Says Civic Action Programme acts as effective bridge between police & public


'Let us pledge to protect youth from terrorism, drugs'


## Every J&K household will be electrified, says CM Omar

'Will take time, but we're committed'

Jammu, Feb 09: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday said that with rising population, expansion of villages and new habitations coming up, it will take time, but the Government is committed to reaching every household and providing electricity.

"The population is increasing, villages are spreading, and new houses are being built. Electrifying them is not a matter of one day. It takes time for DPRs to be prepared. There is no village which is completely un-electrified. However, in some villages, certain habitations or parts remain without electricity and they need to be electrified," the Chief Minister told the Legislative Assembly.



The Chief Minister, who also holds the Power portfolio, was replying to a question raised by MLA Billawar Satish Kumar Sharma regarding un-electrified habitations in his constituency. He said that electrification

is being carried out through centrally sponsored schemes as well as under the UT CAPEX programme. "This is an ongoing process. The DPRs for the areas named by the honourable MLA are also being prepared. Every effort will be made to ensure that there is no house without an electricity connection, but this process will continue," he added.

The Chief Minister further informed that some rural and remote habitations/morhas — not entire villages — such as Thingnen, Kanodi and Hanok of Panchayat Madoon/Dehota in Billawar area remain un-electrified or partially electrified.

"Expansion of habitations in remote areas is a continuous process, which requires extension of | More on P6

## Power generation capacity of J&K to rise by 47% in upcoming fiscal

Srinagar, Feb 09: In the upcoming fiscal, Jammu and Kashmir is all set to have nearly 47 percent of extra hydro power generation capacity.

According to the official figures available with the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Jammu and Kashmir will have an additional 1685.7 Megawatts (MWs) of power generation capacity in addition to the existing 3540.15 MWs.

It also said that by the financial year 2030-31, Jammu and Kashmir will have 7314.85 MWs of power generation capacity.

The figures revealed by the government in the Legislative Assembly states that "The UT of J&K has 32 existing power projects with aggregate capacity of 3540.15 MW. This includes projects of aggregate capacity 1197 MW in the UT sector, 6 projects of aggregate capacity 2250 MW in the Central sector and 12 Projects of aggregate capacity 92.75 MW in the IPP (private) sector."

"A capacity addition of 3704.5 MW is expected through eight proposed and six under construction Hydroelectric Power Projects (HEPs) in the UT of J&K in the next 5 years Viz 2026-27 to 2030-31," the government said.

Stating the breakup wise details, the government further informed that in the financial year 2026-27 four HEPs will be commissioned including the 1000 MWs Pakaldul, 624s MW Kiru and 12 MW Karnah as well as 49.70 MWs (IPP JAKEDA).

It also said that in the 2027-28 financial year, 540 MWs Kwar and 37.5MWs Parnai projects will be commissioned.

## Noisy scenes in Assembly over SASCI schemes

PDP's Para says govt walking into 'debt trap', BJP stages walkout

Jammu, Feb 09: The Legislative Assembly on Monday witnessed noisy scenes over a Government of India (GoI) scheme for infrastructure development through interest-free loans, after Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) MLA Waheed-ur-Rehman Para alleged that the Union Territory was walking into a debt trap by implementing the scheme.

Participating in the budget discussion, as per news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Para, who represents the Pulwama assembly segment, accused the government of pushing Jammu & Kashmir into a debt trap through the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI).

"This is the most dangerous scheme you are implementing after the abrogation of Article 370. You have been given the mandate to preserve Jammu & Kashmir and to reclaim it, but instead you are putting the entire region on sale," Para claimed.

He further argued that SASCI is not a grant. "Who will repay the loan after 50 years? We are mortgaging Jammu & Kashmir. SASCI means the destruction of Jammu & Kashmir. We are selling Jammu & Kashmir for petty loans," he alleged, demanding a discussion on the scheme in the House. ## Light rain, snow likely in J&K on Feb 10

Srinagar, Feb 09: A weak western disturbance is likely to affect Jammu and Kashmir on February 10, bringing light rain and snowfall at many places across the Union Territory, weather officials said on Monday.

As per the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), there is no forecast of any major rain or snow activity over Jammu and Kashmir till February 20. However, light snowfall is likely at a few higher reaches during the night of February 9, followed by light rain or snow at most

places on February 10.

From February 11 to February 20, weather conditions are expected to remain generally dry, the IMD said, with only brief spells of light snowfall at isolated higher reaches around February 14 and February 17.

Independent weather forecasters said the western disturbance expected on February 10 is weak in nature and may cause only light precipitation, with moderate rain or snow at a few locations.

Another weak western disturbance is currently expected to approach the region around February 17, though its impact is also likely to remain limited. | More on P6

Jammu, Feb 09: The discussion on Budget 2026-27 resumed in Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly on Monday with Legislators holding detailed deliberations on the government's financial proposals and policy priorities.

Initiating the debate, Legislator Dr Sajjad Shafi Uri described the Budget as the best possible within the resources available to the government. He said that Budget reflects a balanced approach, addressing the key social welfare concerns while ensuring fiscal prudence. He highlighted fee waivers



for the students from economically weaker families, free transport facilities for persons with disabilities among other things, in the budget.

Legislator Altaf Ahmad Wani said that no decision should be taken without the consent of the concerned MLA. He stressed the need for upgradation of

the health sector in Anantnag district and raised concerns over the closure of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Institute of Medical Excellence in Katra.

Legislator Balwant Singh Mankotia urged the government to fulfil promises made to the people of Jammu and Kashmir. He highlighted the need to address the issue of daily wagers.

In his address, MLA Mohammad Yousuf Rather (Tarigami) said that industrial development should be a priority for the government to create employment opportunities for the youth. He stressed that locals must be preferred for employment | More on P6

## Financial inclusion key to inclusive growth: Chief Secretary Inaugurates Financial Literacy Week 2026 for J&K and Ladakh

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo on Monday inaugurated the Financial Literacy Week (FLW) 2026 for the Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh. The week-long programme is being organised by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) from February 09 to February 13, 2026, with a focus on strengthening financial awareness and safe banking practices among citizens.

The event, as per an official statement, was also attended by Rachna Sharma, Secretary, Rural Development and Panchayati Raj Department; Vidhu Shekhar, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Jammu; Deepak Dubey, Joint Director Information, Jammu; Shri Vikas Mittal, GM/O-I-C, NABARD, Jammu; Sunit Kumar, CGM, J&K Bank; controlling heads of banks; and officers and representatives from Government departments, RBI, banks, financial institutions and UTLBC J&K and Ladakh.

Addressing bankers and stakeholders on the occasion, the Chief Secretary observed that financial inclusion reflects the Gandhian principle of "Sarvodaya through Antyodaya", both as a policy objective and as a shared responsibility of all institutions. He underlined that the importance of financial inclusion is evident from the fact that nearly seven of the seventeen Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are directly linked to financial access and empowerment of the masses.

Highlighting recent achievements, the Chief Secretary stated that during the three-month financial inclusion campaign conducted from July to October 2025, the Government, in collaboration with banking institutions, worked extensively at the Panchayat level to saturate benefits under various Government of India schemes including Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana

(PMJJBY), Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY), Atal Pension Yojana (APY) and Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY). These efforts resulted in KYC updation of nearly 5.9 lakh accounts, covering about 51 percent of the targeted accounts. He further noted that institutions such as RBI, NABARD, SEBI, PFRDA and banks are collectively working towards creating financial awareness among citizens. He added that financial integration through governance is also gaining momentum with the introduction of financial literacy lessons in JKBOSE curriculum, alongside livelihood training and skill development programmes.

Speaking about this year's theme, "KYC - Your First Step to Safe Banking", the Chief Secretary emphasised the need for adopt- KYC Centralised KYC mechanism, which, like UPI, can simplify financial transactions and credit access while ensuring account hygiene and strengthening defence against financial fraud and cyber threats. He reiterated that the vision of Viksit Bharat and sustainable development is closely linked to comprehensive financial inclusion.

Stressing the importance of grassroots outreach, he called for greater use of Common Service Centres (CSCs) as effective last-mile delivery platforms. He also emphasised leveraging the network of Self Help Groups (SHGs), which have nearly 8 lakh members across J&K, to enhance financial awareness at the community level. Additionally, he suggested using ATM kiosks, social media platforms and railways as tools for mass financial awareness, stating that financial literacy directly translates into financial empowerment.

This year's theme, "KYC - / KYC - Your First Step to Safe Banking", focuses on sub-themes including Basics of Know Your Customer (KYC), Central KYC Registry (CKYC), and Account

Hygiene and Financial Discipline. The theme aims to highlight the importance of KYC as the foundation of safe and secure banking. In his opening remarks, Chandrashekhar Azad, Regional Director, RBI Jammu, highlighted that last year a nationwide campaign was undertaken at the Gram Panchayat level to saturate Financial Inclusion schemes, including re-KYC of bank accounts. RBI Jammu, along with banks and stakeholders in J&K and Ladakh, actively supported the campaign to ensure re-KYC enrollment for eligible account holders.

Building on the awareness created through the campaign, FLW 2026 focuses on educating the public on all aspects of KYC compliance. The campaign emphasises that while KYC is a regulatory requirement, it is simple to complete through multiple safe and convenient modes. It also aims to familiarise citizens with facilities like Central KYC (CKYC), which simplifies the KYC process.

Further, the campaign encourages citizens to remain alert against fraudulent calls, messages and links related to KYC updation, which can result in financial loss. It also sensitises the public about the serious consequences of becoming money mules due to inducements.

During the week, RBI, in collaboration with banks and stakeholders, will conduct awareness programmes and outreach activities across the country, including the Uts of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh. These initiatives will continue throughout the year to ensure sustained impact.

Through these collective efforts, RBI aims to reinforce the message that KYC is not merely a regulatory requirement, but a vital step towards building a secure, transparent and trustworthy financial ecosystem for all.

## '48% of J&K under forest land'

Srinagar, Feb 09: Forests cover nearly 48 per cent of the total geographical area of Jammu and Kashmir, with districts like Kupwara, Baramulla and Doda accounting for the largest share of forest land, according to official data released by the Forest, Environment and Ecology Department.

As per the district-wise forest cover figures for 2024-25, Jammu and Kashmir has a total geographical area of 42,241 square kilometres, out of which 20,194 square kilometres are under forest cover, translating to 47.81 per cent of the total area.

Doda district accounts for the highest forest area in absolute terms, with 5,555 square kilometres under forests. This constitutes 27.51 per cent of the total forest area of the Union Territory, while forests cover 47.52 per cent of Doda's geographical area. Baramulla



follows with 2,690 square kilometres of forest land, making up 13.32 per cent of the total forest area and 58.63 per cent of the district's geographical area. Udhampur has 2,343 square kilometres of forests, accounting for 11.60 per cent of the total forest area and 51.49 per cent of its geographical area.

Kupwara district has one of the highest forest densities, with forests covering 71.58 per cent of its geographical area. The district has 1,703 square kilometres of forest land, contributing 8.43 per cent to the overall forest area of Jammu and Kashmir.

In south Kashmir, Anantnag has 2,068 square kilometres under forests, which is 10.24 per cent of the total forest area and 51.91 per cent of the district's geographical area. Pulwama, with a smaller geographical area, has 810 square kilometres of forests, covering 57.94 per cent

of the district.

In the Jammu region, Rajouri has 1,267 square kilometres of forest area, accounting for 48.17 per cent of its geographical area, while Poonch has 951 square kilometres, covering 56.81 per cent. Kathua and Jammu districts have forest cover of 991 square kilometres and 959 square kilometres, respectively, with forests covering 37.38 per cent of Kathua's area and 30.97 per cent of Jammu district.

Srinagar district has the lowest forest cover, with 380 square kilometres under forests, which is 1.88 per cent of the total forest area and 17.06 per cent of its geographical area. Budgam has 477 square kilometres of forest land, covering 34.79 per cent of the district.

The data pertains to areas on this side of the Line of Control and excludes regions under illegal occupation of China and Pakistan, the department said—(KNO)

## MLA Para questions poor utilisation of budget funds

Srinagar, Feb 09: Peoples Democratic Party MLA Waheed-ur-Rehman Para on Monday questioned the government's ability to translate massive allocations into real development on the ground.

Para acknowledged that Jammu & Kashmir is passing through unprecedented times and that the National Conference-led government is facing immense challenges.

Questioning poor utilisation of funds, Para pointed out that last year's budget stood at nearly Rs 1.40 lakh crore, yet only about 12 per cent had reportedly been spent. "If almost 90 per cent of the previous year's budget remains unutilised, will the government spend it in one month now?" he questioned.

He further revealed that more than 100 projects across crucial departments such as agriculture, horticulture, health and education recorded zero expenditure over the year. "Funds are being allocated, but nothing is happening on the ground. Either there are serious institutional failures or the government lacks capacity. If

utilisation is not ensured, allocations become meaningless," Para said.

Para said that drug abuse is rapidly increasing across Jammu and Kashmir but is not being treated with the seriousness it deserves. "This is destroying our youth, our families and our future, yet there is no focused strategy or urgency from the government," he said.

Para also described cancer as a "silent pandemic" in the region, claiming that more people are now dying due to cancer than violence. "Despite alarming numbers, there is hardly any focused intervention. The government must appeal to the Prime Minister for a dedicated cancer hospital in Jammu and Kashmir so families are not forced to sell assets and travel outside the region for treatment," he said.

Para said that nearly 75 B.Ed colleges had gone defunct in the last one year. "These institutions functioned even during the peak of militancy, yet today they are being shut down. The government should have taken this up with the HRD Ministry to save these colleges and students' futures," he said—(KNO)

## J&K job seekers paid Rs 48 Cr in application fees

Srinagar, Feb 09: The Jammu and Kashmir government on Monday said it has collected over Rs 48 crore in application fees from unemployed youth over the past two years through the Jammu & Kashmir Public Service Commission (JKPSC) and the Jammu & Kashmir Services Selection Board (JKSSB).

Responding to a question raised by MLA Pulwama, Waheed ur Rehman Para, the government said that Rs 14.48 crore was collected in 2023-24 - including Rs 7.39 crore by JKPSC and Rs 7.09 crore by JKSSB. In 2024-25, JKPSC collected over Rs 10 crore, while JKSSB generated more than Rs 23 crore as application fee from job aspirants. The total amount collected over the two years stands at Rs 48.88 crore, the government said.

It further informed the House that around 10,400 posts have been advertised by JKSSB in the last two years, while JKPSC has advertised around 1,750 posts during the same period.

Speaking in assembly Para said that 70 per cent of the population of Jammu and Kashmir yet there is nothing for them in the budget.

He said that if you aren't providing them jobs at least don't charge them in huge amounts as there are candidates who are unable to submit forms.

"This is despite the Government's explicit promise that all application forms would be made free. Charging exorbitant fees from jobless youth not only contradicts the stated policy of the Government but also amounts to blatant exploitation of unemployed aspirants, who are already under severe economic distress," he said.

Para said that due to unemployment issues, youth are suffering from anxiety, depression and other mental health issues as it can be checked from hospitals—(KNO)

## 'One-third of Dal-Nigeen Lake restored in 5 years'

Srinagar, Feb 09: Nearly one-third of the Dal-Nigeen Lake stands rejuvenated over the past five years following sustained mission-mode conservation efforts, leading to the clearance of 6.5 square kilometres of aquatic vegetation and an increase in the open water area of Dal Lake to over 20.3 square kilometres for the first time, officials said on Monday.

They said that The conservation work covered the Dal-Nigeen Lake and its 337.17 square kilometre catchment area and was carried out by the Jammu and Kashmir Lake Conservation and Management Authority (LCMA), they said.

According to officials, the LCMA undertook dredging operations and restored around 20 navigation channels spanning nearly 10 kilometres



to improve water circulation. Several blocked water channels were reopened, intake channels and nallahs were developed, and protective and retaining structures were constructed to stabilise vulnerable areas of the lake.

To improve water quality and ecological health, the authority installed aerators, fountains and jetties at multiple locations and carried out large-scale plantation drives across the catchment to check soil erosion, they said.

Officials said houseboats on the lake are being progressively connected to sewage treatment plants to prevent untreated discharge into the water body. A new 30 million litres per day sewage treatment plant at Gupt Ganga, Nishat is under construction at a cost of 306 crore, while existing STPs are being upgraded under the AMRUT 2.0 programme.

Daily lake-cleaning operations are also being carried out with the involvement of 300 to

400 personnel through an outsourcing agency. The exercise is providing livelihood support to Dal Lake dwellers while ensuring regular removal of waste from the lake, officials said.

The government is also in the process of launching an Integrated Management of Dal and Nigeen Lake Ecosystem project under the Prime Minister's Development Programme (PMDP) at a cost of 212.38 crore to ensure long-term conservation and promote tourism, they said.

In addition, the LCMA has undertaken public outreach and community engagement initiatives, including lake cleaning, de-silting and plantation drives under Sewa Parv 2025, along with awareness programmes aimed at promoting community participation in lake conservation, officials added—(KNO)

## J&K exported 637,000 tonnes of fruit in 2024-25

Srinagar, Feb 09: Jammu and Kashmir exported more than 637,000 metric tonnes of fruit outside the Union Territory during 2024-25, generating a turnover of over rupees 3,171 crore, according to data released by the Agriculture Production Department (Horticulture).

Mandi-wise figures show that Sopore fruit mandi in Baramulla district accounted for the highest volume of fruit exports. Sopore alone exported 289.22 thousand metric tonnes of fruit during the year, generating a turnover of rupees 1,387.50 crore. Kanispora mandi in the same district exported 10.39 thousand metric tonnes, with a turnover of 47.94 crore.

Shopian's Aglar fruit mandi emerged as the second-largest contributor, exporting 121.19 thousand metric tonnes of fruit and generating 628.34 crore in turnover.

In south Kashmir, Jablipoora fruit mandi in Anantnag exported 64.86 thousand metric tonnes of fruit, with a turnover of 282.90 crore. Pulwama district exported fruit through two mandis — Prichoo and Pachhar. Prichoo mandi handled exports of 22.44 thousand metric

tonnes with a turnover of 116.99 crore, while Pachhar mandi exported 13.56 thousand metric tonnes, generating 70.56 crore.

Parimpora fruit mandi in Srinagar exported 32.29 thousand metric tonnes of fruit during the year, with a turnover of 165.06 crore. In Kulgam, the Kulgam fruit mandi exported 16.81 thousand metric tonnes, earning 67.62 crore.

In north Kashmir, Handwara mandi in Kupwara exported 36.16 thousand metric tonnes of fruit with a turnover of 113 crore, while the Kupwara mandi handled exports of 2.63 thousand metric tonnes, generating 132.38 crore. Zozna mandi in Ganderbal exported 4.67 thousand metric tonnes of fruit, earning 19.97 crore.

Budgam's Zaloosa mandi at Charar-e-Sharief exported 5.65 thousand metric tonnes of fruit, generating a turnover of 26.12 crore.

In the Jammu region, Narwal fruit mandi exported 17.70 thousand metric tonnes of fruit during 2024-25, with a turnover of 113.18 crore. Overall, fruit exports from Jammu and Kashmir during 2024-25 stood at 637.57 thousand metric tonnes, with a cumulative turnover of 3,171.56 crore, the data shows—(KNO)


### Upgradation of existing healthcare infrastructure Govt's priority: Health Minister

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: Minister for Health and Medical Education, Sakeena Itoo, Monday informed the Legislative Assembly that upgradation of the existing healthcare infrastructure is top priority of the government, with special focus on rural and peripheral areas.

The Minister stated this while replying to a question raised by Legislator Mir Mohammad Fayaz regarding SDH Kupwara in the House Monday.

The Health Minister, as per an official statement, informed that as per Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) norms, each district across the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir is mandated to have one District Hospital. In case of Kupwara, the District Hospital has already been upgraded to the level of an Associated Hospital of Government Medical College (GMC) Handwara, thereby catering tertiary healthcare services



to the population of the region. She added that upgradation of a District Hospital to the level of a Super-Speciality Hospital does not fall within the ambit of IPHS norms.

The Minister also informed that a 50-bedded Critical Care Block (CCB) is presently under construction at Sub-District Hospital Kupwara at an estimated cost of Rs. 23.75 crore under ECRP-II. Besides, a

District Integrated Public Health Laboratory (DIPHL) and Block Public Health Units (BPHUs) are being established at various health facilities in the district under the PM-Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM), she added.

The Minister further said that Sub-District Hospitals (SDHs) have been strengthened in terms of human resources, machinery and equipment

thereby enabling them to provide services at par with District Hospitals across the UT. She added that to address critical gaps, the department is committed towards strengthening the existing healthcare facilities strictly in line with the IPHS 2022 norms like extending support to the general public through rationalization of services and development of robust e-Sanjeevani/tele-medicine facilities under a well-designed hub-and-spoke model. Mobile Medical Units are also being conceptualized to ensure healthcare delivery in hard-to-reach and geographically challenging areas, she said.

The Health Minister added that to augment medical and para-medical staff that commensurate with the patient inflow, the department is undertaking rationalization of existing resources. She said that a comprehensive plan is being implemented to optimally redistribute available staff across health facilities in the district, with particular focus

on Sub-District Hospital (SDH) Kupwara.

She said that rationalization and periodic transfer of long posted staff is being undertaken to systematically bridge the gap between patient inflow and staff strength, ensuring equitable and efficient healthcare delivery across the district.

The Health Minister apprised the House that the several measures have been undertaken to improve the service delivery and quality of care at Sub-District Hospital (SDH) Kupwara. These included enforcement of duty rosters, attendance and service norms across all staff categories, regular supervisory visits and monitoring by district and divisional health authorities, strengthening of emergency services, diagnostics, pharmacy and referral systems, implementation of National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS) for systematic enhancement of patient care and others.

Legislator Mir Saifullah raised the supplementary.

### Govt considering de-freezing of teacher posts to address staff shortage: Education Minister

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: Education Minister Sakeena Itoo informed the Legislative Assembly that the de-freezing of Teacher posts is under active consideration of the government to overcome shortage of teachers in schools across Jammu and Kashmir.

The Minister, as per an official statement, said this while replying to a question of Legislator Pawan Kumar Gupta, regarding shortage of teaching staff, in the House Monday.

The Education Minister said that recruitment of teacher posts were frozen by State Administrative Council decision taken in year 2018 and the government is actively working to de-freeze these posts so that fresh recruitment is expedited in the department.

She informed the House that 594 posts of Lecturers in 27 disciplines have been referred to JKPCS, besides 727 non-teaching and 43 posts of MTS have been referred to Finance Department for revival/concurrence.

Regarding filling up of vacant posts of Teachers, she apprised that all these posts have been frozen for transition of RRETS, Teacher Grade II/III to clear the salary issue of Teachers who were engaged under SSA.

The Education Minister also said that in 2025-2026, a total of 258 Senior Lecturers have been elevated as in-charge Principals besides 56 PG Masters/Teachers have been elevated

as in-charge Lecturers. She added that 551 PG Masters/Teachers were placed as in-charge Headmasters and a proposal for placement of more than 500 additional Masters as Headmasters is currently under process in the department.

The Minister said that 80 Headmasters were elevated as in-charge Zonal Education Officers. In non-gazetted cadre, she said that 1170 Teachers have been elevated as Masters in 2025-26.

Regarding Udhampur district, the Education Minister said that 42 positions of Principals out of 43, 8 posts of ZEOs out of 11 and 243 posts of lecturers out of 538 have been filled in the district. She added that engagement of CRCs as well as rationalisation of staff is under process to overcome shortage of staff in schools across J&K.

The Minister further said that the Pupil Teacher Ratio in respect of Schools of Udhampur West constituency is 1:16, which shows sufficient staff is available as per enrolment. She added that for academic quality enhancement subject specific teachers, CRCs, online classes are being arranged.

The Minister attributed the improved performance of Jammu Division in the 10th and 12th board exams to the government's initiatives, saying these efforts have led to a notable academic upswing, with results surpassing those of previous years.

Legislator Ranbir Singh Pathania raised supplementary question.

### Cluster Universities of Jammu, Srinagar allotted land for establishment: Education Minister

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: Minister for Education Sakeena Itoo apprised the House that both the Cluster Universities of Srinagar and Jammu have been allotted land for construction of their establishments in Jammu and Kashmir.

The Minister, as per an official statement, said this while replying to a question raised by Legislator Tanvir Sadiq in the Legislative Assembly.

The Minister said that the Cluster University of Srinagar

and Jammu were established under the "Srinagar and Jammu Cluster Universities Act, 2016" under Rashtriya Uchcharat Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) Scheme by clustering the human and infrastructural resources of five existing City Colleges for each university at Srinagar and Jammu in accordance with the guidelines of RUSA 1.0.

She said that historic and high-performing colleges such as SP College, Women's College, M.A. Road; Amar Singh College, MAM College, GGM Science College and SPMR College of Commerce were placed under Cluster Universities.

The Minister said that both the universities have developed their independent PG schools with their own faculty. She said that at present, there is no proposal under consideration of the government to affiliate, merge or transfer administrative and asset control of aforesaid colleges of Srinagar and Jammu to Cluster Universities.

The Minister also said that at present, the administrative control of Teaching and Non-teaching Staff of the constituent colleges is with the Higher Education Department.

Legislator Saif-ud-din Bhat raised supplementary question.

### Augmentation of Batote town water supply scheme under AMRUT 2.0 underway: Govt

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: The augmentation of Water Supply Scheme (WSS) Batote Town under AMRUT 2.0 is currently underway in Ramban Constituency.

This was stated by Minister for Health and Medical Education, Sakeena Itoo in the Legislative Assembly Monday while replying to a question raised by Legislator Arjun Singh Raju on behalf of Chief Minister Omar Abdullah.

She informed that the augmentation work is being executed at an allotted cost of Rs. 2.387 crore and an expenditure of Rs. 1.85 crore has been incurred till date.

Giving details of physical status of scheme till date, the Minister, as per an official statement, informed that Distribution System has been laid besides Installation of Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTCs) is in progress. Legislator Sajjad Shaheen raised supplementary question.

### Achabal area adequately served by existing water supply schemes: Javed Rana

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: The government Monday clarified that there is no proposal for establishment of a new PHE Division at Achabal as the area is effectively being catered by the PHE Sub-Division Anantnag and PHE Sub-Division Kokernag.

Replying to a question raised by Legislator Abdul Majeed bhat in the House, Minister for Jal Shakti, Javed Ahmed Rana as per an official statement, informed that Achabal area falls under the jurisdiction of Jal Shakti (PHE) Division Bijbehara. He said that Achabal area is being effectively catered by the PHE Sub-Division Anantnag and PHE Sub-Division Kokernag, which together manage 157 Water Supply Schemes (WSSs) covering 31,448 households.

Javed Rana said that since

a large number of operational WSSs are functioning efficiently with a balanced workload, there is presently no functional or administrative justification for creation of a separate PHE Division at Achabal.

The Minister informed that out of the total, 70 Water Supply Schemes feeding the area have been taken up under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), UT Capex and NABARD at an estimated cost of Rs. 17,182.02 lakh. Of which, 52 schemes have already been operational. He said that the remaining are at various stages of execution.

He further informed that the division has a substantial number of operational schemes and the existing Sub-Division-wise workload remains within manageable limits.

Legislators Altaf Ahmad wani and Hasnain Masoodi raised supplementary questions.

### Govt adopts 2-pronged strategy to enhance flood resilience in Anantnag: Javed Rana

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: The government has adopted a two-pronged strategy, involving short-term and long-term measures, to mitigate the flood risks in Anantnag district and enhance overall flood resilience.

This was informed by Minister for Jal Shakti, Javed Ahmed Rana, in response to a question raised by Legislator Nizam-ud-din Bhat on behalf of Legislator Peerzada Mohammad Syed.

Javed Rana, as per an official statement, said that the recent interventions have significantly strengthened the flood management infrastructure and improved the district's flood resilience. He informed the House that Anantnag district has 195 flood-prone villages and continuous efforts are underway to safeguard life, property and agricultural assets through



sustained preventive and protective measures.

Providing details, the Minister said that permanent flood protection works have been undertaken under PMDP Phase-II for strengthening of flood management infrastructure in vulnerable areas of Anantnag district.

He informed that bank protection works have been executed at critical locations

at a cost of Rs 10.07 crore, covering a length of 873 metres. He added that embankments in flood-prone stretches have been raised at a cost of Rs 18.97 crore, covering a length of 9,168 metre.

Javed Rana said that short-term measures are being focused on immediate preparedness and mitigation in vulnerable areas. He said that these measures include restoration of weak spots identified during safety audits of river embankments through temporary protection works, such as laying filled EC bags on bunds.

He further informed that with the onset of the flood season, advance preparedness is being ensured by pre-positioning EC bags at vulnerable locations and keeping men and machinery in a state of readiness.

Regarding the irrigation projects in Anantnag district, the Minister stated that the

district has a total of 64 irrigation schemes, comprising 47 gravity schemes, 15 Lift Irrigation Schemes (LIS) and 2 Tube Well Irrigation Schemes (TWIS). He informed that these schemes cover a Cultivable Command Area (CCA) of 22,742 hectare, against which an irrigation potential of 18,667 hectare has been created with 18,481 hectare presently under utilization.

He further informed that 19 irrigation schemes were earlier taken up under the AIBP-PMKSY, of which, seven have been completed while the remaining are at various stages of completion.

Furthermore, seven irrigation schemes have been undertaken under UT Capex, of which, two stand completed while the remaining are currently in progress, he added.

Legislator Altaf Ahmad wani raised supplementary questions.

### Technical reappraisal of Chakoora lift irrigation scheme underway: Govt

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 09: The government informed the House that a technical reappraisal for the balance components of Lift Irrigation Scheme Chakoora Pulwama is underway and necessary action will be initiated based on its outcome.

Minister for Jal Shakti, Javed Ahmed Rana, stated that necessary action will be initiated based on the outcome, in response to a question raised by Legislator Ghulam Mohi-ud-din Mir.

The Minister, as per an official statement, informed the House that the scheme being funded under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) 1.0, a technical reappraisal is currently underway to assess the revised Benefit Cost Ratio (BCR), the cost involved and the actual command area to be covered under the project.

He added that the scheme is incomplete due to meager funding under Irrigation sector particularly from Central Assistance.

### CSIR-IIIM Srinagar organises 3-day hands-on training on qRT-PCR

Srinagar, February 9: The CSIR-Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine (CSIR-IIIM), Srinagar Branch, has commenced a three-day hands-on training programme on quantitative real-time PCR (qRT-PCR), aimed at enhancing practical competencies in advanced molecular biology techniques among students, research scholars and laboratory professionals. The programme is designed to provide participants with comprehensive, bench-level proficiency in gene expression analysis, covering the entire workflow from sample preparation to data interpretation.

In his virtual address, Dr. Zabeer Ahmed, Director, CSIR-IIIM, as per a PIB statement, highlighted the critical importance of qRT-PCR in contemporary molecular biology.

He emphasised its indispensable role in precise transcript quantification, validation of high-throughput genomic data, and its applications in translational research and molecular diagnostics.

The intensive curriculum spans the complete experimental pipeline, beginning with high-quality RNA isolation and contamination control, followed by optimised reverse transcription strategies, primer design considerations, and selection of appropriate chemistries including SYBR Green and probe-based assays. Participants receive structured training in instrument setup, run execution, and robust data analysis methodologies. The programme places strong emphasis on practical skill development through extended wet lab sessions on RNA isolation, cDNA synthesis, and qRT-PCR,

complemented by troubleshooting modules addressing common challenges such as low yields, non-specific amplification, efficiency variations, and inter-run inconsistencies. Good laboratory practices and quality control measures form an integral part of the training.

The programme is being organised at CSIR-IIIM Srinagar Branch by Dr. Nasheeman Ashraf, Senior Principal Scientist, and co-organised by Dr. Syed Reyazul Hassan, Senior Principal Scientist, and Dr. Phalesteen Sultan, Principal Technical Officer, under the patronage of Er. Abdul Rahim, Chief Scientist and Head, IIIM Srinagar Branch. Conducted under the CSIR-Integrated Skill Initiatives, the training is scheduled from February 9 to 11, 2026, and has attracted around 20 participants from various parts of the country.

Director, CSIR-Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine (IIIM), Jammu, Dr Zabeer Ahmed, was present in the meeting among other senior officials. The main objective of the meeting was to discuss the future roadmap for operationalisation of Industrial Biotech Parks.

Parks, infrastructure and ongoing activities. He highlighted that IBTP houses specialised facilities including fermentation units, phytopharma extraction systems, plant tissue culture laboratories, quality testing and analytical labs besides pilot-scale processing units. These facilities are enabling startups and researchers to carry out product development, validation and scale-up under scientific guidance.

He noted that the IIIM-Technology Business Incubator (BioNEST) at the park is actively mentoring startups and providing them with laboratory access, workspace and technical handholding. Several startups, including women-led enterprises and agri-biotech ventures, are currently registered and

utilising the facilities for developing biotech-based products.

Commissioner Secretary stressed the importance of building strong public-private partnerships to ensure higher investment and better market linkages. He called for a structured operational framework with defined timelines, monitoring mechanisms and convergence with government schemes to maximise the park's impact. He also emphasised outreach to youth, farmers and entrepreneurs from across districts so that the benefits of biotechnology reach grassroots levels. Skill development and entrepreneurship were identified as key pillars for making the biotech park economically relevant.

Dr Shahid Iqbal underscored the active participation from

CSIR-IIIM and JK ST & IC team to make these facilities fully functional.

Earlier, Dr Saurabh Saran, Senior Principal Scientist, Fermentation and Microbial Biotechnology Division and Principal Investigator, IIIM-Technology Business Incubator (BioNEST), gave a detailed presentation on incubation and soft initiatives taken by CSIR-IIIM at Industrial Biotech Park, Ghatti, Kathua.

Dr Saran also explained that the incubator provides end-to-end support to start-ups right from idea incubation to product development. He noted that more than 10 startups from J&K, Punjab and neighbouring regions have shown interest in incubation, with several ventures

already utilising the facilities. Office space, laboratory access and technical mentoring are being extended to incubated startups.

The review brought together senior scientists, technical experts, JKSTIC officials and incubation managers to assess infrastructure readiness, startup engagement, skill development programmes and long-term sustainability of the biotech ecosystem being built in the region. The discussion focused on optimising the use of existing facilities, strengthening startup support systems and accelerating industry partnerships.

During the meeting, discussions on financial planning, equipment utilisation, industry collaborations and phased expansion of facilities.

## What to know about Takaichi's conservative policies after big election win

Tokyo, Feb 09: Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi's big election win paves the way for her ruling party to dominate the crucial lower house of parliament. It also gives her the political power to make a strong rightward shift in Japan's security, immigration and social policies.

Here's what to know about that divisive conservative agenda, which she calls necessary to make Japan "strong and prosperous."

Larger military capability, spending and arms sales

Takaichi has pledged to revise security and defence policies by December to bolster Japan's military capabilities, lifting a ban on

weapons exports and moving further away from postwar pacifist principles.

Takaichi wants to build up intelligence-gathering to work more closely with ally Washington and defence partners such as Australia and Britain. She plans to establish a national intelligence agency to meet those goals. She is also pushing to enact a highly controversial anti-espionage law that experts say could undermine civil rights.

Takaichi has followed through on a pledge to US President Donald Trump to push Japan's annual defence budget to double 2022 levels to 2 per cent of its gross domestic product by March.

Trump, China and WWII

history Takaichi is set to visit Washington to meet with Trump at the White House on March 19. The US president announced on social media the trip as he endorsed the prime minister ahead of Sunday's election.

The talks are expected to focus on defence spending, investment commitments under a USD 550 billion package for Washington that Japan pledged in October, as well as China. Trump will make a trip in April to Beijing to meet with Chinese leader Xi Jinping.

Takaichi's remarks in November, suggesting possible Japanese involvement if China takes military action against Taiwan, a self-governing island that Beijing claims as its own,

led to diplomatic and economic reprisals from China.

Takaichi, who has gained firmer political clout after the election, could pursue a more hawkish stance with China. This was hinted at when she mentioned her wish to visit Tokyo's Yasukuni Shrine, where the remains of war criminals are kept.

Takaichi, who used to be a regular visitor to Yasukuni, has stayed away from praying at the shrine since taking office. But on Sunday, during an interview with Fuji Television, Takaichi said she wants to create an environment to allow a Yasukuni visit that can be understood by neighbouring countries, which regularly protest when it occurs.

Tougher measures on immigration, foreign labour

She has also been pushing for tougher policies on immigration and foreigners.

This resonates with a growing far-right population that has supported the rise of anti-globalist party Sanseito, which says the LDP's promotion of foreign labour as a solution for Japan's declining population is making Japanese communities unsafe and causing cultural clashes.

Her government, in January, approved tougher rules on permanent residency and naturalisation, as well as measures to prevent unpaid tax and social insurance.

Preserving traditional family values

Takaichi supports the imperial family's male-only succession and opposes same-sex marriage.

She is also against a revision to the 19th-century civil law that would allow separate surnames for married couples so that women don't get pressured into abandoning theirs.

In a step that rights activists call an attempt to block a dual surname system, Takaichi is calling for a law to allow the greater use of maiden names as aliases instead.

Big government spending, consumption tax cut

Her top economic priority is to address rising prices and sluggish wages. And she needs to pass a budget bill for fiscal 2026 to fund those measures.

Takaichi advocates boosting government spending despite concerns that such moves will delay progress on trimming

Japan's national debt, which is about triple the size of its economy.

Takaichi last year introduced a "crisis-management investment" plan in 17 strategic areas such as food, energy, defence, and supply chains.

She also proposed a temporary sales tax cut.

She said in her campaign pledge that the government will speed up consideration of suspending an 8 per cent food consumption tax for two years to ease the burden of household living costs.

But her ambiguity over the plan, including how to fund the tax cut, caused unease in financial markets. Japan has the highest national debt among advanced economies.

## Opposition likely to move resolution to remove LS Speaker Birla from office

New Delhi, Feb 09: The opposition is considering moving a resolution to remove Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla from office for disallowing Rahul Gandhi and other opposition leaders from speaking in the House on the Motion of Thanks to the President's address, as well as for the suspension of eight MPs.

At the same time, Gandhi, the leader of the opposition in the Lok Sabha, and some others met Birla on Monday afternoon to work out a solution to end the stalemate, as the House has not been functioning properly ever since the former Congress chief was not allowed to speak on the India-China issue last week.

Sources said a notice for the resolution is likely to be given under Article 94-C of the Constitution, and over 100 opposition MPs have already signed it. However, the TMC is keen on taking up the SIR issue more vigorously, while the Samajwadi Party wants to highlight the alleged insult of Malwa queen Ahilyabai Holkar.

The notice is being given to move a resolution for the removal of the Speaker for disallowing the leader of the opposition from speaking in the House on the motion of thanks, for not initiating action against BJP MP Nishikant Dubey for his unsubstantiated charges against women MPs of the Congress, and suspension of eight opposition MPs, the



sources said.

They said a resolution in this matter would be moved in the Lok Sabha soon, and signatures of MPs are being procured. As many as 103 MPs had already signed the resolution, the sources said, adding that a final decision on when to give the notice against the Speaker would be taken on Tuesday.

Rahul Gandhi along with TMC's Abhishek Banerjee, Samajwadi Party's Akhilesh Yadav and DMK's T R Baalu, met Birla soon after the Lok Sabha was adjourned for the day on Monday, to work out a solution and end the stalemate.

During the talks, the leaders are learnt to have raised various points on why the opposition was protesting in the House. Gandhi also told the Speaker that they were ready for a discussion, provided he was

allowed to speak.

The Congress and other opposition leaders are now awaiting the final decision of Speaker Om Birla, after he is learnt to have told the opposition leaders during the meeting that he would get back to them after speaking to the government side, the sources said.

During the meeting, which lasted a few minutes, Gandhi and other leaders apprised the Speaker about the issues they wanted to raise in the House. Sources said Gandhi told the Speaker that he wanted to raise the issue of suspension of eight Congress MPs and other matters relating to Parliament, including the charges made against the women MPs. They urged the Speaker to revoke the suspension of eight MPs to end the stalemate.

The Lok Sabha has not been functioning properly ever since Gandhi was not allowed to speak on February 2. The Rajya Sabha started the discussion on the Union Budget for 2026-27 on Monday.

After the meeting with the Lok Sabha speaker, Gandhi claimed that Prime Minister Narendra Modi did not come to the lower House of Parliament to reply to the discussion on the motion of thanks to the President's address as he was "scared" of former army chief MM Naravane's unpublished memoir.

The Leader of Opposition also dared those claiming there was a threat to the prime minister from MPs last Thursday to "file an FIR" against the person threatening Modi. Gandhi said the opposition is quite keen that the discussion happens. He claimed the government was scared of having a discussion on the Budget because of the India-US deal, the way it was done, and its impact on farmers.

"We are very disturbed about this idea that has been floated that members were going to threaten the PM. There is no question of that. The fact is very clear, the prime minister was scared to come to the House, not because of the members but because of what I was saying, and he is still scared because he cannot face the truth," he said.

"He (Modi) should have the courage to come. I also mentioned that 'look, if someone has said that he is going to attack the PM, please file an FIR, arrest that person.' Why are you not doing that?" Gandhi

posed. "The agreement is that we will be allowed to say these points, and then the discussion should happen."

"But let us see what the government says. My personal view is that the government is scared of having a debate. The PM did not come to the House. He was scared of what we say, he was scared of being handed Naravane's book as a first step," he added.

Separately, women Congress MPs have written to Birla over the "unsubstantiated allegations" made by him against them. In the letter by several women MPs, including Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, they objected to charges made by the speaker. The decision to move the resolution to remove Birla from the office of Lok Sabha speaker was taken at a meeting of opposition leaders held in the chamber of Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge this morning. The TMC, the Left, DMK, SP, RJD, Shiv Sena (UBT) and NCP (SP) and RSP were among the parties that attended the meeting.

If moved, this will be the fourth such notice against a sitting speaker of the Lok Sabha.

The first such resolution was moved against the first Speaker, G V Mavalankar, which was defeated. Again, a resolution was moved against Speaker Hukum Singh, which could not be taken up due to a lack of numbers in the House. The third resolution was moved against Speaker Balram Jakhar, which was also defeated.

## Bharat Ratna for Savarkar would enhance award's prestige, says RSS chief

New Delhi, Feb 09: Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat on Sunday said that conferring the Bharat Ratna on Vinayak Damodar Savarkar, popularly known as Veer Savarkar, would be an "honour for the award itself", asserting that the Hindutva ideology has already garnered widespread public admiration.

Bhagwat made the remarks while addressing an event titled '100 Year of Sangh Journey - New Horizons' in Mumbai.

Speaking on the "delay" on the conferment of the award, he said, "I am not part of that committee, but if I meet someone, I will ask why it is being delayed. If Savarkar is given the Bharat Ratna, it will be an honour to the award itself, and its prestige will increase. Even without receiving any honour, he already rules the hearts of the people."

The demand for awarding Bharat Ratna to Savarkar has been a recurring political issue.

While several leaders and groups have advocated for the country's highest civilian honour to be bestowed upon Savarkar, the Congress party has

strongly opposed such proposals, describing him as a "traitor" over his mercy petitions submitted to British authorities during his imprisonment in the freedom struggle.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and Shiv Sena have repeatedly voiced support for granting Bharat Ratna to Savarkar, citing his contributions as a freedom fighter, writer and social reformer.

During his address at the event, Bhagwat also spoke about the organisational approach and philosophy of the RSS, emphasising that the Sangh focuses on instilling "sanskrit" or values rather than engaging in aggressive publicity or campaigning.

"Excessive campaigning leads to publicity, which can breed arrogance. One must protect oneself from it. Publicity should be like rainfall: appropriate in timing and quantity," Bhagwat said, while adding that the RSS has been expanding its outreach initiatives in recent times. Bhagwat also commented on language use within the RSS, stating that English would not be adopted as the medium of communication for the organisation's functioning, as it is not an indigenous language.

## SC terms siphoning of over Rs 54,000 cr by digital fraud 'dacoity', asks Centre to frame SoP

New Delhi, Feb 09: The Supreme Court on Monday described the siphoning of over Rs 54,000 crore by digital frauds as absolute "robbery or dacoity" and asked the Centre to draft a standard operating procedure in consultation with stakeholders like the RBI, banks and the Department of Telecommunications to deal with such cases.

A bench comprising Chief Justice of India Surya Kant and Justices Joydipya Bagchi and N V Anjaria observed that the amount siphoned off by digital fraud is more than the budgets of many small states.

Noting that such offences may be due to either collusion by or the negligence of bank officials, the top court stressed the need for timely actions from the RBI and the banks.

Issuing a slew of fresh directions, it asked the Ministry of Home Affairs to consider the Standard



Operating Procedure (SoP) of the Reserve Bank of India and similar SoP or decisions of the Department of Telecom (DoT) and come up with a draft MoU in four weeks to effectively deal with such offences.

The bench has also noted that the RBI has crafted an SOP prescribing action by the banks to temporarily hold debit cards to prevent cyber-enabled fraud.

It directed the CBI to identify digital arrest cases and asked the Gujarat and Delhi governments

to accord sanction to the federal probe agency to proceed with the investigations in the identified digital arrest cases.

The Supreme Court also asked the RBI, the DoT and others to jointly hold a meeting to come up with a framework for providing compensation in digital arrest cases. It said a pragmatic and liberal approach is needed to deal with the award of compensation to digital arrest victims and posted the plea for a further hearing after four weeks.

It asked the authorities to file fresh status reports before the next date of hearing.

On December 16, the bench asked the Centre to look into the suggestions put forward by the amicus curiae in ensuring compensation to victims of digital arrests, while voicing its concern over the enormous amounts taken out from the country by cyber criminals.

Digital arrest is a growing form of cybercrime in which fraudsters pose as law-enforcement officers, court officials or personnel from government agencies to intimidate victims through audio and video calls. They hold the victims hostage and put pressure on them to pay money.

On December 1, the top court asked the CBI to carry out a unified pan-India probe into digital arrest cases, and asked the RBI why it is not using artificial intelligence to trace and freeze bank accounts used by cyber criminals.

## Will not allow anyone to create impediment: SC on SIR exercise in WB

New Delhi, Feb 09: Amid West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's apprehension of "mass exclusion" of voters in the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in the state, the Supreme Court on Monday said it would not allow anyone to create an impediment in the exercise.

A bench comprising Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justices Joydipya Bagchi and N V Anjaria said it would issue whatever orders or clarifications are required in the matter.

"We will not allow anyone to create any impediment in the SIR exercise. It must be clear to the states," the CJ said while hearing a batch of petitions, including the one filed by Banerjee, related to the ongoing SIR of electoral rolls in West Bengal.

The bench took note of the affidavit filed by the Election Commission (EC) which alleged burning of its notices by some miscreants.

It directed the West Bengal director general of police (DGP) to file an affidavit in this regard.

The poll panel said that so far, no FIR has been registered against the miscreants.

"A message must go that the



Constitution of India applies to all states," Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, said.

The top court took note of the West Bengal government providing a list of 8,505 Group B officers to the poll panel, and said they may be trained and employed in the SIR process.

The bench clarified that final decisions on revision of the electoral rolls will always be taken by the electoral

roll officers.

The bench said the manner of employment and work profile of these 8,505 officers will be decided by the poll panel.

During the hearing, senior advocate Shyam Divan, appearing for Banerjee, raised apprehensions about the appointment of micro-observers and mass exclusion of eligible voters in the SIR exercise.

"We don't want any mass exclusion," Divan told the bench.

## Silver surges 6 pc to Rs 2.72 lakh/kg on firm global trends

New Delhi, Feb 09: Silver prices climbed more than 6 per cent to Rs 2.72 lakh per kilogram in the national capital on Monday, while gold rose nearly 1 per cent to Rs 1.58 lakh per 10 grams, driven by firm global trends and a weaker US dollar.

According to local marketmen, the white metal climbed Rs 17,000, or 6.66 per cent to Rs 2,72,000 per kilogram (inclusive of all taxes), from Friday's closing level of Rs 2,55,000 per kg.

In addition, gold of 99.9 per cent purity increased Rs 1,300, or 0.83 per cent to Rs 1,58,500 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). It had closed at Rs 1,57,200 per 10 grams in the previous session.

## Bangladesh's EC bans use of mobiles within 400 yards of polling centres on election day


Dhaka, Feb 09: Bangladesh's Election Commission has issued a directive, prohibiting mobile phones within 400 yards of polling centres on the election day, sparking protests from right-wing political parties who threatened to lay siege to its office if the decision is not withdrawn.

Bangladesh will hold parliamentary elections on February 12 - the first since the ouster of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina following massive protests led by students in August 2024.

"No individual will be allowed to enter a polling centre or remain within a 400-yard radius of it with a mobile phone. The restriction will apply to voters, polling agents, and all others present on election duty, with limited exceptions," said the directive issued on Sunday.

It said only the presiding officers, officers-in-charge of the police assigned to centres, and two authorised para-police Ansar members on election duty would remain beyond the purview of the order.

Jamaat-e-Islami and its



right-wing allies, which emerged as the main challenger to its once crucial ally, the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), in the absence of the now disbanded Awami League, sharply protested the decision, threatening to besiege EC's office unless the order was retracted. "If this rule is not withdrawn by this (Monday) evening, a stern movement will be built," Jamaat chief Shafiqur Rahman said.

Jamaat's assistant secretary general Ahsanul Mahboob Zubair made the announcement in a press release.

The student-led National Citizen Party (NCP), which

emerged last year with interim government chief Muhammad Yunus' blessings and joined the Jamaat-led 11-party right-wing election alliance, also criticised the EC's decision.

"If the decision is not withdrawn by this evening, the EC will be besieged tomorrow (Tuesday)," NCP convenor Nahid Islam said. The NCP leaders spearheaded the 2024 street protests called the July Uprising that toppled Hasina's Awami League regime.

The BNP has not commented on the EC order so far.

Meanwhile, the election campaign entered its final

day, with the national capital witnessing rallies by senior leaders of major political parties.

BNP Chairperson Tarique Rahman attended rallies at Kamal Ataturk Avenue playground in his Dhaka-17 constituency and at the Kalabagan Krirachakro Club playground.

Bangladesh Khelafat Majlis Ameer Maulana Mamunul Haque, nominee of the 11-party electoral alliance in Dhaka-13, joined a rally at Mohammadpur Eidgah Ground. Jamaat Ameer Rahman and NCP's Nahid Islam also attended the event.

## US VP Vance heads to Armenia, Azerbaijan to push peace, trade

Tbilisi, Feb 09: US Vice President JD Vance will visit Armenia and Azerbaijan this week to push a Washington-brokered peace agreement that could transform energy and trade routes in the strategic South Caucasus region.

His two-day trip to Armenia, which begins later on Monday, comes just six months after the Armenian and Azerbaijani leaders signed an agreement at the White House seen as the first step toward peace after nearly 40 years of war.

Vance, the first US vice president to visit Armenia, is seeking to advance the Trump Route for International Peace and Prosperity (TRIPP), a proposed 43-kilometer (27-mile) corridor that would run across southern Armenia and give Azerbaijan a direct route to its exclave of Nakhchivan and in turn to Turkey, Baku's close ally.

"Vance's visit should serve to reaffirm the US's commitment to seeing the Trump Route through," said Joshua Kucera, a senior South Caucasus analyst at Crisis Group.

"In a region like the Caucasus, even a small amount of attention from the US can make a significant impact."

The Armenian government said on Monday that Vance would talk with Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan and that both men would then make statements, without elaborating.

Vance will then visit Azerbaijan on Wednesday and Thursday, the



White House has said.

Under the agreement signed last year, a private US firm, the TRIPP Development Company, has been granted exclusive rights to develop the proposed corridor, with Yerevan retaining full sovereignty over its borders, customs, taxation and security. The route would better connect Asia to Europe while — crucially for Washington — bypassing Russia and Iran at a time when Western countries are keen on diversifying energy and trade

routes away from Russia due to its war in Ukraine. Russia has traditionally viewed the South Caucasus as part of its sphere of influence but has seen its clout there diminish as it is distracted by the war in Ukraine. Securing US access to supplies of critical minerals is also likely to be a key focus of Vance's visit. TRIPP could prove a key transit corridor for the vast mineral wealth of Central Asia — including uranium, copper, gold and rare earths — to Western markets.

## Naqvi set to seek Sharif's nod for India match after BCB asks Pak to end boycott: PCB source

Karachi, Feb 09: Pakistan Cricket Board chief Mohsin Naqvi is set to request his Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif to withdraw the boycott of their T20 World Cup match against India after being requested to do so by his Bangladesh counterpart, a PCB source has revealed.

Naqvi is set to brief Sharif on the latest developments on the issue later on Monday. The game against India is scheduled to be held in Colombo on February 15.

"Naqvi will brief the PM on



the communications he has had with the Bangladesh, Sri Lankan and Emirates cricket boards and with the ICC on the crisis," the source said.

Bangladesh Cricket Board President, Amin ul Islam was in Lahore for the talks Naqvi had with Imran Khawaja, vice chairman and independent director

of the ICC, on Sunday.

Sri Lanka and Emirates board have both urged the country to review its decision and the PCB source confirmed that Islam, while appreciating the support Pakistan has shown for Bangladesh cricket, also requested Naqvi to end the boycott.

He said that Naqvi is likely to ask the PM to permit the team to play India in the World Cup in view of the discussion and appeals from Sri Lanka, Emirates and Bangladesh boards.

However, the final decision rests with Sharif and the PCB would abide by it.

## Takaichi's landslide win reflects deep structural, ideological shift in Japan: China

Beijing, Feb 09: China on Monday said that Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi's massive victory in the midterm polls, a result widely seen as fuelled by public resentment over Beijing's strong opposition to her, reflects some deep-seated structural problems and shifting ideological currents.

Takaichi's Liberal Democratic Party won more than two-thirds majority in the House of Representatives in Sunday's election.

The election results in Japan reflected some deep-seated structural problems as well as evolving trends of ideological currents, which deserve profound reflection by visionary individuals from



all walks of life in Japan and the international community at large, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Lin Jian told reporters.

He was replying to a question

at a media briefing here whether Beijing's tough stance toward Takaichi's remarks on Taiwan, persisting with diplomatic tension, influenced the outcome of

elections in her favour.

China never interferes in the internal affairs of other countries, firmly opposes any erroneous words and actions that interfere in its internal affairs, infringe upon its core interests, Lin said, defending Beijing's tough stance towards Japan in the last few months objecting to Takaichi's remarks.

China mounted a massive diplomatic offensive against Japan over Takaichi's remarks in November last year that a Taiwan contingency could be a "survival-threatening situation" for Japan that may lead to action from the country's defence forces in support of the United States.

## 'Gary Kirsten is mentor who brings in human side to team'

New Delhi, Feb 09: Namibia skipper Gerhard Erasmus believes the presence of Gary Kirsten as mentor has added a bit more than mere tactical sharpness, pointing at former World Cup winning coach's ability to connect with players on a personal level while still offering a competitive edge shaped by vast experience.

Reflecting on what Kirsten brings to the table, Erasmus underlined the value of his pedigree and familiarity with conditions ahead of Namibia's opening game against Netherlands on Tuesday.

"Yes, he (Kirsten) obviously has lots of experience not only in the IPL but as you say with the 2011 India squad. So definitely he brings a winning edge to it (our campaign). And also

brings lots of knowledge of the different grounds."

Erasmus went on to explain that, beyond credentials and trophies, it is the management style that truly resonates with the squad. "But I think looking past that, I think it's very nice in terms of management that you have so many mentor type coaches who really like to bring the human side first and they really like to connect with the players."

He stressed that this player-first approach is what earns the respect of the group.

"I think that's what we respect most about Gary and all the other coaches on our staff. But cricket is very much conditions based and it's awesome to have him around."

Elaborating on Kirsten's influence, Erasmus highlighted his deep understanding of

venues and opposition players. "He knows all the grounds around here and also opposition players he knows because he has been with so many different players. And as you say, immense experience."

Not thought about India game on Feb 12

Turning attention to Namibia's upcoming fixture against the Netherlands, Erasmus made it clear that thoughts of the high-profile clash against India on February 12 at this very venue isn't a priority right now.

He emphasised that the team's immediate focus is entirely on the next challenge.

"No, all our energy is on the Netherlands game now. It's such a different game that we're going to face as opposed to the India game. Yeah, we haven't even thought about the 12th."




