J&K Govt rules out OPS revival, employees to remain under NPS

Jammu, Feb 18: Jammu & Kashmir Government on Wednesday ruled out any proposal to revive the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) for its employees.

In a written reply to a cut motion submitted by Peoples Conference MLA Sajad Gani Lone, the Minister in-charge of Finance informed the Legislative Assembly that there is no proposal to revive OPS, stating that the transition to the New Pension Scheme (NPS) was a conscious decision aimed at balancing fiscal sustainability with social security for government employees.

"The introduction of the New Pension Scheme in 2004 by the Government of India, subsequently adopted by States and Union Territories,

was a conscious decision aimed at safeguarding fiscal sustainability while ensuring post-retirement social security to government employees," the reply reads, as per news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

The Minister added that the government has consistently followed a policy of adopting employee welfare measures introduced by the Government of India, with the objective of maintaining parity and uniformity in service benefits for employees.

Defending the shift to NPS, the Minister said that the growing pension bill posed a serious challenge to the State's financial stability.

219 ventilators non-functional in J&K hospitals: Govt tells House

Srinagar, Feb 18: The Jammu and Kashmir Government on Wednesday informed the House that out of 877 ventilators installed across hospitals in the Union Territory, 219 remain non-functional, highlighting gaps in critical care infrastructure.

Replying to a question of MLA Shamim Firdous, Health and Medical Education Department Minister Sakina Itoo, as per news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), said that 658 ventilators are functional while 219 are non-functional.

While giving institution-wise details, she said that in GMC Jammu and its

associated hospital there are 320 ventilators, among which 209 are functional and 111 are non-functional.

"In SMHS Srinagar, 08 ventilators are non-functional and in GMC Srinagar associated hospitals excluding SMHS, 44 are non-functional," they said.

They said, in GMC Anantnag, just 10 out of 36 ventilators are functional. GMC Baramulla has 2 non-functional ventilators, GMC Doda 10, GMC Kathua 2 and GMC Rajouri 3 are non-functional," they said adding in GMC Udhampur and GMC Handwara, all 39 and 6 ventilators respectively are functional.

Decongesting Srinagar Traffic

Key road, corridor development projects undertaken: Deputy CM

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 18: Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Choudhary Wednesday said that the government has undertaken various key road projects and corridor developments to decongest traffic flow across downtown and arterial roads in Srinagar district.

The Deputy Chief Minister, as per an official statement was replying to a question raised by Legislator Tanvir Sadiq in the Legislative Assembly.

He informed the House that projects currently under various stages for execution included Nowshera to Soura (KZP Road), Saida kadal to Ashaibagh (SMS Road), Devi Angan-Hawal road besides Alamgiri Bazar Chowk and Mirza Kamil Sahib (MK Sahib) Chowk corridors.

"The road stretches in downtown Srinagar, being old alignments, are struggling to cope with increased traffic, urbanization, and commercial activity, leading to congestion during peak hours," stated the Deputy CM.

He said that routine maintenance and necessary repairs are being carried out periodically to ensure traffic ability and road safety.

The Deputy Chief Minister said that with preliminary assessments for improvement and widening of identified stretches have been undertaken. "Comprehensive widening in most cases entails substantial land acquisition, shifting of utilities and removal of encroachments, requiring inter-departmental coordination," he said.

He added that the land acquisition process has also been affected in certain stretches due to court litigations, thereby impacting the progress.

Sharing details, the Deputy Chief Minister informed that the structures near Nalbal Bridge part of Nowshera to Soura (KZP Road) have been acquired while acquisition of remaining structures would be taken up after settlement/negotiation in



the High Level Committee (HLC) and finalization of pending court cases.

He said survey for widening of Saida Kadal to Ashaibagh (SMS Road) is presently underway for a length of approximately 1.75 km. Besides, the proposal envisages widening of the carriageway from 7.50 meter to 21.00 meter and Detailed Project Report (DPR) is being submitted after completion of survey and feasibility formalities.

He informed that the preliminary project report for widening/upgradation of Devi Angan-Hawal Road has been prepared under CRIF for an estimated cost of Rs. 31.25 crore (including land acquisition and utility shifting cost of Rs. 30.00 crore and development cost of Rs. 1.25 crore) for a length of 1.40 km. "The project shall be taken up upon approval under the scheme and subject to the availability of funds," he said.

He said that the project of Alamgiri Bazar Chowk stands approved under UT Sector 2025-26 for an amount of

Rs. 335.00 Lakh which includes acquisition of 05 structures and junction redesigning.

Further, the Deputy Chief Minister said that the project of Mirza Kamil Sahib (MK Sahib) Chowk Junction redesigning has been approved under UT Sector 2025-26 for an amount of Rs. 135.00 lakh.

He said that the government is cognisant of the traffic congestion issues in downtown Srinagar and the necessity of ensuring smooth movement of ambulances, fire services and other emergency vehicles. He said that the road up-gradation and improvement works are being undertaken in a phased manner.

"Improvement works such as resurfacing, strengthening, drainage correction and junction re-modelling are being executed under regular R&B grants and other infrastructure development schemes," he added.

The supplementaries were raised by Legislators Mubarik Gul and Sham-im Firdous.

6th Khelo India Winter Games: Div Com Kashmir reviews arrangements

\SRINAGAR, FEBRUARY 18: Following the announcement of dates for the commencement of 2nd leg of the 6th Edition of the Khelo India Winter Games at Gulmarg, Divisional Commissioner Kashmir Anshul Garg chaired a comprehensive meeting to review preparations for the smooth and successful conduct of the national sporting event.

The meeting, as per an official statement was attended by Deputy Commissioner Baramulla, Commissioner SMC, SSP Traffic Srinagar, SSP Security, SSP Traffic Rural, Secretary, J&K Sports Council, CEO GDA, RTO, and officers from various departments including Information, Health, PHE, KPDCI, Transport, Hospitality & Protocol, Tourism, Cable Car Corporation, IMD, ULB, RDD, Rural Sanitation, Doordarshan, and other concerned agencies.

At the outset, Secretary, J&K Sports Council gave a detailed presentation



covering the number of participants, expected VIP attendance, scheduled events, accommodation availability, transportation plans, cultural programmes, and promotional activities.

While chairing the meeting, the Divisional Commissioner reviewed a wide range of arrangements, including the arrival of participants at Srinagar Airport, transportation logistics to

Gulmarg, accommodation facilities, and essential services such as electricity, drinking water, sanitation, mobile network connectivity, and critical healthcare services. He stressed the need for seamless coordination among all departments.

Emphasizing synergy and accountability, he directed the appointment of nodal officers for specific roles and assignments.

He also ordered the activation of a joint control room to facilitate effective communication among stakeholder departments and ensure timely dissemination of information, further strengthening interdepartmental coordination.

The Divisional Commissioner instructed the Chief Medical Officer to ensure the availability of an ECG machine at Gandola, deployment of medical teams, and placement of a critical care ambulance at the venue. He also called for maintaining cleanliness and sanitation at the venues and along the route from Srinagar Airport to Gulmarg.

Highlighting safety measures, he directed an increase in the number of Avalanche Rescue Team members for immediate response to any hazard and emphasized the mandatory use of anti-skid chains by vehicles operating on Gulmarg-Tangmarg road.

Also, he instructed the Director Tourism to leverage the event to promote tourism activities and boost tourist footfall in the region.

SMC Commissioner inspects EESL Lights Godown to assess quality standards

Skill Development programme on Drug Discovery, Biomedical Research concludes

Srinagar, February 18: The three-day Skill Development Program on Drug Discovery and Biomedical Research concluded successfully at the CSIR-IIIM Srinagar Branch. The hands-on training, organized by CSIR-IIIM Srinagar Branch, focused on practical laboratory techniques in biological assays and in vivo mice experiments and brought together early-career researchers, laboratory professionals, and students for intensive skill building under the CSIR-Integrated Skill Initiatives.

The Program, as per PIB statement was organized by Dr Fayaz Malik, Chief Scientist and his Research Group who gave participants hands-on Training on Drug Discovery and Biomedical Research. Biological Assays and Mice Experiments provided participants with practical exposure to experimental design, assay execution, data collection, and ethical conduct of small animal studies. Over three days, participants completed a structured sequence of laboratory modules with Day 1 focusing on Assay design and in vitro techniques. Participants learned assay selection and optimization, sample preparation, cell-based assay setup, and quantitative read-outs using spectrophotometric and plate-based methods. Emphasis was placed on controls, reproducibility, and data integrity. On Day 2, Participants were given hands on training on biological assays and analytical methods. The second day covered advanced biological assays, dose-response analysis, basic pharmacokinetic sampling, and interpretation of assay results. Hands-on sessions included ELISA, enzymatic activity assays, and troubleshooting common assay artifacts. The final day introduced ethical considerations, animal handling, dosing techniques, sample collection, and endpoint assessments. Participants practiced humane handling, accurate dosing, and collection of biological

samples for downstream analysis while following biosafety and animal welfare standards.

Dr. Zabeer Ahmed, Director CSIR-IIIM Jammu and holding additional charge of CSIR-CIMAP Lucknow, sent a virtual message to participants. He congratulated the organizers and trainees and highlighted the importance of integrating rigorous laboratory practice with translational research. He noted that proficiency in assay validation, proper animal model selection, and robust data management is essential for advancing drug discovery pipelines and for producing reproducible, publishable results.

Er. Abdul Rahim, Head IIIM Srinagar Branch and Chief Scientist RMBD & IST, addressed the valedictory session virtually. He commended the practical orientation of the program and underscored the branch's commitment to building local capacity in preclinical research. He emphasized the need for standardized protocols, quality assurance in biological assays, and adherence to regulatory and ethical frameworks in animal studies.

Dr. Fayaz Malik thanked the faculty, technical staff and participants for their enthusiasm and noted that the interactive module was designed to rapidly upskill attendees in techniques directly relevant to drug discovery workflows. Dr. Reyaz Ul Hassan, Sr. Principal Scientist highlighted the role of careful experimental planning and documentation in translating bench results into actionable leads. Dr. Muza-mil Ahmad, Pr. Scientist also spoke at the closing, offering practical tips on data analysis and quality control that participants can apply immediately in their laboratories.

The program was coordinated by Dr. Nasir ul Rasheed, Nodal, Skill Development under CSIR-Integrated Skill Initiatives. This training forms part of CSIR's broader effort to bridge academia and industry through targeted, job-oriented skill development.

Dy CM objects to Assembly banners

Jammu, Feb 18: Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Choudhary on Wednesday asked how protest banners surfaced inside and outside the Assembly.

Talking to reporters here, Choudhary said, "How did the banner come there? This is being planted," he said, alleging that BJP leaders were orchestrating protests in cases related to National Law University, daily wagers and other issues.

He said that any grievance against police conduct should be taken up with the Chief Minister through proper channels.

He maintained that the present government was elected by the people after decades and understands which issues are genuine and which are politically motivated. "We know which protest is legitimate and which is being done at the behest of a party," he said.

The Deputy Chief Minister also hit back at BJP leaders over remarks that some politicians were "growing on Delhi's pieces." Without naming individuals directly, he referred to instances where leaders elected from other states chose different home states, calling it "double politics."

On the issue of unemployment and youth concerns, Dy CM Choudhary said such matters cannot be resolved through street theatrics. He urged opposition leaders to seek appointments with the Chief Minister and present their demands formally.

Referring to the upcoming Khelo India Winter Games in Gulmarg from February 23, he said the event would boost tourism and inspire local youth. He cited sporting icons such as Sachin Tendulkar, Kapil Dev and Virat Kohli as examples of how athletes motivate young people across the country.

"Players from across India and abroad will participate. Tourists will come. This will help our youth move forward in sports," he said.

MINISTER SATISH SHARMA TERMS STATEHOOD DELAY UNJUSTIFIED

Meanwhile, Minister Satish Sharma on Wednesday

termed delay in restoration of statehood as unjustified and defended the budget presented by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah.

Speaking to reporters outside the Assembly, Sharma, as per the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) alleged that BJP has remained silent on the restoration of statehood.

Minister Sharma said the present government is managing with limited resources and still presenting a "people friendly" budget. He praised the Chief Minister for preparing what he called a balanced budget despite financial constraints.

Raising concern over unemployment, Minister said joblessness is at its peak and daily wagers are anxious about their future. Referring to ongoing protests by daily wagers, he said the Chief Minister has assured phased and time bound monthly payments within a year.

He also said Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh must not be divided along religious or regional lines. He called for collective accountability and alleged large scale corruption after 2019. In a sharp remark, he claimed that more resources have been looted in recent years than during the era of Maharaja Hari Singh.

On security, Minister reiterated that Jammu and Kashmir was downgraded from a state to a Union Territory on the pretext of controlling militancy. He questioned whether militancy has actually been curbed and referred to recent border incidents. He accused political opponents of humiliating and provoking youth for political gain.

On statehood, Minister asserted that Jammu and Kashmir must regain its full status as promised by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He said no region should be reduced in stature, comparing the transition from state to Union Territory to reducing a senior officer to a lower rank.

He expressed confidence that the Prime Minister would honour his assurance and said BJP leaders should show courage and support the demand for restoration of statehood—(KNO)

Fruit prices 'sky-rocketing'

Srinagar, Feb 18: As the holy month of Ramadan commenced, prices of fruit and other essential items witnessed a sharp hike in Srinagar markets.

Shoppers said that prices of several fruits are already touching the sky making it difficult for families to manage daily purchases. "I came to buy oranges and bananas, but the prices are too high even before Ramadan has started," said Jahangir Ahmad, of Srinagar.

Another local Imran Ahmad, said fruits like guava, apples and mangoes have become expensive. "Every year prices rise before Ramadan, but this time it has started too early," he said.

Vendors however, blamed the hike on increased rates at the Mandi. "We are purchasing fruits at higher prices from the Mandi. Naturally, we have to sell them accordingly," said Waseem Sofi a fruit seller.

"We are not overcharging, but



the wholesale rates have gone up," he said. Meanwhile, Bashir Ahmad Basheer, Chairman of the Kashmir Valley Fruit Growers and Dealers Union (KVFGDU), told KNO that the wholesale prices at the Mandi are normal. "We regularly issue

official rate lists of fruits and vegetables. The prices are within the normal range and there is no unusual hike at the Mandi level," he said, adding that retailers should follow the issued list. As per the official wholesale fruit price list

issued on 18th, February and accessed by KNO, the rates were as: Mango Safeeda (15 pieces) Rs: 100–102; Mango Totapuri (per piece) Rs: 60; Banana First Class (per dozen) Rs: 72–85; Dragon Fruit (per tray) Rs: 600–750; Guava Pink (per kg) Rs: 76–100; Guava (per kg) Rs: 50–55; Papaya (25 kg) Rs: 1050–1200; Kinow (per kg) Rs: 72–83; Watermelon (per chest) Rs: 23–53; American Apple (half peti) Rs: 140–264; Red Glow Apple (per dozen) Rs: 125–100; Kiwi (per piece) —; Payne Apple Raja (per number) —; Melon Sun (per kg) —; Melon Bobby (per kg) —; Pomegranates (per kg) —; Green Grapes (per chest) —; Maharaji Apple (per dozen) Rs: 100–125; Orange Dana (per chest) Rs: 191–112; Extraordinary Delicious (per chest) Rs: 212; Orange 141 Dana (per dozen) Rs: 140–161; Orange 171 Dana (per dozen).

Snow carnival held at Doodpathri

No proposal for new Veterinary Centres in Gulabgarh: Javid Dar

Says 1200 posts referred to recruitment agencies

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 18: Minister for Agriculture Production department, Javid Ahmad Dar, Wednesday informed the House that around 1200 gazetted and non-gazetted posts in the department have been referred to Jammu and Kashmir Public Service Commission (JKPSC) and Jammu and Kashmir Services Selection Board (JKSSB) for timely filling up of vacancies.

Replying to a question raised by MLA Gulabgarh Khurshid Ahmed, the Minister, as per an official statement stated that 17 Veterinary Centres and 21 Sheep Extension Centres are presently functional in the Gulabgarh Constituency. He added that among these, two centres are being managed through internal arrangements to ensure uninterrupted veterinary services to the livestock breeders. He said that these centres collectively cater to the healthcare needs of the livestock population in the constituency.

The Minister further informed the House that there is presently no proposal to establish new Veterinary or Sheep Extension Centres in Gulabgarh Constituency or elsewhere in the Union Territory. He explained

that establishment of new centres is considered based on several parameters like livestock population, geographical conditions (hilly, plain, or isolated areas), distance from existing centres and techno-feasibility reports submitted. He added that the proposals are processed further only if they meet feasibility criteria and availability of resources.

Highlighting measures to support migratory livestock breeders, the Minister said that the department regularly organizes Summer Camps at highland pastures including Dudhwan (Warwan), Kousarnag (Kulgam), Thatbal (Gulabgarh), Chandrani (Ramban) and Nikan (Mangnar, Gulabgarh). He added that these camps provide essential veterinary healthcare services to the sheep and goat breeders during the grazing season.

Responding to the supplementary questions regarding vacant posts, establishment of additional centres and deployment of veterinary doctors and staff during migration periods, the Minister assured the House that adequate staff arrangements are made during the migration season and all genuine demands and issues raised by the Member will be addressed in a timely manner.

Rs 242.46 Cr WSSs to strengthen water supply in rural Basohli; Javed Rana

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 18: Minister for Jal Shakti Javed Ahmed Rana Wednesday said that the government has undertaken a slew of measures to strengthen the drinking water infrastructure by implementing multiple Water Supply Schemes (WSSs) across both rural and urban areas of the Basohli constituency.

This was stated by the Minister, while replying to a question on water supply schemes raised by MLA Darshan Kumar in the Legislative Assembly.

The Minister, as per an official statement said that for the rural population, drinking water supply is being strengthened through 43 water supply schemes, including 42 under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) worth Rs 242.46 crore and one under NABARD. "Of these, six schemes have been completed while the remaining are at advanced stages of completion," he said.



The Minister informed the House that for urban areas, water supply is being managed through the existing schemes, which are being further augmented under AMRUT 2.0. He said that under AMRUT 2.0, a project titled "Augmentation and Improvement of Water

Supply System in Basohli Town under AMRUT 2.0" has been sanctioned at an estimated cost of Rs 12.60 crore to enhance the overall water supply infrastructure.

To ensure uninterrupted access to potable drinking water during the execution phase of these schemes,

water is being supplied through the existing systems. Besides, water tankers are being deployed wherever required, he added.

Jal Shakti Minister also provided details about the progress of completed, ongoing and commissioned water supply schemes under the Jal Jeevan Mission in the constituency.

He further informed that the the government of India has extended the Jal Jeevan Mission timeline up to December 2028. He said that all the pending schemes will be completed within the extended period, adding that strenuous efforts are underway for their completion.

Regarding payments to the contractors, the Minister stated that Call Deposit Receipts (CDRs), Security Deposits and Performance Security amounts are being released strictly in accordance with the terms and conditions of the respective contracts.

Construction of 50 bedded Additional Block at SDH Sunderbani in progress: Sakeena Itoo

The Minister, as per an official statement stated this while replying to a question of Legislator Randhir Singh in the House.

The Minister informed the House that an amount of Rs. 424 lakh has been earmarked for utilization against three projects like construction of 50 bedded additional Block at SDH Sunderbani, setting up of Dialysis Unit at SDH Sunderbani and Design, Supply, Installation, Commissioning and Trial-run (DSICT) of Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) of 05 KLD capacity at Government CHC Kalakote Rajouri during the current Financial Year. She added that Rs. 361.90 lakh have been released by the Finance Department, against which an expenditure of 300.00 lakh has been incurred, so far.

The Minister stated that the ongoing projects are being closely monitored, with delays reported to executing agencies for swift action, ensuring timely completion and full utilization. She also informed that the Tile/Electrical work is in progress on the second floor while Mechanical work at SDH Sunderbani is also being done on war footing. She added that allotment of DSICT of ETP of 05 KLD capacity at Government CHC Kalakote Rajouri is under process.

Delimitation of Panchayat Halqas after Census exercise: Javid Dar

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 18: Minister for Rural Development and Panchayati Raj departments, Javid Ahmad Dar, Wednesday informed the House that the government of Jammu and Kashmir has frozen the boundaries of all administrative units across the Union Territory until completion of the Census 2021.

Replying to a question raised by Legislator Abdul Majeed Bhat (Larmi) in the House, the Minister stated that the government vide S.O. 53 of 2025 dated 27.02.2025, issued by the Planning and Monitoring Department, has ordered freezing of boundaries of Districts, Tehsils, Municipalities, Towns, Revenue Villages and other administrative units across



the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir with effect from 01.07.2025 till the completion of Census 2021.

The Minister, as per an official statement, further informed that

as per Section 2 (J) of the Jammu and Kashmir Panchayati Raj Act, 1989, delimitation of Panchayat Halqas is based strictly on population figures. Any exercise regarding delimitation or rationalization of Panchayat Halqas can only be undertaken after the completion Census 2021, he added. He reiterated that the government is committed towards fairness and distribution of resources based on justice and equity.

The Minister said that the government is serious about development of Panchayat Halqas and their rationalization with Community Development (CD) Blocks on the basis of proximity, geographical considerations and access of the public to government institutions and services.

6,999 Solar Street Lights being procured during 2025-26: Satish Sharma

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 18: Minister for Science & Technology, Satish Sharma, Wednesday said that 6,999 Solar Street Lights (SSLs) are being procured during the year 2025-26 with a minimum of 50 being provided in each constituency of Jammu and Kashmir.

The Minister, as per an official statement stated this while replying to a question raised by Legislator Ajaz Ahmad Jan in the Legislative Assembly.

He added that few lights are also being installed in migrant camps and some border areas of the Union Territory of J&K.

The Minister informed the House that in Poonch district,



the material has recently been delivered for further

installation, including the Poonch-Haveli Constituency. He said that a proposal for 70 Solar Street Lights (SSLs) to be installed in the Poonch-Haveli Constituency has been received from the office of the MLA. "Against a quantity of proposed 70 SSLs, 50 have already been delivered and the installation shall start shortly with expected completion by February", he added.

He also said that at present no proposal for establishment of solar power plants in border villages has been formulated by JAKEDA, Science and Technology Department.

Govt focuses on faculty, infra augmentation in operational offsite campuses of JU: Sakeena Itoo

JAMMU, FEBRUARY 18: Minister for Education, Sakeena Itoo Wednesday said that the government is focusing on augmentation of infrastructure and faculty in operational offsite campuses of Jammu University (JU) at Bhaderwah, Kishtwar, Udhampur, Reasi, Ramnagar, Kathua and Poonch.

The Minister, as per an official statement, said this while replying

to a question of Legislator Dr. Sunil Bhardwaj in the Legislative Assembly.

The Education Minister said that the Higher Education Department is committed to adopt innovative pedagogical practices and strengthening of culture of research and innovation within the universities, while placing emphasis on strict adherence by the University of Jammu to the approved Academic Calendar. She added that measures like periodic monitoring of teaching-learning

process; promotion of faculty development and student-centric academic activities; phased adoption of Smart Classrooms and effective and timely utilization of e-resources; streamlining of office procedures through digitization of records; prudent financial planning in conformity with prescribed financial norms along with time-bound maintenance and up-gradation of classrooms, laboratories, libraries and other facilities are being implemented

for the benefit of students.

The Minister further said that the University of Jammu presently has eleven off-site campuses approved by the University Council, of which, currently seven campuses are operational at Bhaderwah, Kishtwar, Udhampur, Reasi, Ramnagar, Kathua, and Poonch.

She informed that for the Financial Year 2025-2026, the Higher Education Department has allocated consolidated Grant-in-Aid

amounting Rs. 260 crore to the University of Jammu for meeting its duly approved expenditure requirements. She added that the Grant-in-Aid is released in lump sum and is not earmarked campus-wise or academic programmes-wise at the level of Higher Education Department.

She said that the internal apportionment and utilization of funds, including allocation towards academic programmes at functional off-site campuses, is undertaken by the University of Jammu.

The Education Minister further said that measures are being undertaken in coordination with the University of Jammu to strengthen and consolidate the academic, administrative and infrastructural functioning of the functional off-site campuses including Ramnagar Campus. The objective behind the initiatives is to ensure a balanced academic growth, optimal utilization of resources and equitable expansion of higher education infrastructure

across Jammu & Kashmir.

She said that the proposal concerning creation of the posts of Rector/Director and other Teaching Faculty positions in respect of the functional Off-site Campuses is under examination in Higher Education Department.

Legislators, Daleep Singh Parihar, R.S. Pathania, Balwant Singh Mankotia and Shakti Raj Parihar raised various supplementary questions, which were satisfactorily replied by the Minister.

Trump wants his Board of Peace to solve world conflicts; it still has lot of work to do in Gaza

Jerusalem, Feb 18: US President Donald Trump's Board of Peace is set to meet for the first time on Thursday in Washington, an early test of whether one of his marquee foreign policy initiatives can gain broad support and advance the shaky ceasefire agreement in the Gaza Strip.

Trump's ballooning ambitions for the board extend from governing and rebuilding Gaza as a futuristic metropolis to challenging the United Nations Security Council's role in solving conflicts.

But they could be tempered by the realities of dealing with Gaza, where there has so far been limited progress in achieving the narrower aims of the ceasefire.

Palestinians, including many civilians, are still being killed in near-daily strikes that Israel says are aimed at militants who threaten or attack its forces. Hamas hasn't disarmed, no international forces have deployed, and a Palestinian committee meant to take over from Hamas is stuck in neighbouring

Egypt.

"If this meeting does not result in fast, tangible improvements on the ground — and particularly on the humanitarian front — its credibility will quickly crumble," said Max Rodenbeck, Israel-Palestine Project Director at the International Crisis Group, a global think tank.

A new international body More than two dozen nations have signed on as the board's founding members.

The list includes Israel and other regional heavyweights involved in ceasefire negotiations, as well as countries from outside the Middle East whose leaders support Trump or hope to gain his favour. US allies like France, Norway and Sweden have so far declined.

Israelis are suspicious of the involvement of Qatar and Türkiye, which have longstanding relations with Hamas. Palestinians object because their representatives weren't invited to the board, even as it weighs the future of a territory that is home to some 2 million of them.

Trump, the self-appointed

chairman of the board, said earlier this week that member countries had pledged USD 5 billion toward rebuilding Gaza and would commit thousands of personnel to peacekeeping and policing. No financial pledges — or an agenda for this week's meeting — have been made public.

"We want to make it successful. I think it has the chance to be the most consequential board ever assembled of any kind," Trump told reporters on Monday. He reiterated his criticism of the UN's record on resolving international disputes.

Ambitious plans Trump — along with son-in-law Jared Kushner and envoy Steve Witkoff — has laid out ambitious plans for rebuilding Gaza with international investment.

In Davos last month, Kushner suggested reconstruction could be complete in a matter of three years, even though UN forecasts suggest that clearing rubble and demining alone could take much longer.

Kushner's slides showed a reconstructed Gaza with a coastal tourism strip, industrial zones

and data centres. He conceded that rebuilding would begin only in demilitarized areas and that security would be essential to attract investment.

The latest joint estimate by the UN, European Union and World Bank says reconstruction will cost about USD 70 billion.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said there will be no reconstruction until Hamas disarms, leaving Palestinians in limbo among the widespread devastation.

Halting progress The ceasefire deal has halted major military operations, freed the last hostages held by Hamas and ramped up aid deliveries to Gaza. But a lasting resolution to the two-year war ignited by Hamas' October 7, 2023 attack into Israel remains elusive.

The deal envisions Hamas handing over its weapons and Israeli forces withdrawing from Gaza as international forces deploy. It left some questions unanswered and set no timeline to secure buy-in and defer confrontation over those issues.

Israel and the US say Hamas' disarmament is key to progress

on the other fronts. Arab and Muslim members of the Board of Peace have accused Israel of undermining the ceasefire with its daily strikes and want the US to rein in its close ally. They have called on Hamas to disarm but say Israel's withdrawal is just as important.

Israel defines demilitarisation as extending from heavy weapons like rocket-propelled grenades all the way down to rifles. Netanyahu said Sunday that Hamas would have to give up roughly 60,000 automatic rifles.

Despite accepting the agreement, Hamas has made only vague or conditional commitments to disarm as part of a process leading to the establishment of a Palestinian state. Senior Hamas officials have said their security forces need to retain some weapons in order to maintain law and order during the transition.

Some of the ideas under discussion include Hamas "freezing" its arms by placing them in sealed depots under outside supervision or giving up heavy weapons while keeping some

handguns for policing, according to two regional officials involved in the negotiations. One official said disarmament is a complicated process that could take months. The officials requested anonymity to discuss the negotiations.

It's far from certain that Israel or the United States would agree to such ideas.

A stabilization force The ceasefire deal also calls for a temporary International Stabilization Force made up of soldiers from Arab and Muslim-majority countries to vet, train and support to a new Palestinian police force. Its mandate is not spelled out in detail, but would include securing aid deliveries and preventing weapons smuggling.

Countries being asked to contribute to the force insist that any deployment be framed as a peacekeeping mission. They have refused to take part in the disarmament of Hamas, a job that could put them in harm's way. Another concern is the presence of armed groups allied with Israel.

Indonesia has begun training

a contingent of up to 8,000 soldiers for the force, though its foreign minister said last week that they would not take part in disarmament.

Postwar governance Under the ceasefire agreement, Hamas is to hand over power to a transitional committee of politically independent Palestinian administrators. The US has named a 15-member committee and tapped former UN envoy Nickolay Mladenov to oversee them as the board's envoy to Gaza.

The committee, led by former Palestinian Authority deputy minister Ali Shaath, has not yet been granted Israeli permission to enter Gaza from Egypt. Israel hasn't commented on the matter.

Mladenov said last week that the committee will not be able to work unless Hamas hands over power and ceasefire violations stop.

"We're only embarrassing the committee and ultimately making it ineffective," he said at the Munich Security Conference. "All of this needs to move very fast."

J&K pays pensions

completion of the prescribed term," the reply noted.

The reply states that Section 95 of the Reorganisation Act provides for the continuation of existing laws in the successor Union Territories until amended or repealed. "There is no provision in the Act that restrains or withdraws pensionary benefits already earned. Further, Section 87 provides for distribution of assets and liabilities of the erstwhile State between the two Union Territories, which includes financial obligations such as pensions. The pension for former legislators is not a fresh benefit but a continuation of a lawful entitlement earned prior to reorganisation, subject to final financial adjustment between the successor Union Territories as determined by the Central Government," the reply stated.

The Minister clarified that there is no legal provision applicable to Ladakh for payment of pensions to former lawmakers. "Since the pensions were authorized under the Jammu and Kashmir State Legislature Members' Pension Act, 1984 (as applicable to the UT of J&K), and there exists no enabling provision for the UT of Ladakh to disburse such pensions (the Act having been repealed in its application to Ladakh), the liability continued to rest with the UT of Jammu and Kashmir," the reply said.

The Ministry further added that the MHA also clarified these pensions should be dealt with by the J&K Legislative Assembly. "The Office of the Principal Chief Controller of Accounts, Ministry of Home Affairs, also clarified that these pensions should be handled by the Secretariat/DDO of the J&K Legislative Assembly," the Ministry said, adding that the Finance Department concurred with this view on November 24, 2021, and the approval was eventually approved by the Lieutenant Governor. Chairperson, member posts in DCW can't remain vacant: Delhi HC

New Delhi, Feb 18: The Delhi High Court on Wednesday said the Delhi government cannot have any reason whatsoever to not fill up the vacant posts of chairperson and members in the Delhi Commission for Women (DCW) or not provide adequate staff there.

A bench of Chief Justice D K Upadhyaya and Justice Tejas Karia asked the Delhi government's counsel to seek instructions on steps taken by it to fill the vacancies and ensure that the commission does not close.

"The commission performs certain important functions for the welfare of women. In view of the functions assigned to the commission under section 10 of The Delhi Commission for Women Act, 1994, there cannot be any reason whatsoever for not filling

up the vacancies in the office of the chairperson and members and for not providing adequate staff to DCW," the court observed.

"Let instructions be sought by the Delhi government counsel as to what steps have been taken by the authorities to fill up the vacant posts and ensure that the commission does not close down. List next Wednesday," it ordered.

The court was hearing a public interest litigation by Buxar MP Sudhakar Singh to fill up the vacant post of chairperson and members of the DCW within a time-bound period.

The petitioner's lawyer, advocate Satayam Singh, said the DCW was "closed" since January 24 as there were no members or staff.

The Delhi government counsel said he has to verify the claim made in the PIL.
