidance on cyber crisis management plan implementation to enhance national preparedness

Through sustained operational engagement and coordinated response mechanisms, CERT-In ensures rapid containment of cyber incidents and supports the restoration of affected systems across sectors. Its continuous flow of actionable intelligence and guidance enables stakeholders to strengthen preparedness, reduce systemic risk, and respond effectively to evolving threats. Together, these efforts contribute to minimising disruption, accelerating recovery, and reinforcing confidence in India's digital ecosystem.

CERT-In at the Core of India's Cyber Resilience Strategy

CERT-In continues to serve as the cornerstone of India's national cyber defence architecture through proactive threat detection, rapid incident response, and large-scale capacity building. Its achievements in 2025 reflect a sustained and systematic effort to strengthen institutional resilience, secure critical digital infrastructure, and reinforce trust in India's rapidly expanding digital ecosystem.

An overview of CERT-In's Key Achievements of 2025

National Cyber Incident Response and Threat Intelligence

In 2025, CERT-In handled over 29.44 lakh cyber incidents, issuing 1,530 alerts, 390 vulnerability notes, and 65 advisories, reflecting large-scale national cyber response capability.

29 Common Vulnerabilities and Exposures (CVES) were identified and published by CERT-In.

CERT-In conducted 122 cybersecurity drills and exercises of varying complexity, including tabletop exercises, with participation from about 1,570 organisations across government, public, and private sectors (Defence, Paramilitary Forces, Space, Atomic Energy, Telecommunications (ISPs), Finance, Power, Oil and Natural Gas, Transportation, IT/ITES sectors, and State Data Centres).

Awareness Initiatives

CERT-In conducted 95 awareness sessions covering 91,065 participants (including National Cybersecurity Awareness Month (NCSAM) October 2025).

In 2025, CERT-In also published a comprehensive suite of reports, whitepapers, guidelines, advisories, and vulnerability notes, providing timely, actionable guidance to organisations and stakeholders for proactive cyber risk mitigation and resilience building.

CERT-In's achievements in 2025 reflect a central role in safeguarding India's rapidly expanding digital ecosystem. Through large-scale capacity building, rigorous audits, continuous awareness efforts, and the release

of forward-looking guidelines and technical frameworks, CERT-In has strengthened institutional preparedness across government, industry, and society.

Institutional Frameworks anchored by CERT-In

To operationalise national cybersecurity policy and translate strategic intent into on-ground action, CERT-In anchors a set of specialised institutional frameworks. These mechanisms provide structured coordination, preventive safeguards, and rapid response capabilities across sectors, States, and citizens.

The Cyber Swachhta Kendra (CSK) (CSK (Botnet Cleaning and Malware Analysis Centre) is established by CERT-In to enhance cyber hygiene among citizens. The centre tracks networks of internet connected devices such as computers, mobile phones, IoT devices, and home routers—that are infected with malware. It provides free tools and guidance to help users clean infected devices and works closely with industry, academia, and internet service providers to identify compromised systems and alert users. Regular awareness campaigns promote safe online behaviour and responsible digital practices.

As of December 2025, CSK covers 98% of India's digital population, sending large-scale notifications on botnet and malware infections. Engaging 1,427 organisations across key sectors, it helps detect and remediate malware, while 89.55 lakh downloads of its free botnet-removal tools underscore CSK's role as a citizen-centric, preventive cybersecurity initiatives.

Security Assurance Framework CERT-In operates a security assurance framework to strengthen the security of government and critical sector systems. Under this framework, certified IT security audit organisations conduct regular audits; Vulnerability assessments and penetration testing are undertaken; and Audit findings are analysed to identify common weaknesses. Based on these insights, CERT-In issues secure design guidelines and promotes best practices. Regular audits under this framework significantly enhance cyber readiness and resilience across sectors.

National Cyber Coordination Centre (NCCC), implemented by CERT-In, monitors cyberspace at metadata level to detect potential cybersecurity threats for situational awareness. It facilitates real-time information sharing with concerned organisations, State governments, and other stakeholders, enabling timely preventive and response actions.

Computer Security Incident Response Teams (CSIRTs) CERT-In oversees a network of CSIRTs operating at the sectoral and State/UT levels. Sectoral CSIRTs support domains such as finance, power, and telecom, while State CSIRTs operate under respective State and UT governments.

Cyber Crisis Management Plan (CCMP) CERT-In has also developed a CCMP for government bodies, providing structured guidance during major cyberattacks and cyber-terrorism incidents. The plan supports rapid response, recovery, and continuity of essential services, particularly for critical infrastructure.

This layered institutional design strengthens national readiness while safeguarding critical infrastructure and citizens alike.

Global Recognition of India's Cybersecurity Leadership

CERT-In's sustained domestic efforts have increasingly resonated at the global level. Its operational scale, technology-driven approaches, and emphasis on collaborative cyber governance have positioned India as a credible and responsible stakeholder in the international cybersecurity ecosystem.

In the Global Cybersecurity Outlook 2025 published by the World Economic Forum (WEF), CERT-In has been highlighted for its deployment of AI-driven situational awareness systems to analyse and detect malicious domains and phishing activities, as well as for its real-time sharing of threat intelligence at the global level.

In April 2025, CERT-In contributed to the Cyber Resilience Compass paper published jointly by the WEF and the University of Oxford, which identified seven critical domains of cyber resilience.

In February 2025, CERT-In was among the international partners to co-sign the joint high-level risk analysis report on Artificial Intelligence titled "Building Trust in AI through a Cyber-Risk-Based Approach", published by France's National Cybersecurity Agency (ANSSI). The report advocates a risk-based approach to enable trusted AI systems, secure AI value chains, and address emerging AI-related cyber risks.

Together, these recognitions underscore CERT-In's growing influence and leadership in shaping global cybersecurity and AI risk governance. They underscore CERT-In's emerging role in shaping global discussions on cyber resilience, threat intelligence sharing, and responsible AI risk governance.

Conclusion

Amid the growing complexity and scale of cyber threats, CERT-In continues to anchor India's cybersecurity ecosystem. Through continuously identifying and mitigating cyber risks, CERT-In has significantly strengthened national cyber resilience. Its initiatives, ranging from institutional frameworks and sectoral & state CSIRTs to citizen-centric awareness programmes, demonstrate a comprehensive and forward-looking approach to securing India's ICT infrastructure and protecting users. SRINAGAR, JANUARY 24: Director Agriculture Kashmir, Sartaj Ahmad Shah, Saturday visited the Floriculture Development Scheme, kitchen garden, and entomology sections at Lalmandi, Srinagar, to assess the damage caused by severe gusty winds during the intervening night of January 22-23, 2026.

The strong winds, as per an official statement, triggered by a broader weather disturbance across the Kashmir Valley, led to uprooting of plants, damage to poly-houses and disruption of ongoing cultivation activities at the site. Transport Dept launches UT-Wide drive against high-intensity headlights

JAMMU, JANUARY 24: The Transport Department, Jammu & Kashmir, has launched a Union Territory-wide enforcement drive against motor vehicles fitted with unauthorized high-intensity white LED headlights and other non-standard lighting systems in view of growing concerns over road safety.

The Transport Commissioner, as per an official statement, has directed all enforcement agencies, including Regional Transport Officers (RTOS), Assistant Regional Transport Officers (ARTOS), Motor Vehicle Inspectors (MVIS) and field enforcement staff, to initiate strict action against vehicles using high-intensity lights that cause glare and impair visibility for other road users.

Officials stated that the blinding effect of such non-standard lighting systems has emerged as a serious road



safety hazard, particularly during night-time driving and low-visibility conditions. These lights have been found

time for oncoming drivers and pedestrians.

The enforcement drive will be conducted across urban areas, highways, rural roads and accident-prone zones throughout the Union Territory. Vehicles found fitted with unauthorized or modified lighting systems will be penalized in accordance with the provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act and relevant rules and such lights shall be removed on the spot wherever permissible.

The Transport Department has also appealed to vehicle owners and drivers to refrain from using non-standard lighting systems and to ensure that their vehicles strictly adhere to approved specifications in the interest of public safety and the safety of fellow road users.

This initiative aims to enhance night-time road safety, reduce road accidents and ensure safer driving conditions for all citizens.

HCs are 'primary sentinel', must be more proactive, alert to systemic failures in rule of law: CJI

Mumbai, Jan 24: High courts need to be more proactive and alert to systemic failures in the rule of law, Chief Justice of India Surya Kant said on Saturday while asserting that "justice delayed is not only justice denied but it is justice destroyed".

He also emphasised the need to encourage mechanisms of mediation and reconciliation.

The CJI was speaking at two events here, one at the Fali Nariman memorial lecture and the second at a felicitation programme organised by the Bombay High Court.

CJI Kant, in his speech at the Fali Nariman memorial lecture, urged HCs to be more proactive and remain alert to systemic rule of law failures in the rule of law and not wait for the knock on its doors.

"The goal must be to transform access to justice from a passive right to a state-guaranteed service. Justice delayed is not only justice denied but it is justice destroyed," he said.

While speaking at the felicitation programme by the Bombay High Court, CJI Kant emphasised on the need to strengthen dispute resolution beyond the courtroom.

"The future of justice depends not only on how efficiently we adjudicate disputes but also on how wisely we resolve them. Mediation, reconciliation, and arbitration are not just alternatives of convenience but they are instruments of mature justice," he said.

They preserve relationships, reduce costs and delays, and allow courts to focus their energies to cases where authoritative adjudication is truly required, CJI Kant said.

"Courts must create an environment where mediation is encouraged. The success of these mechanisms rests largely on a proactive court where judges are open to exploring alternative dispute resolution with seriousness," he urged.

CJI Kant said the budget allocation for judiciary is liberal and adequate in Maharashtra and every request is met with in a most respectable manner and without any delay by the state government.

High Courts should not remain only revisional or appellate courts but should be vibrant and accessible centres to constitutional remedy, CJI Kant said.

High courts are not mere stepping stones to the Supreme Court, the CJI stressed.

"High Courts are the primary sentinel guarding the doorsteps of the ordinary citizen, ensuring that the rule of law is not a distant concept but a localised, breathing reality," he said.

It is the court that hears the first cry of an infant child, the CJI remarked.

"While the Supreme Court may have the final word, the high court often has the most vital one," he opined.

monitor event venues and surrounding areas," he said, adding that checkpoints have been set up in Srinagar and other district headquarters, particularly at key entry points.

"Random vehicle checks and frisking operations are being conducted to prevent the movement of subversive elements," he added.

He said elaborate arrangements have been made not only for the main Republic Day function in Srinagar but also for similar celebrations scheduled to be held in all districts of the Valley.

The IGP said that separate Republic Day functions will be organised in respective districts, where chief guests will take the salute, adding that similar strict security measures have been implemented for those events as well.

IGP Birdi extended an open invitation to the public to participate in the celebrations along with their families. "I want to convey to the common people that they are very warmly welcomed to join these celebrations with their families," he said, adding that special encouragement was being extended to school-going children to attend the events.

Responding to a query about whether any specific invitations were required, the IGP said the celebrations were open to all. "It is an open kind of invitation. Everyone is free to come," he said.

Furthermore, security forces along the Line of Control and the International Border have been placed on high alert to prevent infiltration and ceasefire violations.

The officials said heightened surveillance has been enforced in key frontier areas, including Gurez, Uri, Karna, Tangdhar and sectors in the Jammu region, while the Border Security Force has intensified round-the-clock patrolling and digital monitoring along the International Border.

They said troops are maintaining strict dominance over sensitive stretches and are fully prepared to respond to any infiltration attempts, adding that border management has been strengthened through smart fencing, drones, quadcopters, robotic surveillance systems and rapid-deployment vehicles to ensure

J&K records severe

Katra recorded a minimum of 6.6 degrees Celsius, Jammu Airport 4.7 degrees Celsius, and Jammu city 4.5 degrees Celsius.

Other districts, including Banihal, Batote, Bhaderwah, Kathua, Udhampur, Ramban, Samba, Rajouri, Reasi, and Kishtwar, reported minimum temperatures ranging from minus 4.4 to 3.8 degrees Celsius.

Meanwhile, the valley received widespread rainfall and snowfall over the past 24 hours, with several areas recording significant accumulation.

Srinagar recorded 37 mm of rainfall and no snowfall on January 23, followed by 16.4 mm of rain and 2 cm of snow on January 24, bringing the total precipitation to 53.4 mm of rain and 2 cm of snow. Qazigund recorded 94.2 mm

of rainfall and 15 cm of snow, while Pahalgam saw 66.2 mm of rain and 64.2 cm of snow.

Kupwara received 45.5 mm of rain and 35 cm of snow, and Gulmarg recorded the highest totals with 101.2 mm of rain and 96.8 cm of snow.

Other areas, including Kukernag, Banihal, Batote, Bhaderwah, Jammu, Katra, Kathua, Mirpur, Awantipora, Udhampur, Ramban, Samba, and Rajouri, also reported varying levels of rainfall, while snowfall was recorded primarily in hilly and valley regions.

Furthermore, the J&K is likely to experience light rain and snow at isolated places on January 25, according to the Meteorological Department.

"Weather is expected to change from January 26, with rain and snow at most places, and a possibility of moderate to heavy precipitation accompanied by thunder and gusty winds at a few locations, mainly during the night of January 26 and evening of January 27," it said. "Partly cloudy conditions are forecast from January 28 to 31 and continuing into February 1-3," it added.

The department advised farmers to suspend field operations until January 28, and the public in snow-bound higher reaches are warned against venturing into avalanche-prone or sloppy areas. (KNO)

Jmu-Sgr NH remains

"Snow accumulation and sub-zero temperatures during night hours made the road extremely slippery," an official said, adding that men and machinery have been pressed into service to restore traffic movement at the earliest.

Many tourists were stranded on Qazigund side of the highway and were forced to return towards safer locations, he said.

Thousands of vehicles, including those stranded at Udhampur and Dhar Road, have remained stuck since the highway was closed on Friday evening. "More than 3,000 vehicles, including trucks carrying essential commodities, are stranded," the officials said.

Meanwhile, other key routes, including the Mughal Road connecting Poonch-Rajouri with Shopian, Kishtwar-Sinhan-Kokernag road, and Srinagar-Sonamarg-Gumri road, also remained closed due to heavy snow accumulation.

IGP Traffic J&K, M. Suleman Choudhary, said that the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and other concerned agencies are working on a war footing to restore the highway.

"There has been heavy snowfall, particularly in south Kashmir areas and at the south portal of the Navyug Tunnel, including Banihal, Ramsu and Nachlana. Due to this, the stretch from Navyug Tunnel to Banihal and Ramsu has been reduced to a single lane," he said.

The IGP said clearance work is underway, but the road is yet to be restored. "Because of snowfall and cold night conditions, the road has become extremely slippery," he said.

Choudhary further said that a decision on reopening the highway will be taken after receiving a green signal from NHAI. "Till then, the highway will remain closed for traffic

movement," he said, adding that the Batote stretch has been partially cleared, which was also closed earlier due to snowfall.

In a traffic advisory issued for Sunday, the Traffic Police said, "Jammu-Srinagar National Highway is still closed due to snow accumulation between Nachlana and the Navyug Tunnel. Jammu-Doda road is also closed. Snow clearance work is in progress."

"Tomorrow, no vehicular movement shall be allowed from Nagrota (Jammu) towards Doda, Ramban, Banihal and Srinagar, and vice-versa," the advisory said.

Commuters belonging to Katra, Reasi and Udhampur towns have been advised to carry valid photo identity cards to facilitate smooth movement, it added. (KNO)

UP to be 'engine' of developed India: Amit Shah



Lucknow, Jan 24: Describing Uttar Pradesh as the "soul" of the country, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday said the state is poised to emerge as the engine of a developed India by 2047, when the nation will celebrate 100 years of its Independence.

Over 70 fugitives wanted by India located abroad during 2024-25: Govt report

New Delhi, Jan 24: Over 70 fugitives, wanted by India, were located abroad during 2024-25, according to an official report.

As many as 203 fugitives wanted by other countries were detected/located in India during the same period.

A total of 71 "wanted persons/fugitives wanted by India" were located abroad in 2024-25, according to the annual report of the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions.

The number of such wanted fugitives located abroad is the highest in the over a decade time, officials claimed.

A total of 27 fugitives/wanted persons returned to India, from abroad in the last financial year, said the ministry's annual report for 2024-25.

It also gave details on the working of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), which acts as the National Central Bureau (NCB) -- the nodal point for Interpol in India.

During the period of April, 2024 to March, 2025, 74 Letters Rogatory (LRs) were served abroad, out of which 54 pertained to CBI cases and 20 of them to state law



enforcement and other central agencies, the report said.

Letters Rogatory is a judicial request to authorities abroad to seek cooperation in a probe being conducted by Indian investigating agencies.

It was confirmed by Indian law enforcement agencies including CBI that 47 LR were fully executed during the said period and 29 were disposed of as closed/withdrawn on partial execution.

As on March 31, 2025, a total 533 LR were pending with other countries, out of which 276 pertained to CBI cases and 257 to state police and other central law enforcement agencies.

As many as 32 LR/treaty based requests were received from various countries requesting to provide assistance in the investigation of criminal matters.

During the year, different Interpol notices were issued by NCB-India for fugitives wanted either for prosecution or to serve a sentence in the country.

These included 126 red notices (request to law enforcement agencies worldwide to locate and provisionally arrest a person pending extradition, surrender, or similar legal action, 89 blue notices (seeking information about a person's identity, location, or activities), 24 yellow notices (global police alert for a missing person), seven black notices (requests about unidentified bodies) and one green notice (a warning issued by Interpol to alert member countries about people who are considered a potential threat to public safety), the report said.

Never violated party line, unapologetic over Op Sindoos stance: Tharoor

Kozhikode (Kerala), Jan 24: Congress MP Shashi Tharoor on Saturday said he has never violated the party's stated positions in Parliament, asserting that his only public disagreement in principle was over Operation Sindoos. Answering questions during a session at the Kerala Literature Festival here, Tharoor said he had taken a strong stand on that issue and remained "unapologetic".

His statement comes amidst recent reports stating "Tharoor's differences with the party leadership", with a speculation that he is upset over Congress leader Rahul Gandhi not adequately acknowledging his presence at a recent event in Kochi and over alleged repeated attempts by state leaders to sideline him.

Explaining his position, Tharoor said that, as an observer and writer, he had written a newspaper column after the Pahalgam incident, stating that it should not go unpunished and that there should be a kinetic response.

He said that while India is focused on development, it should not be dragged into a prolonged conflict with Pakistan, and that any action should be limited to targeting terrorist camps.

Tharoor said that to his surprise, the Indian government did exactly what he had recommended.

Tharoor said it was Jawaharlal Nehru who posed the famous question: "Who lives if India dies?" "When India is at stake, when India's security and its place in the world are involved, India comes first," he said.

He added that political parties may have differences as part of the process of building a better India, but when national interests are involved, India must prevail.

Iran's Revolutionary Guard commander warns US, says his force has its 'finger on trigger'

Dubai, Jan 24: Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard, a force which was key in putting down recent nationwide protests in a crackdown that left thousands dead, is "more ready than ever, finger on the trigger," its commander said Saturday, as US warships headed toward the Middle East.

Nournews, a news outlet close to Iran's Supreme National Security Council, reported on its Telegram channel that the commander, Gen. Mohammad Pakpour, warned the United States and Israel "to avoid any miscalculation."

"The Islamic Revolutionary Guards and dear Iran stand more ready than ever, finger on the trigger, to execute the orders and directives of the Commander-in-Chief," Nournews quoted Pakpour as saying.

Tension remains high between Iran and the US in the wake of a bloody crackdown on protests that began on December 28, triggered by the collapse of Iran's currency, the rial, and swept the country for about two weeks.

Trump's warnings
US President Donald Trump has repeatedly warned Tehran, setting two red lines for the use of military

force: the killing of peaceful demonstrators and the mass execution of people arrested in the protests. Trump has repeatedly said Iran halted the execution of 800 people detained in the protests. He has not elaborated on the source of the claim, which Iran's top prosecutor, Mohammad Movahedi, strongly denied on Friday in comments carried by the judiciary's Mizan news agency.

On Thursday, Trump said aboard Air Force One that the US was moving warships toward Iran "just in case" he wants to take action.

"We have a massive fleet heading in that direction, and

would make earlier US strikes against Iranian uranium enrichment sites "look like peanuts."

"They should have made a deal before we hit them," Trump said.

Airline jitters
The tension has led at least one European airline to cancel some flights to the wider region, with Air France saying it had decided to temporarily suspend its service to Dubai in the United Arab Emirates.

The airline cancelled two return flights from Paris to Dubai over the weekend, saying, without elaborating, that it was due to the current situation in the Middle East. It said it would resume its service to Dubai later on Saturday.

"The airline is closely following developments in the Middle East in real time and continuously monitors the geopolitical situation in the territories served and overflowed by its aircraft in order to ensure the highest level of flight safety and security," the company said.

Arrival information at Dubai's international airport also showed the cancellation of Saturday flights from Amsterdam by Dutch carriers KLM and Transavia, and a flight from Luxembourg by Luxair. The airlines did not immediately respond to requests for comment. Some flights from KLM were


also cancelled on Friday and Saturday to Tel Aviv, Israel, according to online flight trackers.

Rising death toll
Although there have been no further demonstrations in Iran for days, the death toll reported by activists has continued to rise as information trickles out despite the most comprehensive internet blackout in Iran's history, which has now lasted more than two weeks.

The US-based Human Rights Activists News Agency on Saturday put the death toll at 5,137, with the number expected to increase. More than 27,700 people have been arrested, it said.

The group's figures have been accurate in previous unrest and rely on a network of activists in Iran to verify deaths. That death toll exceeds that of any other round of protest or unrest there in decades, and recalls the chaos surrounding Iran's 1979 Islamic Revolution.

Iran's government offered its first death toll on Wednesday, saying 3,117 people were killed. It said 2,427 were civilians and security forces, and labelled the rest as "terrorists." In the past, Iran's theocracy has undercounted or not reported fatalities from unrest.
